





Of the large rewards offered for the scalp of John Pitchlynas . . . "Spain have caused a number of the Indians to believe that when the line is run between the United States and Spain that all Indians who may be within the bounds of the United States, that their lands will be settled and their women and children made slaves of . . . My arrival has caused great confusion among the Spanish part of this Nation . . . the Government at New Orleans has sent for all the Chiefs of the Nation to visit them immediately. It is necessary when the leading Medal Chiefs visit me on National matters great attention paid them in order to secure their friendship. For that purpose I ought to be furnished with provisions and liquor and some goods occasionally to be presented to such leading men . . . The friendship and interest of the Choctaw Nation may at this time be a mark of moment to the United States, the King of Spain in not complying with the Treaty and the bloody talks given out by his emissaries induce me to believe that he has an intention of urging the Choctaws and the Creeks to Declare War Against the United States, etc., etc.


