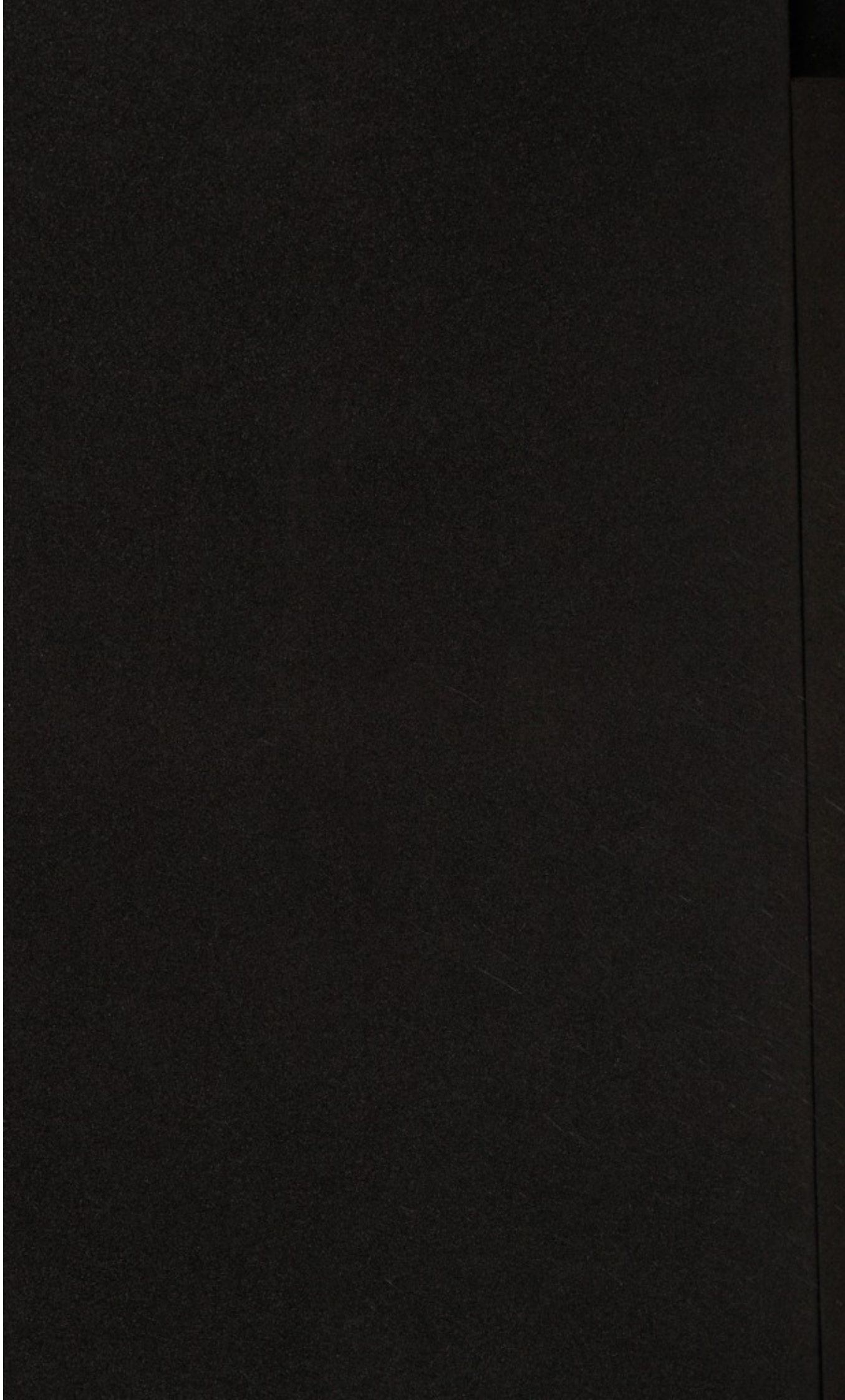

Abraham Cuson attained great eminence in the early 17th Cent. and an examination of this watch, still in going order after three centuries, immediately proves that such regard was well-founded.

The originals, of which 2,000 were made c. 1846, were used as pivot guns for sea and land service and had a length of 11 ft. 4½ in., bore 8.92 ins.; fired a solid shot of 68 lbs. with a propellent charge of 16 lbs. powder. They were used in great numbers at the Siege of Sebastopol and also on H.M.S. "Warrior." There is a record of one gun having fired upwards of 4,000 rounds and being in serviceable condition, comparison with modern ordnance is interesting.

