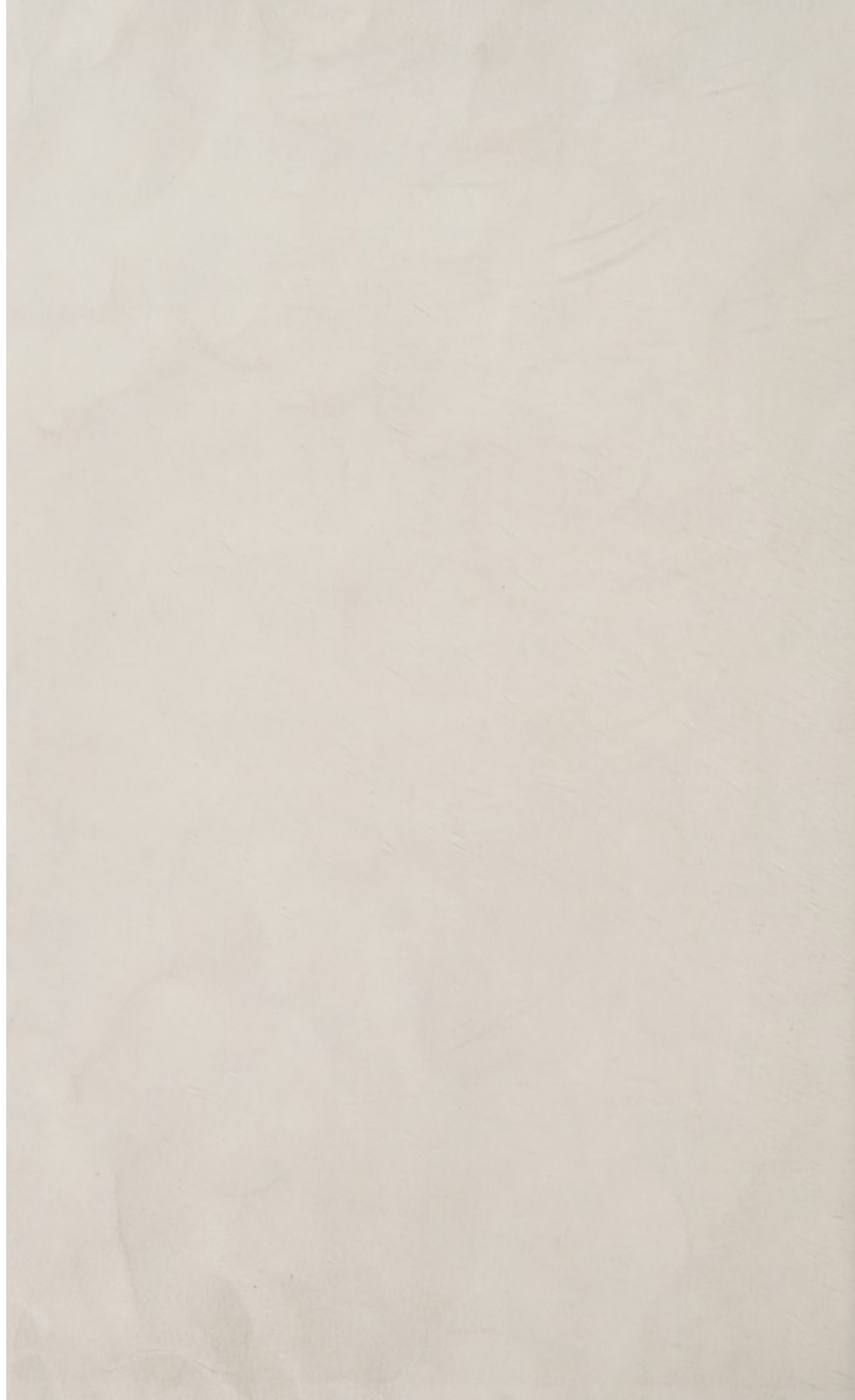

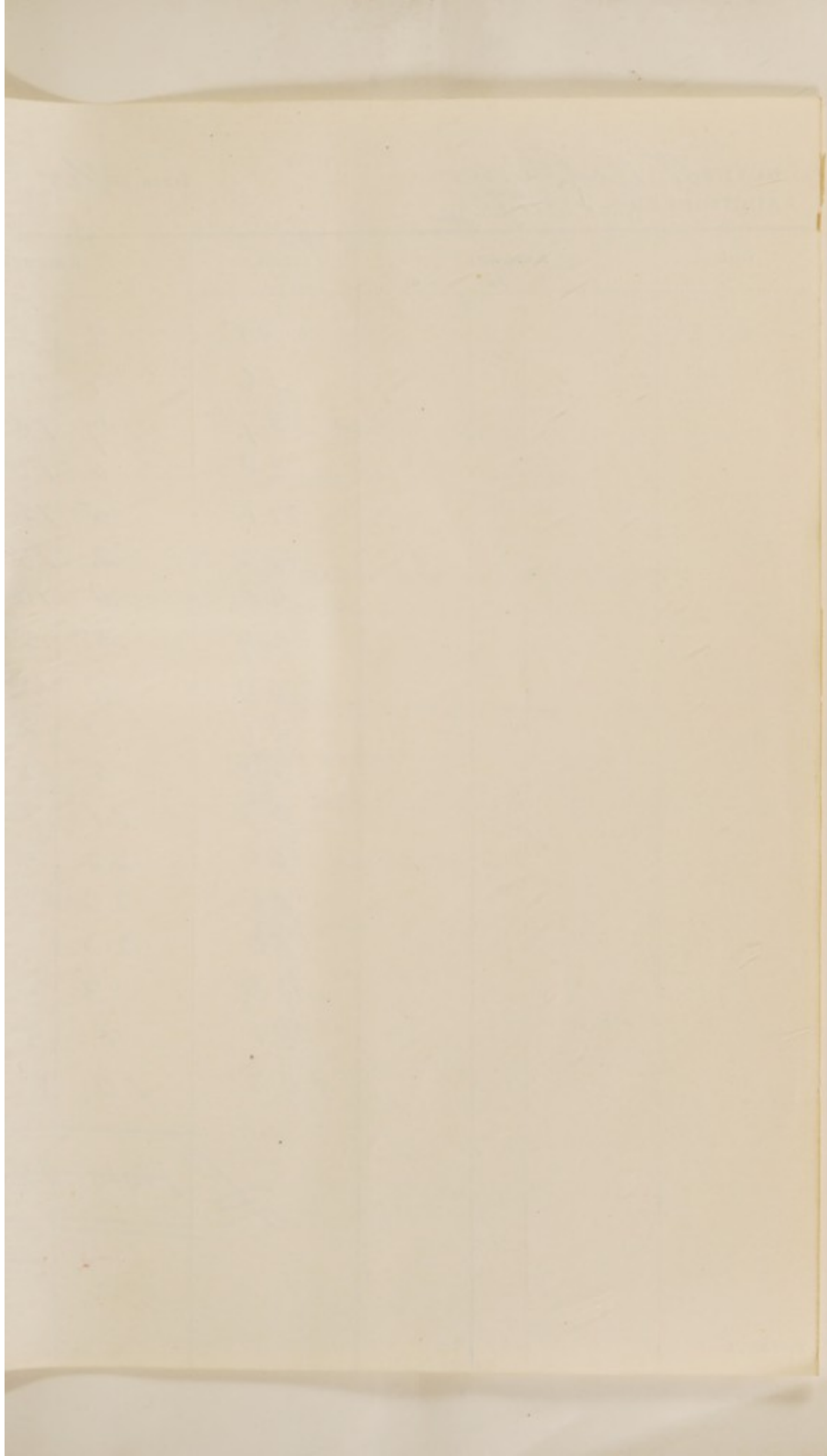

The Property of a Collector.

- 1 A German Knife and Fork with plain silver handles, the fork with double prongs, in a decorated cuir-bouille case, dated 1774; and a Silesian folding Spoon and Fork 5
- 2 A Silesian small folding Knife and Fork of baroque period, the green ivory handles studded with florets and foliage, in a leather covered case, and four German double-pronged Forks with metal and bone handles 7
- 3 A German Knife and a Fork, the former with a bone handle studded with metal plaques with the coat of arms of Saxony *c.* 1700, in leather cases; and four other Knives and a Fork, *17th Century and earlier* 9
- 4 A Mecklenburg Knife and Fork with finely carved ivory handles in the form of American Indians wearing plumes, feather kilts and capes, *17th Century*; two Dutch bone Knife Handles, and a pair of Porcelain Handles 6
- 5 A Hamburg Knife and Fork and a Spoon in a tooled leather case, the silver knife and fork chased with figure subjects, and dated 1789 4
- 6 A Hamburg Knife and Fork and a Spoon in a painted and tooled parchment case, the handles of the knife and fork with filigree work (*cf.* "Knives and Forks," plate 58, Bailey) 4

