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Annual Subscribers

Every person who subscribes, collects or raises at least £1 per annum towards the funds of the Board, or of any particular institution under the Board, is qualified to become a member of the Board, and to vote at the annual election.

Life Contributors

Similarly, a donation of not less than £20 confers these qualifications for life.

Commemoration Plates

A donation of not less than £100 entitles the donor or donors to have a tablet placed over a bed in one of the hospitals, to commemorate the special occasion which prompts the donation.

Annual Free Beds

*Upon receipt of £50 a bed will be set aside for the treatment of free patients throughout a whole year.

Perpetual Free Beds

*An investment in trust securities earning £50 per annum will endow a free bed in perpetuity.

MINUTE

of the Chairman of the Board for the Year 1924-1925

INTRODUCTORY.—In the last Annual Report, brief reference was made to the fact that when the Estimates for 1924 were under consideration, in January of that year, I took the opportunity of making a comprehensive statement regarding the financial position, referring specially to the question of Provincial subsidy, and pointing out the great disabilities under which hospital work was being carried on in the Cape Peninsula, due to the whittling down of the subsidy provisions in the Hospitals Ordinance. I ventured to make the suggestion that the Hon. the Administrator should appoint a Commission to recast the financial clauses of that Ordinance, and at the time I submitted my Minute, a year ago, it was understood that this suggestion was before the Executive Committee of the Provincial Council.

But the publicity given to my statement in the Press resulted in a spontaneous movement throughout the Cape Province for a Conference of Hospital Boards, and this desire was endorsed by the Cape Hospital Board on 26th March, when I was empowered to convene such a Congress, on a suitable date to be fixed by myself.

A Conference was duly arranged and was held in the City Hall, Cape Town, on Monday, 14th April, 1924. The following Hospital Boards were represented by delegates : Albany, Barkly West, Beaufort West, Cape, Cradock, East London, Graaff-Reinet, Kimberley, Kokstad, Lovedale, Mafeking, Malmesbury, Montagu, Mossel Bay, Oudtshoorn, Paarl, Port Elizabeth, Queenstown, Riversdale, Stellenbosch, Uitenhage, Umtata, Vryburg and Worcester. Other Hospital Boards, including Victoria West, Butterworth, Somerset East and Bedford, which were not able to send delegates, wrote expressing their cordial approval of the Conference, and promised to support any action which might be decided upon as the result of the deliberations of those who attended.

Unfortunately I became the victim of an accident a few days before the Conference was held, and, therefore, was unable to attend. The Vice-Chairman (Rev. A. J. S. Lewis) was also unavoidably absent. One of the Board's delegates, Mr. Frank Robb, was appointed Chairman, and the Secretary and Treasurer of the Board (Mr. W. Sinclair Thomson) was elected Honorary Secretary of the Conference. It was natural that most of the discussion centred round the financial plight of Hospital Boards brought about by the statutory limitation of Provincial subsidy, which has been imposed year after year since 1921. The Conference sat throughout the whole day, and at the conclusion of its labours appointed a deputation which laid before the Hon. the Administrator the resolutions which had been adopted.

No relief has yet been obtained as the result of the representations made to the Provincial Administration, but the effects of the Conference have been very far reaching indeed. As the result of the focussing of public attention on the hospital position, the newspapers, particularly the "Cape Times," featured the difficulties under which hospital work was being carried on, on account of the lack of any general policy; and during the last session, Mr. Morris Alexander, K.C., M.L.A., succeeded in getting Parliament to direct that an inquiry be conducted into the whole question of hospitals and allied matters, with a view to the framing of a policy suited to the needs of the country. In accordance with this decision, the Minister of Public Health, in October last, appointed a Public Hospitals Inquiry Committee, consisting of Mr. M. C. Vos (Chairman), Dr. A. J. Stals, M.L.A., Mr. George Reyburn, M.L.A., Mr. J. R. Booth, Dr. A. H. Louw, Sir Edward Thornton, K.B.E., and Mr. W. P. Morgan, the latter being also appointed secretary. The terms of reference in this inquiry are as follows :--

1. To examine and report upon the present position, system, laws and arrangements as to—

- (a) The accommodation and facilities available in the equipment of public hospitals and kindred institutions, including tuberculosis, venereal diseases and school clinics, dispensaries, sanatoria and institutions for dealing with maternity, neurological infections or communicable and chronic sick cases.
- (b) The establishment, financing, administration, management and working of such institutions.
- (c) The hospital facilities available for the training of medical and dental students, nurses and midwives; and
- (d) Public medical, dental, nursing and midwifery nursing services generally and as regards both urban and rural areas—and the co-ordination of the various institutions and agencies for dealing with the sick with each other and with the organisations for preventing or limiting disease, dealing with epidemics and promoting or safeguarding the public health.

