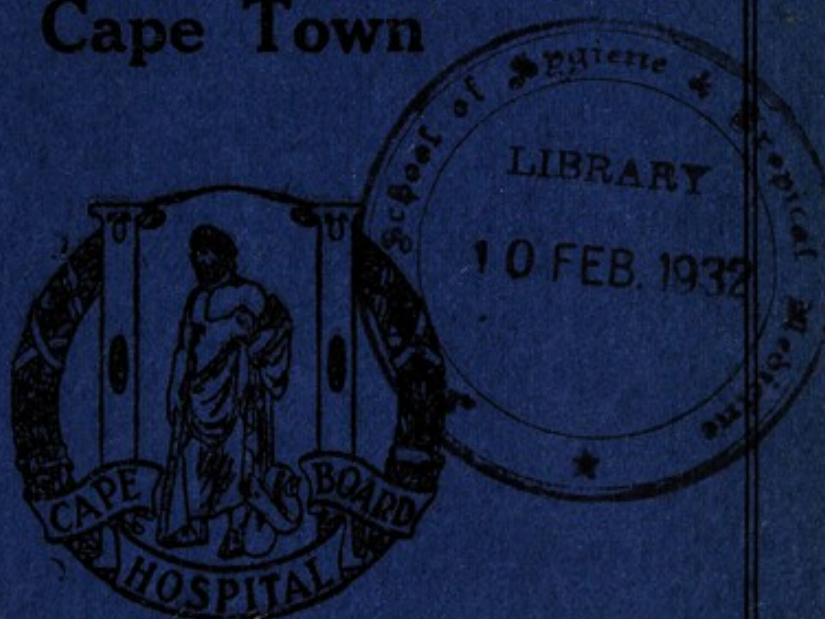

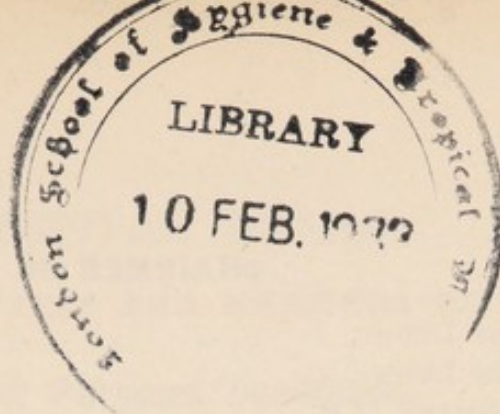

### Finance and General Purposes Committee.

#### *Duties :*

The Finance and General Purposes Committee shall, in accordance with the Rules of Order, and with the approval of the Board :

- (a) supervise all the fiscal concerns of the Board and report periodically as to the state of the several funds of the Board ;
- (b) prepare and submit to the Board in the month of December in each year a statement of the estimated capital income and expenditure and of the recurrent income and expenditure of the Board in respect of that year ;
- (c) prepare and submit to the Board during the month of December in each year a statement of the estimated recurrent income and expenditure of the Board's Institutions in respect of that year, which shall be framed after consultation with the other Standing Committees concerned ;
- (d) receive at each monthly meeting a statement of the payments effected by the Secretary and Treasurer of the Board during the preceding calendar month, and thereafter report to the Board the total amount of the expenditure in question ;
- (e) arrange all investments of moneys held by or funds entrusted to the Board ;
- (f) report to the Board at the request of any of the other Standing Committees as to the provision of funds for any object connected with the administration of the Board or any of its Institutions ;
- (g) supervise the collection of all revenue due to the Board and its Institutions ;
- (h) be responsible for the control of the Head Office of the Board, and deal with all matters appertaining to the appointment, emoluments, resignation or leave of the Secretary and Treasurer and other officers employed therein ;
- (i) invite and deal with all tenders received for annual supplies and services required by the Board ;



- (j) arrange all insurance policies, whether in respect of fire, fidelity guarantee, workmen's compensation, or any other risk.

The control and administration of the several Institutions of the Board, are allocated to Standing Committees as follows :—(1) Somerset Hospital to the Somerset Hospital Committee ; (2) Rondebosch and Mowbray Hospital and Woodstock Hospital to the Rondebosch and Woodstock Hospitals Committee ; (3) Victoria Hospital, Wynberg, and False Bay Hospital to the Wynberg and Simon's Town Hospitals Committee ; (4) Eaton Convalescent Home and McGregor Convalescent Home to the Convalescent Homes Committee ; and (5) Cape Town Free Dispensary, Peninsula Maternity Hospital and the C.H.B. District Nursing Organisation to the Combined Institutions Committee.

*Duties of these Committees are as follows :—*

- (a) Exercise a general supervision of such Institution or Institutions, including the fabric and grounds thereof ;
- (b) Carry out such regulations as may be framed by the Board in respect of such Institution or Institutions ;
- (c) Subject to the approval of the Board, make all professional and other appointments in connection with such Institution or Institutions ;
- (d) Deal with the representations of patients in and members of the Staff of such Institution or Institutions ;
- (e) Advise the Board in all matters affecting such Institution or Institutions ;
- (f) In December of each year, in consultation with the Secretary and Treasurer of the Board, frame Estimates of the recurrent income and expenditure of such Institution, or Institutions in respect of that year



and submit the same without delay to the Finance and General Purposes Committee ;

- (g) Generally administer such Institution or Institutions, provided, however, that no expenditure shall be incurred unless prior provision has been made therefor in the approved Estimates of the Board for the current year or by special resolution of the Board.

## **MINUTE**

### **of the Chairman of the Board for the Year 1930-1931.**

---

This is the third occasion upon which I have had the honour of signing the Annual Report of the Cape Hospital Board in the capacity of Chairman. I was first elected to that position on 26th October, 1928, and I can honestly say that the period which has elapsed since that date has been the most interesting in the whole of my experience. The task of alleviating human suffering is one which must appeal to any man of sensibility, and I find it impossible to express the intense satisfaction I derive from my association with the great work which is carried out by the Cape Hospital Board.

