



THE DE BARRI CRAWSHAY COLLECTION.

This interesting collection contains a large number of eoliths; these are considered by many antiquaries to have been the rude tools of very early man, and many of these specimens came from the collection of Mr. B. Harrison, the pioneer in this branch of Archæology; the types are varied, and most of the objects came from Kent, many from the neighbourhood of Ightham, where Mr. Harrison lived for many years.
