SUBJECT.—*Report on Civil Hospitals and Dispensaries for the triennium 1942-44.*

I have the honour to submit for the information of Government the report on Civil Hospitals and Dispensaries for the triennium 1942-44.

BUILDINGS.

2. *Major works.*—During the year 1944, no new major work was carried out.

3. *Minor works.*—During the year 1944, execution of new works was restricted to those which were considered to be urgent and inescapable, in view of the difficulties in obtaining building materials, as a result of the conditions created by the war. Even then, several minor works, representing additions and alterations and improvements to buildings of Government Hospitals and Dispensaries were carried out at a cost of Rs. 61,479 from the Surgeon General's Discretionary grant. The following are some of the important works undertaken during the year :—

4. *General.*—The buildings of the various Government Hospitals and Dispensaries have been kept in good condition, the requisite repairs having been carried out by the Public Works Department. During the triennium of 1942–44, Major and Minor works costing about Rs. 48,245 and Rs. 2,44,897, respectively, were carried out at the various Government Hospitals and Dispensaries.

BOMBAY CITY HOSPITALS.

5. During the triennium under report, one hundred beds at the J. J. Hospital, and a similar number at the St. George's Hospital, which were placed at the disposal of the Defence Department in 1941, continued to be at its disposal. In addition, a part of the M. A. Podar Hospital placed at the disposal of the R. A. F., for a hospital of 60 beds for their sick personnel.

6. *G. T. Hospital, Bombay.*—The Clinical Unit System introduced at this hospital has worked very satisfactorily.

The course started for the training of candidates in the D. M. R. continued to make good progress during the year under report. The X-ray and Electro-therapeutic Department is open daily, and is very popular. The need for a proper Out-patients Department is keenly felt. The construction of a new Out-patients Department has been sanctioned by Government as a post-war item.

7. *Cama and Albless Hospitals, Bombay.*—The generous offers of Rs. 1,00,000 from Mr. M. G. Desai for the construction of an administrative Block in the compound of these hospitals with a modern operation theatre and of Rs. 15,000 from Dr. Freany Cama, for the construction of a Nursery for new-born babies, have since been accepted by Government.

MOFUSSIL HOSPITALS.

8. *Civil Hospital, Ahmedabad.*—The land for building a new hospital on a more open and healthy site outside the city walls has been acquired, but its construction has been postponed till after the war. In order, however, to meet the increasing demand for in-patient accommodation, it has been decided to convert the B. J. Medical School Hostel into an annexe to the hospital. The question of shifting the students from the hostel to a rented building, is under consideration at present.

9. *Civil Hospital, Nasik.*—A considerable amount of new hospital furniture has been purchased from public donations amounting to Rs. 2,690 collected during the year in cash in addition to a new operation table presented to the hospital. A special grant of Rs. 1,570 has been sanctioned for drugs, etc., for the Venereal Diseases Department at this hospital.

10. *Vithal Sayana Civil Hospital, Thana.*—The District Local Board, Thana, has kindly donated an "ultra-violet ray lamp", worth Rs. 1,280, for the use of the hospital.

The ambulance supplied to the hospital as a gift from the Thana District Rupee Fund, is proving very useful.

11. *Civil Hospital, Satara.*—Government have accorded administrative approval to the recurring and non-recurring expenditure in connection with the increase in the number of beds from 50 to 75 in the Post War Reconstruction Scheme.

12. *Sassoon Hospitals, Poona.*—The Advisory Committee for the recruitment of Probationer Nurses, formed during the year 1941, is working satisfactorily. The Lady Superintendent has started a Recreation Club for Nurses.

13. *Civil Hospital, Broach.*—This is the only institution in the District where artificial Pneumothorax treatment is given, and many patients are taking advantage of it. A Nursing Association has been formed at this hospital during the year under report under the name of the "Broach Civil Hospital Nursing Association". A sum of about Rs. 8,700 has been collected by way of donations from various philanthropic persons.

GENERAL.

14. *Water Supply.*—Complaints of inadequate water supply exist at a few Government hospitals, notably Belgaum, Dharwar, Sholapur and also J. J. Group of Hospitals and St. George's Hospital, Bombay.