The year 1930, so far as the Board's institutions are concerned, was marked by steady progress in all directions. In my previous report I referred to a verbal statement made by Dr. van der Spuy (Assistant Medical Officer of Health) to the effect that he was greatly impressed by the change for the better which had taken place since his previous inspection in 1928. That statement was fully confirmed in his official report, subsequently presented to the Board through the Provincial Secretary. Dr. van der Spuy made a further inspection of the institutions at the beginning of this year, and our Secretary informs me that, just prior to his return to Pretoria, Dr. van der Spuy said, "I congratulate you on the condition of your hospitals." This is high praise indeed, and will be as gratifying to the members of the Board, all of whom have worked hard and well in the interests of our institutions, as it is to me personally.

I indicated in my previous report that the Board's major efforts in regard to development are directed towards the realisation of the Groote Schuur Hospital scheme. Some three, or possibly four, years must necessarily elapse, in the most favourable circumstances, before that scheme is completed; in the meantime the Board are faced with the task of coping with the ever-increasing demands upon their resources. As evidence that their efforts to deal with the position have been met with a considerable measure of success I would quote the following figures:—In 1930, 10,323 indoor patients were treated at the several institutions, as compared with 9,487 during the year 1929; and the number of out-patients' attendances rose from 174,427 in 1929 to 199,242 in 1930. The



increase in the number of convalescents cared for was proportionately far greater, the figures for 1929 and 1930 being 699 and 954 respectively. These figures are the more remarkable when the great increase as between 1929 and the preceding year, to which reference has previously been made, is taken into account.

The following summary of the Board's activities during the year is necessarily brief and incomplete, but will serve as an indication of the manner in which those activities have been directed.

**GROOTE SCHUUR HOSPITAL.**—The actual work of construction in connexion with the new hospital has been begun by the letting of a contract for the foundations of the main building. This contract was awarded to the lowest tenderers, Messrs. W. Cornelius (Ppty.), Ltd., of Durban, at a price of £49,846. The site was handed over to the contractors on 20th January, 1931, and the work is to be completed within 14 months from that date. The Public Works Department are now proceeding with the preparation of working drawings, specifications, etc., for the superstructure, and presumably contracts for the next succeeding section of the work will be completed before the conclusion of the contract for the foundations, so that the erection of the hospital will be continued without any break.

I wish to record the Board's appreciation of the services rendered by Mr. Vos (the Vice-Chairman) in connexion with the planting of trees and shrubs at the site of the new hospital. It would be impossible to overestimate the value of Mr. Vos' expert knowledge in this regard, which he has so generously placed at the Board's disposal.

**SOMERSET HOSPITAL.**—It is considered that in view of the fact that the work of this, the largest of the Board's institutions, will, in the comparatively near future, be transferred to the new Groote Schuur Hospital, it would be unwise to contemplate any marked development at Somerset Hospital. Pending a settlement of the question of the future of this institution, the Board have, in effect, concentrated upon the general improvement of the conditions there. In the main, these improvements have taken the form of renovations, etc., to the fabric of the several buildings, thus repairing the enforced neglect of many previous years; it can be said to-day that the buildings are now in good shape, and that the hospital is no longer compelled to have recourse to more or less unsatisfactory makeshifts in order to exercise its ordinary functions.

Among various improvements which it has been possible to effect are the complete reorganisation of the sterilising rooms and of the kitchen of the Nurses' Home. The main hospital kitchen has been electrified, and in various directions the administration of the institution has been "tightened-up" generally. The hospital is



particularly fortunate in possessing the services of a most efficient Engineer, under whose supervision continual improvements are being carried out departmentally.

Although the average daily number of indoor patients under treatment at Somerset Hospital during 1930 was about the same as during the preceding year, there was a considerable increase in the number of persons under treatment, the relevant figures for the two years being 4,920 and 5,368; in other words, the average length of stay in hospital was appreciably reduced. In 1929 the average length of stay was 23.73 days, whereas in 1930 the average period was 21.43 days. The close co-operation which now exists between the Hospital and the Convalescent Homes, probably accounts very largely for the reduction.

There was a corresponding increase in the number of attendances upon out-patients, the figures for 1929 and 1930 being 46,653 and 51,949 respectively.

**WOODSTOCK HOSPITAL.**—No special improvements, other than general renovations have been effected at this hospital since my last report. The grounds have, however, been taken in hand, and the appearance of the hospital has been rendered much more pleasing in consequence. The Board have at present in hand various works, including certain necessary alterations to the X-Ray rooms, and the reconstruction of the kitchen. The accommodation for in-patients at this hospital is officially limited to 64, but the average daily number for the whole year 1930 was 66, which will give some indication of the chronic condition of overcrowding there.

**RONDEBOSCH AND MOWBRAY HOSPITAL.**—During the year it was decided to alter the title of this hospital by eliminating the word "Cottage." The institution contains 54 beds, and in view of this, and of the nature of the work performed there, it was considered that the term "Cottage" could no longer be correctly applied to the hospital.

The amenities of the institution have been greatly increased by the provision of a commodious masonry stoep for the European female wards (which was substituted for a dilapidated wooden structure which had long outlived its usefulness) and the erection of an exactly similar stoep at the opposite side of the main hospital building to serve the European male wards. The necessity for utilising the front stoep of the hospital for the accommodation of patients has thus disappeared, and it is now proposed to enclose portions of this stoep for the purpose of enlarging and improving the lighting of the adjacent wards. It is also proposed to enclose two stoeps at the rear of the main building in such a way as to adapt them for use as dressing-duty rooms, which are urgently needed.



The cottage for the Resident Medical Officer, to which I referred in my previous report, is now completed and in occupation, and constitutes a distinct asset to the hospital.

The appearance of the hospital has been very greatly improved by the clearing and painting recently carried out, and I should like to pay a tribute to the enthusiasm of the Matron, as the result of which the grounds, formerly a depressing wilderness, are now clean and tidy and bright with flowers.

