MEDICAL DEPARTMENT

FOR THE YEAR 1922.

CHAPTER I.

Vital Statistics.

POPULATION.—The estimated population on December 31st was 25,176 an increase of 471 on that of 1921.

BIRTH RATE.—752 births were registered during the year 1922 being 30.47 per thousand of the estimated population, an increase on last year when it was 28.57.

DEATH RATE.—There were 344 deaths in the Colony during the year, being a mortality of 13.92 per thousand; this is the lowest local record for many years and lower than any recorded in the United Kingdom during the last 20 years.

STILL-BIRTHS.—There were 51 cases of still-births.

Annexure I shows the number of arrivals and departures from the Colony and the number of deaths and births during the year.

CHAPTER II.

Meteorological Statistics.

Annexure II shows the monthly meteorological returns and the number of deaths for the year.

CHAPTER III.

Diseases prevalent during the year.

There were no epidemics of any infectious or contagious disease during the year and the health of the population was exceptionally good.

CHAPTER IV.

Vaccination.

The results of vaccination were excellent: 406 children were vaccinated in the Central District all successfully. Only one child required to be vaccinated a second time.

CHAPTER V.

Quarantine Station.

The station was made use of on several occasions, but there were no outbreaks of disease.

CHAPTER VI.

Leper Camp.

There were 11 inmates on December 31st.

A census of all persons suffering from leprosy was made during the year. The total number was found to be 33. Lepers having friends willing to take charge of them and to guarantee that they shall be cared for and necessary precautions taken to prevent spread of infection are allowed to remain in their homes.

During the year two Sanitary Inspectors were appointed to visit these lepers

in their homes and to see that instructions were being carried out.

CHAPTER VII.

Pauper Institute.

The Fiennes Institute continued to give asylum to the indigent. The number of occupants averaged about 72.

CHAPTER VIII.

Maternity Home.

261 patients were admitted.
There were 182 babies born.
There were 7 cases of twin birth.
Anæsthetic was given 3 times.
One case of puerperal eclampsia.
Three deaths occurred during the year.

CHAPTER IX.

Sanitation.

Some much needed reforms were carried out during the year and all sanitary matters are now under the Medical Department instead of being as formerly, under the Town Board.

CHAPTER X.

Staff.

Dr R. Brault left the service in May.

Dr N. Phani was appointed as A. M. O. Praslin and took up his duties in December.

Since the departure of Dr. Brault, South Mahé has been without a resident Medical Officer, Dr. Bradley visiting the district twice weekly.

Miss Lloyd left the service of the Colony after the completion of three years Nurse Maternity Home, she has not been replaced by a European Nurse.