15. *Advisory Committees.*—The committees at Government hospitals in Bombay City and in the mofussil met occasionally during the year and continued to do useful work. Thanks are due to the members for the interest they evinced in the welfare of the patients.

16. *Grants-in-aid to Mission Hospitals.*—Owing to war conditions the financial help from overseas, which the Mission Hospitals in India used to get has been cut off, with the result that the Institutions found it very difficult to continue their normal activities. In order that the authorities in charge of these hospitals may continue their useful work, special grants aggregating the amounts shown below were given to some of the Mission Hospitals in this Province, during the triennium under report :—

17. *Unani systems of Medicine.*—With a view to encouraging the Tibbia College, Bombay, the following non-recurring grants were given to it during the triennium :—

18. *Ayurvedic systems of Medicine.*—The Mahadevi Anandilal Podar Hospital, Worli, Bombay, started functioning in 14th January 1942. It opened only with the out-door Department, and the in-door Department was started from 10th March 1942. This is the only institution of its kind in the City of Bombay, established on the Ayurvedic system of Medicine on the medical side, with up-to-date facilities for surgical treatment in accordance with modern medical practice.

During the triennium under report, Government have sanctioned the establishment of the State Faculties for the Ayurvedic and Unani Systems of Medicine. These Faculties have been authorised to hold preliminary and qualifying examinations in the respective systems of Medicines under the Bombay Medical Practitioners' Act, 1938.

19. *Leprosy.*—The special Leprosy Officer before resigning his appointment in 1943, had completed the survey of incidence of leprosy in the Districts of Satara, East Khandesh, Sholapur, Ratnagiri, Nasik, Ahmednagar, Poona, Bijapur, West

Khandesh, Ahmedabad, Kaira, Surat, Broach and Panch Mahals, by carrying out house to house survey in some of the selected villages and examining all the school children and the patients and other members of the household of all lepers, he detected. He also gave them suitable instructions as to their segregation and treatment. The main improvement he suggested was that the treatment centres should be in charge of Medical Officers specially trained in leprosy treatment. Arrangements have been made at the Haffkine Institute, Bombay, for the training of S. M. S. Officers, in a special two weeks' course. There are two courses in a year, one commencing from 1st October, and the other from 1st December. Twenty-one S. M. S. Officers have been trained during the triennium under report and some more will be trained in future also.

In addition to the grants for the maintenance of lepers the following non-recurring grants were given to some of the leper hospitals during the triennium under report :

The management and control of the Kondhwa Budruk Leper Hospital in the Poona District has been taken over by Government, from 1st November 1942, as the Mission to Lepers, India, found itself unable to continue its management and especially as it was necessary to do so, for the detention of statutory lepers, until some other suitable arrangements could be made for providing accommodation for them elsewhere.

So also the management and control of the Sir D. M. Petit Leper Hospital, Ratnagiri, has been taken over by Government from 1st March 1944, as the District Local Board, Ratnagiri, found itself unable to continue its management owing to its straitened financial position, on the condition that it should pay an annual contribution of Rs. 2,000 towards the maintenance of the hospital.

Under the auspices of the British Empire Leprosy Relief Association (Indian Council), 38 centres were working in the Province in 1944. The total number of cases treated at these centres during the year under report was 4,972; out of these 3,309 were old cases while, 1,663 were new.

In addition there were 75 centres (clinics) at Grant-in-aid dispensaries. The total number of cases treated at these clinics during 1944 was 1,134. The total number of patients treated in all classes of institutions in the Province during 1944 is reported to be 5,426.

20. *Anti-tuberculosis activities.*—A Tuberculosis ward constructed out of the returnable amounts from the King Emperor's Anti-Tuberculosis Fund has been opened during the triennium under report at the Civil Hospitals, Alibag and Bijapur. A ward for tuberculosis patients at the Civil Hospitals, Jalgaon, which is nearing completion, will be ready for use soon.

21. *Blood Transfusion Service*.—(A.1) Blood plasma has established itself as a therapeutic measure of great importance and Government have appointed a Blood Transfusion Officer of the status of a Civil Surgeon with effect from 2nd December 1944, to organise and develop Blood Transfusion Service in this Province.

