#### Finance and General Purposes Committee.

#### Duties:

The Finance and General Purposes Committee shall, in accordance with the Rules of Order:

- (a) deal with and report upon all questions appertaining to the general policy of the Board;
- (b) be responsible for the control of the Head Office of the Board, and deal with all matters appertaining to the appointment, emoluments, resignation or leave of the Secretary and Treasurer and other officers employed therein;
- (c) arrange, co-ordinate and supervise the training of nurses;
- (d) deal with all other matters which do not fall within the jurisdiction of any of the other Standing Committees;
- (e) consider and report upon or conclude, as may be directed, such matters as are specifically referred to it;
- (f) supervise all the fiscal concerns of the Board and report periodically as to the state of the several funds of the Board;
- (g) prepare and submit to the Board in the month of December in each year a statement of the estimated capital income and expenditure and of the recurrent income and expenditure of the Board in respect of the next ensuing year;
- (h) prepare and submit to the Board during the month of December in each year a statement of the estimated recurrent income and expenditure of the Board's institutions in respect of the next ensuing year, which shall be framed after consultation with the other Standing Committees concerned;
- (i) receive at each monthly meeting a statement of the payments effected by the Secretary and Treasurer of the Board during the preceding calendar month and thereafter report to the Board the total amount of such expenditure;
- (j) arrange all investments of monies held by or funds entrusted to the Board;
- (k) report to the Board at the request of any of the other Standing Committees regarding the provision of funds for any object connected with the administration of the Board or any of its institutions;
- (l) supervise the collection of all revenue due to the Board and its institutions;
- (m) invite and deal with all tenders received for annual supplies and services required by the Board;
- (n) arrange all insurance policies, whether in respect of fire, fidelity guarantee, workmen's compensation or any other risk;
- (o) consider and report upon or conclude, as may be directed, such matters as are specifically referred to it.

The control and administration of the several Institutions of the Board are allocated to Standing Committees as follows: (1) Groote Schuur Hospital to the Groote Schuur Hospital Committee; (2) Rondebosch and Mowbray Hospital, Woodstock Hospital and Victoria Hospital, Wynberg, to the Rondebosch, Woodstock and Wynberg Hospitals Committee; (3) False Bay Hospital, Eaton Convalescent Home, McGregor Convalescent Home, Princess Alice Home of Recovery for Children and Lady Michaelis Orthopaedic Home to the False Bay Hospital and Convalescent Homes Committee; (4) Peninsula Maternity Hospital, Cape Town Free Dispensary, the C.H.B. District Nursing Organisation and the Subsidised Midwifery Service to the Combined Institutions Committee; (5) Somerset Hospital, to the Somerset Hospital Committee.

#### Duties of these Committees are as follows:

- (a) Exercise a general supervision of such Institution or Institutions including the fabric and grounds thereof;
- (b) carry out such regulations as may be framed by the Board in respect of such Institution or Institutions;
- (c) subject to the approval of the Board, make all professional and other appointments in connection with such Institution or Institutions;
- (d) Deal with the representations of patients in and members of the Staff of such Institution or Institutions;
- (e) advise the Board in all matters affecting such Institution or Institutions;
- (f) in December of each year, in consultation with the Secretary and Treasurer of the Board, frame Estimates of the recurrent income and expenditure of such Institution, or Institutions, in respect of next year and submit the same without delay to the Finance and General Purposes Committee;
- (g) generally administer such Institution or Institutions, provided, however, that no expenditure shall be incurred unless prior provision has been made therefor in the approved Estimates of the Board for the current year or by special resolution of the Board.

# REPORT OF THE CHAIRMAN OF THE BOARD FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31ST DECEMBER, 1946.

As Chairman of the Board, I feel it is an honour as well as a pleasant duty to report on the work of the Board during the past year.

The following survey of the work has been condensed as much as possible

to give outstanding indications of progress.

