- 1. The highest bidder to be the buyer; and if any dispute arise between bidders, the lot so disputed shall be immediately put up again, provided the Auctioneer cannot decide the said dispute.

FOREWORD.

R ICHARD BULL (whose family were established at Goldsborough Hall, Yorks) followed his father's profession as a Turkey merchant in the City of London; he married Mrs. Bennet, from whom the present owner of the Library, Lord Burgh, is descended. He was one of the leading collectors of old engravings of his day; and a great number of rare and valuable engravings (including many exceptionally fine impressions) are included in the splendid extra-illustrated works which form the most remarkable feature of his collection.

The Library has received a few additions since his death, in particular the long series of first editions of Swinburne's works presented by the author to his aunt Lady Mary Gordon of Northcourt, Lord Burgh's grandmother. Swinburne constantly visited his aunt, and much of his work was done at Northcourt.

But the character of the Library lies in the fact that it is an untouched example of a collection formed by an eighteenth century dilettante and man of letters. Of such collections, whatever their quality, very few now exist; and the tastes, friendships, and rare industry of the compiler invest this one with unusual interest.

Unlike Michael Wodhull and many others of his contemporaries, Bull had no overmastering devotion for the classics. Dividing his interest between books and engravings, he devoted his greatest industry to the combination of the two; and as a pioneer of extra-illustration, produced works rivalled only by such as the late Mr. Crisp's monumental "French Engravers and Draughtsmen."* The most imposing of these is the "Recueil de Portraits, Villes, etc., pour servir aux Lettres de La Marquise de Sévigné," a remarkable collection of almost every engraving bearing on the "Letters" which it was possible to obtain, bound in volumes with manuscript descriptions. Other works very elaborately enlarged are the magnificent Life of Bishop Burnet, and Walpole's Royal and Noble Authors (both containing many rare portraits); Lord Sandwich's Voyage and Lord Macartney's

Embassy, with fine portraits and views; the latter includes an interesting set of Chinese drawings. A most attractive series is that of the works of Thomas Pennant, with whom Bull was very friendly and in frequent correspondence, and who himself supplied much of the material with which the books are embellished. The drawings added to the manuscript copy of "London to Dover" are specially noteworthy.

Mr. Bull was also on intimate terms with Horace Walpole and gathered a remarkable collection of the Strawberry Hill publications. Many of the rarer leaflets are bound together in a volume with sets of the head and tail-pieces, notes by Walpole and Kirgate, and a water-colour drawing of the printing office at work, showing Kirgate setting up type.

"Ffirst whereas in regard of the wounderfull populousnes of the place, and close crowdinge of the streets & howses one on the Neck of another, Soe that there was scarce breathinge for the Inhabitants: There must of necessity (To make the City wholesome and Comodious, And to retayne (?) the Inhabitants within the same) be a greate expatiacon & inlargement both of the Streets & City, which by the Modell thereof (herewith sett forth) may more playnely appear: Which Modell I have drawne by the self same scale, by which I drew the Mapp of the old City, which is a scale of yards of 3 Foote to the yard.




