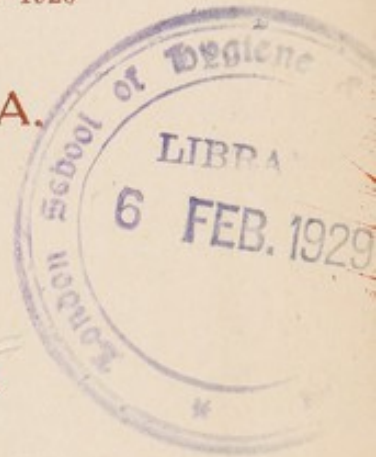

Finance and General Purposes Committee.

Duties :

The Finance and General Purposes Committee shall, in accordance with the Rules of Order, and with the approval of the Board :

- (a) supervise all the fiscal concerns of the Board and report periodically as to the state of the several funds of the Board ;
- (b) prepare and submit to the Board in the month of December in each year a statement of the estimated capital income and expenditure and of the recurrent income and expenditure of the Board in respect of that year ;
- (c) prepare and submit to the Board during the month of December in each year a statement of the estimated recurrent income and expenditure of the Board's Institutions in respect of that year, which shall be framed after consultation with the other Standing Committees concerned ;
- (d) receive at each monthly meeting a statement of the payments effected by the Secretary and Treasurer of the Board during the preceding calendar month, and thereafter report to the Board the total amount of the expenditure in question ;
- (e) arrange all investments of moneys held by or funds entrusted to the Board ;
- (f) report to the Board at the request of any of the other Standing Committees as to the provision of funds for any object connected with the administration of the Board or any of its Institutions ;
- (g) supervise the collection of all revenue due to the Board and its Institutions ;
- (h) be responsible for the control of the Head Office of the Board, and deal with all matters appertaining to the appointment, emoluments, resignation or leave of the Secretary and Treasurer and other officers employed therein ;
- (i) invite and deal with all tenders received for annual supplies and services required by the Board ;

- (j) arrange all insurance policies, whether in respect of fire, fidelity guarantee, workmen's compensation, or any other risk.

The control and administration of the several Institutions of the Board, are allocated to Standing Committees as follows :—(1) Somerset Hospital to the Somerset Hospital Committee ; (2) Rondebosch and Mowbray Cottage Hospital and Woodstock Hospital to the Rondebosch and Woodstock Hospitals Committee ; (3) Victoria Hospital, Wynberg, and Simon's Town—Kalk Bay Hospital to the Wynberg and Simon's Town Hospitals Committee ; (4) Eaton Convalescent Home and McGregor Convalescent Home to the Convalescent Homes Committee ; and (5) Cape Town Free Dispensary, Peninsula Maternity Hospital and the C.H.B. District Nursing Organisation to the Combined Institutions Committee.

Duties of these Committees are as follows :—

- (a) Exercise a general supervision of such Institution or Institutions, including the fabric and grounds thereof ;
- (b) Carry out such regulations as may be framed by the Board in respect of such Institution or Institutions ;
- (c) Subject to the approval of the Board, make all professional and other appointments in connection with such Institution or Institutions ;
- (d) Deal with the representations of patients in and members of the Staff of such Institution or Institutions ;
- (e) Advise the Board in all matters affecting such Institution or Institutions ;
- (f) In December of each year, in consultation with the Secretary and Treasurer of the Board, frame Estimates of the recurrent income and expenditure of such

Institution, or Institutions in respect of that year and submit the same without delay to the Finance and General Purposes Committee ;

- (g) Generally administer such Institution or Institutions, provided, however, that no expenditure shall be incurred unless prior provision has been made therefor in the approved Estimates of the Board for the current year or by special resolution of the Board.