The number of patients treated during 1946, as compared with 1945 indicates an all-round growth in the work of Hospitals:—

#### GROOTE SCHUUR HOSPITAL:

Generally the work of the Hospital expanded considerably during the year A Plastic Surgery Unit was inaugurated and Dr. N. Petersen was appointed Surgeon-in-Charge, whereupon he relinquished his appointment as Honorary Assistant Surgeon in the general surgery wards. Dr. T. Lindsay Sandes retired on the 30th June. He had rendered invaluable service for many years, and is sadly missed. Dr. G. A. Elliott, Honorary Visiting Physician, left at the end of November to occupy the Chair of Medicine at the Witwatersrand University

Resident Medical Staff.—Increasing demands, owing to the continuously growing number of patients, kept the Resident Medical Staff fully occupied and often over-worked, and the necessity for an augmented Resident Medical Staff will receive early attention.

Nursing Staff.—Miss S. M. Marwick assumed duty as Matron on the 1st February and was at once faced with the formidable task of filling posts, some of which had been vacant during the war years, while others had been temporarily filled.

Mr. A. Chapman: Acting Business Manager.—Mr. A. Chapman was appointed Acting Business Manager of the Groote Schuur Hospital on the 22nd October, 1939, and served the Board in this capacity until 8th October, 1946, thus carrying the burden of this responsible post during a very difficult period. The Board desires to record its appreciation and thanks to Mr. Chapman for his valuable services and wishes him well in his retirement.

Radiological Department.—The work of the Radiological Department has also greatly increased. After prolonged negotiation, the Department was successful in obtaining the services of Dr. A. S. Johnstone, who has had considerable experience in diagnostic work overseas.

Training of Male Nurses.—As there has been a demand for male nurses, the South African Nursing Council has been requested to recognise the Groote Schuur Hospital as a training school for Male Nurses.

Hot and Cold Water Supply.—This matter has presented a somewhat difficult problem during the year, and the Board is carefully investigating the position generally in order to reach an adequate solution.

Water Reservoir.—A new reservoir was erected at a cost of £3,500 which will assure for this institution a plentiful supply of water at all times.

The new reservoir was constructed owing to the Board being informed that the pipe lines from Steenbras were inadequate to meet the full demands of the City, which might mean a restricted supply to the Hospital during the dry season.

Embankments.—Since the building of the embankments at the Groote Schuur Hospital, the Board has been faced from year to year with considerable expenditure, due to erosion, and it is hoped that the effective treatment of these embankments now in hand will remedy past defects.

Out-Patient Department.—The Out-Patient Department continues to serve an ever increasing number of patients. Accommodation is, however, proving a problem and steps are being taken to provide much needed additional space to obviate present overcrowding.

**Occupational Therapy Department.**—This recently established section has proved a boon to countless patients; unfortunately here, too, the inadequate space available is proving a problem.

#### WOODSTOCK HOSPITAL:

The number of cases treated in the Out-patient Department is the second highest in the Peninsula; the Groote Schuur Hospital alone having treated

a greater number of Out-patients during the period.

Many of those treated in the Out-patient Department at Woodstock Hospital receive as much care and treatment as they would have received as in-patients. Many, in fact, would have been so admitted had accommodation permitted.

The Woodstock Hospital Assistance Committee rendered valuable services

for which the Board records its sincere appreciation.

In spite of difficulties which constantly arose owing to shortage of trained nursing staff, the work of this Hospital proceeded smoothly and efficiently during the year.

Visitors to Hospital.—During the year, Lord and Lady Euston (Lord Euston is a grandson of Lord Buxton, who donated Children's Wards at Woodstock Hospital) visited the Hospital and showed great interest in the work being done. They were received and entertained by the Matron and myself.

#### RONDEBOSCH AND MOWBRAY HOSPITAL:

The routine work of the hospital proceeded normally and uneventfully

during the past year.

In view of the projected Children's Hospital to be erected on a site in Rosebank, it is proposed not to proceed with the proposed McLachlan Memorial Children's Ward at this institution, and that the funds be used instead to re-build and equip an operating theatre to be known as the "Dr. McLachlan Theatre".

