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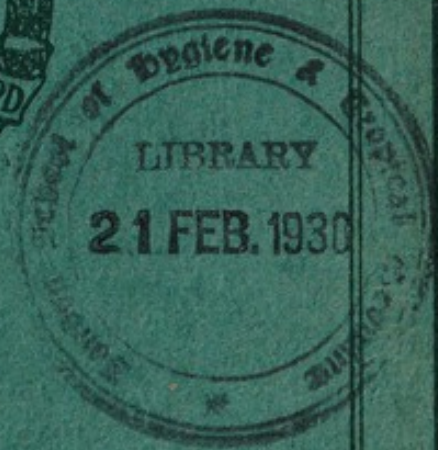

Finance and General Purposes Committee.

Duties :

The Finance and General Purposes Committee shall, in accordance with the Rules of Order, and with the approval of the Board :

- (a) supervise all the fiscal concerns of the Board and report periodically as to the state of the several funds of the Board ;
- (b) prepare and submit to the Board in the month of December in each year a statement of the estimated capital income and expenditure and of the recurrent income and expenditure of the Board in respect of that year ;
- (c) prepare and submit to the Board during the month of December in each year a statement of the estimated recurrent income and expenditure of the Board's Institutions in respect of that year, which shall be framed after consultation with the other Standing Committees concerned ;
- (d) receive at each monthly meeting a statement of the payments effected by the Secretary and Treasurer of the Board during the preceding calendar month, and thereafter report to the Board the total amount of the expenditure in question ;
- (e) arrange all investments of moneys held by or funds entrusted to the Board ;
- (f) report to the Board at the request of any of the other Standing Committees as to the provision of funds for any object connected with the administration of the Board or any of its Institutions ;
- (g) supervise the collection of all revenue due to the Board and its Institutions ;
- (h) be responsible for the control of the Head Office of the Board, and deal with all matters appertaining to the appointment, emoluments, resignation or leave of the Secretary and Treasurer and other officers employed therein ;
- (i) invite and deal with all tenders received for annual supplies and services required by the Board ;

- (j) arrange all insurance policies, whether in respect of fire, fidelity guarantee, workmen's compensation, or any other risk.

The control and administration of the several Institutions of the Board, are allocated to Standing Committees as follows :—(1) Somerset Hospital to the Somerset Hospital Committee ; (2) Rondebosch and Mowbray Cottage Hospital and Woodstock Hospital to the Rondebosch and Woodstock Hospitals Committee ; (3) Victoria Hospital, Wynberg, and Simon's Town—Kalk Bay Hospital to the Wynberg and Simon's Town Hospitals Committee ; (4) Eaton Convalescent Home and McGregor Convalescent Home to the Convalescent Homes Committee ; and (5) Cape Town Free Dispensary, Peninsula Maternity Hospital and the C.H.B. District Nursing Organisation to the Combined Institutions Committee.

Duties of these Committees are as follows:—

- (a) Exercise a general supervision of such Institution or Institutions, including the fabric and grounds thereof ;
- (b) Carry out such regulations as may be framed by the Board in respect of such Institution or Institutions ;
- (c) Subject to the approval of the Board, make all professional and other appointments in connection with such Institution or Institutions ;
- (d) Deal with the representations of patients in and members of the Staff of such Institution or Institutions ;
- (e) Advise the Board in all matters affecting such Institution or Institutions ;
- (f) In December of each year, in consultation with the Secretary and Treasurer of the Board, frame Estimates of the recurrent income and expenditure of such

Institution, or Institutions in respect of that year and submit the same without delay to the Finance and General Purposes Committee ;

- (g) Generally administer such Institution or Institutions, provided, however, that no expenditure shall be incurred unless prior provision has been made therefor in the approved. Estimates of the Board for the current year or by special resolution of the Board.

