Finance and General Purposes Committee.

Duties :

The Finance and General Purposes Committee shall, in accordance with the Rules of Order, and with the approval of the Board :

- (a) supervise all the fiscal concerns of the Board and report periodically as to the state of the several funds of the Board ;
- (b) prepare and submit to the Board in the month of December in each year a statement of the estimated capital income and expenditure and of the recurrent income and expenditure of the Board in respect of that year ;
- (c) prepare and submit to the Board during the month of December in each year a statement of the estimated recurrent income and expenditure of the Board's Institutions in respect of that year, which shall be framed after consultation with the other Standing Committees concerned ;
- (d) receive at each monthly meeting a statement of the payments effected by the Secretary and Treasurer of the Board during the preceding calendar month, and thereafter report to the Board the total amount of the expenditure in question ;
- (e) arrange all investments of moneys held by or funds entrusted to the Board ;
- (f) report to the Board at the request of any of the other Standing Committees as to the provision of funds for any object connected with the administration of the Board or any of its Institutions ;
- (g) supervise the collection of all revenue due to the Board and its Institutions ;
- (h) be responsible for the control of the Head Office of the Board, and deal with all matters appertaining to the appointment, emoluments, resignation or leave of the Secretary and Treasurer and other officers employed therein ;
- (i) invite and deal with all tenders received for annual supplies and services required by the Board ;

- (j) arrange all insurance policies, whether in respect of fire, fidelity guarantee, workmen's compensation, or any other risk.

The control and administration of the several Institutions of the Board, are allocated to Standing Committees as follows :—(1) Somerset Hospital to the Somerset Hospital Committee ; (2) Rondebosch and Mowbray Cottage Hospital and Woodstock Hospital to the Rondebosch and Woodstock Hospitals Committee ; (3) Victoria Hospital, Wynberg, and Simon's Town—Kalk Bay Hospital to the Wynberg and Simons' Town Hospitals Committee ; (4) Eaton Convalescent Home and McGregor Convalescent Home to the Convalescent Homes Committee ; and (5) Cape Town Free Dispensary, Peninsula Maternity Hospital and the C.H.B. District Nursing Organisation to the Combined Institutions Committee.

Duties of these Committees are as follows :—

- (a) Exercise a general supervision of such Institution or Institutions, including the fabric and grounds thereof ;
- (b) Carry out such regulations as may be framed by the Board in respect of such Institution or Institutions ;
- (c) Subject to the approval of the Board, make all professional and other appointments in connection with such Institution or Institutions ;
- (d) Deal with the representations of patients in and members of the Staff of such Institution or Institutions ;
- (e) Advise the Board in all matters affecting such Institution or Institutions ;
- (f) In December of each year, in consultation with the Secretary and Treasurer of the Board, frame Estimates of the recurrent income and expenditure of such

Institution, or Institutions in respect of that year and submit the same without delay to the Finance and General Purposes Committee ;

- (g) Generally administer such Institution or Institutions, provided, however, that no expenditure shall be incurred unless prior provision has been made therefor in the approved Estimates of the Board for the current year or by special resolution of the Board.