**VICTORIA HOSPITAL, WYNBERG.**—This hospital has undergone a complete metamorphosis as the result of the opening, on 7th November, 1930, of the new non-European wards. These wards are housed in a separate block of three storeys with a basement. The opinion has been expressed—and I heartily concur in it—that the new wards are equal, if not superior, to anything of the sort in this country. The total cost of the building, and of the enlargement of the Nurses' Home by twelve rooms with appropriate bath-room and lavatory accommodation, was less than £19,000, and there can be no question that the Board have secured remarkable value for the money spent. The architect (Mr. H. J. Brownlee) displayed exemplary care and forethought, and as an instance of the manner in which he protected the Board's interests at all stages of the work may be mentioned the fact that a saving of over £500 was effected on various items.

As I indicated in my previous report, the commodious and well-lighted basement of the new block has been adapted to serve the purpose of an out-patient department, and in this connexion I wish to place on record the Board's thanks to the Victoria Hospital Association, who contributed £350 towards the cost of the necessary alterations. The department is now being equipped by means of a donation of £500 from the Estate of the late William Templer Buissinné, who bequeathed the sum mentioned for the benefit of the poor of Wynberg, irrespective of race or creed. It is hoped that the out-patient department will be opened in the near future.

The main kitchen of the hospital has been remodelled, and equipped throughout with electrical cooking apparatus. The cost of this work, which was rendered necessary by the enlargement of the hospital, was approximately £1,000; it would be impossible to overestimate the value to the hospital of the alteration.

Another very great improvement has been effected at this hospital by the laying-out of the grounds in front of the institution. This work has enormously enhanced the appearance of the hospital, which is beautifully situated. I wish to record the Board's appreciation of the action of the Victoria Hospital Association, who agreed to contribute £250 towards the cost of laying-out the grounds; and at the same time to thank Mr. Vos for the time and



trouble which he devoted to the supervision of the work. It is still necessary to deal with that portion of the grounds which lie between the main building and the Nurses' Home ; until recently it seemed likely that this additional work would have to be postponed owing to the present financial stringency. However, I am glad to say that, as the result of personal representations made by Mr. Vos to Mr. P. S. Douglas-Hamilton, of Wynberg, the latter, who had just previously given a sum of £100 towards the Kitchen Fund of the hospital, has most generously donated a further amount of £200, which has been earmarked for the further improvement of the grounds. It will thus be possible for the laying-out of the grounds to be completed immediately.

Among other improvements in contemplation at this hospital is the provision of a Dispensary, which will be used mainly in connection with the out-patient department.

The official bed-roll at the Victoria Hospital, Wynberg, is 92 ; actually the large balconies to all floors of the new non-European wing make it possible for patients in excess of that number to be accommodated, and as many as 107 persons have recently been under treatment at one time.

**FALSE BAY HOSPITAL.**—This is the institution which was formerly known as the Simon's Town—Kalk Bay Hospital. The name has been changed chiefly with a view to enlisting the sympathy and support of residents in the Muizenberg area, who apparently had formed the opinion that the old title precluded them from participating in the benefits of the hospital, which, of course, was not the case.

The work carried out at this hospital during the year 1930 shows a very marked increase in comparison with the figures for the preceding year. Whereas in 1929 the average daily number of in-patients was 17.78, the corresponding figure for last year was 23.62, the number of individuals treated having risen from 402 to 506. The improvement is attributable to several causes, among which may be mentioned the reorganisation of the staff, to which I referred last year, and the formation of a Medical Advisory Sub-Committee. With regard to the staff, I am happy to say that the rather drastic action taken by the Board in 1929 has been fully justified by results ; so far as I am aware there has not been the slightest suggestion of friction since the reorganisation was effected.

The Board's application for a loan for the purpose of enlarging the Nurses' Home was duly granted by the Provincial Administration, and the work of adding a second storey to the existing building is now practically completed. The enlarged Home will be as pleasant as any in the Peninsula. When the Matron takes up her residence in the new Home, it will be possible to utilise her present



quarters for hospital purposes ; the accommodation for patients will then be increased from 26 to 28 beds.

Other improvements about to be undertaken at this hospital comprise the provision of a sterilising room, a retiring room for doctors, a sluice room and other minor alterations. The greater part of the cost of these works is being found by the newly-constituted False Bay Hospital Association, the formation of which I heartily welcome. This Association has been founded on the lines of the Victoria Hospital Association, which has performed such excellent service for the Wynberg Hospital. The last Annual Ball held at Simon's Town in aid of the local hospital, which was organised by the ladies and gentlemen who have now formed themselves into an Association, realised no less a sum than £320. Of this amount £120 was placed to Maintenance Account, the balance of £200 being earmarked for the general improvements to which I have referred.

**PENINSULA MATERNITY HOSPITAL.**—The new building for this hospital is now approaching completion, and it is expected that it will be ready for occupation by the middle of this year. Notwithstanding the fact that it was necessary to exercise the very strictest economy in regard to this building, in order that its cost should not exceed the limited funds available, no essential requirement has been sacrificed, and it is safe to say that the new hospital will compare very favourably with similar institutions elsewhere. The bright and airy wards, labour and delivery rooms, operating theatre, nurseries and babies' wash-rooms, duty-rooms, etc., leave little or nothing to be desired, and the whole building has been designed with a view to economical administration. It was found possible to provide for a commodious ante- and post-natal clinic in the basement, and at a later stage to proceed also with the erection of a new kitchen block, which will probably be equipped electrically. The Board have now in hand the matter of re-modelling the old building to serve the purposes of Nurses' Home, accommodation for Resident Medical Officer and students. It is also proposed to erect a new mortuary, and to enclose the ground at the rear of the premises which was recently acquired from the Cape Town Council. As the money available from the loan granted for the re-building of the hospital will not be sufficient for all these purposes, it has been decided to make a grant of £2,000 to the institution from the Board's Contingency Fund.

The Board, in common with other bodies concerned with health matters, have been greatly concerned on account of the acute shortage of practising midwives in this country, and have devised a scheme for an improvement of the position in this respect. Given the necessary financial support, the question presents no great



difficulty. I sincerely hope that the time is not far distant when it will be possible to say that adequate and efficient maternity treatment is available for all in need of it.

