

# [Prescribed maximum length 3 pages.] NOTES ON VACCINATION IN ASSAM FOR THE YEAR 1920-21.

1. Introductory.—The charge of the Department was held by Major T. C. Mc-Combie Young, I.M.S., up to 14th August 1920 and by Major J. Taylor, I.M.S., in officiating charge from that date until the end of the year.

2. Vaccination Agencies.—The vaccination in plains districts was carried out entirely by the staff of vaccinators paid by Local bodies, no unpaid vaccinators being licensed during the year. Vaccinators in hill districts were paid by Government. The total number of vaccinators employed during the year was 401 as against 430 in 1919-20. The number of vaccinators in Sylhet district was increased by 25 during the year and minor increase took place in other districts. The numbers now employed are approximately what was recommended in 1918, the Local Boards having almost without exception brought their vaccination staff to the required level.

3. Total number of operations.—The total number of operations performed in Assam during the year 1920-21 was 4,18,936 as compared with 4,41,866 in 1919-20 showing a decrease of 14,459 primary vaccinations and 8,471 re-vaccinations. The decrease is accounted for by the reduction of vaccination in Manipur State by 44,771 the State having had a phenomenal vaccination year in 1919-20. Apart from this special figure the general vaccination of the province would show an increase of 21,841 operations. The number of operations performed by the different agencies was as follows :—

3,99,525 operations by departmental Vaccinators.

2,106 operations by Dispensary staff.

12,346 operations by Tea Garden Agencies.

4,687 operations by Jail, Asylum, Police Hospital and Cholera Hospital Agencies.

272 operations by Railway agency.

4. Deaths from small-pox.—The rate of mortality from small-pox in'Assam during the year 1920 was '24 per mille of the population as compared with '20 in 1919. The highest ratio ('49) was reported from the district of Darrang. The next highest rate ('46) was in the district of Sylhet where small-pox was epidemic throughout the year, the Habiganj thana being most affected. Sibsagar district with a rate of '28 per mille was third in order. Other districts were little affected. Sixty-six per cent. of the total deaths from small-pox in the province occurred in Sylhet district.

5. Dispensary vaccination.—The total number of persons vaccinated at dispensaries during 1920-21 was 2,106 as compared with 11,119 in 1919-20.

6. Percentage of successful operations.—The percentage of success in primary vaccinations was 94.93 and that for re-vaccinations 65.01 as compared with 95.71 and 72.04 respectively in 1919-20.

7. Different methods of vaccination .- All vaccinations were performed with glycerinated lymph made in the Vaccine Depôt, Shillong.

8. Vaccination work in different districts.—Eight districts show an increase in the number of operations performed during the year under report as compared with the preceding year, viz., Sylhet (+15,109), Naga Hills (+7,726), Darrang (+4,955), Goalpara (+2,464), Garo Hills (+2,142), Lakhimpur (+413), Nowgong (+142) and Khasi and Jaintia Hills (+114). Decreases occurred in Manipur State (-44,771), Cachar (-4,882), Kamrup (-2,900), Sibsagar (-2,166), Lushai Hills (-1,174) and Sadiya Frontier Tract (-102). The increase in Sylhet was due to the large number of operations done in Habiganj subdivision to combat the outbreak of small-pox in that area. The decrease in Manipur State as compared with the previous year is due to the very extensive vaccination campaign carried out in the State in 1919-20 during which period 20 per cent. of the total population was vaccinated. The rate 'could naturally not be kept up.