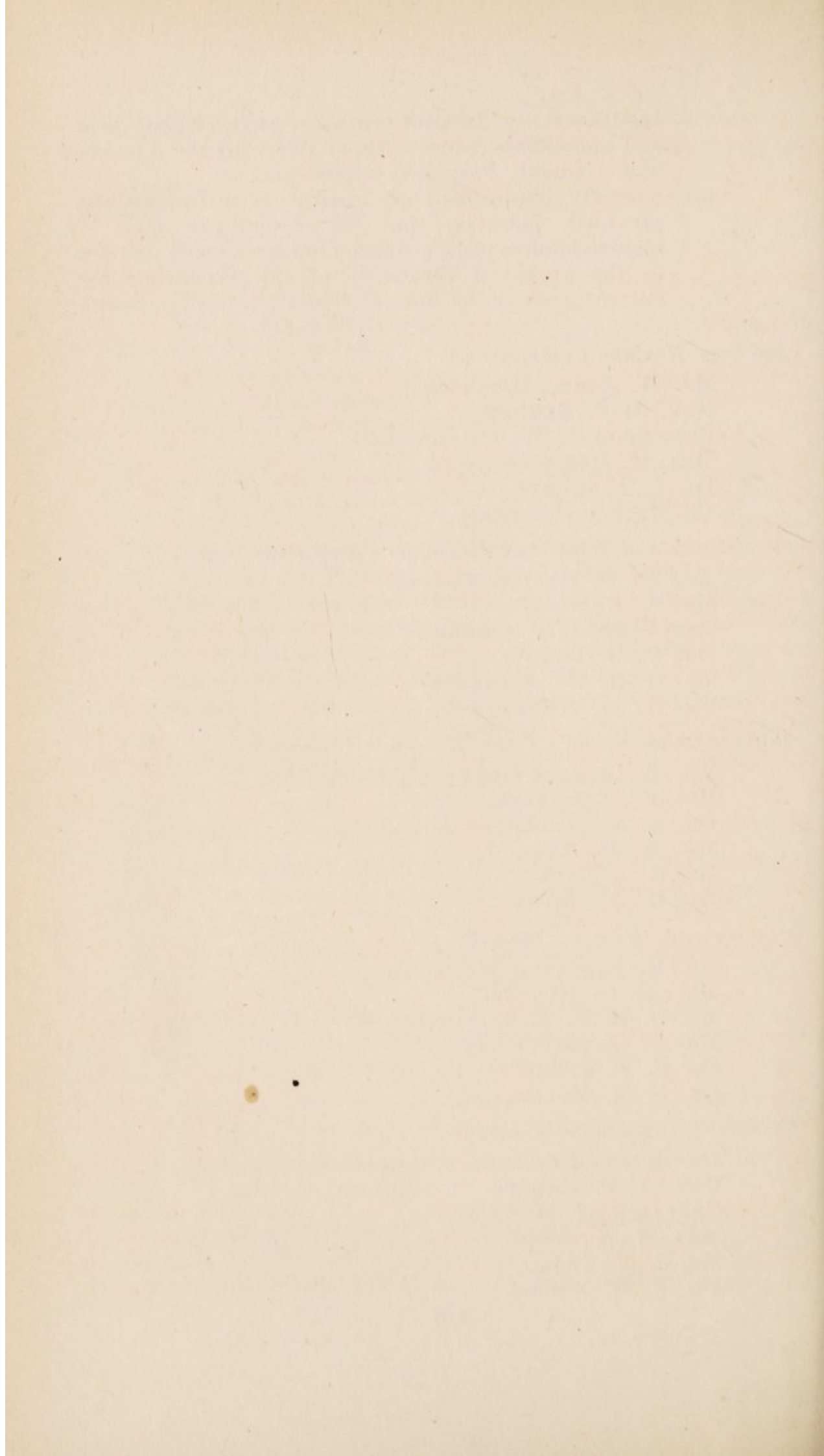

MINUTE

of the Chairman of the Board for the Year 1926-1927.

MEMBERSHIP OF THE BOARD.—The elected members who retired last year were the Rev. A. P. Bender, Dr. O. J. Currie, Mrs. Hector Mackenzie and Mrs. A. Eburn-Salmon. With the exception of Mrs. Mackenzie, who declined nomination, all were re-elected. The Rev. Canon H. Orford was elected in the place of Mrs. Mackenzie.

The vacancy for an Administrator's representative was filled by the appointment of Mr. G. H. E. Dickinson.

The City Council of Cape Town reappointed Mr. J. Z. Drake and Mr. E. Hopper, and appointed Mrs. H. Horwood to fill the vacancy caused by the resignation of Mr. S. Goldstein. Mr. A. J. G. Simpson was appointed as joint representative of the Municipalities of Wynberg, Simon's Town and Durbanville.

The Divisional Council of the Cape reappointed Mr. H. Durr and appointed Mr. W. H. Lategan in the place of Mr. N. Thatcher.

The representatives on the Board of the Honorary Visiting Medical Officers of Institutions were appointed as follows :—

Somerset Hospital : Professor A. W. FALCONER and Dr. J. LUCKHOFF.

Woodstock Hospital : Dr. R. SHARP.

From the beginning of May, Dr. P. T. Cairns was appointed the representative on the Board of the Honorary Visiting Medical Officers of Woodstock Hospital, in place of Dr. R. Sharp, who had been appointed Acting Medical Superintendent of Somerset Hospital.

RECONSTITUTION OF THE BOARD.—Under Ordinance No. 17 of 1926, passed in the last session of the Provincial Council, the Board was completely reconstituted, the number of members being reduced from 36 to 18, and the Committees of Institutions

as formerly constituted being abolished. The new Board came into office on 26th October, 1926, and the first meeting was held on 28th October. Mr. M. C. Vos was unanimously elected Chairman of the new Board, and I had the honour of being elected Vice-Chairman.

THANKS TO MR. H. F. EAST.—After Mr. H. F. East relinquished the Chairmanship of the Board, a year ago, a Special Committee was appointed to frame a resolution expressing appreciation of his services, and on 26th May, 1926, the following statement framed by that Committee was adopted by the Board, and placed on record by unanimous resolution :—

That the Board place upon record their deep appreciation of the valuable services rendered by Mr. H. F. East during his tenure of the offices of Vice-Chairman and Chairman of the Board from 1916 to 1926.

Mr. East was one of the original members of the Board, elected by contributors at the first meeting held after its establishment, and he has ever since manifested the liveliest and most active interest in the many-sided work of the Board and in the several Institutions under its control—a work which was rendered particularly onerous during the five years of his chairmanship on account of the acute financial stringency caused by the limitation of the Provincial subsidies to hospitals.

He has presided over the meetings of the Board with dignity and ability, and often under trying circumstances has evinced a courtesy and consideration which have earned for him the gratitude of the members.