Government have also since sanctioned the establishment of a Government Blood Transfusion Service. The service for the present consists of the following two units :

I. Processing Unit—

- 1 Medical Officer.
- 1 Assistant Technician.
- 2 Laboratory Assistants.
- 4 Laboratory Attendants.

II Mobile blood collecting unit—

- 1 Medical Officer.
- 2 Laboratory Assistants.
- 1 Laboratory Attendant.
- 1 Peon.

These units will be attached to the Haffkine Institute, Bombay. The intention is that in due course, each Government Hospital should have a static blood collecting unit. It will collect blood primarily for its own hospital transfusions and only surplus blood will be sent to the Haffkine Institute, for processing. The mobile blood collecting unit attached to the Haffkine Institute will collect blood from outside places like Jails, Factories, etc., for processing at the Institute.

A donation of Rs. 10,000 offered towards the establishment of a Blood Bank at the J. J. Group of Hospitals, has since been accepted by Government. Government have also sanctioned the necessary establishment required for the Bank.

The Blood Transfusion Officer during December 1944 made personal contacts with the Railways and Jail authorities, etc., and visited some of Government and non-Government Bombay Hospitals.

B. The Bombay City Branch of the Indian Red Cross Society continued to conduct a blood collecting unit and has done very useful work during the triennium under report.

22. *State Medical Faculty*.—The College of Physicians and Surgeons has raised the L.C.P.S. course from $3\frac{1}{2}$ years to $4\frac{1}{2}$ years from June 1941. Government did not for various reasons agree to follow the revised L.C.P.S. course at the Government Medical Schools but decided to continue old L.C.P.S. curriculum. The College of Physicians and Surgeons was however not willing to postpone the introduction of the revised course. Pending the conversion of the Government Medical Schools at Poona and Ahmedabad into colleges, a State Medical Faculty has therefore been established for holding examination leading upto the registrable qualifications in allopathy. The students passing the examination at the end of $3\frac{1}{2}$ years' course of study held by the Faculty are granted the Diploma called the "L.M.P.(Bom.)".

RURAL DEVELOPMENT.

23. (a) *Conversion of Dispensaries into Cottage Hospitals*.—A scheme to convert suitable Municipal and District Local Board dispensaries into cottage hospitals has been evolved and Government have so far opened 5 cottage hospitals at the following places :—

These hospitals are in charge of a B.M.S. Class II Officer, with a S.M.S. Officer as assistant, in addition to two nurses and other auxiliary staff, and they have provision each for about 15 beds. The idea in converting the dispensaries into cottage hospitals is to provide a co-ordinating link between the Subsidised Medical Practitioners at one end and the District Headquarter hospitals at the other. A rural dispensary, thus re-oriented as a cottage hospital, will take in cases from Subsidised Medical Practitioners as cannot be treated at home and pass on to the larger hospitals those requiring special facilities for diagnosis and treatment. As these hospitals have proved very useful, it is proposed to open 33 additional cottage hospitals, so as to have at least two cottage hospitals to begin with in each of the 19 Districts of this Province.

(b) *Improvement to District Local Board Dispensaries.*—As a part of rural Development programme, Government have sanctioned a scheme to give grants to District Local Boards with the view that the dispensaries in the Mofussil in charge of Government S.M.S. Officers, having indoor accommodation, should use them to “capacity” as they are little used at present, because of the poor arrangements for attendance and diet. A grant of Rs. 360 per annum to a dispensary having no nurse or midwife towards the pay of a nurse or two ward-boys, if a nurse is not available, and a grant of 0-4-0 per bed per diem for diet charges of the patients and other contingent expenditure have been sanctioned for the purpose. This arrangement will induce those persons who are unable to attend the dispensary daily to take regular treatment to remain as inpatients. The above scheme has been introduced in all the District Local Board Dispensaries in charge of Government Medical Officers. Government have also further increased the grant of 4 annas per bed per diem for diet charges of the patients and other contingent expenditure to annas 8 with effect from 1st April 1945, in the case of those dispensaries maintained by District Local Board which have agreed to bear 50 per cent. of the additional expenditure involved. It is also proposed to extend the scheme to some of the Municipal Dispensaries in this Province in charge of Government Medical Officers on the condition that the Municipalities agree to bear 50 per cent. of the additional expenditure of 0-4-0 for diet charges.