2. To make recommendations as to the best means of meeting the present and providing for the future needs of the Union in connection with the above-mentioned matters and also as to any amendments of existing laws relating thereto which the Committee may consider desirable.

The Inquiry Committee have already taken evidence throughout the country, and it is understood that their report is now being framed. It is to be hoped that they have succeeded in agreeing upon practical proposals which the Government will be able to put into effect, and which will help this Board to attain the object towards which we have been striving for many years, that is, the provision of hospital accommodation in the Cape Division adequate and suitable for the needs of the community.

MEMBERSHIP OF THE BOARD.—The members who retired a year ago by effluxion of time were Mr. A. Boag, Mrs. A. Hallack, Mr. S. A. Harvey and Mrs. J. L. Plant. Mrs. Hallack and Mr. Harvey were not re-nominated, and in their places Dr. W. A. Rail and Dr. E. Lister Wright were elected. Mrs. J. L. Plant and Mr. A. Boag were again returned.

The City Council of Cape Town re-appointed Mr. W. D. Hare as one of their representatives to hold office for a term of three years, and appointed Mr. J. Z. Drake in the place of the Rev. H. J. Barnes, resigned. Mr. J. McDonald was appointed for one year as joint representative of the Municipalities of Wynberg, Simon's Town and Durbanville.

The Divisional Council of the Cape appointed Messrs. W. Derry and F. J. van H. Duminy. In October Chevalier J. B. Callanan was appointed by the Divisional Council to succeed Mr. William Derry, deceased.

The representatives on the Board of the Honorary Visiting Medical Officers of Institutions were appointed as follows :—

Somerset Hospital: Professor C. F. M. SAINT and Dr. H. W. REYNOLDS.

Woodstock Hospital: Dr. R. SHARP.

Rondebosch and Mowbray Cottage Hospital: Dr. A. R. MCLACHLAN.

Victoria Hospital, Wynberg: Dr. H. CLAUDE WRIGHT.

Simon's Town-Kalk Bay Hospital: Dr. A. B. BULL.

In October Dr. H. Claude Wright resigned, and was succeeded by Dr. G. F. Fismer.

The Hon. the Administrator appointed Mr. Geo. Smart to hold office for a term of three years. Some months later the Rev. G. F. C. Faustmann, one of the representatives of the Hon. the Administrator, resigned, and in July the Rev. A. G. du Toit was appointed in his place. In September, advice was received that the Hon. the Administrator had appointed Col. W. Standford as a member of the Board in the place of the Rev. Canon H. W. Orford.

BUILDING EXTENSION AT RONDEBOSCH AND MOWBRAY COTTAGE HOSPITAL.—Plans and specifications have been prepared for two new wards for coloured patients to be erected in the grounds of the Rondebosch and Mowbray Cottage Hospital at an estimated cost of £3,000. A sum of £1,300 has been provided on the current Loan Estimates of the Provincial Administration for this purpose, and the balance of approximately £1,700 is expected to become available from the Dr. Syfret Memorial Fund. The plans, etc., were submitted to the Provincial Administration some time ago, but were returned for modification ; new plans were then prepared and submitted, but the required authority to proceed with the work has not yet been received.

BUILDING IMPROVEMENTS.—During the past year the thatched roofs of the old building at the Victoria Hospital, Wynberg, were replaced with tiled roofs at a cost of £1,146 7s. 2d.

Structural alterations were also carried out at the premises of the Cape Town Free Dispensary in order to provide two additional rooms. The cost was £519.

At the Eaton Convalescent Home the balcony of the de Pass Wing has been reconstructed in concrete, and the balcony adjoining the staff quarters has been repaired.