As Chairman of the Finance Committee, in particular, and as a member of the other constituent Committees of the Board, Mr. East has displayed conspicuous energy in the discharge of his varied duties.

The Board trust that Mr. East may be long spared to continue the philanthropic work to which he has devoted so many years of his life and to serve the Cape Hospital Board still further by his labours for the extension of its powers and of its usefulness to the community at large.

ESTIMATES APPROVED.—The effect of the exemption of Hospital Boards from the provisions of the Limitation of Subsidies Ordinance was shown when the Board's Estimates were submitted to the Provincial Administration at the beginning of the year. They were approved without alteration and the Board were, therefore, authorised to spend during the calendar year a sum not exceeding £87,549. The actual expenditure was £85,326.

NEW HOSPITAL AT GROOTE SCHUUR.—The protracted discussions and negotiations with regard to the new hospital to be erected on the Groote Schuur Estate have been satisfactorily concluded, and on 5th July, 1926, the lease of the site, and the agreement supplementary thereto, were signed by the appointed representatives of the University of Cape Town and the Board. The following are the main provisions of these documents :—

- (a) The lease is for a period of 99 years, and is renewable for further periods of 99 years at a time provided 5 years' notice is given before the termination of the lease or any renewal thereof ;
- (b) Should the University require the premises to be vacated at the termination of the lease or of any renewed period, it must compensate the Board or its successors for all buildings and appurtenances erected or brought on the land with the consent of the University ;
- (c) The rent payable is £1 sterling per annum.
- (d) Within a period of 5 years from the date of the commencement of the lease the Board has undertaken to erect on the site leased a fully-equipped hospital for the sick.
- (e) The professors, lecturers and students (whether undergraduates or post-graduates of the University) are to have access to the hospital for the purposes of and incidental to practical teaching and training in medicine and surgery in accordance with conditions agreed between the University and the Board and approved by the Administrator.
- (f) The hospital to be erected on the site leased to the Board shall be called " The Somerset Hospital."
- (g) The hospital shall be a fully-equipped hospital for the sick and a teaching hospital for undergraduates and post-graduates, medical students of the University being admitted to the full practice of the hospital under conditions to be laid down by the Board on the recommendation of the Committee of the Institution.
- (h) There shall be a consultation between the University and the Board prior to the erection or variation of any of the hospital buildings.
- (i) The allocation of the beds in the hospital to the various branches of medicine and surgery shall be as agreed upon between the University and the Board.

- (j) Those professors and lecturers belonging and attached to the University whose University work demands that they should hold associated hospital appointments, shall be *ex officio* members of the visiting medical staff of the hospital and shall have such material at their disposal for teaching purposes as is recommended by the University and approved by the Board ;
- (k) No professors, lecturers or students except those who have been duly authorised by the authorities of the University, shall be given access to the hospital for the purpose of obtaining practical teaching and training in medicine and surgery.
- (l) Representations shall be made to the Administrator with a view to the University obtaining representation on the Board.
- (m) In appointing the Committee of the Institution, the Board may, subject to the provisions of Ordinance No. 5 of 1912 and any amendments thereof duly enacted, give the University representation on that Committee.
- (n) In addition to the Medical Advisory Sub-Committee already provided for in the regulations of the Board there shall be a special Sub-Committee of the institution to be called the Appointments Sub-Committee : this Sub-Committee to consist of the members of the honorary visiting medical staff holding the senior appointments, and to be consulted with regard to all medical appointments, honorary or paid, as well as any appointment of matron. When the hospital is first instituted, and until the completion of the honorary visiting medical staff, the members of the Medical Advisory Sub-Committee of the Somerset Hospital holding the senior appointments shall be the Appointments Sub-Committee.
- (o) This agreement shall endure and have effect for the full period of the Deed of Lease signed concurrently herewith and for the further periods of any renewal of such lease.

Unfortunately, the actual work of preparing the site has not yet begun. The delay in this respect is due to the fact that after having made arrangements to have the site levelled by means of convict labour, representations were made to the Board with a view to this work being carried out by free labour in order to alleviate the unemployment prevailing. Through the good offices of the Administrator the Board were released from their engagement with the Prisons Department, and have now been permitted to make

fresh arrangements with the Department of Labour, under which that department will recruit civilised labourers, resident in Cape Town, who will be employed on the work of levelling the site under the superintendence of the Public Works Department. Any excess cost over the agreed basic estimate of £35,000 is to be borne in equal proportions by the Department of Labour and the Board.