#### EATON AND McGREGOR CONVALESCENT HOMES:

The work of these institutions proceeded normally during the year. The bathing box purchased at St. James for the use of patients at the McGregor Convalescent Home proved a boon to the children.

#### LADY MICHAELIS ORTHOPAEDIC HOME:

Estimates for the coming year will provide for the re-painting of wards not previously renovated, including part of the European Ward, the corridors and Coloured Wards.

It is satisfying to record that efforts made during the year resulted in three orthopaedic trained nurses being added to the staff. The Board's acknowledgments are due to Lady Michaelis for her continued kindly interest in the work of the Home. The Women's Hospital Auxiliary (L.M.O.H. Branch) have shown great interest, giving parties to the children, gifts of pink-tinted furniture for the coloured wards and sun umbrellas. The Boy Scout and Girl Guide Organisations have continued paying welcome visits to the patients in the Home.

Extensions: The additional ward now in use has proved a welcome extension. Although not admitting of a larger number of patients being treated, it considerably minimised the inconvenient conditions under which the Home was conducted previously.

#### PRINCESS ALICE HOME OF RECOVERY:

In general the health of the children was good and orthopaedic work proceeded normally. The buildings were repainted during the year, which was generally an uneventful one. The question of drainage in preparation for necessary extensions is receiving the Board's attention.

#### VICTORIA HOSPITAL, WYNBERG:

Continued difficulties were encountered during the year through a shortage of trained staff, and also the need of additional accommodation for nurses. Miss C. M. Loopuyt assumed duty as Matron on 15th April, 1946. The work of the institution expanded considerably and proceeded satisfactorily during the year.

#### PENINSULA MATERNITY HOSPITAL:

Great difficulties have been experienced during the year regarding shortage of beds in both European and Coloured Wards. Bookings are steadily increasing, and it is found difficult to accommodate the growing number of patients. It is hoped that current plans for extensions made possible by the acquisition of adjacent properties will eventually accommodate additional patients and staff.

Miss J. M. Reive, Matron of the Peninsula Maternity Hospital, retired during the year, after many years of successful service with the Board, which extends to her cordial good wishes for deserved success in her future undertakings.

#### SOMERSET HOSPITAL:

Generally the work of the hospital proceeded smoothly during the year. The continued shortage of trained nursing staff has been a difficulty. There is, however, no shortage of pupil nurses, and there is a pressing need of extensions to the Nurse's Home.

All Honorary appointments were occupied except that of Honorary Consultant Ear, Nose and Throat Surgeon, which was eventually filled towards the end of the year.

An additional Resident Medical Officer was appointed from August, 1946, on account of the general increase in the work of the Out-patient Department.

As this Hospital was intended, *inter alia*, for the training of non-European nurses and doctors, a non-European Resident Medical Officer was appointed at the beginning of the year.

Thirty medical beds (20 male and 10 female) have been allocated to the University of Cape Town Medical School for teaching purposes. This arrangement, which was necessary to relieve congestion at Groote Schuur Hospital, is working well.

The work of the Radiological Department has increased enormously, and the appointment of an additional radiographer is necessary. The Physio-Therapy Department, now in charge of a qualified Masseur, is meeting present needs.

A memorial plaque in the Eye Department now commemorates the magnificent gift of Eye Equipment bequeathed by the late Dr. J. Cristol.

The Maternity Section is functioning satisfactorily, and is served by the Honorary Staff of the Peninsula Maternity Hospital. Medical students of the University of Cape Town, also receive their Midwifery training in the Maternity Section.

Extensions to the Theatres, X-Ray section and other departments are in contemplation.

#### FALSE BAY HOSPITAL:

This institution continues to serve a great and growing need in the Simonstown, Glencairn and Fish Hoek areas. The work proceeded normally and uneventfully during the year.

Dr. A. B. Bull, Honorary Medical Superintendent of the False Bay Hospital retired from that post in 1946. He will be greatly missed by his colleagues and by the Board.