CHAIRMAN AND VICE-CHAIRMAN.—I was again re-appointed Chairman of the Board, and Rev. A. J. S. Lewis was again reappointed Vice-Chairman.

HONORARY MEDICAL SUPERINTENDENTS.—At the beginning of the year appointments as Honorary Medical Superintendents were made as follows :—

Woodstock Hospital: Dr. R. SHARP.

Rondebosch and Mowbray Cottage Hospital: Dr. A. R. McLACHLAN.

DUTIES OF BUILDINGS, GROUNDS AND EQUIPMENT COM-MITTEE.—At the first meeting of the reconstituted Board paragraph (g) of the schedule of duties of the Buildings, Grounds and Equipment Committee was amended by deleting the exception in the final clause of the paragraph; the paragraph as amended, therefore, stands as follows :—

Have the care of all buildings, grounds and gardens, and the furniture, appliances and equipment thereof, and order the execution of all repairs and alterations thereto. **EXEMPTION OF INSTITUTIONS FROM SECTION 54 OF ORDINANCE No. 5 OF 1912.**—During the year which ended on 31st December last, the institutions under the control of the Board were exempted from the provisions of Section 54 as follows :—

- (1) All the institutions under the control of the Board from the provisions of sub-section (a) of Section 54.
- (2) The Somerset Hospital and the Peninsula Maternity Hospital only from the provisions of sub-section (b) of Section 54.

RETIREMENT OF MISS J. A. FARQUHARSON.—It was notified to the Board on 26th March of last year that Miss J. A. Farquharson had intimated her intention to resign from the position of Matron of Woodstock Hospital, and the Board by a special resolution associated themselves with the expression of deep regret recorded by the Committee of Woodstock Hospital in accepting Miss Farguharson's resignation. It was decided to convey this resolution to Miss Farquharson and to assure her that when she left the service of the Board she would carry with her the esteem and affection of the members of the Board, the Committee of the Institution, the nursing staff, and, they felt sure, of those to whom she had ministered as patients in the Hospital. Miss Farguharson left the service on 31st August, 1924, after having held the position of Matron of Woodstock Hospital for fourteen years. Prior to her appointment at Woodstock Hospital Miss Farguharson was on the staff of Somerset Hospital for a period of nearly three years.

RETIREMENT OF SISTER FARISH.—Sister I. Farish, of the staff of Somerset Hospital, retired on pension as from 1st July, 1924. She was in the service of the Institution for a period of 31 years.

SUPERINTENDENT OF DISTRICT NURSES.—Miss Ada Elliott was appointed Charge District Nurse in July, 1921. In April of last year, as a result of representations from the Committee of the C.H.B. District Nursing Organisation, the Board decided to change the designation of the position held by Miss Elliott to "Superintendent of District Nurses."

STANDARDISATION OF NURSING STAFFS.—On 28th December, 1923, the Board appointed a Special Committee to consider the whole question of the requirements of the several Hospitals in respect of nursing staffs, in order that as far as possible a definite standard might be laid down on some such basis as the number of beds at each Hospital, and that any existing anomalies or disparities between one Hospital and another might be rectified. At a meeting of the Board, held on 26th March in the following year, the Committee reported that after considering a table pre

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pared by the Secretary and Treasurer, showing the authorised and actual nursing staffs of the Board's Hospitals as at 1st March, 1924, and the number of beds available at each of these Institutions, it had been resolved that, having regard to the varying conditions at the Hospitals of the Board, it was impossible to lay down a standard which would be capable of uniform application to the Board's Hospitals. The Committee recommended, therefore, that the Board reaffirm their approval of the authorised staff already laid down, subject to the following modifications : (a) that an additional nurse-probationer be authorised for Somerset Hospital, and (b) that the staff authorised for the Victoria Hospital, Wynberg, be altered by the substitution of two nurse-probationers for one staff nurse.

