CHAPTER I.

Vital Statistics.

ESTIMATED POPULATION.—The estimated population of the Colony at the end of the year was 24,811 being an increase of 158 on that of last year.

Annexure I. shows the number of arrivals and departures from the Colony and the num-

ber of births and deaths during the year.

BIRTH RATE.—The total number of births registered for the year was 735 being 29.81 per thousand of the estimated population, higher than last year when it was 25-19 per thousand.

DEATH RATE.—The total number of deaths for the year was 363 a mortality of 14-92 per thousand, lower than last year when it was 18.84 per thousand.

STILL-BIRTHS .- There were 37 cases of still births during the year.

The number of children who died under 5 years of age was 95 and of these 51 were under the age of one. Last year the number was 91 and 41 respectively.

CHAPTER II.

Meteorological Statistics.

No statistics are available for this year.

CHAPTER III.

Diseases prevalent during the year.

Whooping-Cough.—An epidemic of whooping cough commenced in the beginning of September and continued during the remaining months of the year, the infection appears to have been introduced by a child coming from East Africa who developed the characteristics symptons after landing and was unfortunately not seen soon enough by a medical practitioner for the necessary precautions to be taken. Practically all the young children in the Colony suffered from the disease, it being 16 years since the last outbreak. The mortality amongst the very young children was high; it is impossible however to give exact statistics as in most cases the cause of death was notified as being due to complications such as broncho-pneumonia-no mention being made of the original disease.

INFLUENZA. - There was a slight recrudescence of epidemic influenza during the month of

December but the number of cases was not considerable and the mortality slight.

Apart from the disease mentioned above the general health during the year was good. The death rate being the lowest recorded since 1907.

ANKYLOSTOMIASIS CAMPAIGN .- The campaign against Ankylostomiasis was continued by Dr J. F. Kendrick until the month of March when he went away on leave. He had commenced a second tour round the Island of Mahé making a house to house visit, treating all those who were found reinfected.

The two Sanitary Inspectors continued to go about the country to see that the provisions of the Ordinance requiring that all buildings used as dwellings be supplied with latrines are

carried out.

CHAPTER IV.

State of the Town of Victoria.

The general improvement of the town was continued.

CHAPTER V.

Vaccination.

In my last report I stated that the vaccine received by post from London was giving good results, unfortunately this did not continue and from the month of August onwards the lymph received was absolutely mert; every effort is being made to obtain a dependable supply.

Quarantine.

CHAPTER VI.

The Quarantine Station was used on several occasions.

CHAPTER VII.

Leper Camp.

The Leper Camp was moved from Round Island Praslin to Round Island Mahé, where far better accommodation has been provided.

CHAPTER VIII.

Staff.

The Chief Medical Officer was absent on leave From February 7th till September 3rd.

Dr Bradley went on leave in May and had not returned at the end of the year.

Dr L. V. Tebbs arrived in May and took over the duties of A. M. O. Praslin.

I regret that no reports are available for the district of Praslin, constant changes of staff have made it impossible to obtain them.

Maternity Home.

Patients.—There were 217 patients admitted.

The number of babies born was 151.

There were two cases of twin birth.

There was need for instrumental delivery in two cases. Chloroform was given twice.

There were two cases of puerperal Eclampsia.

ASSISTANT MEDICAL OFFICER, SOUTH MAHE For the Year 1920.

FIRST ANNUAL REPORT .- I have the honour to forward my first annual report on South Mahé District, First and Second Divisions.

EPIDEMIC DISEASES .- Ist .- INFLUENZA: The District remained free from the epidemic of

Influenza prevailing in Victoria during the last part of the year until the last week of December when the disease appeared. Two deaths had to be registered.

2nd.—Whooping Cough.—The Disease which was imported from Victoria appeared in South Mahé 1st Division early in December. Children frequenting the Victoria school or visiting families in the same District seemed to have been the main factor in the spreading of the Disease. The epidemic is only at its beginning and we cannot foresee yet the ravages that might be done amongst the population of this District.

Vital Statistics.

Births.-166: An increase of 20 over last year.

DEATHS .- 60: The average for the last five years has been 64.

MARRIAGES .- 20: The highest record since 1915.

FOR THE YEAR 1920.

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FIRST ANNUAL REPORT :-- I have the honour to forward my first annual report on the Anse Royale Lunatic Asylum.

HEALTH OF INMATES IN 1920 .- As a whole the patients enjoyed good health in 1920.

The Asylum remained free from any epidemic.

Four deaths were registered, equally divided amongst males and females. The number of patients treated was 23.

Admissions:—Seven patients were admitted: 4 males, 3 females.

Discharged:—Six patients were discharged: five males as "recovered" and one female as "not improved".

The number of patients out on trial at the end of the year was 2; one pauper male and one private female.

Remaining at the end of the year: 20 patients 10 males and 10 females.