#### CAPE TOWN FREE DISPENSARY:

As in previous years, the services of the Cape Town Free Dispensary proved a blessing to thousands of sick poor, and considerably relieved O.P.D. work at various other institutions. The recent installation of an incinerator meets a long-felt need.

#### C.H.B. DISTRICT NURSING ORGANISATION:

Cases continued to increase during the year. Owing to the somewhat nebulous position regarding control of the D.N.O., it was not possible to proceed with hoped-for extensions of the organisation. Miss G. M. Edwards was appointed Superintendent on the 26th December, 1946, after some twenty years' continuous service with the Board as a District Nurse. Continued difficulty was experienced in securing permanent staff. Generally the work of the organisation proceeded smoothly.

V.N.I. St. Pauls Branch.—The work was continued satisfactorily during a very busy year. The shortage of private nurses continued, and the need of a District Nurse in the Sea Point area was especially realised.

During the year, 2,158 new cases were treated in their homes or at the district rooms. Of these, 1,392 were paying patients (133 Europeans; 1,259 non-Europeans): 766 were free patients; 12,984 visits were paid by patients to the district rooms, and 7,289 visits were paid by the Sisters to patients in their homes.

Special thanks are due to the Victoria Nurses Institute for the gift of £50 made regularly each year for carrying on work in the District VI area, and

for other donations for special purposes.

Grateful acknowledgment is due to the Annual Subscribers who so kindly contribute each year to this work, and also to the Cape Town and Suburban Clothing Guild for a generous gift of clothing, and to the Rotary Club for parcels of food, as well as to those who have kindly contributed food tickets and money towards comforts for district patients.

Lakeside-Kommetje Branch.—Over 11,000 cases were treated, about half of these at district rooms, and the remainder either at a clinic or at their homes—a splendid record of work. The new Clinic at Noordhoek opened in January. The work is proceeding very satisfactorily. A considerable sum has been raised by Sister Crawford and helpers to purchase equipment for the district room at Muizenberg, when one can be obtained. Excellent work was done during the year by this branch.

Owing to the generosity of Mr. Max Sonnenberg, M.P., a considerable sum had been promised towards the establishment of a district room. Of this offer it is hoped to take advantage when the overlapping functions of the Board and the new Health Centres are clarified.

Wynberg Branch.—During the year, 745 new and old cases were dealt with in the district room, Mauerberger Clinic and homes of patients. In addition 3,404 visits were made to district room, clinic and homes. The Mauerberger Clinic, Ottery, rendered valuable help and service in that area.

The Clothing Guild continued to supply garments and other useful articles for old and young. The gifts are varied, and the Committee's gratitude is

more than a lively anticipation of favours to come.

The work of all the other D.N.O. branches was commensurately heavy but the services were carried out in a very satisfactory manner.

D.N.O. Cottage at Athlone.—Through the generosity of the Black River—Athlone Branch of the District Nursing Organisation, the Board has been presented with a Cottage at Gleemoor Township, which will eventually serve as the headquarters of the District Nursing services in that area. With a view to commemorating the excellent work done by Mrs. M. E. Harsant and her Committee over a number of years in the interests of the sick poor, the Board unanimously agreed that the cottage be named "Harsant Cottage".

#### SUBSIDISED MIDWIFERY SERVICE:

Owing to the difficulty of obtaining a suitably experienced Sister, the post of supervisor has been vacant for a considerable period. Recently, however, the Superintendent of the District Nursing Organisation (Miss G. M. Edwards) kindly came to the Board's assistance at some personal inconvenience, by agreeing to supervise the Services in the interim. The work has proceeded satisfactorily, in view of the extensive areas covered and the exigencies that arise in consequence.

#### ORTHOPAEDIC WORKSHOP:

The work of the department is steadily increasing and its usefulness is becoming more apparent daily. Unfortunately lack of accommodation has up to the present seriously hampered the output of work but energetic steps are being taken towards securing larger premises and an increased staff. New accommodation for the Workshop has now been found at the Somerset Hospital.

