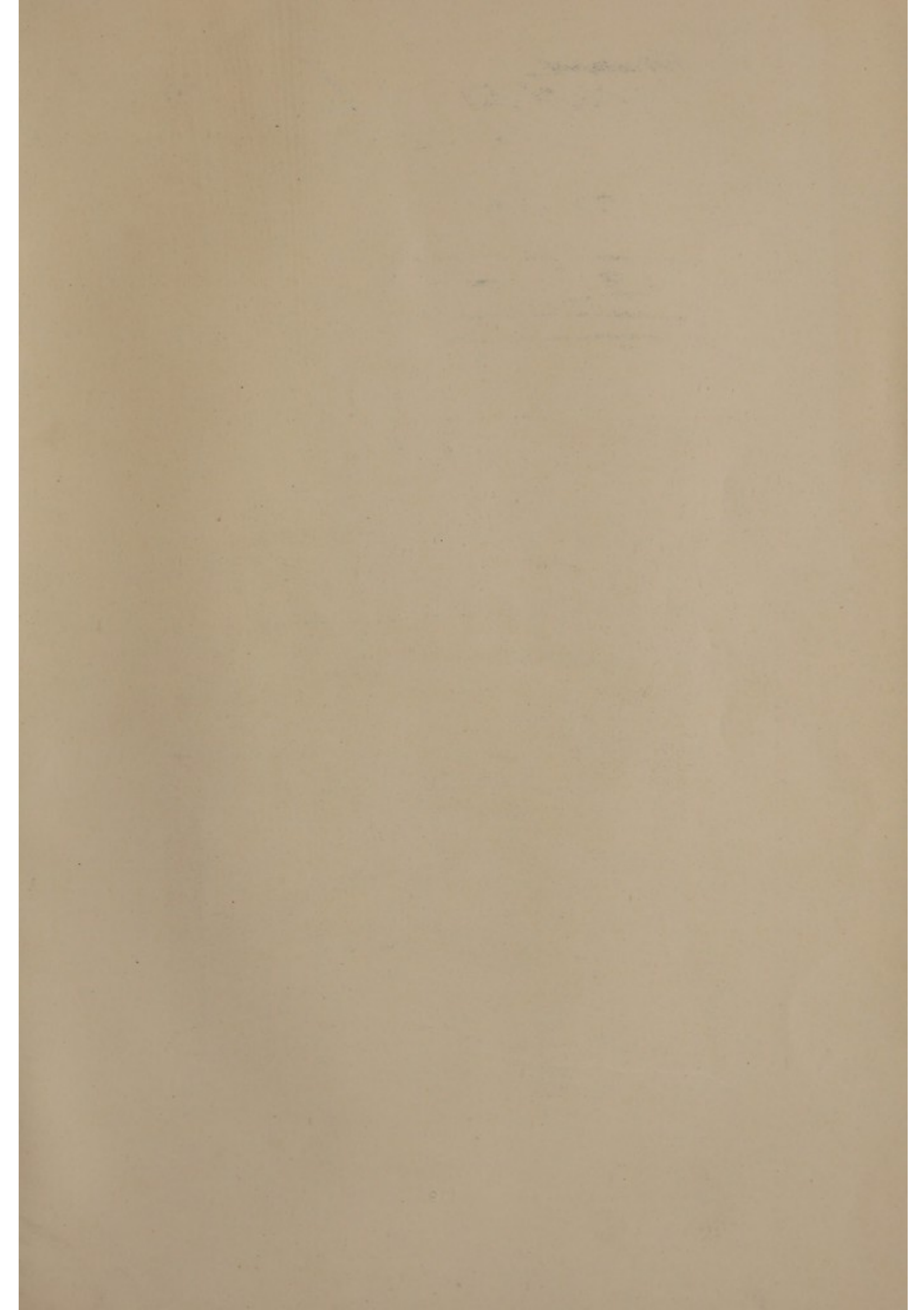

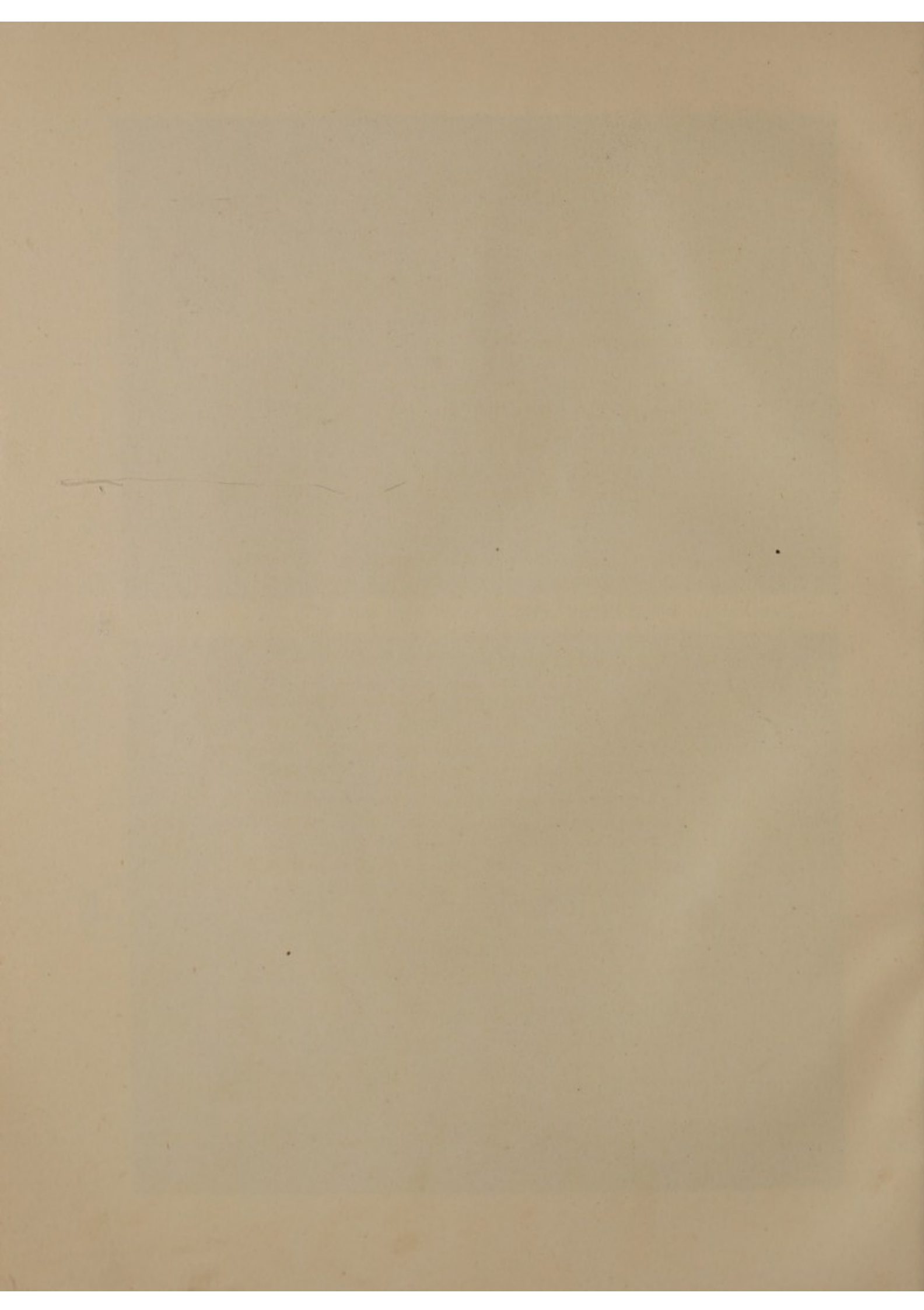

Woodhall Park was built in 1778 by Thomas Leverton (1743-1824).

Mr. Avray Tipping says: "Despite changes of ownership, the furnishing which Rumbold must have carried out under Leverton's eye has in large measure most happily persisted. The architect himself probably designed much more than the mirror and carpet for the drawing-room. The charming tripods in that room, if not the side tables, look as if they were of his invention. In several of the rooms illustrated we see the same style, and probably the same influence."—"English Homes," page 219, Vol. I.