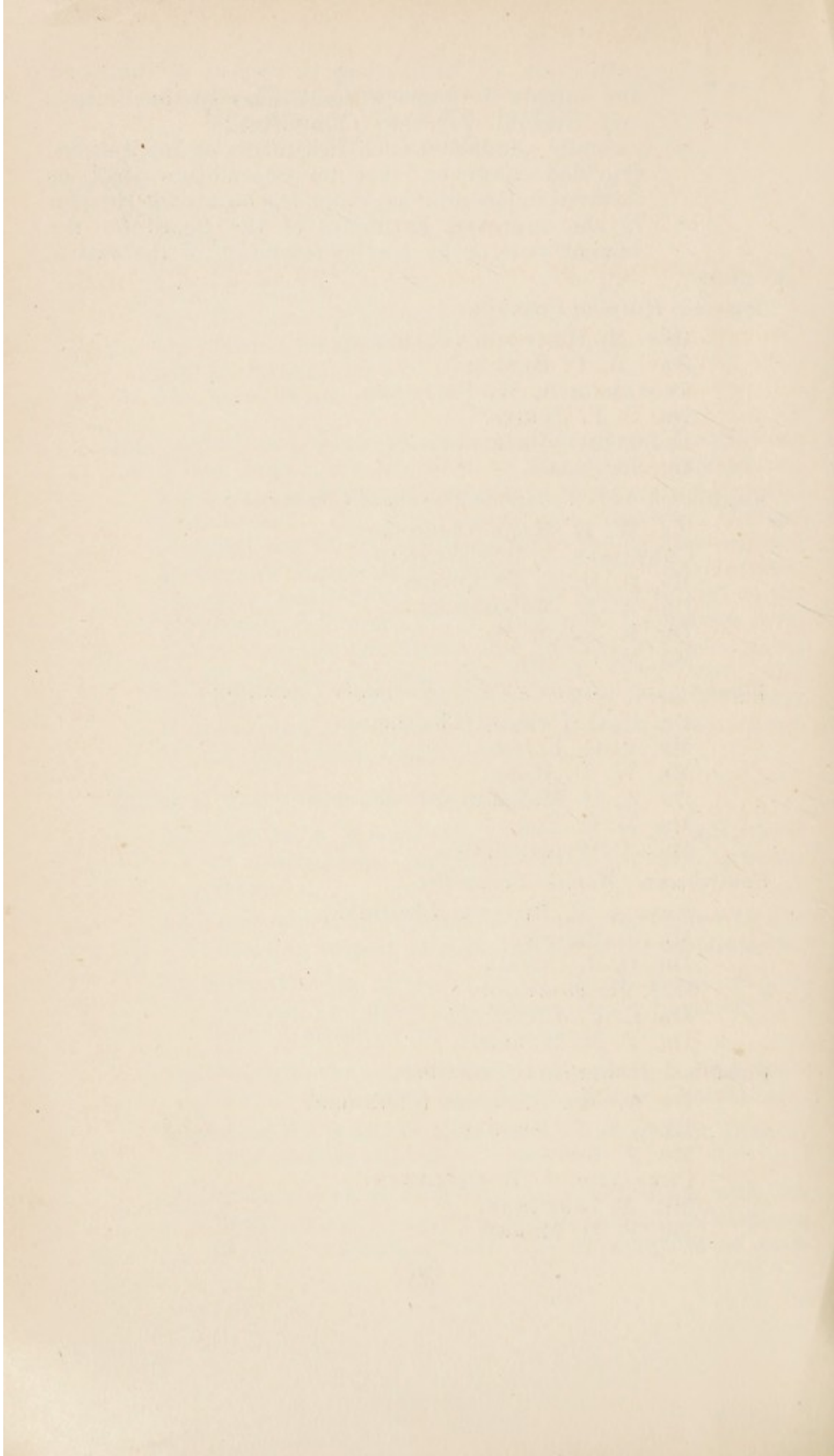

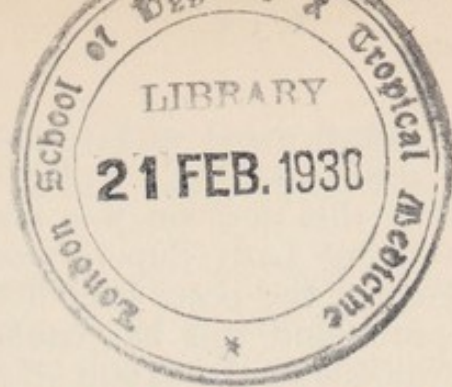

MINUTE

of the Chairman of the Board for the Year 1928-1929.

HOSPITAL DEVELOPMENT.—The work of levelling the site of the new hospital to be built on the Grootte Schuur Estate, has been protracted rather longer than was anticipated a year ago. The earth works and stone pitching, etc., are now completed, however, and the site will be ready for building operations at the end of the current month. On the other hand, the Administrator has not yet signified his approval or otherwise of the scheme, so that it is not possible, at this stage, to say when actual building operations will be proceeded with, or whether the scheme will take the form outlined in last year's Annual Report of the Board.

In the meantime, the pressure on the hospital accommodation in the Peninsula has, if anything, been more acute than ever during the past year, notwithstanding the efforts which the Board has made to cope with the position by increasing the bed roll of certain institutions. In this connection it may be of interest to note that 8,855 persons were treated in the Board's hospitals in 1928, compared with 7,989 treated in 1927. This increase is reflected at all the hospitals, the largest proportional increase being at the Rondebosch and Mowbray Cottage Hospital.