IMPROVEMENT OF HOSPITAL ACCOMMODATION PENDING ERECTION OF NEW HOSPITAL.—At a meeting of the Board held on 28th April last, Mrs. H. Horwood submitted a motion in the following terms :—

Having in view the fact that some considerable time must elapse before the building of a new hospital in the Peninsula will materially affect the present acute shortage of hospital accommodation :

That the Further Hospital Accommodation Committee or other duly constituted Committee, be instructed to make a regional survey of the medical needs of the area under the care of the Cape Hospital Board, and to report on the possibility of increasing the availability of medical services to the community by such measures as :

- (1) Further out-patient departments or free dispensaries at selected points, or by a travelling dispensary.
- (2) Expansion and development of the District Nursing Service.
- (3) Expansion of existing cottage and suburban hospitals, having regard to the fact that a new 500-bed hospital will not cope with the natural increase in the number of patients in three or four years' time.
- (4) Inauguration of a thoroughly efficient and adequate system of Convalescent Homes for all classes of patients so that the time for which hospital beds are occupied will thus be considerably lessened.
- (5) The immediate establishment in town of a new Maternity Home with district work attached, where midwives only will be trained, as medical students will be amply catered for in the Maternity Block to be built at Groote Schuur.

The motion was carried and referred to the Committee of the Board. At the following meeting on 26th May, the Chairman submitted, through the Committee of the Board, a memorandum dealing with the important points raised in Mrs. Horwood's motion,

with a view to facilitating discussion thereon. In this memorandum he put forward a series of proposals which he estimated would involve expenditure of approximately £20,000, and if adopted would tide over the interregnum of five years until the new hospital at Groote Schuur is built. This memorandum was adopted by the Board, and it was resolved that if the Provincial Administration was unable to advance a loan of approximately £20,000 for the purpose of financing the proposals submitted, the Chairman should approach the Administrator with a view to securing an advance of that amount on account of the sum of £100,000 which is due to the Board in respect of the purchase price of Somerset Hospital. Subsequently the Provincial Secretary asked for an estimate of the recurrent expenditure which would be entailed in putting the Board's proposals into effect, and he was informed that about £15,000 per annum would be required for maintenance and administrative costs only, excluding interest and redemption charges in respect of any loan advance which might be made to the Board to meet the capital expenditure involved in their scheme. Later, a further enquiry was made by the Provincial Secretary, particularly as to the cost of establishing the additional dispensaries suggested, and as to whether any of the additional institutions or increased accommodation would be rendered unnecessary when the new hospital at Groote Schuur became available. The estimate asked for was furnished, and an assurance was given that none of the expansion proposed would be superseded by the accommodation provided in the new hospital. On 26th November last the Provincial Secretary wrote stating that the Administrator was not prepared to approve of the Board's proposals, as he considered that they should now concentrate their efforts in the erection of the new hospital at Groote Schuur, and as the Board's own funds, together with a substantial loan from the Union Government would be necessary for the purpose, it was not considered advisable that the Board should use the available capital for any other purpose. This letter was reported to the Board on 22nd December, when it was resolved that with a view to bringing before the Administrator the necessity for carrying out the Board's scheme, he be invited to visit, with members of the Board, the institutions under the Board's control, particularly the Peninsula Maternity Hospital. Consideration of the Provincial Secretary's letter was formally deferred.

ADMISSION OF PATIENTS.—The question of the admission of patients and the charging of patients' fees has been the subject of very serious consideration by all the Standing Committees of the Board during the past few months. At the last meeting of the Board the following statement of policy presented by the

Finance and General Purposes Committee was accepted and endorsed :—

It was resolved that the Chairmen of the several committees controlling institutions be directed to deal with any difficulties which may arise in this connection, and that they be asked to bear in mind (a) that the primary care of the Board is the treatment of the sick poor : (b) that if patients of the part-paying or paying classes are admitted—and the latter should only be admitted as casualties, or in some similar emergency—the fee assessed must be in accordance with the means of the patient or the person responsible for the patient.

The Board also directed that representations be made to the Administrator for the amendment of Ordinance No. 5 of 1912 so as to ensure that all applicants for admission to hospitals shall be required to complete the statutory form of admission.

SUPERINTENDENT OF SOMERSET HOSPITAL.—It was recorded in the last Annual Report that Dr. A. Carrington Seale had retired from the post of Resident Medical Superintendent of Somerset Hospital, and that after an unsuccessful attempt to fill the vacancy by appointing an overseas candidate, the Administrator had agreed to the post being re-advertised at the higher commencing salary of £1,000 per annum, rising to £1,200, plus a furnished house and the other usual emoluments, but had stipulated that the advertisement should be published only in South Africa. No suitable applicant was found as the result of this procedure being followed, and later in the year the Administrator agreed to the post being advertised afresh, and to applications being received from lay candidates as well as medical men. Seventy-nine applications were received, and the Board selected Dr. Kenneth C. Middlemiss, of Glasgow, the same candidate who had been chosen originally at the lower salary, and had declined the appointment when it was offered to him. The Administrator's approval was sought to the appointment of Dr. Middlemiss under the new conditions, but this was withheld, and negotiations were entered into with two medical men resident in South Africa who had not been amongst the applicants. One of these, Dr. J. M. B. de Wet of Johannesburg, was appointed at a commencing salary of £1,200 per annum, rising to £1,500 per annum, together with the other authorised allowances of a furnished house, etc. Dr. de Wet intimated to the Board that he would not be able to assume duty until 1st September, 1927. The appointment of Dr. de Wet on these terms and conditions was recently approved by the Administrator. After Dr. Seale relinquished the appointment at the end of 1925, Dr. F. Forman was appointed in a temporary capacity, for two

months, and was succeeded by Dr. Seale (who was re-appointed in a temporary capacity) but the latter also only held office for two months. Dr. R. Sharp, at that time a member of the Board, was next appointed, also temporarily and in a part-time capacity, and he continued to act as Superintendent until the end of 1926. From 1st January this year Dr. Strafford S. Hewitt was appointed Acting Resident Medical Superintendent ; he has just given notice of his intention to resign at the end of March.