NURSES' PRIZE SCHEME.—At the December (1923) examination of the Colonial Medical Council, candidates entered as follows : Somerset Hospital, 13 ; Rondebosch and Mowbray Cottage Hospital, 1 ; Victoria Hospital, Wynberg, 1 ; Peninsula Maternity Hospital, 8. With four exceptions (one at Somerset Hospital, one at Victoria Hospital, Wynberg and two at the Peninsula Maternity Hospital) these candidates were successful. The following awards were accordingly made under the Board's prize scheme :—

Miss M. E. van Dyk, Somerset Hospital, 1st prize, £5.

Miss V. M. de Villiers, Somerset Hospital, 2nd prize, £3.

Miss M. Chowles, Rondebosch Hospital, 3rd prize, £2.

In order of merit in the examination list for the Province these candidates were placed respectively first, sixth and seventh. The prize of £2 10s. awarded to the most successful pupil-midwife trained at the Peninsula Maternity Hospital was gained on this occasion by Miss A. S. C. Timmerman, who took fourth place in the midwifery examination list for the Province.

At the June (1924) examination thirty candidates entered as follows: Somerset Hospital, 13; Woodstock Hospital, 2; Rondebosch and Mowbray Cottage Hospital, 1; Victoria Hospital, Wynberg, 3; Peninsula Maternity Hospital, 11. With five exceptions (four at Somerset Hospital and one at the Peninsula Maternity Hospital) these candidates were successful. The following awards were accordingly made under the Board's prize scheme :—

Miss R. D. Daly, Somerset Hospital, 1st prize, £5.

Miss M. Watson, Somerset Hospital, 2nd prize, £3.

Miss M. J. Musgrave, Woodstock Hospital, 3rd prize, £2. Miss A. S. Nelson, Wynberg Hospital (divided).

In order of merit in the examination list for the Province they were placed respectively third, eleventh (bracketed) and fifteenth (bracketed). The prize of $\pounds 2$ 10s. awarded to the most successful pupil-midwife trained at the Peninsula Maternity Hospital was divided between Sister H. M. Moodie and Miss S. J. de Wet, who were bracketed for the thirteenth place in the midwifery examination list for the Province.

In this connection the Board adopted a recommendation to the effect that in future no prize be awarded to a nurse or midwife who is placed lower than tenth in order of merit in the list of examination results published by the Colonial Medical Council.

In December, 1924, there were twenty-nine candidates as follows: Somerset Hospital, 14; Woodstock Hospital, 3; Rondebosch and Mowbray Cottage Hospital, 1; Victoria Hospital, Wynberg, 1; Peninsula Maternity Hospital, 10. They were all successful. The following awards were accordingly made under the Board's prize scheme:—

Miss K. J. Muller, Somerset Hospital, 1st Prize, £5. Miss U. A. Noble, Somerset Hospital, 2nd Prize, £3. Miss M. Ayliff, Somerset Hospital, 3rd Prize, £2.

In order of merit in the examination list for the Province they were placed respect vely, first, sixth and eighth. The prize of $\pounds 2 \ 10$ s., awarded to the most successful pupil-midwife trained at the Peninsula Maternity Hospital, was awarded to Miss F. A. Parry, who was placed second in the midwifery examination list for the Province.

PATIENTS REFUSED ADMISSION.—The following is a summary of the returns submitted to the Board every month, during the calendar year 1924, shewing the patients refused admission, through lack of accommodation, at the several Hospitals :—

HOSPITAL ASSOCIATION.—At the Conference of Hospital Boards of the Cape Province, held in April of last year, a resolution was adopted affirming the desirability of forming a Hospital Association, not necessarily restricted to the Cape Province, which by interchange of ideas, either in writing or at periodical meetings of its members, will advance the interests of hospitals and improve the methods of hospital management; and suggesting that members and officials of Hospital Authorities be eligible for membership of such Association. When this resolution was brought before the Board it was decided strongly to approve of the principle of a Hospital Association on the lines indicated, and the Board expressed their willingness to take any action necessary in furthering the object in view.

NEW HOSPITAL SCHEME.—At a meeting of the Board on 25th June last, a report of the Further Hospital Accommodation Committee was submitted detailing the procedure to be followed in formulating and carrying out the campaign for raising funds to meet the cost of building a new general hospital on the Groote Schuur Estate, in accordance with the plans adopted by the Board in October, 1920. The Board adopted the principle embodied in this report that a permanent Association should be formed at a public meeting for the purpose of raising funds for building and endowing the new hospital, all moneys collected being credited to a separate account in an approved bank and handed over to the Board when the time arrived for spending such moneys. The Board also adopted the detailed proposals of the Committee with regard to the constitution of the Association suggested.