9. Composition and strength of the inspecting staff.—A Deputy Sanitary Commissioner was appointed during the year. One additional Sub-Inspector of Vaccination was appointed for the Sadiya Frontier Tract. No other changes were made. 10. Verification by the inspecting staff.—The Civil Surgeons and the Subdivisional Assistant Surgeons on their behalf inspected 13,468 primary operations and 5,689 revaccinations or 4.45 and 5.73 per cent. respectively of the total vaccinations made during the year. Three thousand and sixty primary and 367 re-vaccinations were inspected by the Deputy Sanitary Commissioner, the inspections by these two agencies being 5.46 per cent. and 6.10 respectively of the total primary and re-vaccinations done. The Sanitary Commissioner inspected 2,041 primary and 939 re-vaccinations. The Civil Surgeons of Cachar, Nowgong and Lakhimpur inspected the largest proportions of primary vaccinations done in their districts the percentages inspected being 14.67, 8.70 and 8.48 respectively. The largest totals inspected were 4,707 primary and 3,937 re-vaccinations by the Civil Surgeon, Sylhet. The Subordinate Inspecting Staff inspected 46.24 per cent. of primary operations and 44.48 per cent, of re-vaccinations as compared with 51.35 and 39.25 respectively in the previous year. In the Khasi and Jaintia Hills district 88.20 per cent. of primary and 76.24 per cent of re-vaccinations were inspected, this being the largest rate for the province. In the Garo Hills only 8.65 per cent. of primary and 29.55 per cent. of re-vaccinations were inspected. Inspection was poor in Goalpara district, the figures being 14.88 per cent. and 19.72 per cent. this low rate being due to changes in the staff.

11. Vaccination in Compulsory areas.—Out of an estimated number of 3,548 infants available for vaccination in the areas in which the Compulsory Vaccination Act is in force 1,786 or 50.33 per cent. were successfully vaccinated as compared with 58.78 per cent. in the previous year.

A detailed examination of the registers in Municipalities and Unions where vaccination is compulsory showed that very few children who had attained the full age of one year had escaped vaccination, but as vaccination is not compulsory until one year is completed a large number of the children born during the year carry over to the vaccination season of the following year. Of children born during the year and available for vaccination 79.3 per cent. were successfully vaccinated in Nowgong, 77 per cent. in Tezpur and 70.7 per cent. in Silchar. The lowest rates were in the town of Sylhet (14.6), Sunamganj (19.8), Karimganj (27.5) and Barpeta (26.1).

12. Vaccine Depôt.—The total number of capillary tubes loaded for issue during the year was 6,41,678, against 7,99,297 in 1919-20, showing a decrease of 1,57,619, although the decrease in operations was only 22,930. This probably indicates better distribution and less waste of vaccine lymph.

The total cost of working of the Vaccine Depôt during the year was Rs. 12,474-4-6 as against Rs. 15,093-8-5 in the preceding year. There was a reduction in the cost of capillary tubes obtained from England of Rs. 2,139-1-8 owing to a favourable rate of exchange. The cost and upkeep of calves was reduced by Rs. 970-15-0 owing to the smaller number under operation, 84 fewer being purchased than in the previous year. Six hundred and eighteen calves were inoculated in 1920-21 and lymph was taken from 522 only. Failure of operation accounted for 35 rejections, illness for 18 and ulceration and unsatisfactory vesicles for 42. One calf died. The greater part of the lymph used was from 144-hour vesicles the inoculation of calves being made by puncture. A few of calves were inoculated by linear incision and the lymph collected at 120 hours. The linear incisions gave a slightly greater outturn of lymph but the earlier collection resulted in a diminution of the average amount obtained from each calf by 27 per cent. Reports on 1,086 vaccinations done with 120-hour lymph show a percentage success of 96.2 as compared with 94.93 for the total vaccinations during the year.

13. Cost of the Department.—The total cost of the department amounted to Rs. 78,973-15-2 during the year 1920-21, as compared with Rs. 71,167-8-9 in 1919-20. There was an increase of Rs. 3,595-8-7 in the cost of subordinate supervising staff due to revision of rates of pay and the appointment of an additional Sub-Inspector. The increase in cost of vaccinators was Rs. 6,436-7-3 due to the employment of 21 additional vaccinators and to revision of their pay. The contingencies of the Vaccine Depôt were reduced by Rs. 3,104-7-7 as compared with in 1919-20.

The cost of each successful vaccination was annas 3 and pies 8 as compared with annas 3 and pies 3 in 1919-20, the increase being mainly due to the additional cost of vaccinating staff.

14. General.—Twelve thousand three hundred fourty-six vaccinations are reported to have been done in tea gardens by Garden Medical Officers as compared with 18,096 in 1919-20. The percentage of success in primary vaccination was 96.67. The number reported from Jails, Lunatic Asylum, Police hospitals and Cholera hospitals was 4,687 as against 5,152 in the previous year.

The following diagram illustrates the death-rates from small-pox in each district side by side with the