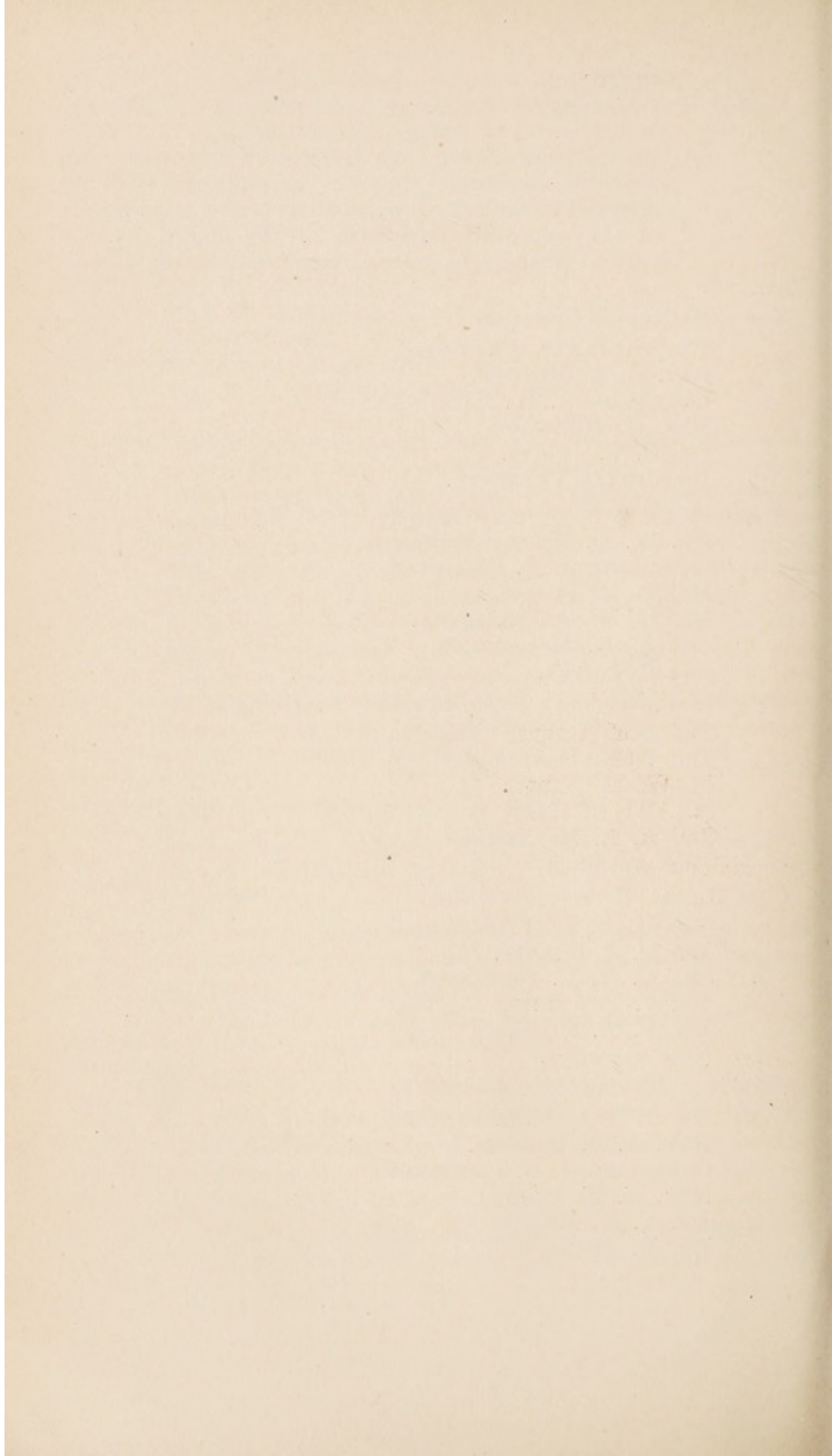

MINUTE

of the Chairman of the Board for the Year 1927-1928.

HOSPITAL DEVELOPMENT.—In the last Annual Report of the Board it was mentioned that after much difficulty arrangements had been made for the levelling of the site of the new hospital to be built on the Groote Schuur Estate, but that the work had not been commenced. A start was made, however, in April of last year, and the work is now so far advanced that it is anticipated that the site will be ready for building operations before the end of this year. The project of the new hospital was advanced a further stage at last month's meeting of the Board when new plans prepared by the Government Architect (Mr. J. S. Cleland) were adopted, with certain modifications, and it was decided to seek the Administrator's approval to proceed with a scheme for a hospital containing 640 beds, at a cost of approximately £750,000, exclusive of the expense of levelling the site and the cost of a laundry and general furniture and equipment. It was also decided, notwithstanding the suggestion put forward by the Hospital Survey Committee in the report they presented to the Government last year, that the existing Somerset Hospital should be merged into the new hospital at Groote Schuur as soon as it is practicable to do so, for the reasons mainly that the present hospital has already been sold to the Provincial Administration for a sum of £100,000, that it would be uneconomical from an administrative point of view to maintain two separate institutions instead of one, and that the medical and scientific resources of the Cape Peninsula are not sufficient to provide for two general hospitals.