KOSHER KITCHEN AT SOMERSET HOSPITAL.—It was recorded in the last Annual Report that the Board had approved of the principle of establishing a Kosher kitchen at Somerset Hospital. The building, which was erected at the sole cost of the Jewish Sick Relief Society, has now been completed and will be brought into use very shortly.

CASUALTY WARD AT SOMERSET HOSPITAL.—In the last Annual Report it was mentioned that a proposal of the Board to build a casualty or observation ward at Somerset Hospital, at an estimated cost of £1,250, was under discussion with the Provincial Administration, the plans submitted by the Board not having found favour with the Public Works Department. An amended plan was subsequently prepared and approved by the Public Works Department, but the project was deferred pending consideration of alternative proposals. At the last meeting of the Board, however, it was decided to proceed with the original scheme, and tenders are now being invited for the construction of the building, the cost of which is to be defrayed from funds belonging to the institution.

X-RAY DEPARTMENT, SOMERSET HOSPITAL.—Following upon the appointment of Dr. J. van Roojen as part-time Radiologist at Somerset Hospital, steps were taken for the reorganisation of the X-Ray department at that institution. Dr. van Roojen proceeded first to deal with the diagnostic work of the department, and the sum of £1,631 has already been spent in carrying out his recommendations in that respect. He subsequently submitted a report setting out his requirements with regard to deep treatment apparatus. The Board adopted his proposals, and a further sum of £1,865 has been provided on the Estimates of the Board for 1927.

WOODSTOCK HOSPITAL.—The old Committee of Woodstock Hospital put forward the following proposals for the enlargement of that institution : (a) That two new wards be built each accommodating about 20 beds ; (b) that the existing night-nurses' quarters remain as they are ; (c) that additions be made to Nurses' Home No. 2 to provide for the increased nursing staff which will be

required when the proposed new wards have been built ; and (d) that a kitchen, a dining-room, a visitors' waiting-room, etc., be built on to Nurses' Home No. 2. It was decided to obtain preliminary sketches illustrating these proposals and alternative proposals made by the Committee of the Board.

VICTORIA HOSPITAL, WYNBERG.—The electrical installation in the Victoria Hospital, Wynberg, has been completely overhauled and extended at an approximate cost of £450, in order to meet the additional demands which will follow upon the expansion of the X-Ray department and the fitting of the new electric elevator now on order.

MCGREGOR CONVALESCENT HOME.—The Railway Department has expropriated part of the property occupied by the McGregor Convalescent Home, Plumstead, and as the Board could not accept the compensation offered, they adopted the suggestion of the Assistant General Manager of Railways, Cape Town, that the matter be settled by informal arbitration. Mr. A. T. Babbs has been appointed arbitrator on behalf of the Board. The portion of the property expropriated included a building, part of which was let, and it has been necessary to build an addition to the existing premises to provide accommodation for a male domestic and for storage purposes.

CAPE TOWN FREE DISPENSARY.—Since the new Board came into office, much consideration has been given to the question of enlarging the scope of the Cape Town Free Dispensary, and a Sub-Committee is at present dealing with the matter in conjunction with the University of Cape Town and the Dental Society of the Cape Province.

DISTRICT NURSES.—Mainly through the activities of Mrs. H. Horwood and the Women's Municipal Association there has recently been a revival of interest in the work of the Board's District Nursing Organisation. Several applications have been received for the appointment of nurses to new areas and for additional nurses in existing areas, and the Administrator has promised his sympathetic consideration of the projected expansion of this work, for which provision has been made in the Board's Estimates for 1927.

EXEMPTION FROM SECTION 54 OF ORDINANCE NO. 5 OF 1912.—At the request of the Board, the Administrator, with the advice of the Executive Committee, approved of the exemption during the calendar year 1926 of all the institutions under the control of the Board from the provisions of sub-section (a) of Section 54 of Ordinance No. 5 of 1912, and of Somerset Hospital and the Peninsula Maternity Hospital from the provisions of sub-section (b) of the same section.