- 75 A FINE SCALE MODEL OF A FIELD GUN WITH CARRIAGE AND LIMBER, by *J. Allen*. The Gun of brass is a model of an ordnance bronze muzzle-loading smooth bore 9-pdr. Field Gun; on a wooden carriage and limber with dished wheels and straked tyres, powder and shot containers and accoutrements exact and complete to the minutest details, including rammer, sponge, jack, handspike, pick, lever, hatchet, axe, hammer and five rounds of solid shot, *gun 9¾ in., carriage and limber 33 in., scale 1½ in. to 1 ft.*; on a mahogany stand enclosed by a glazed case, c. 1860 38/1-

The original bronze gun had a bore of 4.2 ins., length 6 ft. 5 in., weight 13½ cwt., it fired a 9 lbs. solid shot with a propellent charge of 2 lbs. of powder. They were made at Woolwich, c. 1856-1859, which period marks the end of the manufacture of bronze guns.

A type no longer seen, this Cart differed from the ordinary Farm Cart, in having a slightly curved floor; note also the bumper ends, used when the Cart was tipped on its hinges, the amount of tilt was regulated by a peg being placed in the key stick. Used more for conveying grains, potatoes, etc., than for field work.

- 77 AN OLD SUSSEX HARVEST WAGGON with detachable tailboard and hay ladder, steel fittings, rope roller and roller scotch to run behind near-side wheel, supported on dished wheels, turning on wooden axle arms, the tyres bonded on hot, the waisted body painted blue, the wheels red, in oak, elm and beech, *floor 18 in. long, scale 1 to 8*

Very few of this type have been made during the last half century, they are a very efficient, but difficult design of the waisted half-lock type, made to be drawn by three horses, and to carry a weight of four tons; many of the earliest type had "straked wheels," (see the 9 pdr. field gun, Lot 75).

- 78 A FINE OLD BERKSHIRE HARVEST WAGGON with detachable tailboard and hay ladders with bright steel fittings, the barrelled eye bolts attaching the shafts are a good example of early smith's work; the outside rails are arched over the hind wheels, and "laddered" with round rods, in 18th Century style, the dished wheels made of elm, beech and ash, turn-on wooden axle arms, fitted with the usual metal wearing clouts, the body of yellow polished boxwood, the floor of oak, laid lengthwise, *floor 18 in., scale 1 to 8*

Though this type is no longer made, a few specimens still survive with waisted half-lock. These three Models are interesting as illustrating the three methods of arranging the top rails of farm vehicles.

All three Models have just been exhibited at the Artists' Crafts Exhibition, Central Hall, Westminster, and it was therefore impossible to include them in the previous sale.