At the same meeting of the Board it was decided to prosecute the scheme for the rebuilding of the Peninsula Maternity Hospital, involving an increase of the number of beds from 24 to 32. It was also decided to include in the development programme extensions of the Woodstock Hospital and the Victoria Hospital, Wynberg, involving the addition of 14 beds to the former and 22 beds for coloured patients at the latter. A scheme for increasing the accommodation available at the Eaton Convalescent Home, by

converting a disused coach-house into a dormitory for 14 coloured male inmates was also adopted. The Board's declared policy in respect of the development of their convalescent homes is to erect two new institutions, one for adults and one for children, mainly to receive patients from the hospitals under the control of the Board, and this decision is now being considered by the responsible committee.

Mention is made in another part of this report of a scheme for a considerable extension of the Cape Town Free Dispensary at a cost of nearly £20,000.

This bare recital of the schemes of extension and development which have occupied the attention of the Board during the past year is but a slight index of the time and energy devoted by the members of the Board to the larger duties of their office. The programme is an extensive one, but it has to be remembered that the hospital accommodation in the Cape Peninsula has fallen very much in arrear of the needs of the area. The Board's proposals will involve considerable expenditure: it now remains for the Provincial Administration, the Local Authorities and the public to indicate to what extent they are prepared to provide the means to meet the ascertained requirements of the community..

MEMBERSHIP OF THE BOARD.—In accordance with the provisions of Ordinance No. 17 of 1926 all the elective members of the Board retire annually. When the Board was reconstituted in October last, the following members were elected to represent the contributors :—

No nomination having been received in respect of the Simonstown—Kalk Bay Hospital, Mr. P. G. Flint, of Simonstown, was elected by the Board as the representative of the subscribers to that institution.

Mr. G. H. E. Dickinson was reappointed as a representative of the Administrator, so that the Administrator's three representatives remain as before, namely, Dr. P. M. Daneel, Mr. G. H. E. Dickinson and myself.

The Divisional Council of the Cape reappointed Chevalier J. B. Callanan and Dr. C. F. Juritz, and appointed Mr. H. F. East as their third representative. Mrs. H. Horwood and Mr. W. James

were reappointed as representatives of the City Council of Cape Town. The third Local Government representative has not yet been appointed and, therefore, the Municipalities of Simonstown and Durbanville are at present without representation on the Board.

The following were appointed to represent the Honorary Visiting Medical Officers: Professor A. W. Falconer, Dr. A. R. McLachlan and Dr. Julius Petersen.

CHAIRMANSHIP AND VICE-CHAIRMANSHIP OF THE BOARD.—At a special meeting of the reconstituted Board, held on 31st October, 1927, I was honoured by being reappointed Chairman of the Board and Mr. W. James was reappointed Vice-Chairman.

SOMERSET HOSPITAL.—On the recommendation of the Somerset Hospital Committee it was decided by the Board, in January of this year, that the authorised capacity of the institution be altered to 308 beds, and that a nursing staff adequate for such a number be provided. As there is no reserve of accommodation in the existing Nurses' Homes at Somerset Hospital, it will be necessary to provide specially for the housing of the eighteen additional nurses to be appointed. With the object of securing the desired accommodation quickly and as economically as possible, the Board have just purchased a large dwelling-house at Mouille Point, in the neighbourhood of the hospital.

CASUALTY WARD, SOMERSET HOSPITAL.—The new casualty ward at Somerset Hospital, which accommodates nine beds, has been completed at a cost of £939. It was brought into use in August of last year.

X-RAY DEPARTMENT, SOMERSET HOSPITAL.—The re-organisation of the X-Ray Department at Somerset Hospital has proceeded during the past year, deep treatment apparatus having already been purchased at a cost of £1,542.

SUPERINTENDENT OF SOMERSET HOSPITAL.—Dr. J. M. B. de Wet assumed duty on 1st September, 1927, as Resident Medical Superintendent of Somerset Hospital, and Dr. J. Hunter, who had been acting in that position since March, was thanked by the Board for his services to the institution.