**CONVALESCENT HOMES.**—The reorganisation of the work carried out at the two Convalescent Homes maintained by the Board (the Eaton Home for European and non-European adults and the McGregor Home for European children) has proved to be an unqualified success. Not only is skilled nursing attention now given to those inmates of the Homes who are in need of it, but there has been, as I have said before, an extraordinary increase in the number of persons passing through them, as will be seen from the following comparative statement :—

Everything possible is done at both Homes to render the stay of the inmates as pleasant and beneficial as possible.

During the year Dr. Strafford Hewitt, who was until recently Superintendent of the Nelspoort Sanatorium, was appointed Medical Superintendent (part-time) for the Homes, and I consider that his energetic co-operation has contributed in no small degree to the general improvement.

The new non-European female ward at the Eaton Home, which was contrived out of a disused stable, is a very fine addition to the institution, and principally because of it it has been possible to increase the "official" bed-roll at the Home from 44 to 56.

Perhaps the most notable recent improvement at the McGregor Home has been the complete electrification of the kitchen. The electrical equipment was supplied by the British General Electric Co., who also supplied the bulk of the electrical cooking equipment for the Wynberg Hospital.

In view of the fact that everyone connected with the Board's institutions worked splendidly throughout the year, I hesitate to single out any institution for special mention. Nevertheless, I cannot forbear to pay a tribute to the manner in which the McGregor Home is being conducted. It is true that last year the Board spent a considerable sum of money in various improvements, such as the laying-out of the grounds (a matter in which Mr. Vos once again placed his unrivalled experience at the Board's disposal), internal renovations and repairs, and various structural alterations; but I doubt very much whether there would have been a great deal to show for that expenditure in the absence of the enthusiasm and efficiency which have been displayed in the management of the institution. This Home might well, without exaggeration, be



described as a model institution ; and indeed it would scarcely be recognised by a person familiar with its condition so recently as a year ago.

**CAPE TOWN FREE DISPENSARY.**—The space at my disposal does not permit of my making more than a passing reference to the alterations which have been effected at this old-established institution, which was completely reorganised during last year. The facilities available there are now immeasurably greater than formerly, and the appointment of an Honorary Medical Staff, comprising a number of specialists, has undoubtedly been a prime factor in the general improvement. The work carried out at the Free Dispensary shows a progressive increase, as will be seen from the fact that whereas the total number of attendances in February, 1929, was 3,034, the number had risen to 3,532 for the month of February, 1930, and was increased to 4,048 in February of this year. These figures, impressive as they are, do not, however, in themselves indicate the true value of the institution to the public ; that value, to my mind, lies principally in the character of the treatment afforded, and I would point to the fact that the clinics at the Free Dispensary now comprise the following : Ophthalmic, Gynæcological, Pædiatric, Aural (Ear, Nose and Throat), Dermatological and Dental. The lastmentioned covers the remedial dental treatment of school children. Recently the Board were reluctantly compelled to negative a suggestion that they should adopt a massage clinic hitherto conducted under the auspices of the Society for the Protection of Child Life ; they did so because it was considered that the limit of the work which could be handled at the Free Dispensary had already been reached. All the special departments at the institution are working to capacity, and although the Board would like to undertake all remedial work which lies within the scope assigned to them, their efforts must necessarily be limited by the staff, funds and space available.

Dr. A. P. Moore-Anderson, who had held the position of Medical Officer since the beginning of 1920, was compelled, through failing health, to relinquish the position in the early part of this year. He was granted extended leave prior to retirement on pension, and on 1st October, 1930, his place was taken by Dr. J. Prisman, who had, for some months previously, assisted in the work of the institution in an honorary capacity. It had previously been decided that in future the appointment of medical officer at the Cape Town Free Dispensary should endure for a period of one year only, subject to the *proviso* that, in the Board's option, the period might be extended for a further year ; no incumbent, however, is to be allowed to hold the position for more than two years. At that time it was assumed that the practice of employing one full-time medical



officer, and of providing relief for him by means of a part-time assistant, would continue indefinitely, but it has since been decided to introduce, when Dr. Prisman's appointment terminates on 30th September next, a new system under which two stipendiary medical officers will be employed in a full-time capacity. The need for employing a relieving or assistant medical officer will thereby be avoided. The rooms in the older portion of the building which were formerly occupied by the nursing staff have been placed at the disposal of the medical officer, and the accommodation available is sufficient to serve the needs of two medical officers when the arrangement to which I have alluded takes effect. The nursing staff are now housed in the top storey of the new building. The advantage of having the medical officer resident on the premises will be apparent to all.

In addition to his relieving duties, the part-time assistant medical officer to whom I have referred visited at their homes patients who were unable to attend at the Free Dispensary. The "outside" visitation of patients by a medical man is an arrangement of long standing; but there can be no doubt that it is a duty which lies outside the functions of a Hospital Board constituted under Ordinance No. 5 of 1912. It is clear that a Hospital Board may establish and maintain institutions for the treatment of the sick, and that they may also appoint district nurses for the purpose of attending sick persons elsewhere than in an institution; but the provision of medical relief for necessitous persons in their own homes, however necessary such relief may be, is definitely not a duty which falls upon Hospital Boards, and I go so far as to say that in affording such relief in the past the Cape Hospital Board have rendered themselves liable to be surcharged for the cost thereof. The Board have therefore decided entirely to discontinue the outside visitation of patients otherwise than by their district nurses, and in conformity with that decision the facilities for such outside visitation have been withdrawn in the cases of the Cape Town Free Dispensary and Woodstock Hospital. So far as the Board are concerned, therefore, the attendance upon patients in their own homes will in future be limited to the services of the district nurses; and I may say that, with a view to minimising the hardship which might otherwise result from the Board's decision, the gap in the district nursing service which formerly existed in the centre of the city, between what were known as the V.N.I. and St. Paul's and Docks Branches of the District Nursing Organisation, has been closed by the appointment of an additional district nurse to the latter Branch, which is now entitled the St. Paul's and Cape Town Central Branch.

It is within the power of the Local Authorities to provide the relief in the form of the medical attendance to which I have referred;



and I understand that the Cape Town Council have now under consideration a proposal to give such relief in the area under their control. I believe that the assistance of the Board's District Nurses will be invoked in this connexion, and it is not necessary for me to say that the Board will willingly and whole-heartedly co-operate in any practical scheme which may be put forward.

