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





A Gabun Horn Charm worn by men; a Congo River Medicine Man's Horn carved with geometric and interlaced ornament; a Nigerian Water Cup for use at the Poison Ordeal; a War Trumpet from the Timini Country; and five other Horns

An East African cocoanut fibre complete one-piece Costume; an interesting chain-mail Helmet, hung with numerous ju-ju; an elongated cane Rat Trap; a Sierra Leone fibre Skirt with dancing rattle; a Tailor Bird's Nest; and an Eel Trap



- A Kaffir Doctor's Belt, or Travelling Pharmacy, composed of small horns and beads; an Amazulu Charm formed of a small gourd and strings of beads; another; a Basutoland Necklace; and three other Necklaces
- A Mashonaland Witch Doctor's Charm worn on the wrist, composed of shells, etc.; a Madagascar Amulet; a Masai Charm composed of red spotted beads and leather; and eight other various Charms, Amulets; etc.
 - An old Kalabar Ordeal Bean; two smaller Beans; two Congo Fetish Rattles; an anti-rheumatic Kaffir Bangle; an Algerian leather Amulet; a Congo Spoon used by Medicine men, patinated to simulate ivory; two Fetish Rattless; and seven other pieces
 - The Leopard Society. A rare and interesting Footmark Printer in the form of two leopards' pads, used by the medicine men for making the print outside the hut of the person summoned to appear before the tribunal, 10in.; the Necklet of pendant imitation leopards' teeth cut by natives from ivory, worn by members of the Society; the steel Dagger used by the Society to execute their victims; and a silver Badge 4
 - An Ashanti Bowman's Charm, worn as a thumb-guard; another Ashanti Fetish, leather covered; a gilt metal Ashanti House Fetish with spike, another, similar; and an interesting collection of Ashanti gold weights; etc.

Two Ashanti gilt metal equestrian Figures, one smoking a pipe and the other carrying a gun; three Standard Bearers; three Foot Soldiers; two Musicians; four other Figures; three Boxes; and two female Figures supporting vase-shaped ornaments on their heads, 16in.

An interesting Benin coral Apron, said to have been worn by the wife of the King of Benin, taken in the Expedition of 1897; a small Benin leopard Plaque; a very small Head finely carved, 3in.; two Bracelets, in bronze, one perforated, 5\sum_in.; and a pair of large castellated Annulets, 11in.

- A pair of Benin gilt metal Figures of a man wearing a tunic, kilt and helmet, carrying an axe; and another with negroid features carrying a young leopard on his shoulder, 17in. and 18in. high, 6½in. wide; mounted on a mahogany wall Plaque
- An unusual Benin carved wood Head overlaid with metal plaques simulating the bronzes of the period and depicting the wearer with a coral choker and high feathered head-dress, $23\frac{1}{2}in$.
- A Benin Human Mask with finely cast features, the cheeks and hair decorated with toad-like animals, the lower part of the face supported on two legs, the whole with a scallop shell border, in brass, 7½in., fine condition
 - A FINE BENIN BRONZE PLAQUE depicting a warrior offering two dogs as sacrifice, the warrior wears a helmet with finial, deep coral choker, close-fitting tunic and skirted robe, 14½in.

 - A New Hebrides Human Skull decorated with black and red pigment; a New Caledonia small jade Charm; a small Aird River bone Shield; and four other various Pieces 7

A British New Guinea carved wood Charm against sickness in the form of a small alligator head; a Fulani African neck Talisman; a New Guinea Canoe Prow small Charm; a Warrior's Charm from the Papuan Gulf; a Breast Charm from Collingwood Bay; a small and well-carved Ancestral Figure from the Sepik River; and two Necklaces

A New Guinea Ear Weight for lengthening the lobe of the ear, from the Fly River District; a Water Bottle from the same region; a Lime Flask; a Necklace with pendant bean, from the Tugeri Tribe; another Necklace; a bark Charm in rattan bag; and another Necklace

A curious New Guinea Ornament of tortoiseshell and beads, decorated with feathers, held in the mouth when fighting or dancing; three small well-carved Charms, from the Fly River district in the form of small crocodile heads; a woman's Breast Ornament; a fine Hornbill Charm; and an interesting set of instruments from the Torres Straits

A New Guinea carved wood Ancestral Figure, of small size, used in the marriage ceremonies in the Fly River district; a wooden Frigate Bird Charm; two Breast Ornaments; a Dutch New Guinea Charm Stick; and three other Pieces

An interesting New Guinea Ancestral Figure forming the top of a short staff or club; a Gopi Charm hung in front of a house, decorated with tribal marks, from the Fly River District; an Adze; another Gopi Charm in the form of a fish; and ten other New Guinea carved wood shields, gopis; etc.