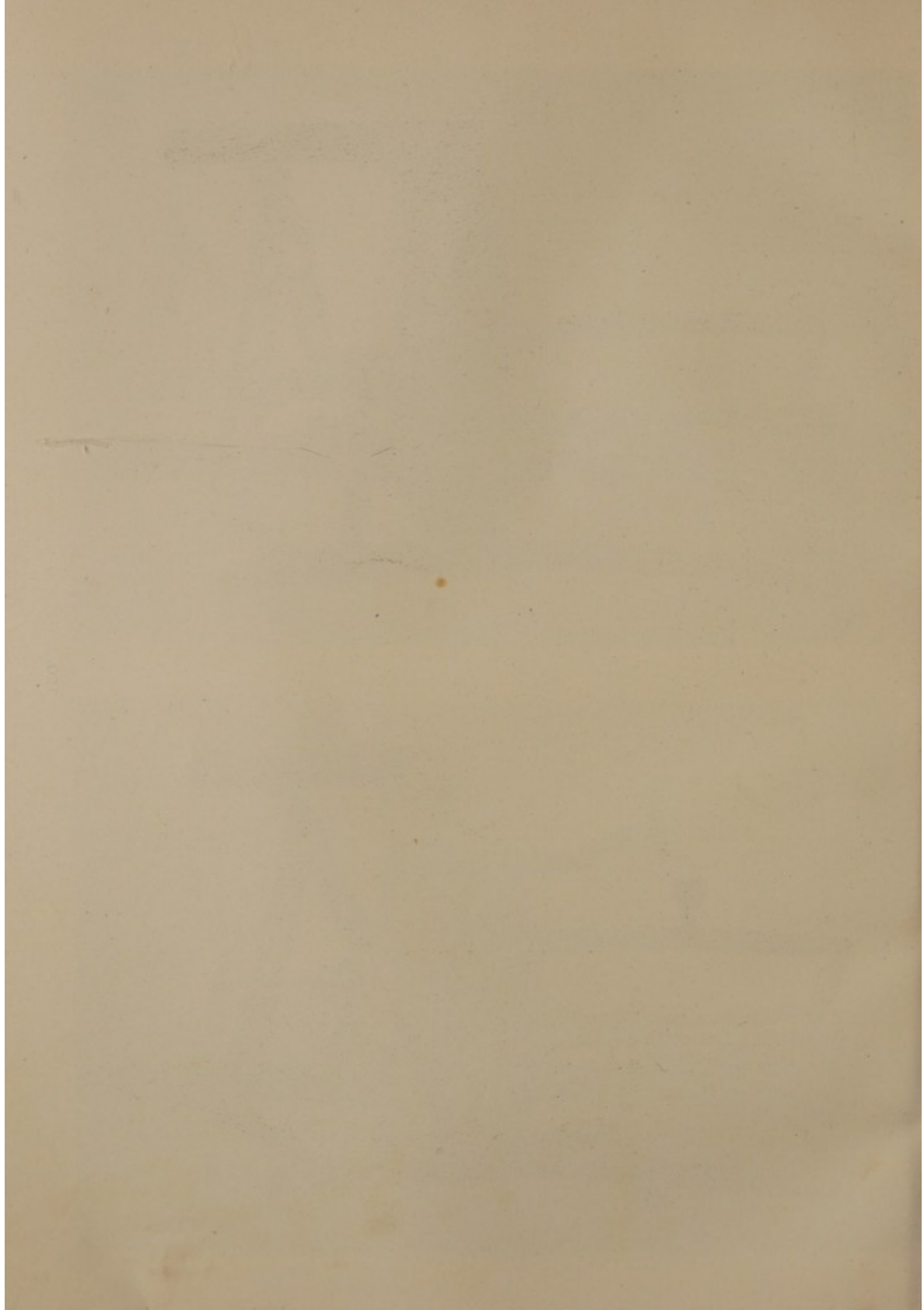
TAPESTRY.

121 A PAIR OF VERY RARE AND IMPORTANT GOTHIC TAPESTRIES, A.D. 1500-1520, of fine design and weave, probably woven at Brussels. They belong to a notable group of famous tapestries, and are akin to the Spanish royal tapestries representing "The Life of the Virgin," a somewhat similar series in the Cathedral of Saragossa, and "The Coronation of the

Virgin" in the Metropolitan Museum of New York. They are of the class known as "compartment" tapestries, in which the main subjects, representing kindred or contrasted incidents from Holy Writ, are separated by early renaissance figures; whilst, in smaller compartments in the upper part, are prophetic or teleological incidents connecting the New with the Old Testament.