AMENDMENT OF ORDINANCE NO. 11 OF 1920.—A draft Ordinance to amend the provisions of the School and Hospital Boards Officials' Ordinance, No. 11 of 1920, was published in the "Provincial Gazette" dated 18th June, 1926. The amended provisions were similar to those which had been proposed in 1923, but the amending Ordinance prepared at that time was very strongly opposed by the Board, in conjunction with the School Board for the Cape Division, and the measure was not proceeded with. After considering the new amending Ordinance, the Board resolved, on 28th July, to reaffirm their decisions of 1923, which had been accepted by the School Board, and Mr. H. F. East and the Secretary and Treasurer were empowered to take action with a view to securing the amendment of the draft Ordinance in accordance with such decisions. However, notwithstanding representations made to every member of the Provincial Council, and the fact that these were supported by all the principal Hospital Boards in the Cape Province, the Ordinance was passed in the form in which it was originally drafted with the exception that it has been provided that the consent of the Hospital Board concerned must be obtained before any of their officials can be dismissed.

MOTOR AMBULANCES.—During the calendar year 1926, 2,431 cases (including 237 arising from street accidents) were removed in the Board's ambulances, an average of 202.58 per month. Of this number 1,503 removals were free and 928 were charged for. After taking expert advice, the Board decided to adopt the Bean car for ambulance purposes, and the service is now carried out by means of three cars of this make. The City Council of Cape Town have increased their annual grant for ambulance purposes from £250 to £400.

FEVER TRAINING FOR NURSES.—During the year the City Council of Cape Town suggested to the Board certain arrangements under which nurses who had qualified in the Board's institutions would be encouraged to take a six months' post-graduate course in the City Infectious Diseases Hospital. The Board agreed to co-operate with the City Council with a view to ensuring that as many as possible of the nurses who graduated in the Board's institutions should take advantage of the fever training provided at the City Hospital. The new regulations of the Colonial Medical Council, which will come into force on 1st July, 1927, extend the period of training to 3½ years at a Class I. training school and 4½ years at a Class II. training school, and provide that wherever practicable during her training period a probationer shall have three months' training in an infectious diseases hospital.

SPECIAL REMUNERATION TO NURSES QUALIFIED IN MIDWIFERY.—Considerable difficulty was experienced during last year in filling vacancies for Sisters on the staff of the Peninsula Maternity Hospital, and the Board came to the conclusion that this was due in a great measure to the fact that, although a nurse holding such a position must be qualified as a midwife as well as a general nurse, no special inducement in the form of increased emolument is offered for this double qualification. In June last the Board decided to bring this matter to the notice of the Provincial Administration, and represented the necessity of an amendment of the Nurses Salaries and Pensions Ordinances to provide for payment of a special allowance to trained nurses who are also qualified in midwifery. The Provincial Secretary, in reply to these representations, stated that the point has been noted for consideration with regard to further proposed legislation in respect of nurses.

SUBSISTENCE ALLOWANCE TO NURSES ON LEAVE.—The Board made representations to the Provincial Administration with a view to authority being given Hospital Boards to pay a subsistence allowance to nurses, at the rate of £5 per month, during periods of statutory annual leave. The Provincial Administration, however, evidently does not look with favour on the proposal, as a reply has been received from the Provincial Secretary to the effect that the Executive Committee is not prepared to deal with the matter during the next session of the Provincial Council.

NURSES PRIZE SCHEME.—At the June (1926) examination of the Colonial Medical Council for nurses and midwives, thirty-three candidates entered as follows: Somerset Hospital, 11; Woodstock Hospital, 3; Rondebosch and Mowbray Cottage Hospital, 1; Victoria Hospital, Wynberg, 8; Peninsula Maternity Hospital, 10. These candidates were successful with the exception of two from Somerset Hospital, the one from Rondebosch and two from Wynberg. The following awards were accordingly made under the Board's prize scheme:—

In order of merit on the examination list for the Province, Miss Norton was placed fifth and Miss Fuller tenth. The first prize of £5 was withheld for disciplinary reasons. The prize of £2 10s. to the most successful pupil-midwife trained at the Peninsula Maternity Hospital was awarded to Miss H. Carlin, who was placed sixth in the examination list for the Province.

At the December (1926) examination twenty-seven candidates entered as follows : Somerset Hospital, 14 ; Victoria Hospital, Wynberg, 4 ; Peninsula Maternity Hospital, 9. These candidates were all successful with the exception of one from Somerset Hospital. The following awards were made under the Boards' prize scheme :—

In order of merit in the examination list for the Province Miss Ramsay was placed first (bracketed), Miss de Wet, fourth, and Miss Bower, fifth. The prize of £2 10s. to the most successful pupil-midwife trained at the Peninsula Maternity Hospital was awarded to Miss J. Robb, who was placed second in the midwifery list for the Province.

EMPLOYMENT OF NATIVE OR COLOURED ORDERLIES.—

The employment of orderlies, ward boys, native or coloured ward-maids or nurses, to perform menial duties in wards where native or coloured patients are treated, is enjoined by Section 25 of Ordinance No. 5 of 1912, but the provisions of this section have always remained in abeyance with the tacit consent of the Provincial Administration. The question of complying with the law in this respect was carefully considered during the past year, and information was obtained as to the number of such orderlies or ward maids required, and the provision of accommodation for them at the several institutions. It was thereafter decided to consider the matter in conjunction with the Estimates for 1927, and in these Estimates provision has been made to meet the expenditure which will be entailed by the employment of such domestics at all the institutions where they will be required.