(c) *Village Aid Scheme.*—In view of the fact that it is not possible to extend the Subsidised Medical Practitioners’ scheme for the present owing to the paucity of medical practitioners, Government have made a provision of Rs. 20,000 per annum for running about 400 to 500 village centres in the Backward class areas. The scheme envisages the establishment of first-aid centres in villages where there are no medical practitioners and which are situated at a considerable distance from Government or District Local Board Dispensaries. Under this scheme primary school teachers of such villages are provided with boxes containing simple remedies and first-aid articles. They are given instruction in the use of these. This scheme has proved very useful in some Districts like Khandesh, Broach, etc. These village aid centres are actually being opened now.

RURAL MEDICAL RELIEF.

24. (a) *Appointment of Subsidised Medical Practitioners.*—Under the Rural Medical Relief Scheme, Government have so far sanctioned 333 centres in the several Districts. The location and type of 321-of-them have already been decided upon and those of the remaining centres are under consideration. Due to paucity of Allopathic medical practitioners, it has been found difficult to open all the centres. Of the 321 approved centres, only 283 (Allopathic 96, Ayurvedic

175 and Unani 12) were functioning during the year under report. The subjoined table shows the number of Subsidised dispensaries and the total number of patients treated in them in the several districts during 1944.

The Subsidised Medical Practitioner scheme has proved a success, and it is therefore proposed to open 100 additional centres as a Post War Reconstruction measure on increased honoraria and allowances, on the condition that the Subsidised Medical Practitioners will undertake vaccination and all anti-epidemic work and the work of Medical Officer of Health. Government have decided that these 100 Subsidised Medical Practitioner centres should be financed and controlled entirely by Government, instead of the expenditure involved being met in the proportion of 4/5th and 1/5th by Government and the District Local Board concerned respectively as at present.

(b) *Appointment of nurse-midwives.*—Of the 81 nurse-midwives to be appointed at the District Local Board Dispensaries under the Rural Medical Relief Scheme, only 46 have been appointed upto the end of 1944 as shown in the subjoined table :

25. *Touring Medical-cum-Propaganda Unit.*—With a view to improving the conditions of Bhils, and other aboriginal and hill tribes in the partially excluded areas, Government have sanctioned two touring Medical-cum-propaganda units in the West Khandesh and one in the Nasik District on a permanent basis and 3 units—one each in Thana, Broach and Panch Mahals District, and also in Akrani Mahal, on a temporary basis. Each unit consists of one organiser and one peon. The organiser is provided with medicines, a gramophone and records and a magic

lantern and slides. The organisers give medical aid in the entire area allotted to them and have had considerable success in making the Bhils and other Hill tribes medicine-conscious. As the scheme has proved useful, it is proposed to open three more such units in the West Khandesh District.

26. *Nursing in Hospitals.*—The deficiency of nursing personnel was increasingly felt owing to the situation created by the war. In order to provide an increasing number of nurses, Government have sanctioned the opening of six new training centres for nurses at the following Civil Hospitals with the number of student nurses admitted annually for training, as shown against them :—

They have also sanctioned the admission of additional student nurses annually at the following hospitals :—

This has increased the total number of student nurses under training by 119.

27. *College of Nursing.*—The College of Nursing, Bombay, started functioning from 1st September 1943. It gives preliminary training in nursing to the student nurses taking the course through the medium of English at the several hospitals, which are recognised by the Bombay Nurses, Midwives and Health Visitors' Council as centres for training of nurses. It trains about 140 student nurses annually. Government have also recently sanctioned the establishment of similar colleges at Poona and Ahmedabad, which will serve as central preliminary training schools for the nurses taking the course through the medium of Marathi and Gujarati respectively. These colleges will start functioning shortly and each will afford a 3 months' course for 60 student nurses annually.

In accordance with the recommendations of the Central Advisory Board of Health, Government have created a Gazetted post of Superintendent of Nursing Services in the Office of the Surgeon General. The Superintendent of Nursing Services assists the Surgeon General in the administration of nursing in this Province.