- 7 A South German folding Spoon and Fork, with heavily gilt handles chased with hunting scenes in baroque style, in a tooled leather case 3
- 8 A good Augsburg silver gilt Spoon and Fork, the handles finely decorated with arabesques and vignettes of landscapes, in a leather case. Augsburg mark (*cf.* Bailey, "Knives and Forks," plate 64) 3
- 9 A pewter Spoon with strawberry knop and fig-shape bowl, another with winged human head knop, and six others in pewter and latten 8
- 10 A Collection of eight small Spoons of various types, Roman, 15th-16th and 18th Centuries, in various metals; an interesting lot 8
- 11 A German 16th Century Spoon with shallow ovoid bowl, and triangular top; another with hoof top, and three others, one with a baluster top, mostly bronze 5
- 12 A Bavarian silver Apostle Spoon, with a figure of St. John; two good latten Apostle Spoons, and another Spoon with maple wood bowl 4
- 13 A Mecklenburg 17th Century silver Spoon, inscribed "Joachimus Grentzow" with wing top; an Apothecary's Spoon of leaf shape with eight marks, and two others 4

- 14 Four Roman Keys with perforated bows; another, with bow of Gothic arch type in bronze and the remainder in iron; another iron Roman Key, and a part of a Roman Lock in bronze 7