SALT RIVER RAILWAY ACCIDENT.—At a meeting of the Board held on 23rd June, 1926, the Chairman made reference to the serious railway accident which occurred at Salt River on 9th June, in which so many valuable lives were lost and so many unfortunate people were more or less seriously injured. It is satisfactory to know that our hospitals responded splendidly to the sudden call made upon their services in this emergency. The Board recorded their deep sympathy with the relatives of those who were killed, and also expressed their appreciation of the good work done by doctors, nurses and others in this connection.

OBITUARY.—At a meeting of the Board held on 28th April last year, the Chairman made the following statement :—

I have to mention with deep regret the death of Colonel William Standford, D.S.O., M.V.O., J.P., which occurred

on 7th April, 1926. The late Colonel Standford did much excellent work on behalf of the hospitals. In 1920 he was appointed to the Board as a representative of the City Council, and he served until 1923. Again appointed to the Board in 1924, as a representative of the Administrator, he remained a member until his death. On the Buildings, Grounds and Equipment Committee his practical experience was of great assistance. He took an especial interest in the Rondebosch and Mowbray Cottage Hospital. For many years he was a member of the Committee of that Institution, and during last year was Vice-Chairman.

The following resolution was then adopted :—

That the members of the Cape Hospital Board record their great regret at the death on 7th April, 1926, of Colonel William Standford, D.S.O., M.V.O., J.P., who was a member of the Board from 1920 to 1923, and from 1924 to the day of his death ; that they express their appreciation of the valuable work he performed on behalf of the hospitals ; and that they tender their profound sympathy to the bereaved relatives.

The Board, on 8th November of last year, adopted the following resolution :—

That the members of the Cape Hospital Board record their great regret at the death on 2nd November, 1926, of Mr. Arthur Wise Sawkins, who was one of the foundation members of the Board, and who held office continuously until the reconstitution of the Board in October, 1926 ; that they express their appreciation of the valuable work he performed as Chairman of the Buildings, Grounds and Equipment Committee, and as a member of the Committees of the Peninsula Maternity Hospital and the Rondebosch and Mowbray Cottage Hospital, of which latter Committee he was for some time Chairman ; and that they respectfully tender their profound sympathy with the bereaved relatives of the deceased.

