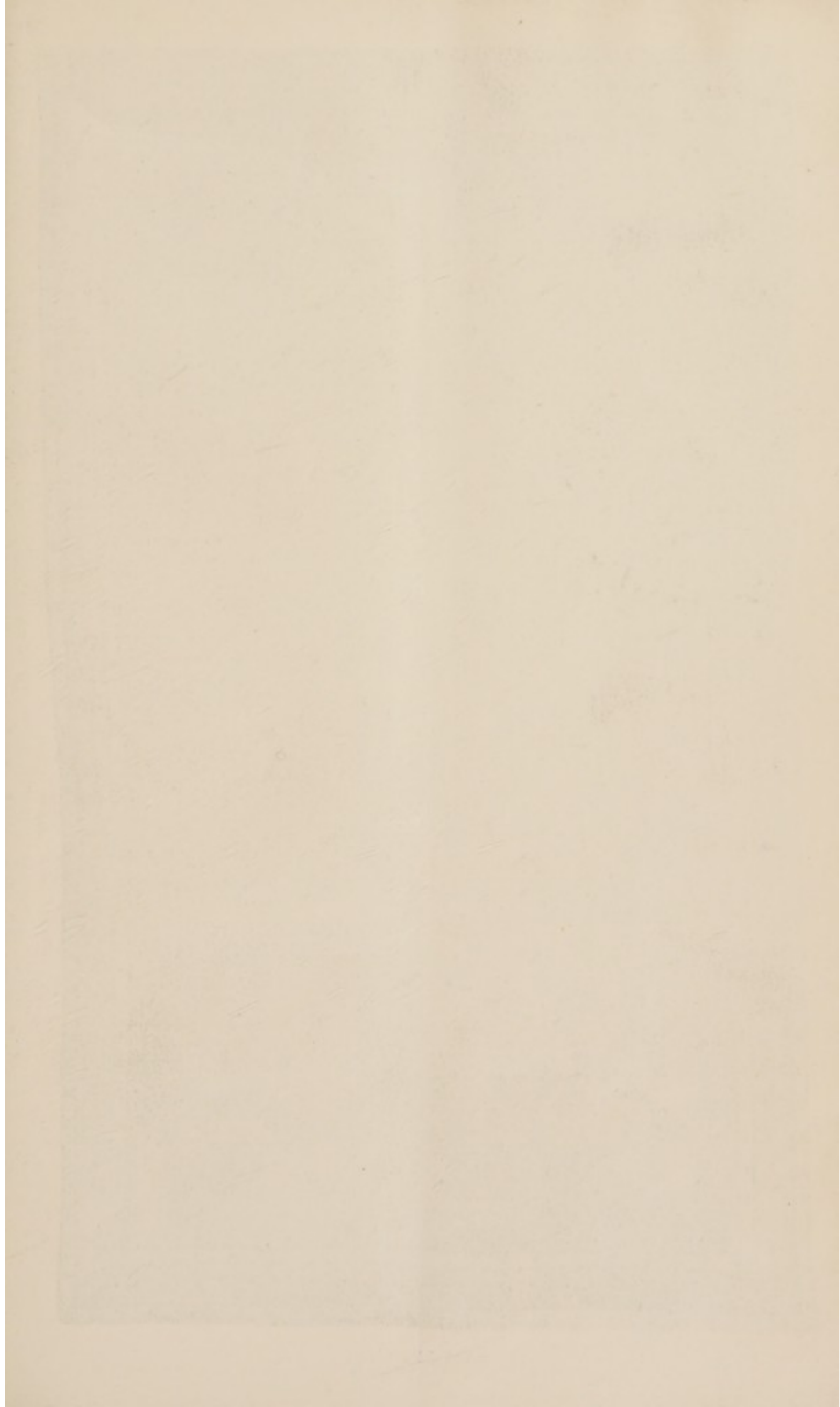

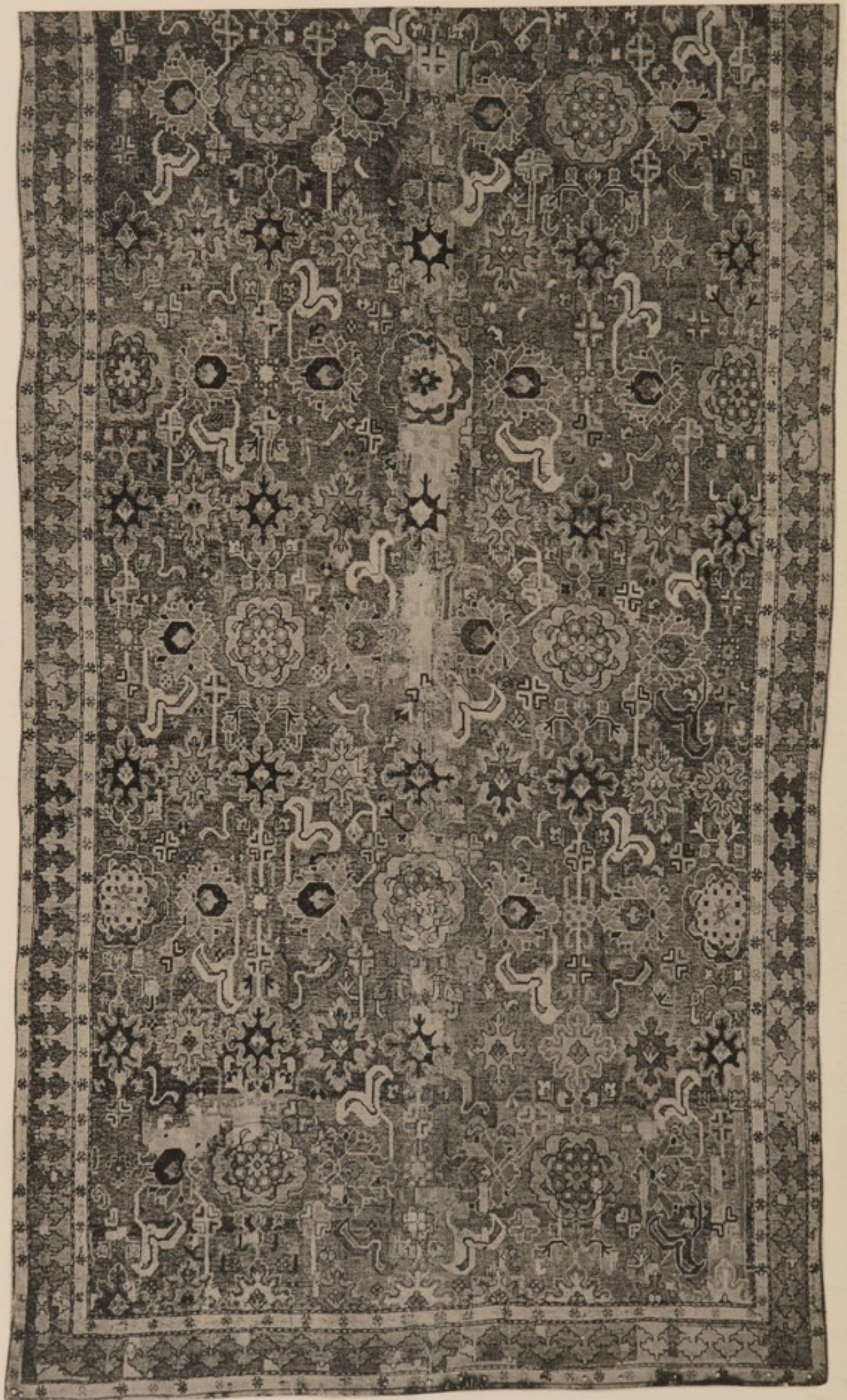

ENGLISH POTTERY

- 1 A LEEDS CREAM WARE TEA CADDY of unusually large size, decorated in relief with bust portraits of George III and Queen Caroline and brilliantly painted in shades of blue, yellow, green, salmon pink, red and black, $6\frac{3}{4}$ in.
 - 2 A LARGE EARLY STAFFORDSHIRE POTTERY FIGURE OF A BEAR of performing type, seated on its haunches, wearing harness and chain, and between its paws, realistically modelled, a figure of a Dog, looking up with teeth bared and full of expression; covered with a light brown glaze, the harness yellow, the dog cream and manganese the base green and hollow, $10\frac{3}{4}$ in. high, 12in. long
 - 3 ST. GEORGE AND THE DRAGON, by *Ralph Wood*, the usual group but with rare colouring, the horse and rider uncoloured but outlined in blue with traces of gilding, the dragon green, altogether an unusual colour scheme, 11in.
 - 4 A FINE STAFFORDSHIRE FIGURE OF A CAT, seated on an oval green base, the cream coloured body with polychrome sponged markings and red ribbon collar, the face full of expression, $13\frac{1}{2}$ in.
- ** A unique specimen of unusual size.

BOW AND SPODE PORCELAIN

- 5 A BOW FIGURE OF A NUN, seated, her left hand holding a rosary, in the right hand a book of devotion, in white habit, puce cowl and scapular, brown shoes, 5½in. (cf. *Herbert Allen*, pl. 3, no. 6, and *Burlington Magazine*, vol. 25, p. 35)
