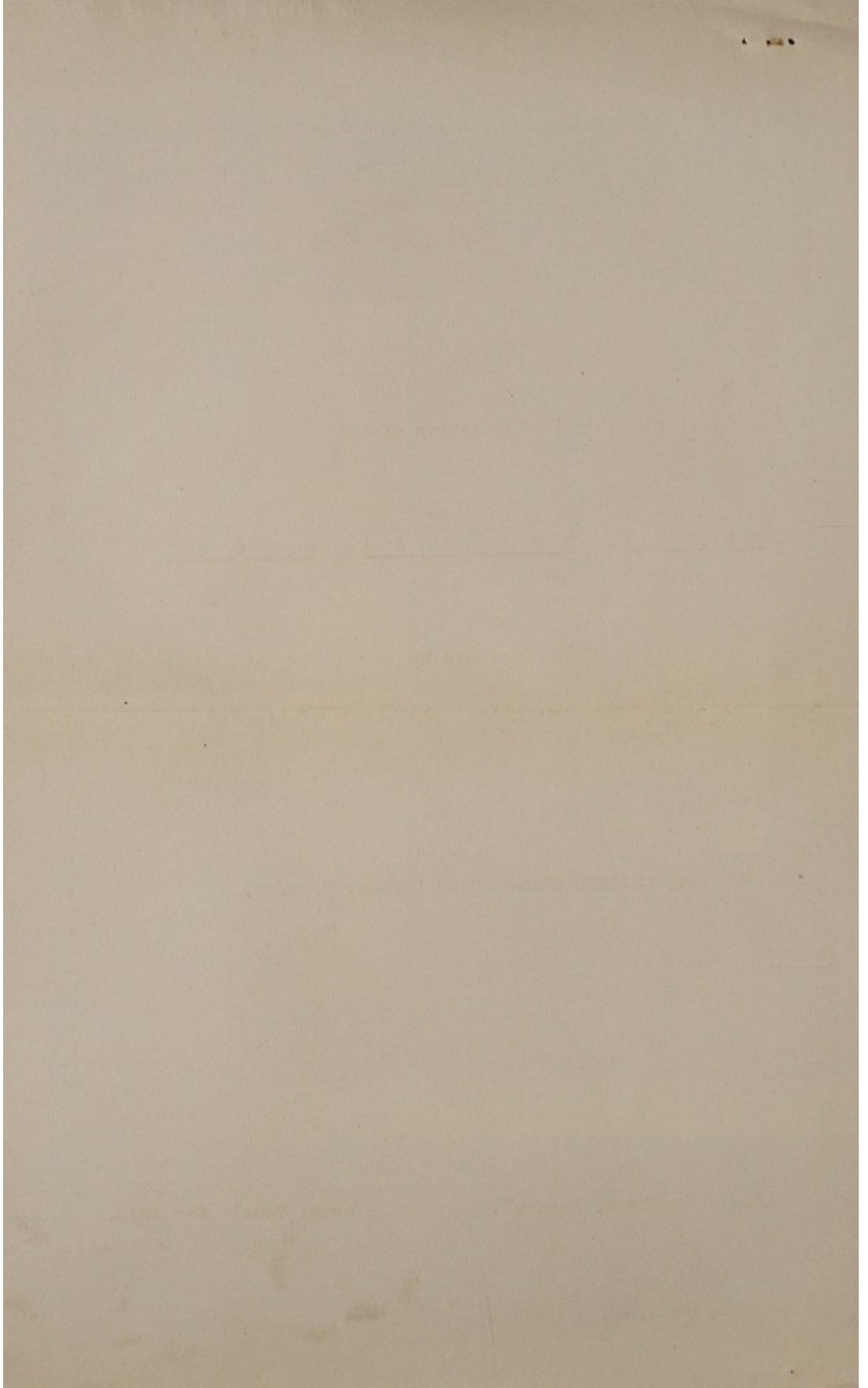

Includes many local notes of value about the diet and times of meals of Oriel University (to which Cogan presented various medical works), and an account of the fever at Oxford in 1577 which broke out at the assizes, and between July 1st and Aug. 12th carried off 510 Persons - "all men and no women". Cogan was described as "an able Physician and Latinist, a good neighbour, and an honest Man."

From the last lines of Martin Lluelyn's poem - "Great Generations solfe is now thy Heire", included in this volume, Fuller may have found his strange idea (Worthies' 1662, Kent, P. 79) that Harvey, though a bachelor, left three hopeful sons to posterity - his books - "De circulatione Sanguinis", which I may call his son and heir; the Doctor living to see it at full age, and generally received; "De Generatione", as yet in its minority: but I assure you growing up apace into Public credit; "De Ovo" as yet in the nonage thereof; but infants may be men in due time". This seems to be Lluelyn's only medical poem; comparing Harvey with Drake and Cavendish, he calls him "Fam'd Circulator of the Lesser World."

Hecquet, after practising at Port Royal, became in 1697 a member of the Faculty of Paris, who employed him as Professor of Materia Medical; he advocated the use of the lancet, and is said to be the prototype of "Dr Sangrado" in "Gil Blas" and to have been called by his contemporaries "the French Hippocrates".

This work was probably printed between 1554 and 1555. Oribasius, a celebrated physician, was a native of Sardis, in Lydia, or of Pergamus. The first to describe salivary glands, also he advanced new ideas on dietetics and gymnastics, and his "Medicinalia Collecta" is highly valued for its explanations of many passages in Galen's writings, and for the extracts it contains from obscure and non-authors.

Peirce, is probably the first English writer who noted the occurrence of acute rheumatism as a sequel to scarlet fever; his account of Major Agnot's case, in which muscular feebleness of the arm followed the constant carrying of a heavy falcon on one fist, is the first suggestion of the morbid conditions described as "trade palsies". The Lympho-sarcoma of the Pericardium, which he discovered post mortem in the case of Sir Robert Craven, IS THE FIRST DESCRIBED IN ANY MEDICAL BOOK. Those three original observations entitle him to a high place among English physicians.
