- I. The highest bidder to be the buyer; and if any dispute arise between bidders, the lot so disputed shall be immediately put up again, provided the Auctioneer cannot decide the said dispute.
- II. No person to advance less than 1s.; above five pounds, 2s. 6d.; and so on in proportion.
- III. All lots are sold subject to the right to impose a reserve; and subject to the right to bid by, or on behalf of, the seller.
- IV. The purchasers to give in their names and places of abode, and to pay down 10s. in the pound, if required, in part payment of the purchase money; in default of which the lot or lots purchased to be immediately put up again and resold.
- V. The lots to be taken away, at the buyer's expense, immediately after the conclusion of the sale; in default of which Messrs. Sotheby, Wilkinson & Hodge will not hold themselves responsible if lost, stolen, damaged, or otherwise destroyed, but they will be left at the sole risk of the purchaser. THE KELMSCOTT PRESS.

The original notice of this book runs—"KELMSCOTT PRESS, UPPER MALL, HAMMERSMITH, 9th MARCH, 1893. CHAUCER'S WORKS. WITH ABOUT 60 DESIGNS BY E. BURNE-JONES. FOLIO." As the book progressed, the number of copies to be issued was increased until, eventually, it took its final form, with 87 woodcut illustrations by Sir EDWARD BURNE-JONES, 14 large ornamental borders, 18 different frames around the

illustrations, and 26 large initial letters, all designed by WILLIAM MORRIS.

The above copy is inscribed on page a2—

“TO ALGERNON CHARLES SWINBURNE FROM WILLIAM MORRIS and EDWARD BURNE-JONES. July 12th, 1896.”

The whole of the inscription, excepting only Burne-Jones's signature, is in the hand of William Morris.

William Morris died on October 3rd, 1896, after months of ill-health that had given serious cause for anxiety. It would almost seem that this presentation copy had been hurriedly printed, to enable Morris to have the pleasure of inscribing it to his friend before he died. An examination of the “Red” printing throughout the volume, will show that the red ink was not working cleanly. The sharpness, and clearness of the woodcuts, and ornamental borders, give evidence of “early impressions.” A pencil note “50” upon the reverse of the blank page immediately following the colophon on page 554, would seem to denote the number of the copy.

letters have his endorsement. It has been computed that excluding autograph letters and the testamentary papers, the first two volumes contain about 50 different handwritings, all of the first generation of Friends, among the writers identified being Sarah and Bridget Fell, Ellis Hookes, Gervase Benson, etc. The papers in the third volume are of the same period and consist mostly of letters to and from various members of the Fell family (George Fox married Margaret Fell, widow of Judge Fell, in 1669).

It was formerly thought that the narrative portion of the Journal was written during Fox and Lower's imprisonment in Worcester Jail, 1674-5, but it is more probable that it dates from Fox's visit to Swarthmoor (April 1675-January 1677). After the death of Margaret Fox the papers remained in the keeping of her daughter Rachel, wife of Daniel Abraham, who resided at Swarthmoor; the estate was sold in 1759, and these papers were given by Sarah Abraham, widow of Rachel's only surviving child, John, to her nephew, Dodgshon Foster; they remained in the Foster family till 1861, when they passed to James Foster's nephew, Robert Spence, by whose grandson they are now offered for sale. The Journal has been reprinted in full by Norman Penney, F.S.A., at the Cambridge University Press, 1911. This description is based on his introduction to that edition. The contents of the third volume have not been reprinted in entirety, though they have been drawn on by various students.

Apart from its religious and biographical importance, the Journal is of no small literary and historical interest. Mr. Edward Grubb writes of it as follows in the Cambridge History of English Literature (vol. VIII, p. 103):—

George Fox's Journal is by far the most noteworthy of all these autobiographical efforts [of the early Quakers], and it is one which, for originality, spontaneity and unconscious power of sincere self-expression, is probably without a rival in religious literature. George Fox was a man of poor education, who read little except his Bible, and who, with pen in hand to the last, could hardly spell or construct a grammatical sentence. Yet, such was the intense reality of his experience, and such the clearness of his inward vision, that his narrative, dictated for the most part to willing amanuenses, burns with the flame of truth and often shines with the light of artless beauty. The story of his early struggles with darkness and despair is in striking contrast with another contemporary self-portraiture that of Bunyan in his *Grace Abounding*, etc.

We reproduce the famous passage in which Fox describes the last occasion when he saw Oliver Cromwell:—

. . . and saw and felt a waft of death goe foorth against him y^t hee lookt like a deade man.
