PUBLIC HEALTH.

Total population is 35,672 as against 39,090 in 1927. The decrease 3,418 is probably due to rubber slump and most of the labourers leaving the estates.

Deaths totalled 952 as against 1,270 in 1927.

The death-rate is 26.68 per mille against 35.05 in 1927.

The total infantile mortality is 387 as against 540 in 1927. Infantile mortality rate is 360·3 per mille as against 417·8 per mille in 1927.

Total Births in 1928—1,074 (529 males and females 545) as against 1,292 (702 males and 590 females) in 1927. The birth-rate per mille of population 1928—30·10 as against the birth-rate of 33·05 per mille in 1927.

There were 2,702 cases treated at the Government Dispensary and Out-Stations.

DISPENSARY AND OUT-PATIENTS.

A total of 2,702 were treated in Brunei Government Dispensary and Out-Stations against 2,482 in 1927. Most of these cases were amongst Government Servants. (Police, Prisoners and Customs Employees.)

VACCINATIONS.

There were 757 vaccinations performed in Brunei and Out-Stations in 1928 as against 1,245 in 1927. These figures were compared to 1,074 births in 1928 as against 1,292 in 1927.

The vaccination is much less this year owing to the Epidemic of skin diseases in the District of Tutong.

SCHOOL EXAMINATION.

There were 96 boys examined at Brunei School of these, 8 showed enlarged Spleen, with a percentage of 8·3 as against 5·5 in 1927. The general health of the boys was good.
