Dear child of sorrow—son of misery!
How soon the film of death obscured the eye
Whence Genius mildly flashed, and high debate." Etc.

John H. Reynolds was the son of the head writing-master at Christ's Hospital. Leigh Hunt (an old Christs' Hospital boy) introduced Reynolds to Keats. Keats's numerous letters to Reynolds show that he was regarded by him as on a footing of full intellectual equality. Reynolds addressed a fine sonnet to Keats, and Keats's own lines on Robin Hood were prompted by Reynolds' sonnets to this popular hero, and the last and best of Keats's poetical epistles was addressed to him. There is indeed hardly another correspondent to whom Keats expresses himself so unreservedly, or who has called forth so many of his best and deepest thoughts.—(D.N.B.).

This was Kipling's School Magazine. He was at the College from January 1878, till July 1882. During his last four terms he was Editor of the Magazine, in which period were published Nos. 4-10, to all of which he contributed. Several others contain contributions by Kipling or are of Kipling interest.

The present copy has a specially printed title, and a List of Contributions by Kipling. Many

of the Articles have never been reprinted.