#### PROJECTED CHILDREN'S HOSPITAL:

Negotiations are in progress regarding a site for the proposed Children's Hospital, the S.A. Red Cross Society having undertaken to raise a sum of £200,000 and the Provincial Administration having agreed to provide a like amount for this purpose. The proposed Hospital should help to relieve congestion at various institutions caused by the necessary provision of children's wards at present.

While the South African Red Cross Society has been organising the collection of funds, members of the Board have been seeking a suitable site for the proposed Children's Hospital, and it gives me pleasure to state that negotiations have been successful, and that the site of the Government Vaccine Station, Rosebank, will eventually become the property of the Board.

## PROJECTED HOSPITALS FOR GREEN AND SEA POINT AREA AND NORTHERN SUBURBS.

During the year many discussions took place between representatives of the areas above-mentioned, the Board, Cape Town City Council and the Provincial Administration with a view to the erection of hospitals to serve these areas.

#### STREET COLLECTIONS:

Street collections held during 1946 realised the following substantial amounts:

The acknowledgments of the Board are due to members of the nursing staffs of various hospitals and the many voluntary workers who assisted by collecting and in other ways, to Mr. H. C. D. Browne, who devoted many leisure hours to the work of organising the mid-week collection and assisting voluntary organisations in their work.

A part of the proceeds of the Hospital Rag was allocated by the students to the South African Red Cross Society, and the balance was allocated to various institutions for the purchase of special instruments and equipment. The Hospital Saturday collection was ably organised by the Women's Hospital Auxiliary to the members of which, and particularly, Mrs. Boehmke, President of the Auxiliary, the Board is greatly indebted for valuable assistance.

#### DENTAL CONFERENCE:

After protracted representations, and a considerable amount of work done in compiling statistics, a deputation, authorised by the Dental Conference waited upon the Minister of Health (Dr. H. Gluckman) to explain the need of increased Dental training facilities at the University of Cape Town.

As a result of these representations, the Government agreed to appoint a Commission to enquire into the necessity for the establishment of a Faculty for the training of dentists. The decision of the Minister is now awaited.

#### **BLOOD TRANSFUSION SERVICE:**

Invaluable aid was rendered to various Hospitals under the Board's control by the Blood Transfusion Service—a voluntary organisation which was instrumental during the year in providing:

Difficulties experienced in finding an adequate number of donors of blood of the various groups required have been great, and the Government Laboratory was able to provide only limited processing facilities. As a result, the question of the Government or the Provincial Administration assuming responsibility for this service is receiving consideration.

#### AMBULANCE SERVICE:

The work of the Ambulance Service (serving the whole of the Peninsula and contiguous areas) shows a considerable expansion, well illustrated by the following figures:—

In 1936, the total mileage covered by the ambulances was 13,957 as compared with 205,957 miles during 1946, more than 15 times as much.

A gratifying feature of the service is that no serious accidents occurred during the year. Although ambulances now transport an average number of 18,000 patients annually, no member of the public has ever been injured whilst travelling in any of the Board's ambulance vehicles.

The Board desires to make grateful acknowledgment of the presentation of an Ambulance to the Groote Schuur Hospital by the Cape Town Hebrew Congregation, in commemoration of its Centenary.

#### CENTRAL WORKSHOPS:

The various institutions under the Board's control are serviced by wellequipped workshops and a staff of highly-skilled technicians and artisans, comprising the complete range of constructional trades on whose assistance any of the hospitals may call, by telephone, day or night. Plans are in hand for additional staff and also expansion of the premises for these workshops.

#### FIRE PROTECTION AND APPLIANCES:

During the year the fire appliances at all the Board's institutions were inspected and found in satisfactory condition, conforming to the requirements of the fire department. A new fire main was connected at the Somerset Hospital, thereby reinforcing fire protection facilities.

Repaintings and Additions to Equipment.—Considerable repainting and additions to equipment was effected at several of the Board's institutions, thereby greatly improving the appearance and durability of the buildings and increasing their efficiency.