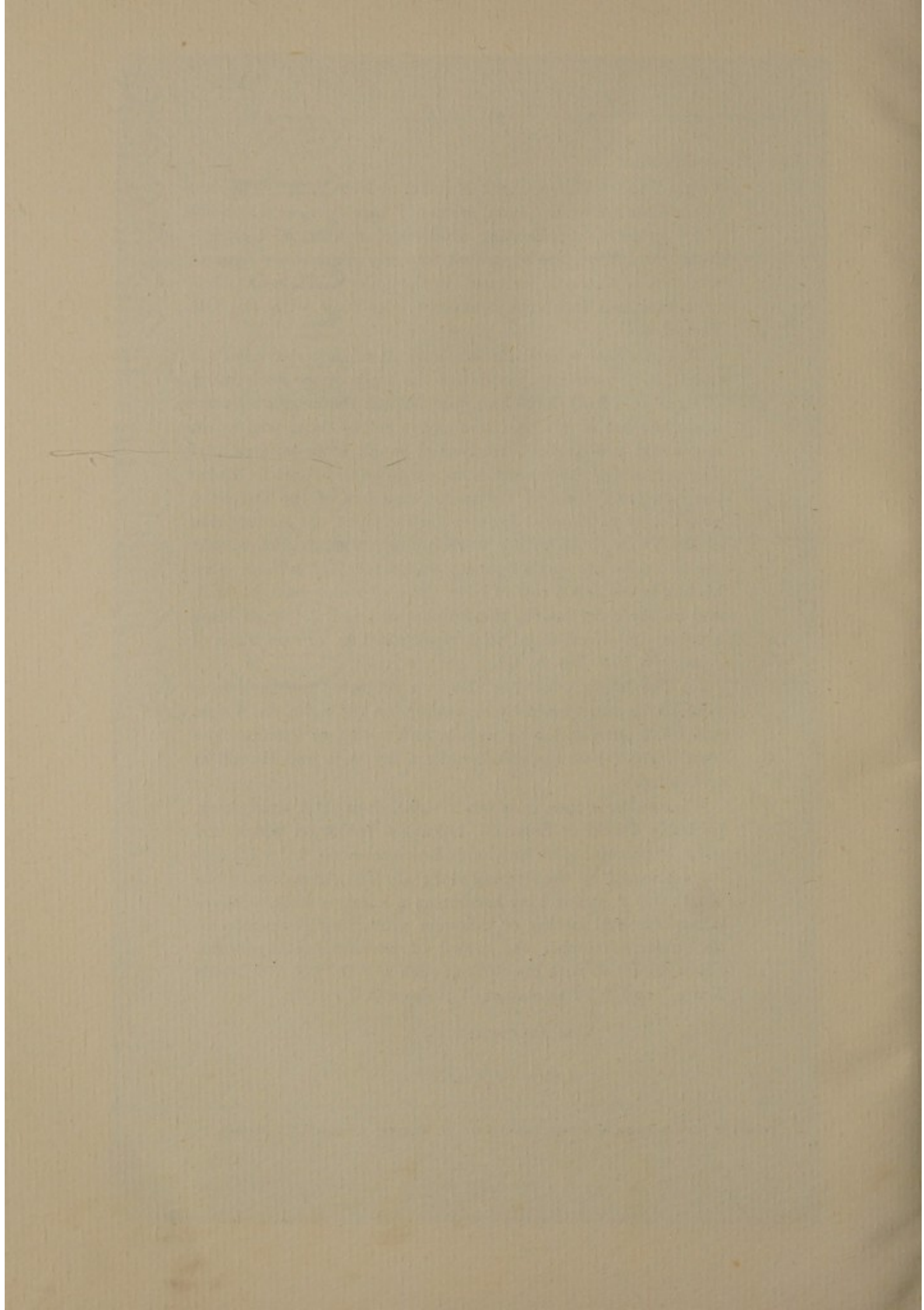
The pair now offered for sale have at some period been cut in half to fit panelling, just below the heads of the lower range of figures; of (a) only the upper portion remains, whilst the lower portion of (b) has been put together from fragments, and could probably be readjusted much more successfully. The subjects of the tapestries appear to be as follows:—(a) On the left, from the Old Testament, the Ark of the Covenant guarded by patriarchal figures; on the right, the Assumption of the Virgin, both with a worshipping multitude below. At the two sides are single figures; on the left Aaron holding up his hands towards a row of rods, three of which have budded, and on the right Isaiah, the Prophet of the Nativity, holding a tablet on which is a brief representation of the Tree of Jesse, *size 17ft. 7in. by 6ft.*

(b) The larger panel has also two subjects; on the left, a young king surrounded by his court; on the right, the Virgin and Child surrounded by angels, and with two Virtues close beside, Pax (?) on the left holding a lily stem and Humilitas on the right.

The smaller scenes, from left to right, show (1) A young king, probably David or Solomon, holding a tablet on which is a royal Virgin riding on an eagle (*Revelations, xii, 14*); (2) Soldiers alarmed by the flaming star; (3) The Adoration of the Magi; (4) A young king honouring a kneeling lady, perhaps Ahasuerus and Esther or Solomon promoting Bathsheba to be queen. Amongst the crowd of worshipping dignitaries below are labels with inscriptions such as "O Pia," "O Dulcis Maria," and "Ad te clamans"; *size 20ft. by 12ft.*