RETIREMENT OF MISS E. HILL.—In September last Miss E. Hill, Assistant Matron of Somerset Hospital, proceeded on long leave prior to her retirement after seventeen years in the service of the Board's hospitals. She was successively a staff nurse in the Victoria Hospital, Wynberg, and a staff nurse, sister and night superintendent in Somerset Hospital, this service well

qualifying her for the post of Assistant Matron of the latter institution, to which she was appointed on 1st June, 1915. By direction of the Board a special letter of appreciation was addressed to Miss Hill on 28th October, 1927, in which she was assured that when her term of leave has expired, and she retires from the service, she will carry with her the Board's best wishes for her continued health and happiness, and their sincere hope that she will long continue to enjoy the pension which she has so well deserved for her unremitting labours in the service of the sick and helpless.

APPOINTMENT OF ALMONER.—During the past year an honorary almoner was appointed on the staff of Somerset Hospital. It has since been decided that this post should be a paid one, and applications for the appointment were recently invited by public advertisement. These applications are now under consideration, and as soon as the Estimates for 1928 have been approved by the Administrator it will be possible to make an appointment.

CAPE TOWN FREE DISPENSARY.—A comprehensive scheme for the expansion of the Cape Town Free Dispensary has been adopted by the Board and submitted for the approval of the Administrator. The total estimated cost of carrying out this scheme is £19,100, which it is proposed to defray out of the bequest to the institution from the late Mr. M. Hiddingh, which it is expected will shortly be paid over.

PENINSULA MATERNITY HOSPITAL.—It was decided by the Board at the beginning of last year that the property in Caledon Street known as "Buckingham Lodge," which is occupied by the Peninsula Maternity Hospital, should be purchased from the owners, the Eastern Telegraph Co., Ltd., and after negotiation the Company agreed to accept a sum of £5,000 for the property. The Public Works Department was asked to prepare a scheme for a new hospital building, to be erected on the vacant part of the site, and for the conversion of the existing building into a nurses' home. Plans were accordingly prepared, and an estimate of £29,200 for the rebuilding scheme was framed by the Public Works Department. The Administrator's sanction was then sought, and he was asked to provide a loan of £35,000 to enable the scheme to be financed. The project was approved, but the Board were notified by the Provincial Secretary that it was not possible to provide in the financial year then current for the loan required. A sum of £6,000 was advanced, however, and this the Board accepted as an instalment of the loan for which they had applied. The purchase of the property has been arranged, but transfer has not yet been passed by the Company to the Board.

EATON CONVALESCENT HOME.—A very considerable improvement was effected at the Eaton Convalescent Home by the reconstruction of the main balconies in ferro-concrete. It was estimated that the work would cost £1,000, but it has been carried out in a very satisfactory manner at a cost of £935 4s. 6d., including architect's fees.

MCGREGOR CONVALESCENT HOME.—It was recorded in the last Annual Report that the Railway Department had expropriated part of the property occupied by the McGregor Convalescent Home, Plumstead, and that arbitration proceedings had been initiated for the purpose of settling the amount of compensation to be paid to the Board. The arbitrators awarded the Board a sum of £3,000 as compensation and damages, and ordered the Railway Department to pay also the costs of the arbitration, amounting to £47 18s. It has been decided by the Board that the money received by way of compensation will be devoted solely to the extension of the objects of the McGregor Convalescent Home.

HIDDINGH BEQUESTS.—The Board were gratified to receive a letter in September last, from the Secretary of the Board of Executors, notifying that the late Mr. Michiel Hiddingh, of Newlands, had left the following legacies: £15,000 to the New Somerset Hospital, Cape Town, and £20,000 to the Free Dispensary, Cape Town. The letter stated, further, that an inventory of the Estate had been filed at the office of the Master of the Supreme Court, and that it appeared there were sufficient funds to pay all legacies in full, but that the major portion of the Estate consisted of fixed deposits, which would not mature before February, 1928. Later, the Secretary of the Board of Executors informed the Board that no provision had been made for the erection of a monument or tombstone over the late Mr. Hiddingh's grave, and suggested that the beneficiaries under the will should contribute towards the cost of providing such a memorial, which was estimated at £148 10s. The Board agreed that their *pro rata* share, namely £56, should be deducted from the bequests to the Somerset Hospital and the Cape Town Free Dispensary.

DONATION FROM THE ESTATE OF THE LATE H. LIBERMAN.—During the year a donation of £1,000 to the Somerset Hospital was received from the Estate of the late Mr. H. Liberman. It was decided by the Board that this gift be commemorated by naming a ward in the new hospital after the late Mr. Liberman, or in some other suitable way.

