The original Manuscript of his translation is preserved at Allegheny College: three of his notebooks containing suggestions and ideas are in the Library of the Pennsylvania Historical Society; while his own copy of the Bible, with manuscript notes in the margins, is the property of the Library Company of Philadelphia.