- 6 A BOW FIGURE OF THE TRIANGLE PLAYER, with finely modelled head surmounted by feathers, wearing a close-fitting puce bodice with blue stomacher, red, blue and gold checkered underskirt, yellow skirt, an ermine pouch at her side, on a hollow rococo base, 7¼in., mark a blue cross, an unusually fine example
- 7 A PAIR OF SWANSEA VASES, of oviform shape, with richly gilt dolphin double handles and white and gilt trumpet necks, the bodies finely painted with a continuous design of old English flowers, terminating in square bases, 14¾in.
- 8 A pair of fine quality Spode double-handled small Bowls and Stands, painted with rosebuds and other old English flowers, on a gold scale and blue ground, 4¼in. diam., mark in sepia and brown 1166

- 9 A pair of small Vases and perforated Covers, with flamiform knops, painted on each side with bouquets of flowers in colour, divided by gilt double handles and beaded borders, 5½in., mark in sepia 1166

- 10 A pair of Spill Vases, brilliantly painted with bouquets of roses, tulips and other old English flowers, on a gilt and blue scale ground, divided by "mons" within beaded borders, 4¼in., mark in red 1166

- 11 A PAIR OF SPILL VASES of large beaker form, on short stems and conical feet, painted with the same design as the smaller pair in the preceding lot, 6in., mark in red 1166, unusual combination of script and print

- 12 A RARE CHELSEA "GOAT AND BEE" JUG, in plain white after the silver model, and supported in the usual manner on the back of two reclining goats, with twig handle and bee in relief under the lip, 4½ in., mark an incised triangle and the word "Chelsea" in script