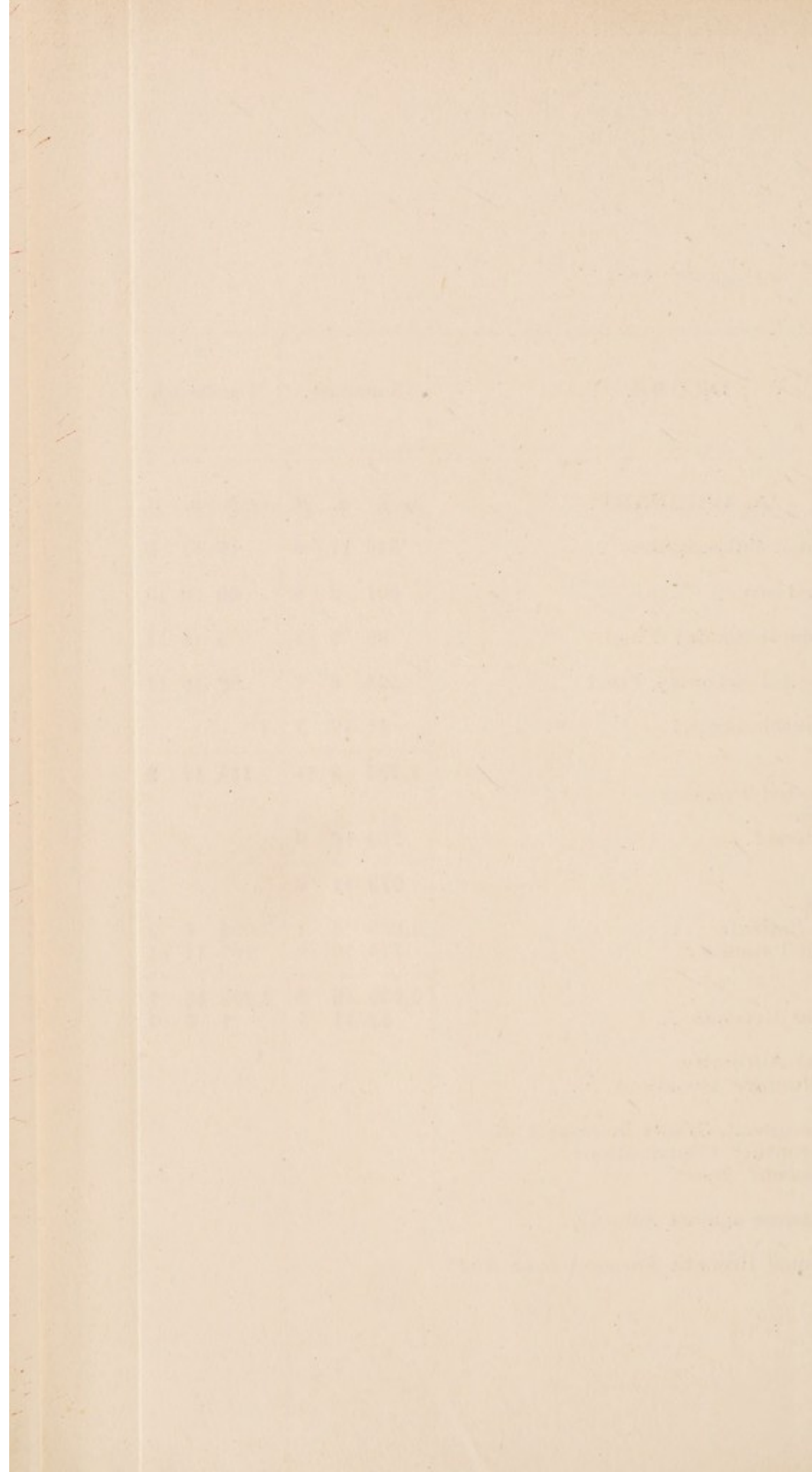

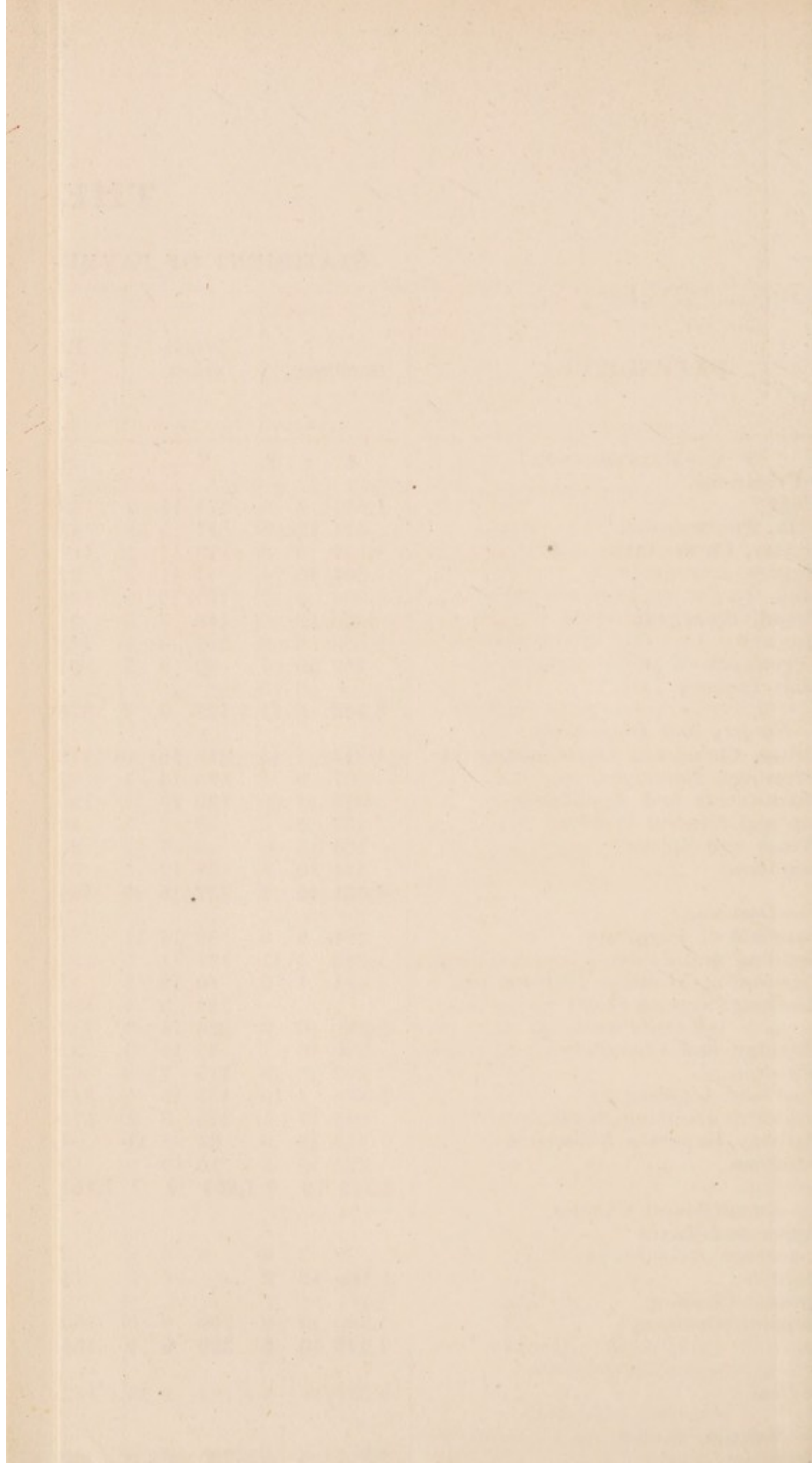