#### DEARTH OF QUALIFIED STAFF:

(a) **Dispensers.**—Continued difficulty has been experienced through the dearth of qualified dispensers, particularly as regards Groote Schuur Hospital and the Somerset Hospital. The large number of temporary appointments, and the many vacancies on the staff has resulted in a serious state of affairs.

(b) Nursing.—The problem of securing the services of trained nurses and sister-tutors con inued during the year, and has not yet been satisfactorily solved.

#### REVISION OF OFFICIALS' AND EMPLOYEES' SALARY SCALES .:

The long-promised revision of salary scales was brought to fruition towards the end of the year, when His Honour the Administrator reviewed the prescribed designations, grades and emoluments for the various posts in the Hospital Board Service in the light of the revision of the salary scales in the Public Service and of recent decisions of the Central Health Services and Hospitals Co-ordinating Council.

#### BOARD MEMBERS:

The following changes in the membership of the Board occurred during the year under review:—

#### Appointments:

Mr. A. Miller was appointed to represent the Cape Divisional Council.

Mr. F. Bakker was appointed to represent Cape Town City Council.

Mr. O. G. Thiel was appointed to represent the S.A. Railways and Harbours Sick Fund.

Mr. Henry Clarke was appointed to represent the Groote Schuur Hospital Association.

Mr. H. J. Alexander was appointed to represent Cape Divisional Council.

The following members resigned from the Board:-

Dr. P. T. Cairns, Mr. A. Davis, Lt.-Col. J. Clarke, Mr. E. E. Fuller, Dr. J. C. Gie and Mr. M. Stakol.

The Board loses their services with regret.

The newly appointed members have already given evidence of their zeal and worth, and I trust their valuable services will be continued.

#### BOARD AND COMMITTEE MEETINGS:

Meetings of the Board and its Committees were well attended during the year, and were often held in loco at the various institutions thus enabling members to investigate and deal with problems on the spot.

#### **NEW HOSPITALS ORDINANCE:**

The Board is not yet in a position to state when the new Ordinance will come into actual operation, nor what adjustments will become necessary in order to meet the requirements of the new form of control. At present the main points in operation under the Ordinance are:

(a) The Local Authorities are relieved of hospital deficits; and

(b) The cost of maintaining the Ambulance Service is the responsibility of the Local Authorities.

It is expected that further information will be available after the report of the Commission which recently returned from overseas is presented to the Provincial Administration. A lengthy statement of the Board's views on the new Hospitals Ordinance was recently submitted for the consideration of the Provincial Administration.

#### ACKNOWLEDGMENTS:

The sincere thanks of the Board are due to all who assisted in its work during the past year, especially the following: The Women's Hospital Auxiliary, the Groote Schuur Hospital Association, The Woodstock, Wynberg and False Bay Hospital Associations, Woodstock Hospital Assistance Committee, The Fairhaven Work Party, Local Committees of the C.H.B. District Nursing Organisation, The Hospital Rag Committee and University Students' Association, the Pieter Moll Memorial Fund, Milnerton Turf Club (who devoted part of the Annual Charity Meeting to the Hospitals), the Rotary Club, The Ladies' Clothing Guild (who gave large quantities of clothing for distribution amongst necessitous patients at the Board's various Institutions), and the Hospitals Welfare Committee.

#### **OBITUARIES:**

Mr. Morris Alexander, M.P. who died on the 23rd January, 1946, will long be remembered for his zeal in the service of the sick poor. Mr. Alexander joined the Board in 1939, and represented the Contributors to the Groote Schuur Hospital. He was a member of the Hospital Committee and of the Finance and General Purposes Committee. His work was of the greatest value to the Board and his cheery presence will be sadly missed.

The Board sustained the loss of a valuable member in the passing of Colonel

W. H. Quirk on the 11th October, 1946.

Colonel Quirk represented the Cape Town City Council on the Board since 1937. He was a member of the Groote Schuur Hospital Committee; and for some time he acted as Chairman of the Combined Institutions Committee.

Colonel Quirk's services were of the greatest assistance to the Board in its

deliberations during the last decade.

