4. It has again been found necessary to maintain the authorized European Staff by the employment of a certain number of locums, not only to allow the Staff to obtain leave, but also to fill vacancies in the Service.

SECTION 11 - PUBLIC HEALTH

- 7. The general health of the community was, on the whole, fairly good throughout the year.
- 8. Periodic inspections of the hotels were made, and these inspections have undoubtedly helped to maintain a reasonable standard of cleanliness and comfort.
- 9. Towards the end of March a Medical Commission, consisting of Sir Walter Johnson, C.M.G., lately Director of Medical and Sanitary Services in Nigeria, arrived in the Protectorate. The Commission was appointed by the Secretary of State for Dominion Affairs to advise on medical administration in the Territory.
- 10. Among the suggestions put forward by the Commission were the establishment of a system of Fixed Dispensaries, the construction of a Maternity Hospital, and the carrying out of a Tuberculosis Survey of the Protectorate.
- 11. The Commission also recommended the provision of extra funds for intensive anti venereal disease measures and for the supply of badly needed equipment at the hospitals.
- 12. It is hoped that it will be possible to bring the major recommendations of the Commission into effect within the next year or two, as their adoption will increase the value of this Department's services to the community to a much larger extent than is at present possible

13. PLAGUE:

No cases of plague occurred during the year, nor were any suspected cases reported. Constant vigilance is, however, maintained for any signs of a possible outbreak.

- 14. SCURVY: 168 cases of scurvy were reported as compared with 229 cases in 1936, but it must not be inferred that the decrease in the incidence of this disease is due to better nutrition as, at present, the only certain means of ascertaining its prevalence is from attendances at the dispensaries.
- 15. TUBERCULOSIS: The following table gives the incidence of pulmonary and other forms of this disease. for the last three years:

While the above figures indicate a slight decrease in the incidence of Pulmonary Tuberculosis and a considerable increase in the incidence of other forms of the disease, it must be borne in mind that the natives do not, as yet, readily seek the aid of European doctors, and any conclusions may be fallacious.

16. SYPHILIS: The total number of cases of Syphilis treated during the year was 6,061, an increase of 489 over the number treated during the previous year.

It will, however, be seen from the following table that there is again a decrease in the proportion of Syphilis to the number of outpatients:

17. YAWS: The number of cases of Yaws was 17, a considerable decrease on the figures for previous years.

18. GONORRHOEA: The following table shows the number of cases over the last three years:

19. MALARIA: 1,393 cases of Malaria were reported, a decrease on the figures for 1936.

The incidence of Malaria in the Protectorate is very largely governed by the amount and distribution of the rainfall.

- 20. BILHARZIA: The number of cases treated was 31, a slight decrease on the previous year. The incidence of this disease is mainly confined to the Bakgatla Reserve. A decrease in the annual figures for Bilharzia has been noted for some years past.
- 21. MEASLES: Only 13 cases of Measles were reported during the year.
- 22. WHOOPING COUGH: There was a large increase in the figures for this disease, 444 cases being reported against 268 in 1936. The largest numbers attended were at Serowe (150 cases) and at Molepolole (91 cases).
- 23. DYSENTERY: 285 cases were reported, an increase over the previous year. As in 1936, most of these cases occurred at Molepolole (118 cases) and at Mochudi (49 cases)
- 24. ALASTRIM: Two cases occurred at Lobatsi, two at Mochudi and four were seen at the Tati Training Institute by No. 2 Travelling Dispensary. Isolation and vaccination were put into force and the spread of infection was prevented.
- 25. CEREBRO SPINAL MENINGITIS: 13 cases were reported during the year, 5 of which occurred in the Kalahari Desert.

 There were only two deaths. From investigations made it

was concluded that infection had originated in the Banwaketsi Reserve. The necessary precautions were immediately taken to limit the spread of this disease as far as possible.

26. ONYAIAI: No cases were reported during the year.

27. LEPROSY: Reported cases of Leprosy increased to 28.

The distribution of these cases was Ngamiland (20 cases),

Francistown (5 cases) and Kanye (3 cases). The Medical

Mission of the Seventh Day Adventists at Maun have in

view a scheme for the establishment of a small Leper Colony.

28. RABIES: No cases were reported during the year.

SECTION 111 - VITAL STATISTICS

29. The total population, according to the 1936 Census, was 260,064. It is not possible to obtain vital statistics in respect of the Native population, but the following figures, obtained from the District Commissioners, give the available figures for Europeans:-

SECTION IV - SANITATION AND HYGIENE

- 30. There has been considerable improvement in the sanitary conditions of many of the native villages since the appointment of a Sanitary Inspector.
- 31. Much remains to be done, in this direction, and progress must necessarily be slow. The large villages in which the Bechuana congregate present a very difficult problem and Serowe, the largest of these, has practically no sanitation at all.