The number of inmates accommodated at the Eaton and McGregor Convalescent Homes rose from 642 in 1927, to 714 in 1928. For some time past the Board have not been satisfied that the best possible use has been made of the two convalescent homes referred to, and it has now been decided to alter the character of the homes to some extent by providing trained nursing attendance for inmates in need of it. By this means, it is thought that it will be possible to clear hospital beds more rapidly than has hitherto been possible, and thus enable a larger number of acute cases to be dealt with. The difficulty in the past has been that in a good many instances it has been impossible to discharge from hospital, patients who were more or less convalescent, for the reason that, for want of a certain amount of nursing attendance which was not available in the homes of these patients, the beneficial effects of their hospital treatment would probably have been lost. The Board, therefore, decided to appoint to the staff of the Eaton Convalescent Home,

a trained nurse with the status of Sister, who would be required to undertake the nursing charge of the inmates of both homes. After this decision was made, the Lady Superintendent and the Assistant Lady Superintendent of the Eaton Convalescent Home resigned the posts held by them, the former by reason of failing health, and this has enabled the Board to revise their original proposals to the extent of arranging to appoint a trained nurse as Matron of the Eaton Convalescent Home, with a housekeeper to assist her in the management of that institution.

MEMBERSHIP OF THE BOARD.—As required by the law, the following elective members of the Board retired in October last :

Rev. A. P. Bender (representing the contributors to Somerset Hospital).

Dr. R. Sharp (representing the contributors to Woodstock Hospital).

Mr. W. D. Hare (representing the contributors to Rondebosch and Mowbray Cottage Hospital).

Dr. O. J. Currie (representing the contributors to Victoria Hospital, Wynberg).

Mr. P. G. Flint (representing the contributors to Simon's Town-Kalk Bay Hospital).

Dr. F. M. Morris (representing the contributors to the Peninsula Maternity Hospital, Cape Town Free Dispensary, Eaton and McGregor Convalescent Homes and C. H. B. District Nursing Organisation).

All these members were re-elected to the Board.

Of the three members appointed to represent the Administrator, namely Dr. P. M. Daneel, Mr. G. H. E. Dickinson and Mr. M. C. Vos, the first-named was due to retire last year, and he was re-appointed by the Administrator. Dr. Daneel subsequently resigned, and Mr. A. Liberman was appointed in his place.

The Cape Town Council re-appointed Mrs. Horwood and myself, and the Divisional Council of the Cape re-appointed Chevalier J. B. Callanan and Dr. C. F. Juritz, and appointed Mr. J. Brown as their third representative.

Mr. A. Withinshaw was appointed as the representative of the Municipalities of Simon's Town and Durbanville.

The following were re-appointed to represent the Honorary Visiting Medical Officers: Professor A. W. Falconer, Dr. A. R. McLachlan and Dr. Julius Petersen.

CHAIRMANSHIP AND VICE-CHAIRMANSHIP OF THE BOARD.—At a special meeting of the Board held on 26th October, 1928, I was honoured by being appointed Chairman of the Board, and Dr. Julius Petersen was appointed Vice-Chairman.

The Board took the opportunity of expressing their appreciation of the valuable services which Mr. M. C. Vos had rendered in his capacity as Chairman.

SOMERSET HOSPITAL.—It was mentioned in the last Annual Report that the Board had purchased a large dwelling-house at Mouille Point for the accommodation of the additional nursing staff required in connection with the increase in the accommodation for patients at that institution. The dwelling-house referred to is now used exclusively for housing the night nurses, and has proved quite suitable for its purpose. An extension of one of the nurses homes of the hospital was carried out during the year, providing accommodation for seven nurses.

During the year it has been possible to effect extensive repairs and renovations to the buildings of the hospital. This work has been carried out departmentally on an economical basis, under the supervision of the Engineer of the hospital, who deserves considerable credit for his work in this connection, and the result has been to restore to the hospital the clean and orderly appearance which should belong to an institution of this kind. Much remains to be done, but a good start has been made, and progress will be maintained with the funds available for the purpose.

WOODSTOCK HOSPITAL.—In June, 1928, two part-time medical officers for the out-patient department of this institution were appointed, one to deal with out-patients attending at the hospital, and the other to visit cases at their homes. Prior to the date mentioned, there had been only one medical officer to deal with out-patients.

RONDEBOSCH AND MOWBRAY COTTAGE HOSPITAL.—Provision has been made for the addition of four beds at this institution, which will bring the total number of beds to 54.

A new X-Ray room and a dining room for the nurses, both of which were urgently needed, were completed at this institution in May last at a cost of a little over £200.