During the triennium under report, Government deputed two trained nurses for post-graduate training in nursing (Sister-Tutors' Course), one to the School of Nursing Administration, Delhi and the other to the United Kingdom.

The appointment of a Nurse Dietician has recently been sanctioned by Government at the J. J. Group of Hospitals, Bombay, which is the largest teaching hospital in the Province. It is also proposed to create similar appointments at some of the other larger hospitals in the Province in the near future.

28. *Red Cross*.—The Red Cross Society continued to render eminently satisfactory work under its enlarged scope. Most of the Civil Surgeons are members of the District Societies and have co-operated actively in its work.

The Travelling Table Dispensaries conducted by the Society are continuing to do good work in the Belgaum, Bijapur, Broach, Panch Mahals and Surat Districts. The Anti-Tuberculosis Clinics attached to the Civil Hospitals at—

(1) Ahmedabad, (2) Belgaum, (3) Surat, (4) Poona, (5) Nasik and (6) Sholapur, continued to do useful work during the triennium.

The Bombay Provincial Branch of the Indian Red Cross Society pays annually a sum of Rs. 4,140 being half the cost of the nurses employed at these clinics. The Clinics serve the purpose of diagnosis and out-patient treatment and act as a sieve to Hospitals where patients receive indoor hospital treatment. The nurse acts as a Health Visitor also.

29. *Diets to Patients*.—Improved diet scales on a uniform basis have been sanctioned by Government at all mofussil hospitals in the Province.

30. *Scheme for distribution of quinine*.—Owing to the difficulties of getting quinine from trade sources on account of the war conditions, the Government of India decided to allocate supplies of quinine available with them for distribution through the Provincial Governments to the private registered medical practitioners and hospitals and dispensaries which are not clients of the Medical Store Depot. The scheme for the distribution of quinine was started in this Province in December 1942 and the supplies of quinine allotted from time to time are distributed by the Superintendent of Excise, Bombay, to the private registered medical practitioners and the hospitals and dispensaries, according to the quota authorised by Government and the Surgeon General.

For this work, a special staff has been sanctioned by Government, and the sanction at present accorded will expire on 31st March 1946.

Along with quinine, quinine substitutes like Mepacrine and Quinacrine are also issued to Medical Practitioners and institutions in this Province on a very liberal scale.

31. *Subsidiary Police Hospital, Naigaum*.—A Subsidiary Police Hospital at Naigaum in charge of a B.M.S. Class II Officer, with a Dispensary for outdoor patients at Worli, was opened during the triennium under report for the treatment of sick policemen in view of the increase in the strength of the Police Force—both officers and constabulary.

32. *Acknowledgments*.—The Department expresses its thanks to all individuals and bodies who have extended their generosity towards the patients in the several hospitals by way of donations or gifts.

Statement A.

33. The total number of Institutions open at the beginning of the triennium was 739. During the triennium under report 42 new Institutions were opened and 16 were closed. The number of Institutions opened on 31st December 1944 was 765.

Statement B.

34. NOTE ON THE WORKING OF THE HAFFKINE INSTITUTE, 1944.

A. *General.*—The year under review put considerable strain on the resources of the Institute. The unsettled conditions in the country and the danger of air-raids called for large quantities of different therapeutic sera to be supplied to different provinces. The recently organised department of serum production had to increase its work considerably to cope with these demands. Heavy demands were also made on the Department of Pharmacology. It rendered very valuable aid to the Army Authorities. All the pharmacological preparations and other medical supplies purchased by the Army in Western India or imported through the Port of Bombay, were submitted to this department for analysis. Nearly 2,000 drugs and chemicals were examined and the examination included both chemical and biological tests. This service has helped the forces to maintain the quality of the medical supplies at a high level. Owing to the shortage of antiseptic solutions, an antiseptic solution called "Pemon" has been prepared by the Department of Chemotherapy and is being supplied to the hospitals.

Outbreak of cholera called for large quantities of cholera vaccine. Other vaccines were also in great demand. These demands were unusually high and had to be met in spite of the scarcity of agar in the country. However, the Institute managed to meet them.