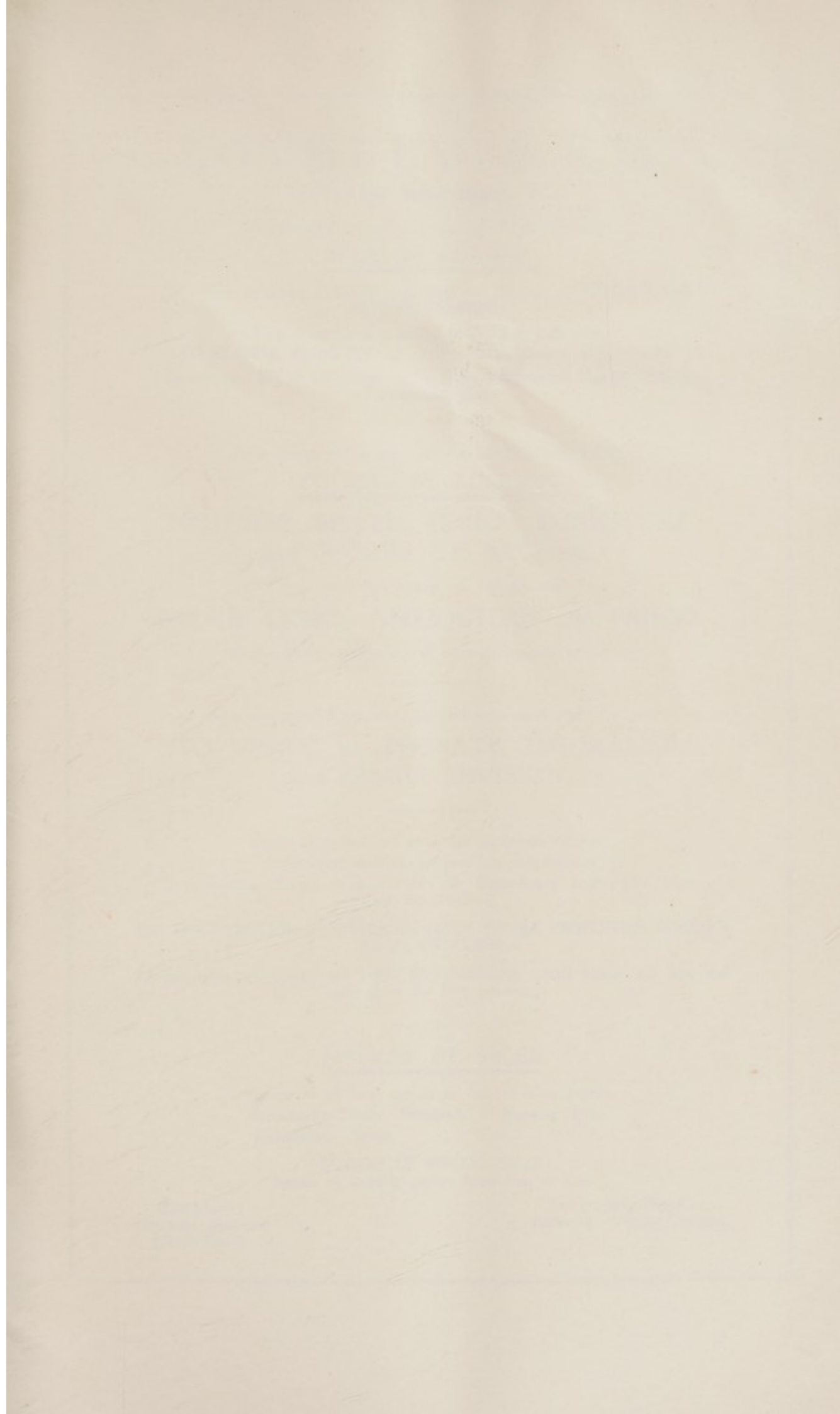

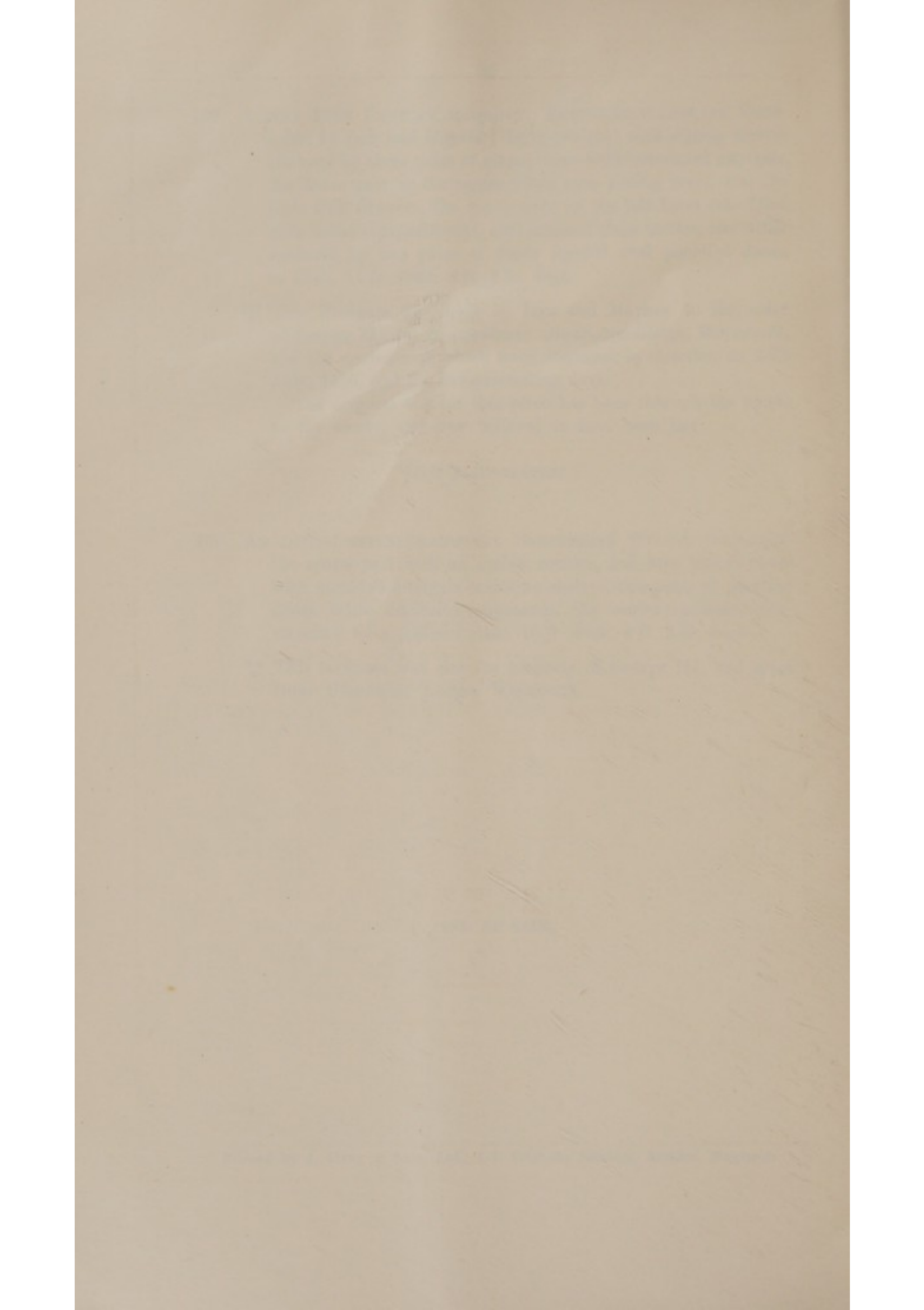