VICTORIA HOSPITAL, WYNBERG.—As foreshadowed in the last Annual Report of the Board, arrangements are being made for the erection of a new block for coloured patients at this institution. This block will be adjacent to and in communication with the existing hospital buildings, and as at present planned, consists of a three-storeyed building constructed in accordance with modern hospital practice, containing accommodation for 44 beds, together with duty rooms, ward kitchens, etc. The Administrator having intimated his approval of the scheme, plans, specifications and quantities are now being prepared, and it is hoped to commence

building operations within a few weeks. As soon as the new building is ready for occupation, the use, as a ward, of the wood and iron building, known as "Hygeia," containing 17 beds, which has been condemned as unfit for such a purpose, will be discontinued, so that the nett increase in the accommodation for coloured patients will be 27 beds. It may be mentioned that the new building is being constructed in such a way that further storeys may be added to it.

It is proposed to utilise the "Hygeia" building as an out-patient department, the need for which is very great.

Provision has also been made for an extension of the nurses' home, which is rendered necessary by the enlargement of the hospital.

PENINSULA MATERNITY HOSPITAL.—The property known as "Buckingham Lodge," which was acquired from the Eastern Telegraph Co., Ltd., and has been the home of the Peninsula Maternity Hospital for some years past, has proved to be entirely unsuited for the purposes of the hospital. As was stated in the last Annual Report, plans were prepared by the Public Works Department for the erection of a new building on the vacant part of the site, but for various reasons the Board have decided to abandon these plans altogether, and to instruct a private architect to prepare a new scheme. Sketch plans have already been submitted to and approved by the responsible committee, and it is hoped that before very long the Board will be in a position to proceed with this much needed improvement. In this connection, it may be pointed out that, although a maternity hospital block is included in the plans of the new hospital at Groote Schuur, the need for a maternity hospital in the area now served by the Peninsula Maternity Hospital will always exist; an essential part of the training of midwives is the attendance upon patients in their own homes, and this can best be provided for in congested districts.

CAPE TOWN FREE DISPENSARY.—Plans for the extension of the Cape Town Free Dispensary buildings, to which reference was made in the last Annual Report, have been completed, and a tender for the work has been accepted. As previously intimated, the cost of the work is being defrayed out of a bequest of £20,000 to the institution from the late Mr. Michael Hiddingh. Part of the additional work at the institution which will be undertaken as soon as the necessary accommodation is available, is the establishment of a dental clinic, and the Board wish to record their cordial thanks to the Dental Society of the Cape Province, and in particular to Mr. M. Braun, for the very valuable advice and assistance which they have given, and are still giving, in this connection.

DISTRICT NURSING.—The district nursing work of the Board was further extended during the year by the establishment of a branch at Southfield. For various reasons, this branch has not been entirely successful, and negotiations are now proceeding for the transfer of the work of the branch to a new branch which it is hoped to establish at Plumstead. Steps are also being taken to establish a branch in the Mowbray area. The number of district nurses in the Board's employ, exclusive of the Superintendent of District Nurses, is now 22.

During the year it was deemed desirable to revise the basic rules of the Organisation.

Representations having been made during the year to the effect that, without adequate transport, it was impossible for the district nurse employed in the Lakeside-Kommetje branch to deal with the huge area for which she was responsible, it was decided to purchase for this nurse an Austin 7 h.p. car, and to pay her a transport allowance of £10 per month, out of which she is required to defray the running expenses of the car and also to refund to the Board monthly an amount sufficient to refund the cost of the car in a period of $3\frac{1}{2}$ years. A similar arrangement was made in the case of the Superintendent of District Nurses.

TRAINING OF NURSES.—The revised syllabus of lectures to nurses as laid down by the Colonial Medical Council and adopted by the South African Medical Council, has necessitated, *inter alia*, the appointment of a Sister Tutor at Somerset Hospital. In response to advertisements issued in this country and overseas, only one suitable application was received for this post, namely, that of Miss S. Marwick, who is now on her way to South Africa to take up the appointment. Provision has been made in the Current Estimates of Expenditure for the employment of Sister Tutors at the other institutions controlled by the Board.

Under the regulations of the Medical Council, training schools for nurses are divided into two classes. The period of training at a Class I. training school, is $3\frac{1}{2}$ years and that at a Class II. training school is $4\frac{1}{2}$ years. One of the requirements in connection with a Class I. institution is that a Resident Medical Officer must be employed there, and, mainly in order to restore to the Woodstock Hospital, Rondebosch and Mowbray Cottage Hospital and Victoria Hospital, Wynberg, their status as first-class training schools, it has been necessary to appoint a Resident Medical Officer at each of the institutions mentioned.

At the examination for nurses held by the Colonial Medical Council in June of last year, 24 candidates entered as follows: Somerset Hospital, 17; Woodstock Hospital, 5; Victoria Hospital, Wynberg, 2. These candidates were all successful, with the exception of one from Somerset Hospital. The following awards were accordingly made under the Board's prize scheme:

In order of merit in the examination list for the Province, Miss Fear was first, Miss Oldfield second and Miss Mathews third. This examination was remarkable for the fact that the five candidates who entered from Woodstock Hospital secured the first five places in order of merit.