**C.H.B. DISTRICT NURSING ORGANISATION.**—This branch of the Board's work continues to expand. The value of it to the public, and especially the public in the outlying districts, cannot be overestimated. Whereas in 1920 the total number of attendances upon patients numbered 12,938, the corresponding figure for 1930 was 75,807. The educative value of the work of the district nurses, under the extremely efficient supervision of the Superintendent (Miss A. Elliott) is enormous; and I believe that the community as a whole will in time reap incalculable benefit from the lessons in elementary hygiene which the district nurses are daily bringing to the homes of the poor. The Organisation now employs, in addition to the Superintendent, 32 district nurses, inclusive of the additional nurse for the Cape Town Central area, to whom I have referred, and of nurses who have just been appointed for the Windermere and Elsie's River districts. The Organisation is by far the most important of its kind in Africa. I should like to take this opportunity of expressing my appreciation of the enthusiastic co-operation of the officers and members of the various Local Committees of the Organisation.

**DOMESTIC TELEPHONES.**—A notable improvement, and one which has led to a marked saving in time and consequent increase in efficiency, has been effected by the installation of automatic inter-communicating telephone systems at the Woodstock and Wynberg Hospitals and the Cape Town Free Dispensary. A similar system is being installed in the New Peninsula Maternity Hospital building.

**MEMBERSHIP OF THE BOARD.**—As required by law, the following elective members of the Board retired in October, 1930 :—

- Rev. A. P. Bender (representing the contributors to Somerset Hospital).
- Dr. R. Sharp (representing the contributors to Woodstock Hospital).
- Mr. W. D. Hare (representing the contributors to Rondebosch and Mowbray Hospital).
- Dr. O. J. Currie (representing the contributors to Victoria Hospital, Wynberg).
- Miss N. E. Warner (representing the contributors to False Bay Hospital, Simonstown).



Dr. F. M. Morris (representing the contributors to the Peninsula Maternity Hospital, Cape Town Free Dispensary, Eaton and McGregor Convalescent Homes and C.H.B. District Nursing Organisation).

All these members were re-elected to the Board with the exception of Dr. R. Sharp, Mrs. A. M. Morris being elected in his place.

The term of office of Mr. G. H. E. Dickinson, one of the three representatives of the Administrator on the Board, expired last year, and Mr. J. W. L. Krige was appointed in his place.

The term of office of Mrs. H. C. Horwood and Mr. J. Brown, as representatives of the City Council, expired in October last, and they were reappointed for one year and two years, respectively.

The Divisional Council of the Cape reappointed Dr. C. F. Juritz and myself, and Mr. W. Rees was appointed as their third representative in the place of Chevalier J. B. Callanan, K.C.S.G.

Mr. A. Withinshaw was reappointed as the representative of the Municipalities of Simon's Town and Durbanville.

Professor A. W. Falconer, Dr. P. T. Cairns and Dr. A. R. McLachlan were reappointed by the Honorary Visiting Medical Officers.

**CHAIRMANSHIP AND VICE-CHAIRMANSHIP OF THE BOARD.**—At a special meeting of the Board held on 27th October, 1930, I was honoured by being re-appointed Chairman of the Board, and Mr. M. C. Vos was re-appointed Vice-Chairman.

**OBITUARY.**—It is with deep regret that I record the deaths, during the year under review, of two of the founders of the Victoria Hospital, Wynberg. Dr. C. F. K. Murray died on 7th March, 1930. He was for many years a member of the honorary visiting staff, and was appointed an Honorary Consulting Surgeon on his retirement therefrom.

Dr. H. Claude Wright died on 22nd January, 1931. He was associated with the hospital for over thirty-eight years, and held the appointment of Honorary Medical Superintendent for many years prior to the inception of the Board in 1913, resigning that post in 1923. He was a member of the Committee of the Hospital from the time of its formation until 1925, and, on his resignation from the Honorary Medical Staff in the same year, he was appointed an Honorary Consulting Surgeon. Dr. Wright was a member of the Board from 1913 (as a representative of the Honorary Medical Officers) until he resigned in 1924.

I have also to record the deeply-regretted death, in July, 1930, of Dr. Hugh Smith, who was, for many years, a member of the Honorary Visiting Medical Staff of Somerset Hospital.



**RESIGNATIONS OF DRS. C. C. ELLIOTT AND E. BARNARD FULLER.**—At the end of last year Somerset Hospital lost the services of two of the oldest members of the Honorary Medical Staff of the institution. Dr. C. C. Elliott, as Honorary Visiting Surgeon, and Dr. E. Barnard Fuller, as Honorary Visiting Urological Surgeon, had rendered memorable services to the hospital for many years, and it was with great regret that the Board received the news of their resignations. As a mark of appreciation, Drs. Elliott and Fuller have been appointed Honorary Consulting Surgeons to the Hospitals.

The vacancies created have been filled by the appointment of Dr. T. Lindsay Sandes and Dr. L. B. Goldschmidt as Honorary Visiting Surgeon and Honorary Visiting Urological Surgeon respectively.

**RADIUM FUND.**—The public will have seen, from notices published in the Press, that the Board have achieved their objective in regard to the Radium Fund. It will be remembered that an appeal was made for £12,000 ; actually, the contributions received up to the end of February, 1931, amounted to £12,708. It is not necessary for me to point to the extreme difficulty of raising money, even for the most worthy object, at the present time ; and I think that, in the circumstances, the success of the Board's Radium Fund is most gratifying. A gentleman well-known in Cape Town was employed for the purpose of bringing the Fund to the notice of business houses, hotels, boarding-houses and the like, with a view to the adoption of official collecting lists. The salary of the gentleman referred to totalled £140, and this amount, *plus* unavoidable expenditure (of less than £60) on printing, stationery, postage, etc., represents the whole of the cost of collecting the money.

