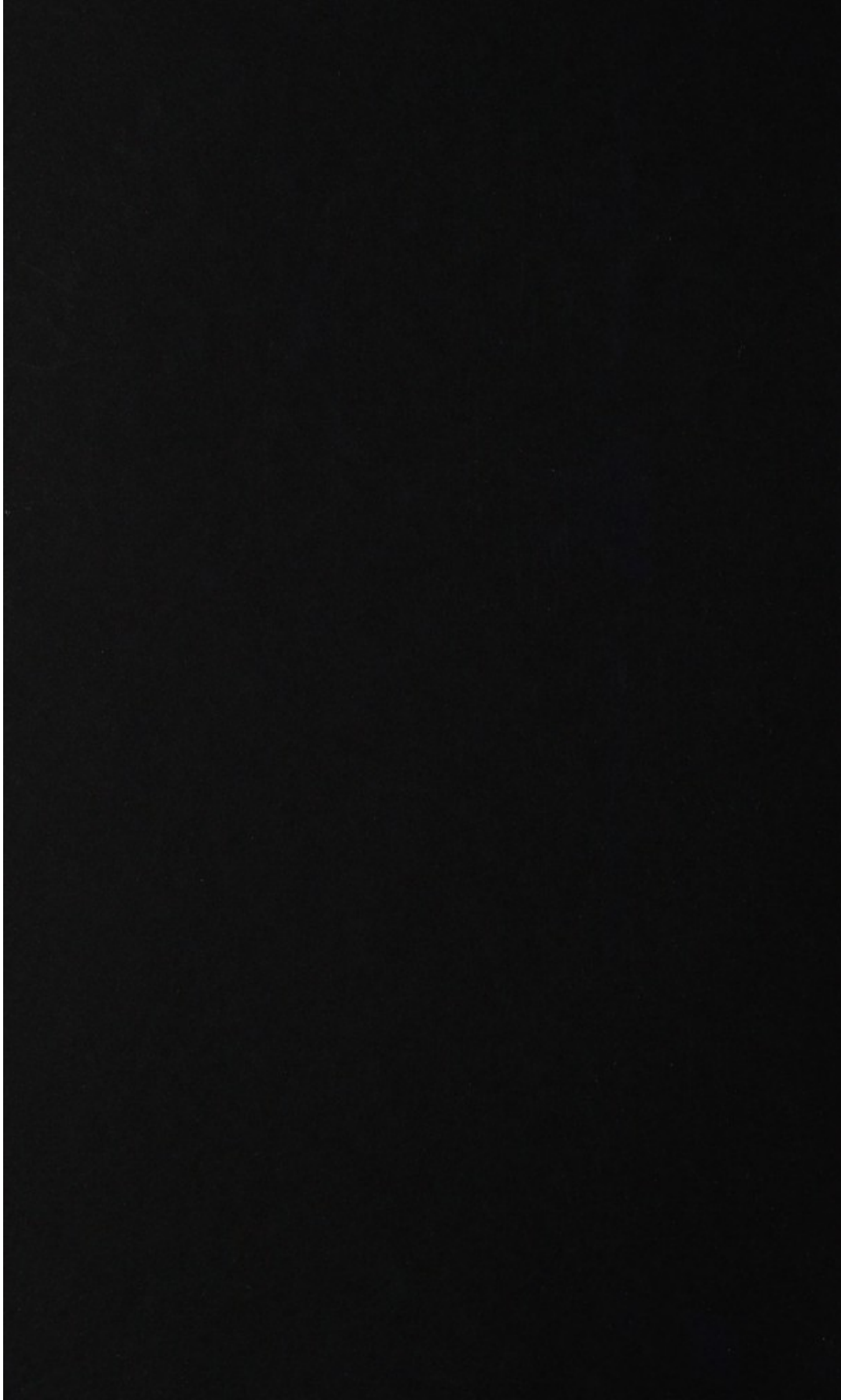

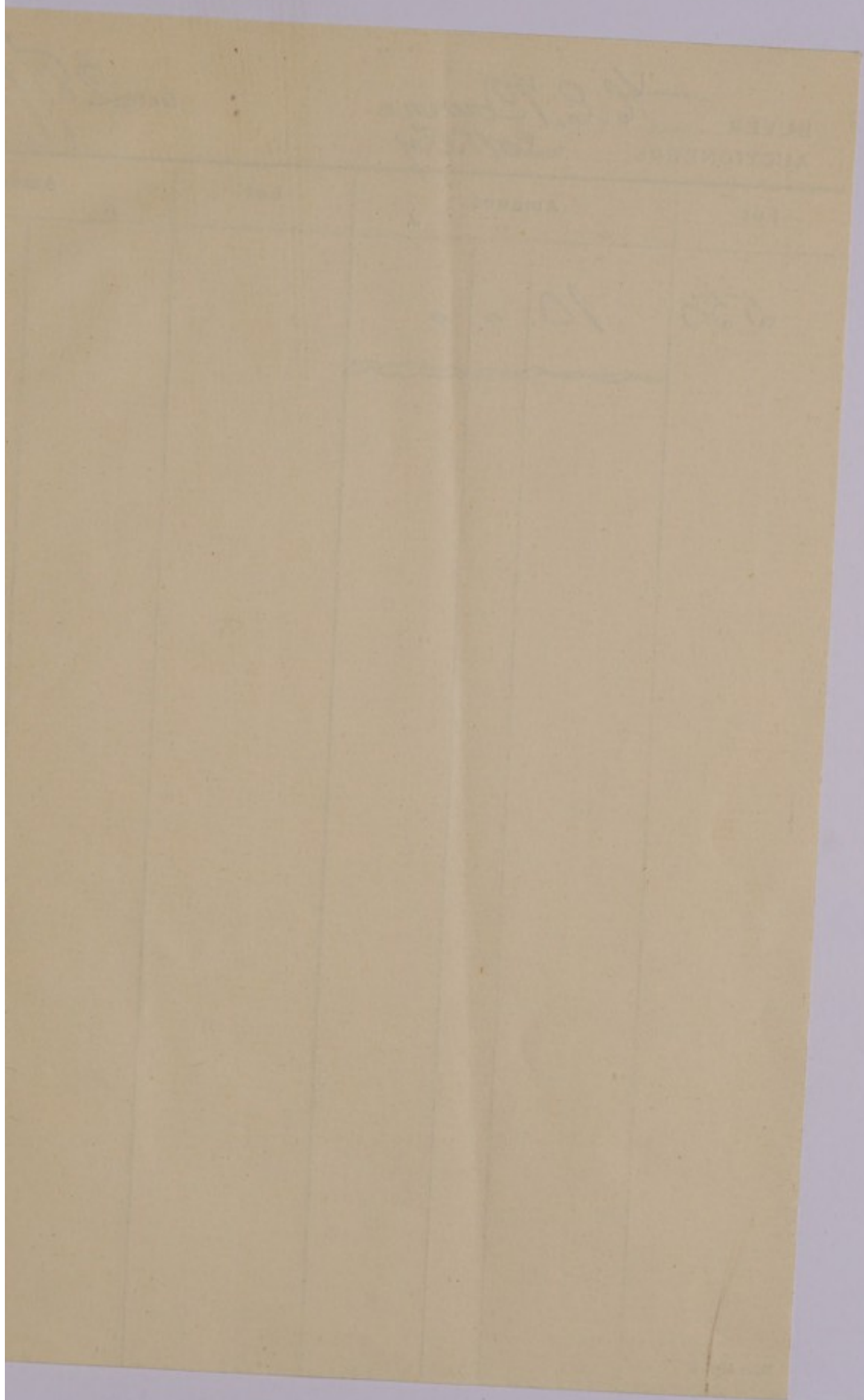

- I. The highest bidder to be the buyer. If any dispute arise the Auctioneer shall have absolute discretion to settle it; and to put any disputed lot up again.
- II. No person to advance less than 1s.; above five pounds 2s. 6d.; and so on in proportion.
- III. All lots are sold subject to the right of the seller or his agent to bid, or else to impose a reserve.
- IV. The purchasers to give in their names and places of abode, and, if required, to pay down 10s. in the pound in part payment of the purchase-money, in default of which the lot or lots purchased to be immediately put up again and re-sold.
- V. The lots to be taken away, at the buyer's expense, immediately after the conclusion of the sale; in default of which Messrs. SOTHEY & Co. will not hold themselves responsible if lost, stolen, damaged, or otherwise destroyed, but they will be left at the sole risk of the purchaser. In view of the curious circumstances of the composition of the work, and the controversy regarding the authorship of the movements, these apparently contemporary attributions to Mozart and Süßmayr are of very considerable interest. It has been impossible to collate the Musical Score, but it is possible this may show important variations, additional marks of expression and figuration, etc.

OWNERSHIP. The MS. which is dated 1804 at the end has on the binding the stamp of F. Placho, and within a nobleman's stamp apparently belonging to him. An inscription on the title refers to the sale by him to a "Franz Fiebes" (though the inscription is somewhat illegible); another early name erased on the title is ? Otto Hatvig; in several places throughout the MS. is a stamp of the "K. K. Oesterreichische Scheidemünze."