Epidemics of plague broke out in certain parts of China, and the situation required immediate attention. Arrangements were made to train a large number of Chinese medical officers, sanitary engineers and bacteriologists in plague control work at the Institute, and intensive training was given in the measures adopted for the control and prevention of plague epidemics. Training was also given in the large-scale production of plague vaccine and therapeutic sera.

C. *Department of Antitoxins and Sera.*—During the year, a total of 90 horses were used for the production of therapeutic sera. Out of the total number of 90 horses, 44 were used for hyperimmunization against tetanus, 15 against diphtheria, 9 against gas gangrene, 4 against dysentery, 14 against snake-venom and 4 against plague. A total of 161 batches of toxins and toxoids, about 3,870 cc. each batch, were prepared for immunizing the horses. A few batches of toxoid were specially processed for use in man. One hundred and seventy-four batches of plasma were concentrated during the year. The average yield of concentrated and purified serum per batch was 3,313 c.c., so that 576,480 c.c. of concentrated and purified serum were prepared during the year. In addition to this, 69,710 c.c. of natural anti-plague and anti-dysentery sera were processed for use in man. Sera and toxoids, which were issued during the year amounted as follows: 562,662 c.c. of serum, 8,917 c.c. of tetanus toxoid, and 9,456 c.c. of diphtheria alum precipitated toxoid. Research works, with a view to preparing and standardising a new polyvalent anti-snake-venom serum, were undertaken during the year. Successful results were obtained.

D. *Department of Entomology.*—This department was engaged in tabulation and evaluation of data about fleas and rodents collected during the period of field investigations by the members of the Plague Recrudescence Inquiry in the Dharwar District. Recommendations for setting up permanent organisations for plague control in the suspected plague endemic centres and the neighbouring areas in the Peninsular India were submitted to the Director of Public Health for the Government of Bombay. Inquiries from different civil and military departments about the identification of snakes, insects, ticks and rodents and general information for their control were attended to, and suggestions to improve the construction of rat-traps were given.

E. *Department of Pharmacology.*—The activities of the department were almost entirely concerned with the examination of drugs and chemicals on behalf of the army. Nearly 2,000 drugs and chemicals were examined and the examination included both chemical and biological tests. The department also prepared and supplied to the army, solutions like 'Mydricine' at the special request of Medical Directorate, G. H. Q., New Delhi. Sulphanilamide paste for use in tropical ulcer was prepared and supplied to the medical officers of the province. The routine work carried out in the department chiefly consisted of examination and standardization of pharmaceutical products prepared by commercial firms and examination of drugs sent by medical officers and institutions in the province for purity and potency.

F. *Department of Virus Diseases (Including Rabies).*—(1) During the year under review 4,578 persons attended the Institute for anti-rabic treatment as against 4,236 the previous year. The different anti-rabic centres were supplied with 8,335 treatments. Of these, 584 were issued for veterinary use. One patient developed hydrophobia. The patient, who had received two punctured wounds on the hand as a result of a bite of a stray dog, sought advice 45 days later, when the wounds had all healed up. Consequently a class III treatment was given. The patient developed hydrophobia four days after the course of treatment.

(2) Vaccine against Yellow fever manufactured by the Laboratories of the International Health Division of the Rockefeller Foundation is stored in the Institute. The vaccine is lyophilised attenuated yellow fever virus known as 17D.

Inoculations were carried out on 6,585 people during the course of the year.

G (I). *Department of Nutrition*.—This department continues to render useful service to the Finance Department (Supply) of the Government. Various questions on human nutrition arising out of the rationing of food-stuffs in the province were referred to the Institute and the department has been giving technical advice in matters of practical nutrition. During the year, experimental work in connection with the fortification of wheat flour with calcium carbonate was undertaken. It was found that the addition of calcium carbonate to wheat flour in a proportion of 1 in 320 did not have any deteriorating effect on the protein and vitamin B₁ content of the latter under ordinary conditions of storage for four weeks. The analytical work was carried out in collaboration with the Department of Biochemistry at the Institute.

Towards the middle of the year, the Finance Department (Supply) appointed a Nutrition Officer mainly to undertake field work and carry out rapid nutrition and diet surveys. This officer was trained at the Institute for the work and he is at present working in close co-operation with the Department of Nutrition at the Institute.