#### **HEAD OFFICE:**

The work of the Head Office staff and that of every institution under the Board's control was considerably hampered during the year through the great difficulties experienced in securing the services of staff, and particularly of typists and junior clerks. It is hoped that the position will be alleviated in coming months.

Mr. L. Welham assumed duty as Secretary and Treasurer on 1st May, 1946. Mr. Welham has had considerable experience of hospital administration, having been Secretary to the East London, Kimberley, and Port Elizabeth Hospital Boards.

Mr. E. R. Kemp left the Board's service at the end of June, after some thirty years' continuous service.

The Board desires to place on record its appreciation of the services of Mr. J. E. X. Wyld, as Acting Secretary and Treasurer, during a period of more than ordinary difficulty.

In conclusion I would like to record my appreciation, and that of my colleagues on the Board, of the loyal service of each and every member of the Staff, and also to pay a tribute to the gentlemen of the Press for their kindly attention to hospital matters during the period under review.

#### GROOTE SCHUUR HOSPITAL.

#### MEDICAL SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT FOR 1946.

#### HONORARY VISITING STAFF:

At the end of June all temporary and acting appointments terminated and these posts as well as several newly created ones were filled on a permanent basis. A Plastic Surgery Unit was inaugurated and Dr. N. Petersen was appointed Surgeon in Charge thereof, relinquishing his appointment as Honorary Assistant Surgeon in the general Surgery wards. Dr. T. L. Sandes retired on the 30th of June after many years of valuable service and will be badly missed in the wards as well as at medical meetings. Dr. G. A. Elliott, Honorary Visiting Physician left at the end of November to take up the post of Professor of Medicine at the Witwatersrand University.

#### RESIDENT MEDICAL STAFF:

In January with the opening of Ward F.4 on the 5th floor an additional Resident Medical Officer was appointed and in July two more, one for Ward C.7 and another for the Orthopaedic Department, as one Resident Medical Officer could not possibly cope with the work of the Department. The Resident Medical Officers have too much work and their number will have to be considerably increased.

#### NURSING STAFF:

Miss S. M. Marwick assumed duty as Matron on the 1st February and was immediately faced with the formidable task of filling posts, some of which had been vacant through the war years and others which had been temporarily filled.

#### RADIOLOGICAL DEPARTMENT:

Dr. I. v. d. Merwe and Dr. C. J. B. Muller, Radiologists, resigned as from 28.2.46. and 31.12.46 respectively. Their posts were filled on a temporary basis by Drs. L. Werbeloff and A. L. McDonnell. On the 5th December,1946, Dr. A. S. Johnstone from Manchester assumed duty as Radiologist in Charge of the Diagnostic Section. With his extensive experience overseas I am sure he will prove an asset to the department.

#### PHYSIO-THERAPY DEPARTMENT:

During the year Dr. H. R. Reynolds' appointment was converted from part-time to full-time Physiotherapist and steps were taken to fill all the posts in this department on a permanent basis.

#### DISPENSARY DEPARTMENT:

The increasing amount of work of this department is seriously hampered by the fact that only four of the eight pharmacists are on the permanent staff.

#### OUT-PATIENT DEPARTMENT:

This department is hopelessly overcrowded so that it is impossible to give every patient proper attention and complaints are at times fully justified. The storing of records is becoming a problem and they are already scattered over various rooms. The only solution is the building of a new department with adequate facilities.

#### ALMONERS DEPARTMENT:

The two Almoners are doing very valuable work but are up against it when chronic sick cases refuse to go to the proper institution or are refused admission there owing to some slight mental aberration which is very common in old age.

#### OCCUPATIONAL THERAPY DEPARTMENT:

Through the generosity of the Red Cross an Occupational Therapy Department has been established and temporarily housed in certain of the rooms earmarked for the Neurology Department. The work done by this department has been of inestimable value to certain types of patients who have been assisted to rapidly regain the use of their limbs and whose stay in hospital has therefore been curtailed and what is perhaps more important their outlook on life has been tremendously improved. Steps should be taken to find proper accommodation.