At the December examination, 14 candidates entered as follows: Somerset Hospital, 8; Woodstock Hospital, 2; Rondebosch and Mowbray Cottage Hospital, 3; Victoria Hospital, Wynberg, 1. These candidates were all successful, with the exception of one from Somerset Hospital and the one from the Victoria Hospital, Wynberg. A prize of £5 was awarded in this connection to Miss H. M. Rowlands, who was placed third in order of merit in the examination list. In accordance with a standing rule of the Board, the second and third prizes were withheld on this occasion, the places in order of merit occupied by the remaining successful candidates being too low to justify the award of such prizes.

At the examination for midwives held in April (1928), five candidates entered from the Peninsula Maternity Hospital, and all were successful. Miss E. Bismire, who was bracketed for second place, with two others, in the examination list for the Province, was awarded the Board's prize of £2 10s.

At the October examination for midwives, eleven candidates entered from the Peninsula Maternity Hospital, and ten passed, Miss F. E. Brennan taking second place in the examination list and being awarded the Board's prize of £2 10s.

Negotiations are proceeding with the City Health Department with a view to facilities being afforded to enable nurse-probationers at the Board's hospitals to undergo a course of training in fever nursing as part of their ordinary curriculum. The matter has already been agreed to in principle, and it now remains to settle the details of the scheme.

MOTOR AMBULANCES.—During the calendar year 1928, 3942 cases (including 368 due to street accidents) were removed in the Board's ambulances, an average of 328 per month. Of this number, 2724 removals were free and 1218 were charged for.

At the beginning of this year a new ambulance was taken into use. This vehicle, which consists of a locally built body mounted on a special Bean ambulance chassis, has proved to be in every way superior to its predecessors.

EXEMPTION FROM SECTION 54 OF ORDINANCE NO. 5 OF 1912.—At the request of the Board, the Administrator, with the advice of the Executive Committee, approved of the exemption during the calendar year 1928, of all the institutions under the control of the Board from the provisions of sub-section (a) of Section 54 of Ordinance No. 5 of 1912, and of Somerset Hospital and the Peninsula Maternity Hospital from the provisions of sub-section (b) of the same section.

BROWN AND ANNIE LAWRENCE HOME.—Under the will of the late Mr. Brown Lawrence, provision was made for the establishment of a Trust for the purpose of erecting and maintaining a home for aged ladies and gentlemen, to be styled the "Brown and Annie Lawrence Home." The Home is to be administered by a Board of Management, consisting of seven persons, five of whom are to be elected triennially by the Cape Hospital Board, and the remaining two to be nominated by the Cape Provincial Administration and to hold office for three years. The first Board of Management has now assumed office, Mrs. E. Barnard Fuller, Mrs. A. B. Reid, Rev. A. P. Bender, Mr. A. Liberman and Mr. A. Withinshaw having been elected by the Board, and Mr. C. M. Gibbs, M.P.C. and Mr. M. C. Vos having been appointed by the Provincial Administration. Mr. Vos has been elected Chairman of the new Board, and Mr. R. J. Lonsdale has been appointed Honorary Secretary. The building of the Home, which is situated at Pinelands, is now nearing completion, and it is hoped that an early start will be made with the work of equipping and furnishing it, and appointing a staff.

MEMORIAL TO THE LATE MRS. A. EBURN SALMON.—On 7th February, 1929, the Rev. A. P. Bender, on behalf of the Board, unveiled a tablet in the Bickersteth Ward of Somerset Hospital in memory of Mrs. A. Eburn Salmon, M.B.E., who devoted a great part of her life to the interests of the sick poor of Cape Town, and particularly the patients at Somerset Hospital, with the management of which institution she had been closely associated for many years.

ENDOWMENT OF BED.—Under the will of the late M. J. Schierhout, the sum of £1,500 was bequeathed to Somerset Hospital to be applied in such manner as the Board may decide,

subject to the condition that at least one bed in the hospital is to be styled and generally referred to as "The Schierhout Bed." In accordance with the Board's usual practice, in such matters, £1,000 of the bequest has been set aside and specially invested to form a fund for the endowment, in perpetuity, of a free bed in the hospital. The balance of £500 has been placed to the Funds Account of the institution.

REGULATIONS OF THE BOARD.—The work of revising the Board's regulations is still proceeding. Considerable difficulty has been experienced in framing the regulations in such a way as to allow for a certain amount of elasticity having regard to the varying conditions at the several institutions, and, at the same time, to guard against ambiguity.