Approximately 500 milligrams of radium element in suitable containers has been purchased, and it is intended to add to this amount in the near future. The Radiological Department at Somerset Hospital is now working at full pressure—in fact, the applications received for treatment are far in excess of the facilities available, so that it has become necessary to curtail the work to some extent. I am quite satisfied that the results which have accrued up to date have amply justified the Board's action in appealing for funds for the purchase of radium, and I wish to take this opportunity of publicly thanking the donors, and all those who assisted in collecting the money. The Fund was a very popular one, and a large part of the subscriptions consisted of more or less small amounts comprised in the special collection lists, which were widely circulated. One of the most pleasing features of the matter was the readiness to contribute evinced by persons resident in the country districts.



### **PRINCESS ALICE HOME OF RECOVERY FOR CHILDREN.—**

As is well known, the efforts made by the Women's Hospital Auxiliary to raise funds for the building and equipment of the Princess Alice Home of Recovery have been crowned with success. The actual construction of the Home would have been begun some months ago—the foundation-stone of the building was laid by Her Royal Highness Princess Alice in June of last year—but for the fact that a serious difficulty arose in connection with the matter of sewage disposal at the site at Retreat, which, as I stated last year, the Board decided to devote to the purpose. This site is not within the water-borne sewage area, and the difficulty in the way of providing a scheme of sewage disposal, for a large institution such as the proposed Home, which would be satisfactory and simple in operation, and at the same time reasonably economical to maintain, appeared at one time to be insuperable. However, I am glad to say that the City Engineer, Mr. D. E. Lloyd Davies, has evolved a scheme which, in the opinion of the expert authorities to whom it has been submitted, will meet the Board's requirements in these respects. This scheme has been accepted by the Board, and the chief obstacle to the speedy erection of the Home has thus been removed.

Mr. Brownlee, the architect, has prepared a large number of sketch plans for the Home under instructions from the Women's Hospital Auxiliary. It has recently become apparent that it would not be possible, with the funds available, to provide accommodation at the outset for 80 children, and it has been decided to make a start with accommodation for half that number. In the latest sketch plans, therefore, provision is made for a single storeyed building, consisting of two wings, each of which is provided with lavatories, bathroom, sluice-rooms, ward kitchen, duty-room and kit-room and a very commodious "day-room" for the use of the patients who are not confined to bed. Each wing will be divided by a temporary partition into two sections, in order that separate accommodation may be available for each of the four classifications of patients. When the necessary additional funds are received it is proposed to extend the institution by the erection of a second block exactly similar to the first, whereupon the necessity for the temporary partitions to which I have alluded will disappear.

It is considered that it would be uneconomical, and indeed almost impracticable, so to design what may be called the administrative block (in which will be housed the accommodation for the nursing and domestic staffs, main kitchen, etc.) as to serve merely the immediate needs of the institution. The plans for this block, therefore, have been drawn in such a way as to afford accommodation sufficient for the requirements of an eighty-bedded Home.



The sketch plans to which I have referred have been accepted by the Women's Hospital Auxiliary and the Board as a basis for the scheme, and work on the details is now proceeding.

#### **TRAINING OF NURSES.**

*General.*—At the examination for nurses held by the South African Medical Council in April, 1930, candidates entered as follows: Somerset Hospital, 9; Woodstock Hospital, 1; Rondebosch Hospital, 2; Wynberg Hospital, 4. These candidates were all successful, with the exception of one from Somerset Hospital, and Miss G. M. Barrett (Somerset Hospital) and Miss N. Leonard (Wynberg Hospital), who were placed in the Honours Division, were awarded prizes of £4 4s. each.

At the October examination, 5 candidates entered, as follows: Somerset Hospital, 2; Woodstock Hospital, 1; Rondebosch Hospital, 1; Wynberg Hospital, 1. Three of these candidates were successful, those from the Woodstock and Rondebosch Hospitals having failed.

*Midwifery.*—At the examination for midwives held in April, 1930, eleven candidates entered from the Peninsula Maternity Hospital and all passed. At the October, 1930, examination nine entered and all passed.

During the year the Administrator approved of the creation of an important new post, viz., that of Sister-Tutor, for the Woodstock, Rondebosch and Wynberg Hospitals. Hitherto the training of the student nurses at these hospitals, apart from their practical experience in the wards, had been confined to lectures given by the matrons and by doctors on the staffs of the hospitals. The ever-growing demands upon the time of the Matrons, which made it increasingly difficult for them to give the requisite attention to the training of the nurses, and also the greatly extended syllabus for such training laid down by the South African Medical Council, rendered the appointment of a Sister-Tutor for the suburban hospitals unavoidable. Miss E. M. Foulkes Pritchard was selected for the post, and assumed duty on 18th August, 1930.

Miss S. Marwick, Sister-Tutor at Somerset Hospital, resigned her appointment in April, 1930, in order to take up a similar post in Natal. She was succeeded by Miss C. M. Courtenay, who assumed duty on 4th August, 1930.

**NURSES' PENSIONS.**—It is satisfactory to know that the Provincial Administration are at last dealing with the long overdue amendment of the law in regard to pensions for nurses. No precise data are as yet available, but it is understood that material improvements are in prospect, and it is hoped that the proposals, when published, will meet with ready acceptance.



The existing pensions for nurses are hopelessly inadequate and, probably for that reason, proposals put forward during last year by the Colonial Mutual Life Assurance Society, Ltd., in regard to the establishment of a Provident Fund for the benefit of the nurses met with a considerable measure of support from the latter. In the event, the Board gave their sanction to the establishment of the Fund, and to the introduction of what is known as the "Stop Order" system in connection therewith. The Fund itself is controlled by three trustees appointed by the members, and, inasmuch as it tends to foster the spirit of thrift, it is to be commended.

**MOTOR AMBULANCES.**—During the calendar year 1930, 4,595 cases (including 485 due to street accidents) were removed in the Board's ambulances, an average of 383 per month. Of this number 3,744 removals were free and 851 were charged for.

The Board now possess four motor ambulances, three of which are in constant use, the fourth being regarded as a spare or emergency vehicle. As I stated previously, it was decided some time ago to import a completely equipped motor ambulance; and I took the opportunity afforded by my visit to England last year to inspect a number of up-to-date vehicles. The best of these, in my opinion, was the "M.A.B." type of ambulance—the initials stand for Metropolitan Asylums Board—which is manufactured by Messrs. W. & G. du Cros, Ltd., of Acton, and, on my advice, the Board have ordered one of these, which will probably be delivered in about two months' time. I am quite sure that the new ambulance will be greatly superior in all respects to its predecessors.