At a meeting of the Further Hospital Accommodation Committee held on 1st September, the Chairman, the Rev. A. J. S. Lewis, reported the proceedings at an interview which Sir Carruthers Beattie. Dr. Julius Petersen and he (each in his private capacity) had with the Hon. the Administrator on 29th August, at which Sir Frederic de Waal laid down certain lines of policy. In consequence of the terms of this report, the Committee resolved (a) that the arrangements made for pressing on with the appeal to the public for funds in aid of the proposed new hospital should be held over for further consideration; and (b) that immediate steps should be taken to interview the Minister of the Interior and Public Health (Dr. D. F. Malan) with regard to the project. The members of the Board were accordingly summoned to a meeting on Tuesday morning, 9th September, and thereafter those members who attended formed themselves into a deputation to the Minister to whom representations were made to the effect that under present conditions the Provincial Administration is apparently not in a position to finance the building of the extension of hospital accommodation required for the Cape Hospital District; and that for this reason and also because the projected hospital will be more than a local institution, and, further, will provide for the clinical teaching necessary for students of the University of Cape Town, the Board, with the sanction and approval of the Hon. the Administrator, wished to repeat to the new Government the request made to its

predecessor, namely, that financial assistance should be given by the Union Government to enable a beginning to be made with this new hospital scheme. Dr. Malan replied pointing out that Parliament had decided upon an inquiry into the hospital position throughout the Union with a view to a definite policy being formulated, and that he proposed very soon to appoint the body to which this inquiry would be entrusted.

At the subsequent meeting of the Board a Special Committee, consisting of Professor Saint and Dr. Reynolds, representing Somerset Hospital; Dr. McLachlan, representing Rondebosch and Mowbray Cottage Hospital; Dr. Lister Wright, representing Victoria Hospital, Wynberg, and Dr. Sharp, representing Woodstock Hospital, was appointed to consider and report upon the details of the scheme adopted by the Board for the new general hospital to be erected on the Groote Schuur Estate.

MOSLEM WARD IN NEW GENERAL MOSPITAL.-In February last, the Further Hospital Accommodation Committee received an offer from Hajee Sullaiman Shahmahomed, of Cape Town, to donate to the Board 5 per cent. Government Stock of the value of £1,000, to form the nucleus of a fund to provide for the erection and/or maintenance of a ward in the new general hospital for the use of Moslems only. On the recommendation of the Committee the Board accepted this gift, but directed that it should be pointed out in reply to the donor's attorneys, through whom the offer was made, that the sum in question was sufficient only for the endowment of one bed, and, therefore, the only way in which the Board could meet the wish of the donor for the erection and/or maintenance of a ward for the use of Moslems only, would be to allow his donation to accumulate so that with compound interest the sum, in course of time, would be sufficient for the purpose in view. The stock has since been transferred to the Board.

ESTIMATES OF EXPENDITURE.—In accordance with the procedure laid down in Ordinance No. 5 of 1912, the estimates framed by the Board in respect of the calendar year 1924 were sent to the Provincial Administration, and on April 1st an intimation was received from the Provincial Secretary that it would be necessary for the Board to reduce the expenditure estimates by £11,208 12s. 9d. It was also stated that the provision for (a) an additional clerical assistant at Somerset Hospital, and (b) a radiologist at Somerset Hospital, could not be accepted. At a meeting held on 30th April the Board directed that a reply should be sent to the Provincial Secretary pointing out that the reduction required could only be effected in two ways : first, by eliminating certain items, and second by closing one or two of the Institutions, or reducing the number