INSPECTION OF INSTITUTIONS.—During the year an inspection of the institutions controlled by the Board was carried out by Dr. A. J. van der Spuy, Assistant Health Officer in the Department of Public Health. The various recommendations and suggestions contained in Dr. van der Spuy's report are being dealt with by the Board. It is noteworthy that Dr. van der Spuy once more draws attention to the fact that the hospital accommodation for the sick poor in the Cape Peninsula is totally inadequate, a fact which, of course, is only too well known to the Board, who are continually faced by the problem of dealing with the numerous urgent cases for whom no beds are available. The chronic condition at nearly all the Peninsula hospitals is one of overcrowding, a condition which renders the proper conduct of the hospitals a matter of extreme difficulty.

NURSES' SALARIES AND PENSIONS.—The Board are strongly of opinion that the emoluments of nurses employed in State-aided hospitals in the Cape Province, as laid down by law, are inadequate; a view which appears to be shared by all the Hospital Boards in the Province. This factor makes it extremely difficult to stabilise the nursing staffs of the hospitals, especially when it is remembered that higher salaries are paid to nurses in other parts of the Union. Moreover, the Cape law makes no provision for the creation of specialised posts; a small allowance (£10) per annum may be paid to a sister engaged in X-Ray or theatre work, under certain restricted conditions, but apart from this, there is no inducement whatever to nurses to qualify in the several specialised departments of modern nursing practice. As an instance of the difficulties with which the Board are confronted in this connection, may be mentioned their experience with regard to the appointment of a Sister for

X-Ray and Massage work at the Victoria Hospital, Wynberg, and the Rondebosch and Mowbray Cottage Hospital. Some months ago, negotiations were begun with a lady who is qualified in both respects, and as a measure of economy, the Board devised a scheme under which she could, if appointed, divide her time between the two hospitals mentioned ; but inasmuch as she, quite naturally, is not disposed to accept the post at the ordinary salary of a Sister—even the allowance of £10 per annum could not apply to the proposed appointment—and as the Provincial Administration has, so far, declined to authorise the creation of a special scale of salary in her case, the question of her appointment is still undecided.

The question of nurses' pensions is intimately bound up with that of their emoluments. Under the existing law, nurses are required to contribute one per cent. of their emoluments to the Pension Fund, and it is said that this contribution is too small to allow of the payment to them of an adequate pension on their retirement. Be that as it may, the fact remains that, under present conditions, when a lady who has spent the whole of her active life in nursing the sick, reaches the age at which she is considered to be no longer fit for service, she is rewarded by a pittance on which she is barely able to sustain life, let alone provide herself with the ordinary comforts to which she is entitled.

The Board have made repeated representations to the Provincial Administration regarding the emoluments and pensions of nurses, and it is hoped that, in the near future, these will bear fruit.

HEAD OFFICE STAFF.—Mr. W. Sinclair Thomson, the first Secretary and Treasurer of the Board, who had held that position for nearly 16 years, resigned from the service on 31st January, 1929, in order to take up the position of Town Clerk of East London. On 23rd January, 1929, the Board, after expressing appreciation of Mr. Thomson's services, adopted the following resolution :

- (a) That on the occasion of the resignation of Mr. W. Sinclair Thomson from the position of Secretary and Treasurer of the Cape Hospital Board, which office he has held since the establishment of the Board in 1913, the thanks of the Board are hereby accorded to him for the invaluable services which he has rendered to the Board and the public over a period of nearly sixteen years ; the congratulations of the Board are extended to him upon his appointment as Town Clerk of East London, and they assure him of their best wishes for his success in all his future undertakings.

- (b) That as a special mark of appreciation of Mr. Thomson's efficient, zealous and successful administration of the hospitals and kindred institutions in the Cape Division under the control of this Board, it is ordered that this resolution be inscribed in the Minutes and be conveyed to Mr. Thomson in the form of a certified extract from the Minutes attested by the signature of all the members of the Board.

The Administrator approved of Mr. Thomson being granted four months' leave of absence on full pay, notwithstanding that he would be in receipt of remunerative employment during that period.

Mr. F. B. Morris has been appointed Acting Secretary and Treasurer and Mr. E. R. Kemp has been appointed Acting Accountant for a period of four months from 1st February, 1929.

Consequent upon Mr. Thomson's resignation, some re-organisation of the Head Office staff will be necessary, but this matter is being held in abeyance, pending the settlement of the permanent appointment to the two posts mentioned.

HEAD OFFICE ACCOMMODATION.—The premises which have been occupied by the Head Office for the past four years, have been found to be very unsatisfactory, both from the points of view of the Board and the Staff. Prolonged negotiations with the Divisional Council have at length resulted in accommodation being provided for the Board's offices on the fourth floor of the Council's new building in Dorp Street, Cape Town. The space available is ample for the Board's requirements, and an additional advantage of the arrangement is that the Board will have the use of the fine Council Chamber for their monthly meetings. The Board hopes to remove to their new quarters by the end of this month.

