ON THE

Hospitals and Dispensaries in Burma

For the Year 1935.

I.—INTRODUCTION.

1. In the triennial Review last year it was explained that the triennium 1932—34 coincided with a period of acute financial stringency. The administrative machinery of the Medical Department was, consequently during the period, subject to a close overhaul with a view to its re-adjusting itself to the stern exigencies of the time. Progress was therefore practically at a standstill, but the outlook has been generally more favourable and encouraging during the year 1935. Medical relief has come to be regarded as so vital and important a function of the modern system of Government that the work of this department cannot be allowed to stagnate or lag behind. There is always an endeavour to keep pace with the progressively rapid advance in the Medical Science and in the improved methods for the alleviation or mitigation of human suffering and disability.

2. The number of hospitals at the end of the year 1935 was 301 as compared with 301 at the end of 1934. During the year the following changes took place. Revised figures in regard to the number of Railway hospitals were furnished by the Burma Railways, the total number given being 30 as against 29 given in the previous year. The hospital for ordinary sick at the Mental Hospital, Minbu, was also included. The Mindat-Sakan Hospital, the Female Dispensary, Bassein, the Sakantha Dispensary in the Shan States, the Military Police Hospital at Chingnambum, the Twante Canal Dispensary, and the Civil Hospital, Lonton, were closed during the year, so also were the Subsidized Medical Practitioners at Daiku, Thanatpin, and Kanbe withdrawn during the year.

The N. M. Tank, the Gyobin Se and the Ingin Se Dispensaries (Public Works Department) were opened during the year as State Special hospitals, and at Mongnaw and Sakantha were opened private non-aided hospitals.

The Municipal Corporation of Rangoon opened a dispensary at Tamwe and also a Tuberculosis clinic. There were thus 301 hospitals at the end of the year.

3. *New Construction.*—Among the important works carried out during the year was an additional female ward at Maymyo, an operation theatre at Yandoon, a ward at Danubyu (donated by U Po Seik and Daw Ohn Pan), an isolation ward at Henzada (donated by Daw Mya of Henzada) and a maternity ward at Môngywa. The female ward at Syriam was extended and the water supply scheme of the Civil Hospital, Thôngwa, was completed. An additional ward in the Military Police Hospital, Lashio, was in process of construction. Mention should also be made of the generous and handsome donations given by Mr. B. Purcell of Mandalay, for the construction of two new Nurses Homes, one at Mandalay and the other at Maymyo, and an Anglo-Indian Ward at Maymyo, and an extension of the eye department of the Mandalay Hospital. Mr. Purcell also very kindly donated a sum of Rs. 10,000 for a new X-Ray apparatus for the Maymyo Civil Hospital, and an X-Ray apparatus costing Rs. 15,000 for the Mandalay Hospital.

The gynæcological work has been moved from the Rangoon General Hospital to the Dufferin Hospital, Rangoon, thus opening up 72 more beds.

The system of charging Re. 1 per bed in four wards of the Rangoon General Hospital and one ward of the Dufferin Hospital was started during the last month of the year.

4. *Indian Medical Service.*—The sanctioned number of Indian Medical Service Officers remained the same as in previous years, *viz.*, 30 plus a reserve of 8.

Statement B. The number of officers on the roll on the 1st January 1935 was 33. During the year four officers were transferred to Burma, one was re-transferred to India, and one retired from the service, thus leaving 35 officers on the roll at the end of the year. Of these eight were on leave, two on Foreign Service, and four were filling non-reserve appointments leaving only 21 officers to fill 30 sanctioned appointments. For the 25 appointments sanctioned for the medical department there were only 16 officers available, of whom five held the five specialist appointments in Rangoon, and the remainder held 11 of the 19 Civil Surgeoncies allotted for them.

5. *Indian Medical Department.*—The sanctioned cadres of Civil Surgeoncies and Subordinate appointments for the medical department reserved for officers of the Indian Medical Department are seven and three respectively. The number employed at the beginning of the year was 11, three in the Public Health Department, one in the Bacteriological

Department, and seven in the Medical Department and the same number continued throughout the year. Two officers, however, of the Indian Medical Department were on leave on the 31st December 1935.

6. *Private Practitioners.*—There was only one temporary Private Practitioner at the beginning of the year, but he was confirmed during the year as a Civil Surgeon and absorbed into the permanent cadre of Burma Civil Surgeons. Thus the cadre of Burma Civil Surgeons was increased from 12 to 13. Two Civil Surgeons retired from service during the year.