- 32. The vast size of the Protectorate, the primitive conditions in which many of the natives live, and the fact that they do not, and can hardly be expected to, realise the value of sanitation, all tend to retard the work. The teaching of Hygiene in the schools continues to make good progress and it is from this generation that one may expect a more enlightened outlook with regard to sanitation generally.
- 33. Talks on sanitation, persuasion, and securing the interest and good will of the Chiefs, are the principal weapons at our command and the results are definitely encouraging.
- 34. Social and Welfare Work: The steady increase in the work carried out at the Social and Welfare Centre at Serowe continues and the fact that numbers of the Bamangwato women are surely but slowly obtaining a knowledge of Hygienic maternity and of proper ante-natal methods, in addition to practical help in child birth and sickness is beginning to bear fruit in that women now come into the Maternity Huts at Serowe from the lands for their confinements.
- 35. During the year 959 huts were visited by the Welfare Nurse. The number of maternity cases attended was 203, and the number of persons who attended the ante-natal clinic was 225.

SECTION V - HOSPITALS AND DISPENSARIES

- 36. The total number of outpatient attendances at the Government and Medical Mission Hospitals and Outstations was 79, 179. Of these, 31,403 were first attendances, the highest figure yet recorded.

- 38. HOSPITALS: The number of inpatients who were treated during the year was 2,134, an increase of 383 over the previous year.

The number of operations performed was 1,189, of which 226 were major and 963 minor operations.

- 40. MEDICAL MISSIONS: The hospital of the Seventh Day
 Adventist Mission at Maun, in Ngamiland, was opened by the
 District Commissioner, Ngamiland, representing the Resident
 Commissioner, on the 15th February.
- 41. The hospital, which has two European and twenty Native beds, was constructed in part from a Government grant of £2,500 from the Colonial Development Fund, the balance of the cost being provided by the Mission. The Government contributes £1,000 per annum towards the upkeep of the hospital.
- 42. This hospital should prove a most useful addition to the means at our disposal for improving the health of the community, as it will serve a large area which previously lacked proper hospital facilities.
- 43. The fact that impatient treatment could be given to 205 persons during the first year of the Maun hospital's existence, as against 37 persons during 1936, indicates the value of the services which may be expected in the future.

 44. The work done by the other Medical Mission hospitals
- and dispensaries in the territory continues to be most valuable and there is, on the whole, a steady increase in the number of patients treated, as will be seen from the tables in this report.

- 45. The Mission hospitals and dispensaries now functioning in the Protectorate are at Kanye and Maun (Seventh Day Adventists), Molepolole (United Free Church of Scotland), Mochudi (Dutch Reformed Church), Ramoutsa (Roman Catholic) and a small station also at Ramoutsa, which is maintained by the Berlin Lutheran Mission. All are doing excellent work by bringing relief to sections of the population which are beyond the reach of established Government Institutions.

 46. With the exception of the United Free Church of Scotland hospital at Molepolole, all these Medical Missions receive Government subsidies.
- 47. It is a matter for regret that it was not found possible for the hospital of the London Missionary Society, which is being built with the assistance of a grant from the Colonial Development Fund, to be completed during the year, but it will be ready early in 1938.
- 48. TRAVELLING DISPENSARIES: Both units gave good service during the year and brought medical help to parts of the Territory which are, at present, beyond the reach of ordinary medical facilities.
- 49. In computing the value of the work performed, due regard must be given to the great distances which have to be covered in very difficult country. For example, during 1937, each vehicle of No.1 unit travelled nearly 16,000 miles in the Kalahari Desert, entailing tremendous wear and tear on the vehicles and a considerable amount of hardship on their crews.
- 50. OFFICIAL VISITS: His Honour the Resident Commissioner visited the hospital at Molepolole on the 14th May, and the hospital at Maun on the 18th July.
- 51. Sir Walter Johnson, C.M.G., visited all the hospitals and dispensaries during the tour carried out by the Medical Commission.

52. The Principal Medical Officer inspected the Government and Mission hospitals at various times during the year.

SECTION V1 - PRISONS AND ASYLUMS.

53. PRISONS: The prisons are well maintained and the health of the prisoners has been good.

54. ASYLUMS: There are no asylums in the Protectorate.

Harmless mental patients are cared for by their relatives and friends. Dangerous lunatics are transferred to institutions in the Union of South Africa.

During the year two Europeans and seven Natives were detained in these institutions.