of beds in all of them. The Board also pointed out to the Provincial Secretary the crippling effect of the Payment of Subsidies Ordinance, which, they had been informed, would be re-enacted, and argued that if the hospital fees were not treated as Provincial revenue it would appear that the spending authority of the Board might be increased by £11,280 beyond the limit set by the Provincial Administration, and that this increase would cover the necessary expenditure which the Board contemplated, and for which they had made provision on their estimates. The Provincial Secretary wrote again on 5th May, stating that the Board, in common with all other Hospital Boards, had been restricted to an expenditure during 1924 which should not exceed the estimated revenue, and suggested that if a deputation of three members was able to convince the Administrator that the present method of calculating subsidy is unfair, inasmuch as any increase in patients' fees would not result in financial benefit to the Board but to the Administration, Sir Frederic de Waal was prepared to recommend that amending legislation be introduced into the Provincial Council in order to rectify the matter in future. A deputation was appointed but a subsequent investigation of the subsidy question, undertaken by the Provincial Auditor at the direction of the Hon. the Administrator, rendered an interview with the Administrator unnecessary.

At the August meeting of the Board a report was received from the Secretary and Treasurer in which it was pointed out that the effect of the continued deadlock between the Board and the Provincial Administration, with regard to the Estimates for 1924, was reflected in the financial statement submitted at the July meeting of the Board, in which it was pointed out, inter alia, that the ordinary expenditure during the first six months of the year was less by £3,536 than was provided for in the Estimates passed by the Board, and that the total extraordinary expenditure during the same period amounted to £753. The Secretary and Treasurer stated that it is obvious that if this deadlock resulted in compulsory " saving," the effect would be not only to curtail necessary expenditure during 1924 below the required limit, but to restrict the Board's spending powers in the following year if the statutory limitation of Provincial subsidy was again imposed. Directions were thereupon given by the Board (a) to proceed on the assumption that the Estimates of ordinary expenditure adopted by the Board on 23rd January, 1924, represented the Board's spending authority for the year; and (b) to the Buildings, Grounds and Equipment Committee to take steps as soon as possible for the execution of all necessary works under their control for which provision had been made in such Estimates of ordinary expenditure.

COLLECTING AGENCIES.—In June last year a Special Committee, consisting of the Chairman of the Board, the Chairman of the Finance Committee, Mrs. Plant, Mrs. Eburn-Salmon and Mr. Oxenham, was appointed to co-ordinate and supervise all the collecting agencies of the Board, and ensure that the policy of the Board in regard to the collection of moneys in aid of their institutions is carried out.

FURTHER DONATIONS FROM THE ESTATE OF THE LATE J. C. HOFMEYR.—At a meeting of the Board held on 26th May, 1922, it was reported that a sum of £1,980 had been remitted by the Secretary of the Colonial Orphan Chamber and Trust Company, being donations from the charitable fund of the Estate of the late J. C. Hofmeyr. This sum was allocated to the five general hospitals, the Convalescent Homes and the Cape Town Free Dispensary, and the wish was expressed that the contributions should be devoted to some specially urgent need in each institution. On 27th August last, it was reported to the Board that an additional sum of £570 had been received, being further donations from the same source, given under the same condition, and to be distributed as follows :—

The thanks of the Board and of the Committees of the Institutions named in the foregoing list were expressed to the Secretary of the Colonial Orphan Chamber and Trust Company for these additional contributions.

X-RAY INSTALLATIONS.—Proposals are at present under consideration for the improvement of the X-Ray departments at Somerset Hospital and Victoria Hospital, Wynberg. The estimated cost of effecting these required improvements is £972 and £350 respectively, and provision has been made for these items of expenditure on the 1925 Estimates of the Board.

PATHOLOGICAL LABORATORY FOR VICTORIA HOSPITAL, WYNBERG.—During the past year the Board acceded to the request of the Committee of the Victoria Hospital, Wynberg, that a Pathological Laboratory should be established at that institution, in which all ordinary examinations (e.g. sputum, blood, etc.) would be carried out, sections of pathological specimens and vaccines prepared, and bio-chemical work done. The estimated cost of the required equipment and fixing the same was given as £275, and it was stated that the sum saved on outside laboratory fees would be greatly in excess of the cost of maintenance. The apparatus and equipment were ordered from Europe some months ago, but have not yet been delivered.

HEAD OFFICE ACCOMMODATION.—The Board have arranged to lease for five years from 1st March, 1925, premises on the first floor of the building at the corner of Burg Street and Hout Street, owned by Mr. Will. H. Phillips. The lease is renewable for a further term of five years, provided three months' notice is given, prior to its expiration, of the Board's intention to exercise such option of renewal.