7. *Civil Assistant Surgeons.*—The sanctioned cadre of Civil Assistant Surgeons remained the same as in previous years. The number on the roll on the 1st January 1935, being 62 permanent, two officiating and three temporary. The officiating and temporary Civil Assistant Surgeons were confirmed during the year, one was promoted permanently as a Civil Surgeon and one retired from the service. At the close of the year there were 65 officers on the roll. Of this number three were on duty in the Public Health Department, one was seconded to the Indian Medical Service and three in the Jail Department. Six were on leave and one was on duty at the Burma Medical School, leaving therefore a balance of 51 Civil Assistant Surgeons on duty at the hospitals. To this number, however, must be added the following: one Lady Doctor, five Lady Civil Assistant Surgeons in the Dufferin Hospital, Rangoon, two in the employ of the Corporation, five in Private Aided and Railway Hospitals, and 13 Burma Civil Surgeons, totalling in all 77 on duty in all hospitals on the 31st December 1935.

8. *Sub-Assistant Surgeons.*—At the beginning of the year 1935 the number of Sub-Assistant Surgeons on the roll was 372 against the sanctioned strength of 401 as compared with 373 at the beginning of the year 1934. In June 1935 the cadre was revised and the sanctioned strength was reduced to 399, but there were only 365 on the roll at that time. During the year there were 11 casualties, but 20 new recruits were entertained, the number of Sub-Assistant Surgeons on the roll at the end of the year being therefore only 381, this number including those on duty at the Jail, on leave and on Foreign Service. The number of Sub-Assistant Surgeons employed in all hospitals on 31st December was 340 (340).

9. *Honorary Medical Officers, House Surgeons and House Physicians.*—The two honorary medical officers at the Venereal Clinic of the Rangoon General Hospital have continued to be so employed during the year. The scheme of employing House Surgeons and Physicians and Assistant House Surgeons and Physicians was extended during the year to the Hospitals at Moulmein and Akyab and this together with the four honorary medical officers at the Rama Krishna Hospital will

account for the increase in the total number of honorary graduates and licentiates. There were 24 House Surgeons and Physicians against 18 in the previous year and 12 Assistant House Surgeons and Physicians against 10 in the previous year.

10. *Nursing Establishment.*—The number (399) of female nurses employed in all hospitals in Burma showed a distinct increase over the previous year (369). This increase is indeed very welcome, but there is room for a still greater increase since an adequate nursing staff is an important factor in the efficiency of a hospital.

11. *Compounders.*—The number of Compounders trained during the year was 19 of whom 17 were Burmans, and 2 were Indians. The total number of compounders employed in the Province was more or less the same as last year, the number for 1935 being 305 against 307 in 1934.

12. As will be seen from its heading, Statement C refers to State-Public, Local Funds and Private Aided Institutions only. The total number of patients treated in 1935 was 3,177,284 including 2,055 patients treated by Subsidized Medical Practitioners although similar figures were not included in 1934. Without however including the patients treated by Subsidized Medical Practitioners, the total number treated in 1935 was 3,175,229 (3,091,413). The increase may be ascribed to more than one cause, for example, growing appreciation in the benefits derived from following the "Prescriptions" of Western Medical Science or on account of the economic conditions of the patients. In normal times some of the patients who sought treatment at hospitals would probably have gone instead to private practitioners. But whatever the cause or causes may be for this growing increase in attendance, it is impossible to deny that it means more work in hospitals, and therefore, *a fortiori*, need for greater assistance to those hospitals which find it difficult to cope with the increased expenditure.

13. *Race and Sex.*—Appendix 1 is a statement indicating by race and sex the number of patients treated in State-Public, Local Funds and Private Aided Hospitals in Burma. It will be observed from this statement that Burmans head the list with 60 per cent (61 per cent) the balance comprising Hindus 22 per cent (21 per cent) Mohamedans 13 per cent (13 per cent) and Europeans and Anglo-Indians and "Others" 5 per cent (5 per cent). It will thus be seen that the proportion between the different races in Burma has been maintained. As regards sex, females accounted for 22 per cent which is the same percentage as in the previous year.