An interesting New Guinea Ceremonial Dancing Mask with a cane frame, covered with painted tappa cloth with bird-like features; a good New Guinea Skull with lower jaw attached; a War Drum; six Fishing Spears; and a circular Divining Board 10

A rare engraved New Guinea Human Skull with lower jaw attached, the forehead engraved with a full-face portrait; a very uncommon net and bead Skirt in fair state of preservation; and a Necklet, perhaps Australian

An Australian Churinga in wood, carved with totemic designs and with traces of eagle's down, 28in.; two others in wood, slightly larger; and four good stone Churingas all engraved with totemic designs (cf. BM. Guide, fig. 103)

A Haida Ladle with totemic handle; an American Hoodoo Charm; a Northern Brazil Rio Branco Necklet made of nuts and agouti teeth; a West American Indian currency piece of bread made of sea kelp, fish eggs and wild berries; and two Necklaces 6

A Cree Indian Dance Rattle; a Sioux Indian Spoon and Head Ornament of beads; a Squirrel's Lower Jaw and Feathers in beadwork and leather bag, worn as a preventive against rheumatism by the Sioux Indians; two beadwork and leather Bags; a Bandeau; two other Pieces; a Jamaican Negro lucky Bean; and Carib West Indies Ornament, mounted on a card

INDONESIA, ETC.

A Dyak Hand Charm, made of rhinoceros horn; an ivory Comb; partly engraved; another Dyak Charm of an interesting nature; a Necklace; a Sumatran Medicine Man's Charm with magic mirror attached; three Figures of Gods, carved in wood; and four Persian Seals; etc.

A Burmese Betel Nut Cutter with ivory handle enriched with glass; small mirrors and beads; another, smaller; a Siamese Talisman in the form of ceremonial shears, used at the Coming of Age of princes and nobles when the shears were used to cut their hair; a Puri (Orissa) Pilgrim Charm; a Burmese Lime Case; an Indian Bridal Necklet; a Korean Pin; two Modern Charms; two other Pieces; and a glazed case containing Nose Jewels, Charms, Flagellating Strap; etc.

Collection of seventeen Philippine Ladles in carved wood, the handles carved with human figures; five other metal Objects; and fourteen Fans; etc.

A Rag-dun or telescopic Temple Trumpet of copper with carved and perforated brass bands, 10ft. 2in. long

An extra large <i>Phur-bu</i> in coloured wood; and two others, smaller, in wood, as used in the <i>sTag-dmar-ch'am</i> or Red Tiger Devil Dances; the smaller one with three heads, brought home by a private soldier from a temple near Gyantse Monastery 3
A T'od-K'rag or human skull Cup lined with copper and with an elaborately ornamented gilt copper cover, as used for the worship of Pal-ldan Lha-mo the great She-devil; also two other skull Cups, unmounted 4
A Ts'e-bum or "Vase of Life," special to Amitayas the Buddha of Eternal Life, a copper vessel usually adorned with peacocks' feathers and Kusa grass, as used in the Eucharist of Lamaism, 9in. high; and three others, one of which has its natural vestment
A K'rus-bum or Holy Water Vase spouted, with hinged cover, copper with gilt panels, 6½in. high; two other Forms with Covers but no spouts; and two Libation Vases in white metal, 9¼in. high
A large Libation Cup on a lotus stem with a dedicatory inscription round the foot, 8½in. high; and three others, smaller 4
A Me-tok-bum or Flower Vase in brass, 8in. high; two others, 4\frac{3}{4}in. high; and one in copper, 7\frac{1}{4}in. high
Four mCh'od-r-ten or Relic Holders, brass, one having an opening in front for viewing the relic, $3\frac{1}{2}in$. to $8in$. high