CONTRIBUTION TO DISTRICT NURSING FROM RED CROSS SOCIETY.—The Red Cross Society have decided to make a contribution of £150 in respect of the year ending 31st July, 1925, towards the expenses of the District Nursing Organisation on condition that ex-soldiers with any disability and their wives and children should have the services of the District Nurse (but excluding midwifery) free of charge, when living in any centre where a district nurse is established under the control of the Board. The contribution is being paid in quarterly instalments, and it has been arranged that the Society will be furnished with a quarterly report of the work which the district nurse may do for discharged and disabled soldiers and their dependents.

AMENDMENT OF REGULATIONS.—On 23rd July, last the Board adopted a recommendation that Regulation 57 be amended in such a manner as to provide that (1) honorary visiting specialists, as defined in Regulation 61 (b) and (2) one honorary anæsthetist (who must be practising only in this particular branch of medicine, and who shall be appointed annually to represent all the honorary anæsthetists) shall be included as members of the Medical Advisory Sub-committee of an Institution. In order to give effect to this decision the regulation in question was amended to read as follows :—

The honorary visiting medical officers and the honorary visiting specialists as defined in Regulation 61, and one honorary anæsthetist (who must be practising only in that particular branch of medicine) appointed annually to represent all the honorary anæsthetists, shall be constituted the Medical Advisory Sub-committee of the Institution, which shall be consulted by the Committee on all matters affecting the medical administration of the Institution, including any appointment of medical superintendent, resident medical officers, or matron ; provided that if there be no honorary anæsthetists on the staff of the Institution the Sub-committee shall consist only of the said honorary visiting medical officers and honorary visiting specialists. It also appeared desirable that certain amendments should be made in Regulations 30 and 73, and they were altered to read as follows :—

- 30. The Chairman of the Committee shall be ex-officio a member of all Sub-committees, except the Medical Advisory Sub-committee.
- 73. The Resident Medical Superintendent shall—
 - (a)
 - (b) arrange for a division of the work of the resident medical staff after consultation with the Medical Advisory Sub-committee;
 - (c)
 - (d) see that notice is sent to every honorary visiting medical officer concerned of operations, post-mortem examinations, etc.

These amended regulations have not yet been approved by the Hon. the Administrator as required by the provisions of Ordinance No. 5 of 1912.

SAFE-KEEPING OF RADIUM.—The Board directed on 24th September last that the question of the safe-keeping of the radium at Somerset Hospital should be reconsidered. The following rules in this connection were adopted by the Board on 28th June, 1922 :—

- (a) The radium shall be issued by the Resident Medical Superintendent only to an Honorary Visiting Medical Officer of the Somerset Hospital, and then only upon a written order signed by such Honorary Visiting Medical Officer.
- (b) Except when the radium is in the custody of an Honorary Visiting Medical Officer, as provided by the foregoing rule (a), it shall remain in the custody of the Resident Medical Superintendent, who shall be held responsible for the safe-keeping of the same.

In order to meet the representations of the Committee of Somerset Hospital that compliance with these rules restricts the usefulness of the radium, the Board approved, on 22nd October, of the amendment of the rules, which now read as follows :—

(a) The radium shall be issued by the Resident Medical Superintendent only to an Honorary Visiting Medical Officer, a Resident Medical Officer, the Sister-in-Charge of the X-Ray Department, or the Sister-in-Charge of the Shipley Pavilion of the Somerset Hospital, and then only upon a prescription signed by an Honorary Medical Officer of the Institution, and the medical officer or sister to whom the radium is issued shall sign a receipt for the same, which shall be held by the Resident Medical Superintendent until the radium is returned to him.

(b) When the radium is in the custody of one of the officers of the Institution mentioned in the foregoing rule (a), such officer shall be held responsible for it; at other times it shall remain in the custody of the Resident Medical Superintendent, who shall be held responsible for the safekeeping of the same.