G. (II). *Department of Experimental Pathology*.—During the year 895 pathological specimens, received from different hospitals in the province, were examined. They include brains from suspected rabid dogs, neoplasms, gynæcological conditions, tuberculosis of different tissues and some rare and interesting pathological specimens. This department continues to give assistance to the research enquiries conducted at the Institute.

A medical officer deputed by the Baroda Government was trained in the department in histological technique and morbid histology.

H. *Department of Clinical Pathology*.—During the year, 16,003 specimens were examined by this department, received from Government hospitals and dispensaries and private medical practitioners. Free diagnostic aid is given in many infectious diseases besides typhoid fever, such as diphtheria, typhus fever, cerebro-spinal fever, dysenteries and malaria. The total number of samples examined for agglutination tests was 1,783. A few cases of typhus fever were detected by agglutination tests alone. The number of samples of blood, examined for Wassermann and Kahn tests was 9,606 and 2,954 respectively. Friedman tests were done on 163 urine samples during the year. In addition to the routine diagnostic tests the activity of the department was also concerned in the preparation of auto-vaccines, identifications and maintenance of poisonous snakes and extraction of snake-venom and examination of samples of disinfectants for the Rideal-Walker test.

A scheme for the preparation and supply of diagnostic reagents was sanctioned by Government under letter No. 5313/33/3082, dated 24th March 1944. Under this scheme, some of the diagnostic reagents, such as agglutinable suspensions, high titre sera, blood-grouping sera, Kahn antigen, rapid malaria stain (JSB) have been prepared. About 200c.c. of group sera A and B, have been supplied during the year. Preparation of a water soluble stain (JSB) for malaria has resulted in saving such costly reagents as glyserine and methyl alcohol, and the stain has been supplied to all Civil Surgeons and Government hospitals of this province.

I. *Department of Biochemistry*.—This department continued to give useful help to various hospitals and medical practitioners as before in the diagnosis of disease by the various biochemical examinations.

The department also carries out work in nutritional problems and undertake vitamin assays. Oxidation of different substances by the plague bacillus is also being studied.

J. Department of Chemotherapy.—During the year, some new sulphanilamide derivatives were prepared and their therapeutic action tested. Large-scale method of production of atabrine, vitamin A, concentrate from shark-liver oil and penicillin are being investigated.

RESEARCHES.

A. Department of Entomology.—An earlier study on the effects of constant temperature and humidity on the development of the larvæ of *X. cheopis*, *X. astia* and *X. brasiliensis* was in course of preparation for publication. The larvæ of *X. astia* are more susceptible to low humidities than those of the other two species. The temperature tolerance of the larvæ of *X. astia* is highest and that of the larvæ of *X. brasiliensis* is the lowest. The experiments conducted to determine the water relations of the larvæ of *X. cheopis* indicate that the great loss of water from the larva due to absence of any special organ for economising water is compensated by the gain of water through food and absorption of water-vapour directly from the air through the integument. In order to test the pulicidal value of D. D. T., and its residual killing effect on fleas, experiments under laboratory and artificial burrow conditions simulating nature were carried out, and the preliminary results give a great hope that the use of D. D. T., will prove very beneficial in the control of plague.

B. Department of Pharmacology.—Investigations on the causation and treatment of tropical ulcers were undertaken. It was found that the disease could not be transmitted to experimental laboratory animals, but was readily transmitted to man if the skin was broken. Attempts to transmit the disease to the unbroken skin failed. Application of sulphanilamide and preferably sulphathiazole paste was found to be an efficient and convenient method of treatment.

C. Department of Virus Diseases (Including Rabies).—The Weil-felix reaction were carried out on 1,596 samples. Of these 75 gave agglutination titres against OX19 in dilutions of 1/250 and over. An analysis of the clinical symptoms of the typhus in Bombay has shown the following features:—(1) The average duration of the fever was 14.1 days. (2) The rash was present in 20.6 per cent. of the cases. (3) The case mortality was low, in the neighbourhood of 1 per cent. One more strain of typhus has been isolated.