While I was in England I was greatly impressed by the "Sorbo" rubber beds and pillows, which are part of the standard equipment of some of the ambulances which I inspected; several sets of these have been imported for use with the Board's ambulances, and have proved most satisfactory.

**MOTOR ACCIDENTS.**—The large and increasing number of motor accidents in Cape Town and its vicinity has, as might have been expected, had a very marked effect upon the returns of the several hospitals. Apart from the fact that a large proportion of the persons injured as the result of such accidents find their way into the Board's hospitals, and thus tend to aggravate the position arising out of the shortage of beds, the Board are faced with considerable difficulty in regard to the collection of fees for their treatment. It is well-known that many persons so injured ultimately receive compensation, either from the driver of the vehicle concerned or, if the latter be insured against third-party risk, from an Insurance Company. Obviously the hospitals should receive some part of the compensation paid as, at least, a partial set-off



against the expenditure to which they are put in this connection ; but unfortunately the Board have no machinery whatever for following up such cases. In an endeavour to deal with the position, the Board, early last year, decided to assess all motor accident cases at 7s. 6d. per day, regardless of whether the patient was, or was not, able to pay at that rate ; the principle underlying this decision was that the hospital accounts would form a legal claim in respect to compensation. The results which have followed from the introduction of this system have been so small as to be almost negligible in comparison with the sums which have accrued, and it will be necessary for the Board to reconsider the whole position.

In this connexion the Board endeavoured, unfortunately without success, to induce the Provincial Administration to introduce legislation on the lines of the British Road Traffic Act of 1930, under which it is not only obligatory upon all drivers of motor vehicles to be insured against third-party risk, but a sum not exceeding £25 must be earmarked for hospital expenses out of any sum paid by way of compensation for injuries sustained as the result of motor accidents. I fear that in the absence of similar legislation here little or nothing can be done to alleviate the position so far as our hospitals are concerned ; and I am convinced that in the meantime we are losing a very large amount of much-needed revenue.

**FINANCE.**—The Board, in common with similar organisations, are experiencing anxiety in regard to their financial position. As is natural, the calls upon their resources tend to increase rather than diminish in times of stringency. Last year they contrived to keep their expenditure within the limits of the Estimates as approved by the Provincial Administration, notwithstanding the heavy cost of effecting the improvements to which I have referred elsewhere in this report. This year the Provincial Administration, upon whom falls the bulk of the financial burden in regard to hospitals, have been compelled to call upon the Board to reduce their Estimates of Expenditure, originally framed on a strictly conservative basis, by a considerable sum. The Board hope, by means of various expedients, to avoid the necessity for curtailing any of their essential services ; but they have a difficult task before them, and I think the time is opportune to appeal to the public for a more liberal measure of support. I have in mind the general maintenance funds of the several institutions ; the public have from time to time responded very generously to appeals for special purposes, such as the Radium Fund. As regards the maintenance funds, however, voluntary contributions from the public, so far from keeping pace with the development of the hospitals, have actually diminished. Such contributions for the year 1920, when the expenditure was under £81,000, amounted to £6,227 ; the corresponding revenue for



1930, when the expenditure was over £124,000, was £5,994. I know that there is a fairly general impression abroad that contributions to the maintenance funds of the hospitals do not benefit these institutions, but merely reduce the sum payable by the Local Authorities and the Provincial Administration. This is a sort of half-truth and, like all half-truths, it is difficult to combat. Let it suffice for me to state that, for this year, at any rate, the amount which the Provincial Administration and the Local Authorities are prepared to contribute towards the maintenance of the Board's institutions is definitely limited, and that the shortfall between this amount and the expenditure can only be met, apart from the small income derived from a few investments, from revenue to be derived from patients' fees and contributions from the charitable public. By far the greater number of the patients accommodated in the Board's institutions receive their treatment free of charge or at a rate considerably below the average cost of maintaining them, and the Board anticipate considerable difficulty in recovering even the comparatively small total of £16,000 which has been budgetted for this year under the head of fees. If, therefore, the charitable public fail them, the Board will be obliged to cast round for some means of reducing their expenditure, which can only be done by curtailing the present facilities for the treatment of the sick. I need scarcely point out that, in view of the existing acute shortage of hospital accommodation, and of the dire poverty in our midst, such a course would be calamitous.

**HOSPITAL BALL.**—The annual Hospital Ball was held at the City Hall on 29th July, 1930, and the proceeds of the function amounted to the large sum of £1,118 ls. 3d. Acting on my suggestion the Mayoress earmarked £500 of this amount for special purposes at the Eaton Convalescent Home, subject to the *proviso* that renovations, etc., to the cottage in the grounds of that institution should form a first charge thereon. It is proposed to utilise the cottage referred to for the accommodation of non-European convalescent children, the need for which is very great; unfortunately, owing to the present financial stringency, it is not possible at present to make provision for the cost of maintaining the additional beds involved in this proposal. I hope, however, that the postponement of this development will not be of long duration.

I have already referred to the very successful Hospital Ball held last year at Simon's Town in aid of the local hospital.

**STREET COLLECTIONS.**—Two street collections in aid of the hospitals were held during the year 1930, the first, which took place on the 23rd April, being organised and carried out, as usual, by the Jewish ladies of the Peninsula, under the leadership of Mrs. Stodel. This collection realised the large sum of £763 3s. 2d. The work of



organising a street collection is far more strenuous and complicated than is generally supposed, and the manner in which Mrs. Stodel and her helpers have, year after year, shown their practical interest in the work of the hospitals is most gratifying.