APPOINTMENT OF MATRON, WOODSTOCK HOSPITAL.—In succession to Miss J. A. Farquharson, Miss M. E. Chesters was appointed Matron of Woodstock Hospital, with effect from 17th September, from which date the appointment was approved by the Hon. the Administrator in terms of Section 2 of Ordinance No. 31 of 1921.

PENINSULA MATERNITY HOSPITAL.—At their last meeting the Board learned with regret that Miss T. R. Mullan had tendered her resignation of the appointment of Matron of the Peninsula Maternity Hospital, which she had held with much success for four years. Prior to her appointment to the position she was Assistant Matron of the Rotunda Hospital, Dublin. Miss Mullan has been succeeded by Miss J. H. L. Reive, who had been senior Sister on the staff of the Peninsula Maternity Hospital for some years.

MOTOR AMBULANCES.—During the calendar year 1924, 1,593 cases (including 109 arising from street accidents) were removed in the Board's ambulances, an average of 132.75 per month. Of this number 871 removals were free and 722 were charged for.

The attention of the Board having been directed to the advisability of more suitable cars being provided for the ambulance service, a sum of $\pounds 1,000$ has been included in the Estimates for 1925 for the purchase of a new car.

OBITUARY.—At a meeting of the Board held on 26th March last year, I made reference to the fact that two more of those with whom we had been associated in hospital work—Mrs. S. A. Sadler and Mr. Amos Bailey—had been removed by death.

Mrs. S. A. Sadler died on the 2nd of February. For many years she had taken a keen interest in the Board's district nursing work, and had served as a member of the Committee of the District Nursing Organisation. To the work of the Simon's Town Branch she was particularly devoted, and largely through her exertions it was brought to a high standard of usefulness and efficiency. Mr. Amos Bailey, J.P., was appointed a member of the Board by the Cape Divisional Council in June, 1918, and continued as a representative of the Divisional Council until November, 1923, when failing health at last compelled his retirement, He set an example of faithful service in public work, despite great physical handicaps, which must have evoked the admiration of all who came in contact with him. His death on the 11th of March brought to a close a life which for a quarter of a century had been devoted to public work, in Parliament and on various local government bodies, and during the major portion of that long term was carried on bravely against severe odds imposed by an enfeebled constitution.

The Board placed on record an expression of their sympathy with Mr. G. H. Sadler upon the death of his wife ; and with the daughters of the late Mr. Amos Bailey in the bereavement they had suffered.

Another death was reported on 25th June last, that of Mr. William Derry. On being apprised of this sad occurrence the Board adopted the following resolution :—

That the Cape Hospital Board desire to express their sorrow at the death on 21st June, 1924, of Mr. William Derry, who from 1918 until March, 1923, and again from November, 1923, until the day of his death, was a member of this Board as a representative of the Cape Divisional Council. The Board also desire to tender their sincere and respectful sympathy to the widow and the bereaved relatives.

At the last meeting of the Board it devolved upon me to make reference to the death of my predecessor in office, Mr. George Smart, which took place on 22nd January, 1925. In the course of my remarks I said it would doubtless be some consolation to the members of the Board that they took the opportunity in Mr. Smart's lifetime, when he retired from the chairmanship of the Board in 1921, after occupying that position for six years, to express appreciation of the great work he accomplished in the cause of hospitals in the Cape Peninsula, and particularly the Somerset Hospital, with the management of which he was connected from the year 1898 until his death. The following resolution was placed on record as a tribute to the

late Mr. Smart's memory, and a message to his bereaved relatives :--

That the members of the Cape Hospital Board mourn the loss of their esteemed colleague Mr. Geo. Smart, J.P., who was continuously a member of the Board from its inception in 1913 until his death on 22nd January, 1925, and who held office as Chairman during the period from 1915 to 1921; and that the Board hereby tender their respectful sympathy to Mrs. Smart and family in the bereavement they have suffered. ACKNOWLEDGMENTS.—The thanks of the Board are due t the Committees of the several Institutions; the Mayoress of Cap Town (Mrs. R. J. Verster) and those who assisted her in organisin the Hospital Ball; and the organisers and collectors who carrie through the Hospital Saturday collection and the Mid-Week Stree collection.

I gladly take this opportunity of expressing my gratitude to the Chairmen of the Standing Committees for the support they hav given me throughout another year.