14. Statement D, shows in the main, the geographical distribution of the diseases treated in all classes of Medical Institutions in Burma. The total number of patients treated throughout the year was 3,445,345 with 7,295 deaths ('21 per cent). As is usual, Malaria accounts for the largest number of patients, the total number affected being 385,284 (406,424). The reduction in the number is presumably due to a recognition by those who reside in malarious areas, of the beneficial results in taking the necessary precautions against infection and re-infection by the malarial parasite. Some of the other important diseases were " Diseases of the Respiratory System " 295,873 (288,496), Injuries 275,138 (258,903), Ulcerative Inflammation 244,017 (239,043).

15. The policy of surveying Leprosy infected areas and thereafter establishing leprosy clinics to treat those leper patients discovered by the Special Leprosy Officer was continued during the year, while the Leper Homes continued to contribute their quota towards alleviating the sufferings of those afflicted with this disease. In regard to the venereal diseases, the total number of patients who suffered from all forms of this disease were 62,134 (51,683). A comprehensive note on the subject of venereal diseases was submitted to Government during the year and it is hoped that before long important measures to reduce the incidence of this disease will be introduced. There were 5,958 patients who attended hospitals for Tuberculosis of the Lungs against (6,389). This number is still high and indicates the dire necessity of the establishment of Tuberculosis Sanatoria and Clinics in Burma. During the year I was asked by the Red Cross Society, Burma Branch, of which I am a member, to suggest suitable sites and to put up a scheme for the establishment of a Tuberculosis Clinic in Burma. This has been done, and it is hoped that with the aid, *inter alia*, of Government, and a few philanthropic commercial and other institutions it will not be long before the establishment of a sanatorium in Burma will be a *fait accompli*.

16. *Surgical Treatment.*—The total number of operations including secondary operations performed during the year was 136,743 (125,405). The total number of patients operated upon also showed an increase, *viz.*, 120,655 (115,034). The increase in the number of operations may be attributed to the increase in the number of patients who submitted themselves for surgical treatment, which increase in turn may be attributed to the gradual elimination of the feeling of dread and terror of the people to submit themselves to such risks as surgical interference or treatment connoted.

" Operations on Veins," as usual, accounted for the largest number of operations, 44,894 (39,339) of such operations being performed in

1935. Of the 120,655 patients treated, 114,222 were shown as "Cured," 5,015 as "Relieved," 687 "Discharged Otherwise" and 751 as having "Died," the death rate 0.6 per cent being the same as in the previous year.

The Blood Transfusion service has been brought into working order at the end of the year and is now in operation at the Rangoon General Hospital at which institution 13 Blood Transfusions were given during the year.

17. These two statements, *viz.*, F and G refer to State-Public, Local Funds and Private Aided Institutions. A summary of the "Receipts" and "Expenditure" during the year will be found below :—

These figures afford little scope for comment since the total "Receipts" and "Expenditure" approximate those for 1934. It is noteworthy, however, that there was an increase of Rs. 40,000 approximately under "Fees and Contributions from patients" presumably due to the provision of more paying beds in hospitals for those who can afford to pay.

18. *Conclusion.*—The Inspector-General of Civil Hospitals, Burma, is severely handicapped by having no technical assistant to help him in the routine work of the office. If one was provided he would be able to get about more freely and gain first-hand knowledge of the problem of the Medical Department in the mofussil to enable him to advise Government fully and correctly in all matters referred to him.

There are 2 *Headquarter* stations and many smaller stations in the Province which have not been visited by the Inspector-General of Civil Hospitals for many years because it takes a long time to get to them and he can not be away from Headquarters for a long period. This would not occur if he had a technical assistant of the requisite seniority to assist him. The communications in Burma are not well developed in some directions, steamers ply over a week or over a fortnight, in some places the only means of communication is after a long rail and river journey hundreds of miles by pony and mules. All this entails time and absence from Headquarters for the period during which the work of the office is in the hands of a non-technical man.

The post of Inspector-General of Civil Hospitals, Burma, was held by Colonel C. A. Gill, I.M.S., from 1st January to 30th March, by Lieutenant-Colonel J. Findlay, I.M.S. (temporarily) from 31st March to 7th April and by me from the 8th April 1935 till the end of the year.

In conclusion I desire to thank the Medical Officers and staff of the various hospitals and dispensaries throughout the province for the continued loyalty and devotion to duty without which the maintenance of such a high standard of medical relief would not have been possible especially when working with restricted finances.

My thanks are also due to my office staff who have worked hard and given me great assistance in the medical administration of the province.