** A specimen in the British Museum (*Guide*, fig. 104) is similarly incised on the base but bears in addition the date 1745; these would appear to be the only two specimens known with the word "Chelsea" on the base, though other examples are known both in white and in colours with the incised triangle mark.

Other Properties

- 13 A FOX-HEAD CUP of fine quality and large size, decorated in natural colours; another on yellow ground; another, smaller, in natural colours; a fourth of later period; and a small pottery Head of a Hound 5
- 14 A Lowdin's Bristol or early Worcester Bowl, transfer printed in outline in black and colours, with Chinese figures, *fine quality*, 5 in.; and a pair of Spill Vases with classic figures in black, 6¾ in. 3
- 15 A FIGURE OF A LION, by *Ralph Wood*, brilliantly modelled and glazed, the lion with right paw resting on a ball, in natural colours on a blue mottled oblong base with green acanthus leaf borders, 12 in. long, 10 in. high
- ** A similar figure is illustrated in the catalogue of the Frank Partridge Collection, pl. 20.
- 16 A PAIR OF CHELSEA CANDLESTICKS, moulded on the circular bases with recumbent goats, the tree trunk columns surmounted by leaf dripguards and nozzles, 8¼ in., *red anchor marks*
- 17 A PAIR OF PINXTON VASES and Covers, the latter painted over a meandering border of old English flowers in the manner of Billingsley, the sides with views and river scenes divided by drapery, 12¼ in. 4