The second collection, known as "Hospital Saturday," was held on 6th September, and took the form, in the main, of an amusing "rag" organised by the students of the Cape Town University. Most unfortunately, the weather on this occasion was very bad, in spite of which, however, no less a sum than £1,149 18s. 6d. was collected. In previous years the arduous duties of organising the "Hospital Saturday" collection was in the very capable hands of Mrs. W. G. R. Murray; after the 1929 collection, however, Mrs. Murray intimated that she would not be able to undertake the work in 1930. Arrangements were thereupon made for the whole matter to be left in the hands of the students, who had signified their readiness to act. At almost the very last moment it was found that the students would be compelled to restrict their activities to the central part of the City. The case was put to Mrs. Murray, who, without the slightest hesitation, and with only a few days in which to make her preparations, assembled a band of helpers, and extended the collection to the suburbs. I mention this incident, not only because it gives me the opportunity of again expressing the Board's gratitude to Mrs. Murray, but as showing how ready people are to come to the assistance of the hospitals when the occasion arises.

**EXEMPTION FROM SECTION 54 OF ORDINANCE NO. 5 OF 1912.**—At the request of the Board, the Administrator, with the advice of the Executive Committee, approved of the exemption during the calendar year 1930, of all the institutions under the control of the Board from the provisions of sub-section (a) of Section 54 of Ordinance No. 5 of 1912, and of Somerset Hospital and the Peninsula Maternity Hospital only from the provisions of sub-section (b) of the same section.

I cannot close this report without a reference to the whole-hearted support which I have received from Mr. Vos, the Vice-Chairman of the Board, who acted for me during my absence in England, and to the great interest in the institutions under their control which was displayed by the Chairmen of all the several Committees of the Board. I would like also to tender my thanks to the members of the Board for their helpful criticism and co-operation in connexion with all phases of our work.

I desire to thank all members of the Board's staffs—Medical, Nursing, Clerical and others—for the way in which each one of them has risen to the occasion in assisting to cope with the ever-increasing work involved in the development of the institutions.



To the Secretary and Treasurer a special word of praise is due for the zeal and ability he has shown in connexion with the many improvements which have been enumerated, particularly with regard to the suburban institutions. A good deal of the success which has attended the Board's efforts to improve the running of those institutions must be attributed to the closer co-operation with the staffs which his weekly visits have made possible.

I trust that the improvement which has been made during the past year will be maintained, and that the Board will continue to merit the confidence and support of everyone concerned.

I conclude with the assurance that it is the earnest wish of every member of the Board that the work of relieving the sick and suffering shall be carried out with efficiency and courtesy.

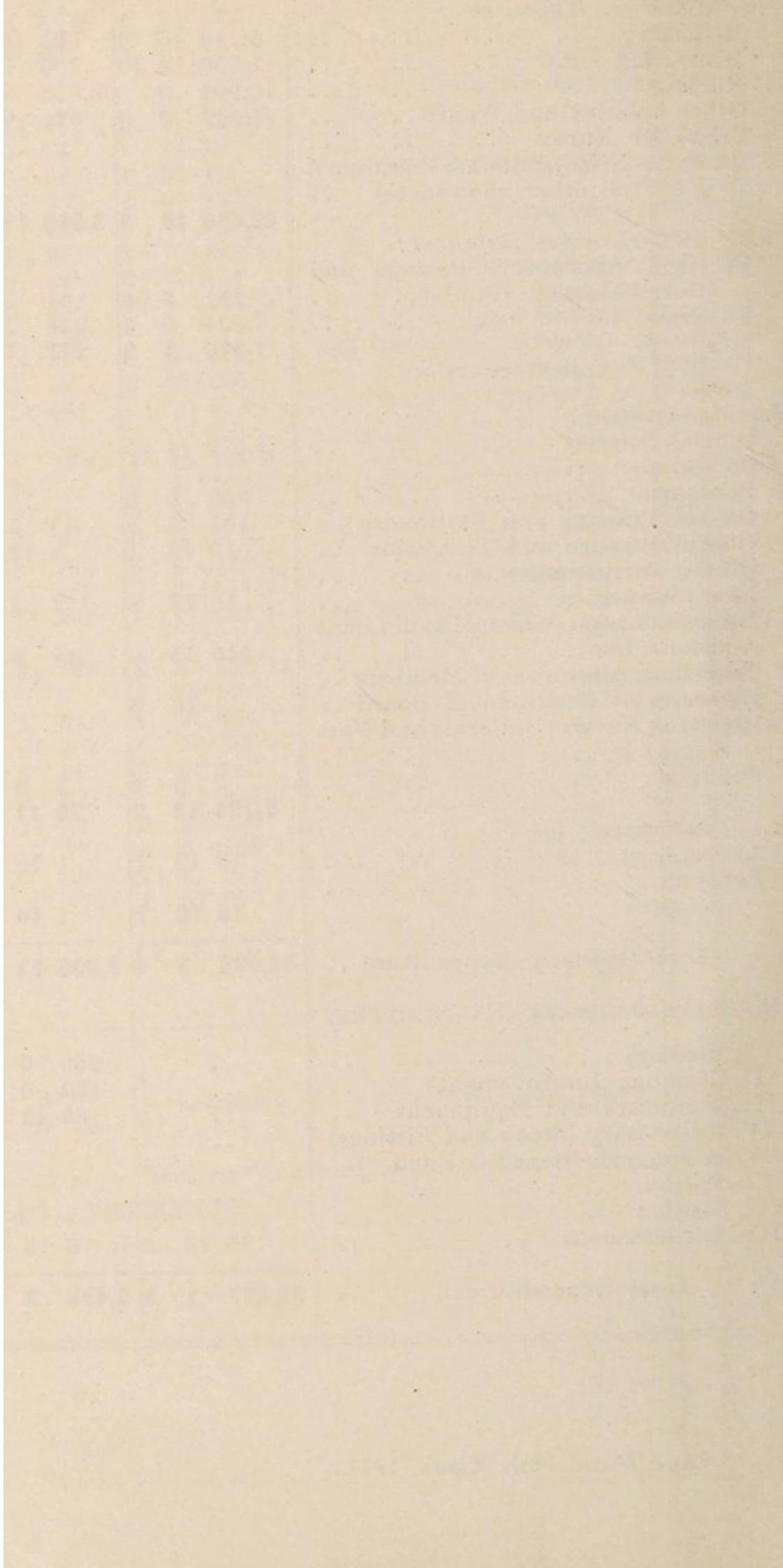