WIRELESS FOR THE HOSPITALS.—As a result of a newspaper appeal to the public, initiated by Toc H, a considerable

sum of money was subscribed for the equipment of the hospitals with wireless receiving apparatus. Of the Board's Institutions Somerset Hospital was dealt with first, and there the installation was inaugurated last Christmas eve. Woodstock Hospital, Rondebosch and Mowbray Cottage Hospital, Victoria Hospital, Wynberg, and the Simon's Town—Kalk Bay Hospital will be equipped in this respect before the end of the current year.

NURSES' PRIZE SCHEME.—At the examination for nurses and midwives held by the Colonial Medical Council in June of last year, thirty-one candidates entered as follows: Somerset Hospital, 12; Woodstock Hospital, 3; Rondebosch and Mowbray Cottage Hospital, 2; Victoria Hospital, Wynberg, 3; Peninsula Maternity Hospital, 11. All but two of these candidates were successful; one of the exceptions came from Somerset Hospital and the other from the Victoria Hospital, Wynberg. The following awards were accordingly made under the Board's prize scheme:—

In order of merit in the examination list for the Province, Miss Byers and Miss Stegman were bracketed for second place, and Miss Skinner was placed fifth (bracketed). The prize of £2 10s. to the most successful pupil-midwife trained at the Peninsula Maternity Hospital was awarded to Miss G. M. Geddie, who was placed first in the midwifery examination list for the Province.

At the December (1927) examination, twenty-five candidates entered as follows: Somerset Hospital, 12; Woodstock Hospital, 2; Rondebosch and Mowbray Cottage Hospital, 2; Victoria Hospital, Wynberg, 5; Peninsula Maternity Hospital, 4. These candidates were all successful, with the exception of one from the Victoria Hospital, Wynberg. The following awards were made under the Board's prize scheme:

In order of merit in the examination list for the Province, Miss Brooke-Thompson was bracketed with another candidate for second place, and Miss Boyd and Miss Hughes were bracketed for fourth place. The prize of £2 10s. to the most successful pupil-midwife trained at the Peninsula Maternity Hospital was awarded to Miss E. Calder, who was placed fourth in the midwifery examination list for the Province.

DISTRICT NURSING.—The extension of this branch of the Board's work, which was foreshadowed in the last Annual Report, took effect during the year. New branches of the District Nursing Organisation have been established in Camps Bay, Claremont, Maitland, Goodwood and the Muizenberg area, and the nurses employed (excluding the Superintendent of District Nurses) have increased in number from eight to twenty-one.

REGULATIONS FOR NURSES AND MIDWIVES.—On 1st July, 1927, new regulations of the Colonial Medical Council in respect of the training of nurses and midwives came into force. Under these regulations it became necessary to appoint resident medical officers at Woodstock Hospital and the Victoria Hospital, Wynberg, in order that they might continue to be recognised as first-class institutions for the purpose of training nurses. The period of training at such institutions was extended from three years to three-and-a-half years. Other changes were also brought about by these regulations. The Rondebosch and Mowbray Cottage Hospital was relegated to second-class rank and the period of training for nurses in that institution has therefore been extended from three years to four-and-a-half years. The Simon's Town—Kalk Bay Hospital, which was formerly regarded as a third-class training school, has ceased to count altogether in that respect under the new code. With regard to midwives, the new regulations provide that except in the case of registered trained nurses the period of training in midwifery must be twelve months.

HEAD OFFICE STAFF.—Proposals for augmenting the staff of the Head Office of the Board were discussed at length during the latter part of last year, and following an investigation of the position by a Sub-Committee of the Board it was resolved to increase the office personnel with a view to coping with the greater demands made on the staff by the committee system established under the new Rules of Order and the extension of the Board's administrative work generally. It is not possible, however, to carry this reorganisation into effect until the Administrator's sanction for the new appointments has been obtained. In the meantime the work of the Board is being carried on under extremely difficult conditions, entailing an undue tax on the members of the staff. From 1st January of this year the two Head Office officials who were seconded for service at Somerset Hospital were transferred to the staff of that institution and placed under the control of the Resident Medical Superintendent.

The question of the remuneration of the Secretary and Treasurer and other principal officers of the Board has engaged attention during the past two years. The Board after mature consideration,

and with a full knowledge of the duties and responsibilities devolving upon these officers, have declared their present salaries to be quite inadequate. The question of amending the Officials' Salaries Ordinance, No. 11 of 1920, which is said to be necessary before the Board's representations to the Provincial Administration can be given effect, is believed to be under consideration at present.