OBITUARY.—It is with deep regret that I record the deaths of three ex-members of the Board.

The Reverend George Robson, who died on 6th April, 1928, was one of the Administrator's representatives on the Board when it was first instituted in 1913, and he continued to hold office in that capacity until he retired in January, 1919. He will be remembered by the older members of the Board for the special part he took in the founding of the Salt River Free Dispensary and the Peninsula Maternity Hospital.

Sir John James Graham, K.C.M.G., died on 17th December, 1928. He was also one of the original members of the Board as a representative of the old Claremont Municipality. Sir John was

the first Vice-Chairman of the Board, and was responsible to a very large extent for the framing of the Board's policy which, in fundamental matters, has remained unchanged to this day.

Mr. Henry Flint East, another of the original members of the Board, died on 19th February, 1929. He became Chairman of the Finance Committee in 1915 and Vice-Chairman of the Board in 1916, and in 1921 he succeeded the late Mr. George Smart as Chairman of the Board, which position he held until the year 1926. Mr. East continued to be a member of the Board until September of last year, when failing health forced him to relinquish his membership. It would be impossible to exaggerate the value of Mr. East's services to the Board. The years during which he occupied the Chair were, probably, the most anxious period of the Board's existence; the financial stringency which characterised the post-war period, was then most acutely felt, and the fact that the Board were able to emerge successfully from the trials to which they were subjected, was, in very great measure, attributable to his wise and prudent leadership.

Yet another death falls to be mentioned. On 8th April, 1928, Mr. G. P. Kling died after a short illness. For 27 years Mr. Kling had voluntarily carried on the work of masseur at Somerset Hospital, and when called upon, he was always ready to extend his labour of love to patients in other institutions of the Board. Mr. Kling's life and work are an example to us all.

ACKNOWLEDGMENTS.—On behalf of the Board I desire to thank all those organisations and individuals who have assisted in various ways in promoting the welfare of the hospitals and allied institutions during the past year.

The Board's thanks are especially due to the Mayoress of Cape Town (Mrs. A. B. Reid, jnr.) and those associated with her in the organisation of the Hospital Ball, which realised the sum of £1,226, and the organisers of the Hospital Saturday collection and the mid-week street collection (Mrs. W. G. R. Murray and Mrs. H. J. Stodel), and the collectors who worked with them; the proceeds of the two collections mentioned amounted to £975 8s. 1d. and £655 16s. 2d., respectively.

Toc H (Cape Town Central Group), who are always so ready to assist in any good cause, again organised the collections at the Sunday evening concerts.

Collections made in the Churches and elsewhere in connection with Hospital Sunday, amounted to nearly £373, and collections on board the ships of the Union Castle Mail S.S. Co., Ltd., in aid of Somerset Hospital, totalled nearly £338.

Christmas Cheer donations to the several hospitals amounted to £223 10s. 10d. During the year, a bequest of £1,800 was received from the Estate of the late Mr. and Mrs. Andrew Cunningham ; in accordance with the provisions of the Will, this money was invested, and the income is being used for Christmas presents for the Matron and nursing staff of Woodstock Hospital.

In accordance with the practice which has been followed for several years, part of the proceeds of the " Charity " race meeting at Milnerton was donated to the hospitals ; in this connection, the Board desire to thank the officials and others who, it is understood, followed their practice of previous years in giving their services free on this occasion.

In conclusion, I wish to express my thanks to the staff of the several institutions and the Head Office, for their co-operation and assistance throughout the year.

SOMERSET HOSPITAL.

The following lists contain particulars of diseases for which In patients were treated at Somerset Hospital during the year 1928—a year which marked the inauguration of several special departments which led to a tremendous increase in the number of patients treated mainly as out-patients, as, owing to the unfortunate shortage of accommodation very few beds (or none at all as in the case of the Department of Psychological Medicine) are available to these departments.

With the help of distinctive out-patient cards containing full clinical notes, it should be possible in future to publish more complete reports. The great increase in the work of the X-ray department has made it necessary to confine diagnostic work to in-patients and patients from other hospital departments, so that this department is no longer available to private practitioners. As soon as the Deep therapy apparatus is in full working order it will hardly be possible for one part-time Radiologist to cope with the work.

During the year an Honorary Physio-therapist was appointed in charge of the massage and medical electricity department. This department has been extended as much as limited space will permit and provided with up-to-date diathermy apparatus and ultra violet ray apparatus which has been of great use in cutting short the length of stay in hospital of certain cases not amenable to ordinary treatment.

The list for the Ear, Nose and Throat Department includes both European and non-European cases. Urological and Orthopaedic cases are included with surgical; cases from the Dermatological, Paediatric and Psychological Medicine departments are included under medical.

