54 BOLIVAR (Simon, 1783-1830).

Full length, standing, uniform, left hand holding sword, two soldiers in tropical landscape to right.

General and Statesman; Founder and first President of the Republic of Columbia, 1819; Founder of Bolivia, 1824. Styled the Washington of South America.