AUDIT OF ACCOUNTS.—Under Ordinance No. 9 of 1927, promulgated in July of last year, it is provided that from and after 1st January, 1928, the audit of the accounts of every Hospital Board shall be carried out at the cost of the Board concerned by an auditor to be appointed by the Provincial Auditor, and that such auditor may be an officer of the Provincial Audit Department. Hitherto the Board's accounts have been audited by two practising accountants, one appointed by the Board and the other appointed by the Provincial Administration; both being paid out of the Board's funds. Up to the present no intimation has been received from the Provincial Administration of the appointment of an auditor for the year 1928.

REGULATIONS OF THE BOARD.—The reconstitution of the Board under Ordinance No. 17 of 1926 rendered necessary the alteration of the regulations of the Board. The first stage of this work was accomplished in July of last year, when amended rules of order which had been framed by the Board were promulgated by the Administrator. A Sub-Committee is at present engaged in revising the other regulations of the Board, and it is hoped that their labours will soon be brought to a satisfactory conclusion.

EXEMPTION FROM SECTION 54 OF ORDINANCE NO. 5 OF 1912.—At the request of the Board, the Administrator, with the advice of the Executive Committee, approved of the exemption during the calendar year 1927 of all the institutions under the control of the Board from the provisions of sub-section (a) of Section 54 of Ordinance No. 5 of 1912, and of Somerset Hospital and the Peninsula Maternity Hospital from the provisions of sub-section (b) of the same section.

MOTOR AMBULANCES.—During the calendar year 1927, 3,024 cases (including 293 due to street accidents) were removed in the Board's ambulances, an average of 252 per month. Of this number 2,038 removals were free and 986 were charged for.

ELECTRICAL INSTALLATIONS.—Following the procedure adopted in the case of the Victoria Hospital, Wynberg, the electrical installation of the Rondebosch and Mowbray Cottage Hospital has been completely reorganised, at a cost of £192. The electrical installations in the Woodstock Hospital and the Eaton

Convalescent Home have also been found to be unsatisfactory, and in some respects even dangerous, and arrangements are now being made to have these installations completely overhauled.

BLOOD TRANSFUSION.—Arrangements have been made whereby payment of £5 5s. is made to any approved person for blood taken for transfusion in emergency cases under treatment at Somerset Hospital. These arrangements have on occasion been extended also to the Peninsula Maternity Hospital.

COMMUNITY CHEST.—At a meeting held in the City Hall on 27th October last to consider the proposed establishment of a Community Chest for Cape Town, the Board were represented by Dr. Julius Petersen and Mr. W. Sinclair Thomson. After considering the report made by their representatives, the Board resolved, on 23rd November, 1927, that they were not prepared to join the Community Chest movement.

OBITUARY.—The ranks of the members and ex-members of the Board have been further thinned by death. Mr. J. J. Michau died on 2nd February, 1927. Apart from his work on the Board, the institution which claimed most of his sympathy and attention was the Rondebosch and Mowbray Cottage Hospital.

Mr. S. N. Ponder, whose death occurred in March, 1927, was a member of the Board from 1916 until 1923. He was for many years a member of the Committee of the Victoria Hospital, Wynberg, of which body he was for some time Chairman.

Dr. A. John Gregory, the former Medical Officer of Health for the Cape Colony, died in England on 14th July, 1927. Dr. Gregory was one of the original members of the Board as it was constituted in 1913. He was appointed by the Administrator and continued in office until 1915 when he resigned on leaving for England.

On 24th July, 1927, the death occurred of Mrs. M. Eburn Salmon, who was a member of the Board from 1914 until 1926, and whose untiring efforts in collecting money in aid of the Board's institutions will be long remembered.

Mr. Thomas Mossop died on 17th November, 1927. He was one of the members of the Board during its first year of establishment, and in subsequent years, and was also closely associated with the Rondebosch and Mowbray Cottage Hospital, of the Committee of which he was Chairman until his failing health necessitated his retirement.

Another death falls to be recorded in this report, that of Dr. J. W. van Eeden. The deceased was House Surgeon at the Peninsula Maternity Hospital, and contracted his fatal illness whilst holding that appointment. He died on 18th December, 1927.

At a meeting of the Board held on 23rd February, 1927, reference was made to the death of Dr. J. F. Parson, who for nearly twenty years, from 1879 until 1898, was Resident Surgeon at the Somerset Hospital.