Five strains of typhus OXK in type, were compared with each other in the rabbit. It was seen that the two strains from Imphal, two from Ceylon and one from Calcutta, showed complete reciprocal cross immunity against one another.

The chemotherapeutic activity of 8 representative compounds, which are heterocyclic derivatives related to Sulphathiazole and Sulphadiazine, against X typhus was studied. None of these had any action on the course of the disease in the mouse.

D. *Department of Nutrition and Experimental Pathology*—(a) *Tropical ulcer*.—Early in the year, a research unit from the Institute was sent to East Khandesh to carry out an investigation on cases of chronic ulcer of the skin and underlying tissues, situated mostly on the lower extremities, which were reported to be occurring in large numbers. Extensive laboratory investigations were carried out and it was found that the ulcer closely resembles “Naga Sore” or “Tropical Ulcer”, as described in Assam. The incidence of “Tropical Ulcer” has not been reported before in the Bombay Province.

As the treatment of the ulcer has been unsatisfactory an extensive clinical trial was given to the application of a sulphathiazole paste in water-in-oil emulsion of cod-liver oil, prepared at the Institute. Local application of the paste combined with general treatment has yielded very encouraging results.

(b) *Vitamin C content of Sweet Toddy*.—Investigations carried out at the Institute during previous years have shown that fresh sweet toddy contains approximately 10 mg. per cent. of vitamin C. Further experiments were undertaken which show that the vitamin C in sweet toddy can be preserved by the addition of sodium benzoate, citric acid and sodium metabisulphite, if the toddy is stored in the cold at a temperature of about 4°C. Under these conditions, nearly two-thirds of the original amount of vitamin C was still present in the toddy even after a prolonged storage for 10 months. On the other hand, when it is stored at room temperature in a dark cupboard, addition of the abovementioned preservatives had practically no effect on the preservation of vitamin C. At the end of one month, nearly two-thirds of the vitamin C was destroyed and at the end of three months there was practically no vitamin C left in the toddy.

(c) *The role of nutritional factors in hepatic cirrhosis*.—Under the auspices of the Indian Research Fund Association, a research enquiry was commenced during the year to study the possible role of nutritional factors in the production of cirrhosis of the liver. Portal cirrhosis is a common disease in certain parts of India, mostly in poorer classes of people and the ætiology of the condition is obscure. Experimental work in connection with this enquiry is in progress. Young albino rats are fed on purified synthetic diets and the resulting chemical and histological changes in the liver studied.

E. *Department of Clinical Pathology*.—Contaminations of bile-clot cultures offered a serious menace to the diagnostic aid in enteric fevers. The problem of keeping down the contaminations was taken in hand and various media were tried for clot cultures. The routine ox-bile medium, when modified by the addition of glycerine and peptone, brought down the contaminations from 50 to 25 per cent. Work is in progress to reduce this percentage further.

CLASSES I AND II.—These include all institutions maintained by provincial funds and under Government management. The fact that an institution possesses endowments or receives contributions from local funds or private subscriptions has not been regarded as a reason for not classing it as "State" when provincial and Imperial funds are practically responsible for all the charges connected with it. Class I—"Public" are State Dispensaries which are open to the poorer classes of the public. Class II are State Dispensaries which serve only a special section of the public as indicated in the sub-classification attached.

CLASS III.—Local fund dispensaries include all institutions which are vested in local boards or municipalities or guaranteed or maintained by local or municipal funds. The fact that such an institution is aided by private subscriptions or receives assistance from Government in the shape of part of the salary of the medical officer, grants of medicine, or otherwise, has not been regarded as a reason for not classing it as a local fund dispensary, when its existence is practically dependent upon local funds.

CLASS IV.—Comprises institutions supported by private subscriptions or guarantee, but receiving aid from Government or local funds.

CLASS V.—Comprises institutions maintained entirely at the cost of private individuals or associations. The fact that Government supplies superior inspection or registers has not been regarded as a reason for not treating it as a private non-aided dispensary.

CLASS VI.—Comprises all railway dispensaries whether maintained by State railways or others.

CLASS VII.—Comprises all subsidised dispensaries opened under the "Rural Medical Relief Scheme."