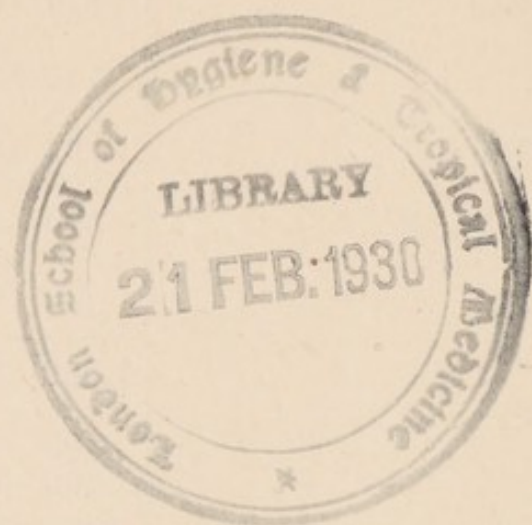

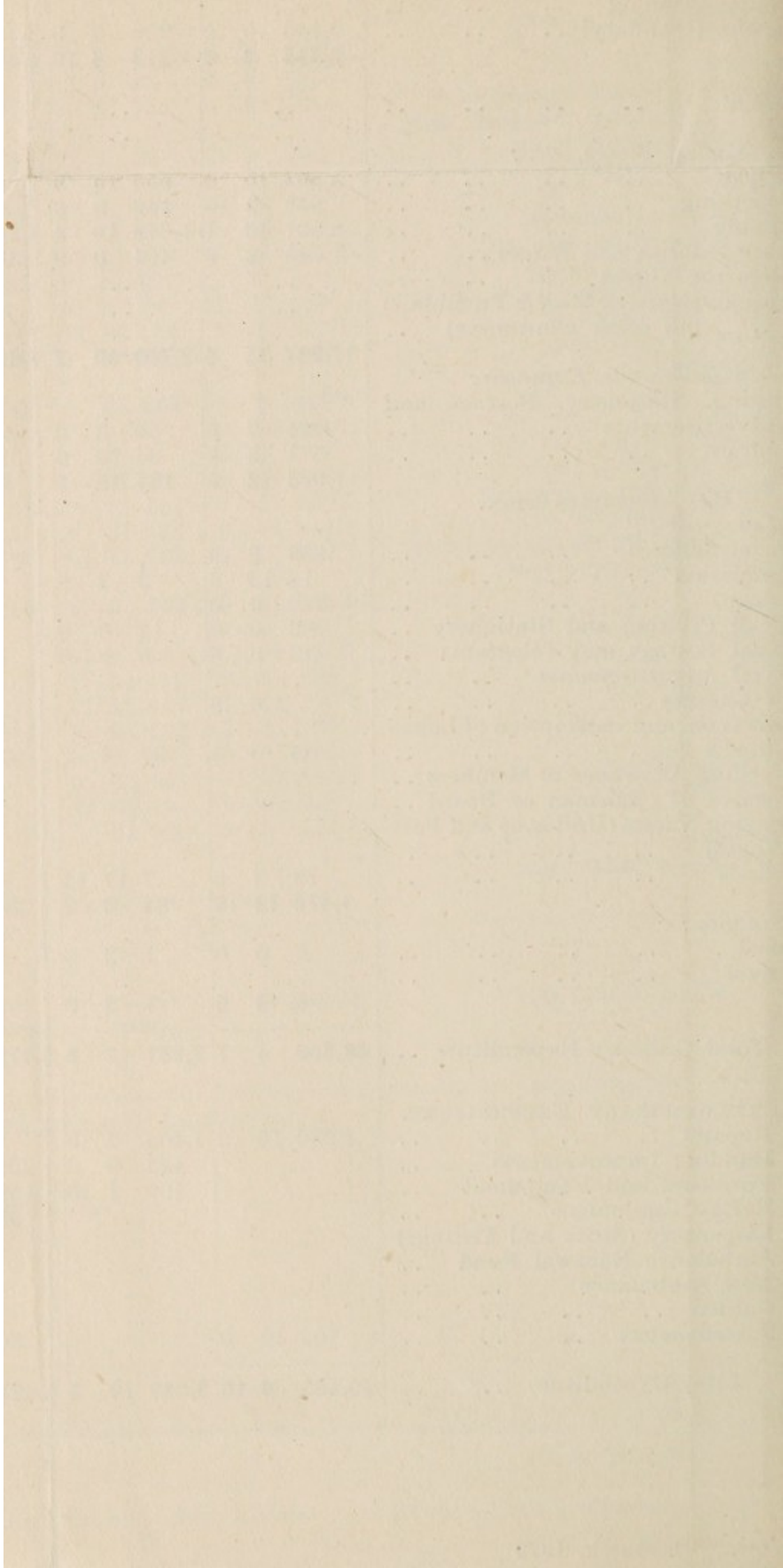