ACKNOWLEDGMENTS.—On behalf of the Board I desire to thank all those organisations and persons who have assisted in various ways in promoting the welfare of the hospitals and allied institutions during the past year.

Thanks are particularly due to the ex-Mayoress of Cape Town (Mrs. A. Fish) and those who assisted her in organising the Hospital Ball, which was a distinct success financially and socially.

The organisers of the Hospital Saturday Collection and the Mid-week Street Collection (Mrs. W. G. R. Murray and Mrs. H. J. Stodel) and the collectors who worked with them have also earned the gratitude of the Board. Toc H (Cape Town Central Group) took over the collections on the Pier in aid of the hospitals, and this practical help is acknowledged with appreciation.

In conclusion I wish to express my thanks to the staff of the Board and the Board's institutions for their co-operation and assistance throughout another year.

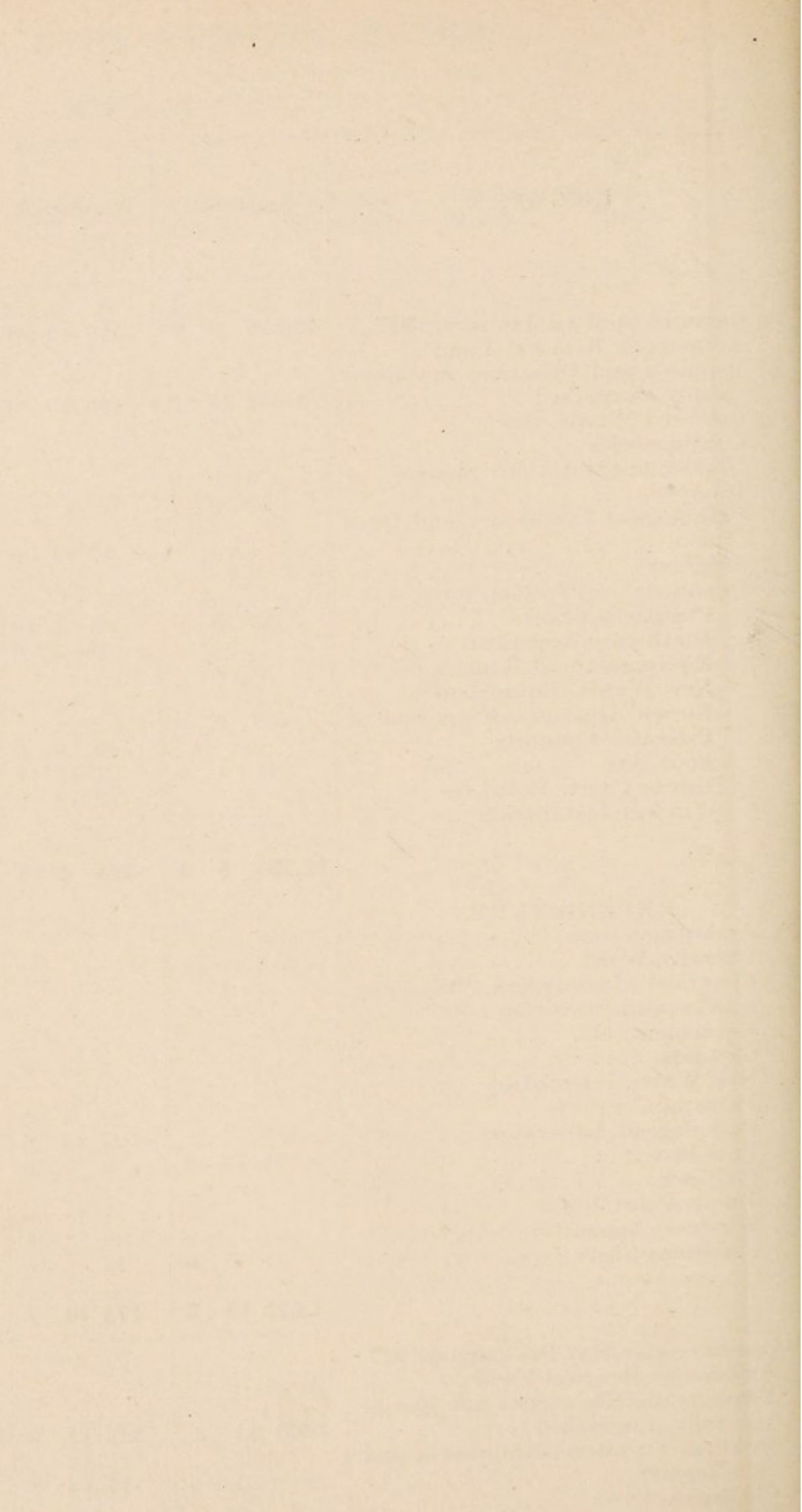

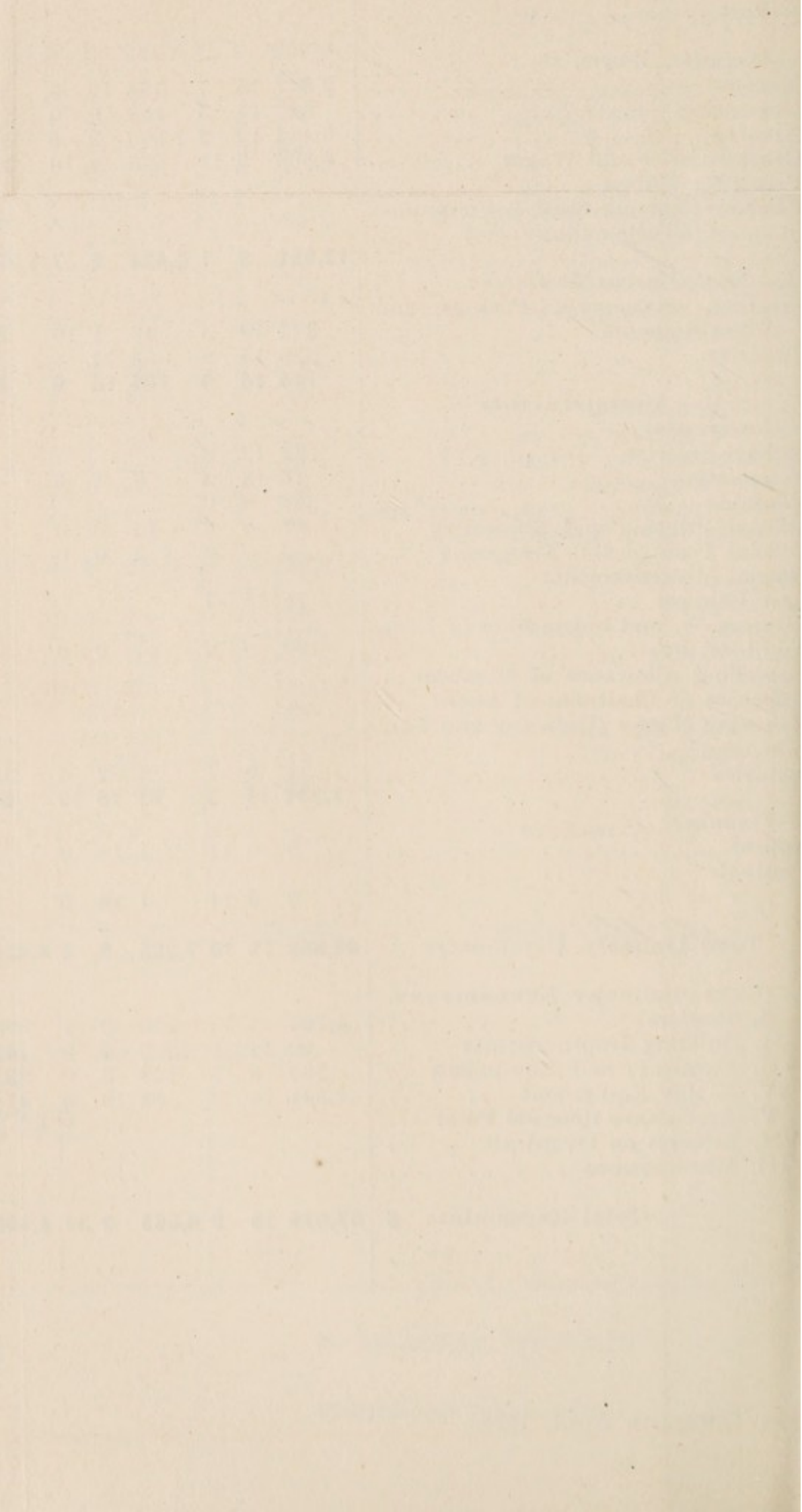