- 18 A DECORATIVE GARNITURE, in English porcelain of three campana-shaped vases, beautifully painted with panels of flowers, fruit and birds on many-sided pedestals with square bases, the ground colour lavender blue and canary yellow, 11in. and 9 $\frac{3}{4}$ in. 3
- 19 A RARE NANTGARW DISH of lobed oval form, the centre decorated with eight rose blooms in Billingsley style on a gilt ground, the borders with eight circular black medallions, decorated with birds in colours and alternate panels of gilt leaves, 11 $\frac{1}{2}$ in., mark *Nantgarw C.W. impressed*
- 20 A FINE WORCESTER TEA AND DESSERT SERVICE, brilliantly decorated with a Japan floral pattern and key fret ornament in colours within fine gilt and moulded borders, comprising :—Teapot, Cover and Stand, Milk Jug, Sugar Basin and Cover, Bowl, two Cake Dishes, two Bread and Butter Plates, twenty Tea-cups, twenty Saucers, Centre Dish, seven Fruit Dishes in shapes, a pair of Baskets and Stands, and twenty-six Plates, *generally in superb condition* 89

- 21 A CHELSEA OCTAGONAL CUP AND SAUCER, decorated in Kakiemon style with a radiating design of alternate panels of gilt "mons" on a rouge-de-fer arabesque ground, divided by sprays of flowers and symbolic motifs; and another Cup and Saucer, similar (cf. *Honey*, pl. 3, fig. B) 4
- 22 A PAIR OF BOW FIGURES of the "New Dancers", the boy in blue lined yellow coat and flowered breeches, the girl in puce bodice, blue, yellow and pink striped skirt and flowered apron, both with plumed hats, *generally in fine state*, 7 $\frac{1}{2}$ in., *rare crescent marks in blue* 2
- ** A similar pair is illustrated in *Bow Porcelain*, by Frank Hurlbutt, pl. 45; see also *The Antique Collector*, November, 1934, p. 311, by the same author.

- 23 A PALISSY DISH of oval form, with fluted and ribbed sides, the centre moulded in relief with Our Lord's Baptism in green, blue, cream and manganese, 12in.

- 24 An interesting Spanish pottery Figure of a Bull, caparisoned with ribbons and covered with a tortoiseshell glaze on an oblong base, 6in. ; and a fine Model of a Bullock Wagon with a peasant leading the team, 11in. 2
- 25 A Neapolitan Figure of a Mendicant in rags and tatters, 12½in. ; a French Funerary Urn with a frieze of flowers and inscriptions, 7½in. ; a Castelli majolica Plaque with animals in two zones ; and three other pieces 6

- 26 A Fürstenberg Tea and Coffee Service, painted with landscapes in colours, with gilt borders, comprising :—a Teapot and Cover, a Coffee Pot and Cover, a Hot-milk Jug and Cover, a Sugar Basin and Cover, a Tea Caddy and Cover, a Slop Basin, a shaped oval Dish, ten Tea-cups, six Coffee Cups and sixteen Saucers 44
- 27 A set of twelve Ludwigsburg Dessert Plates, painted with different views in colours in the centres, within scale pattern borders painted with sprigs, 9½in. diam. 12
- 28 A set of twelve Frankenthal Dessert Plates, painted in colours with cherubs and sprigs within blue and gold lined borders, 9in. diam. 12

Other Properties

- 29 A PALISSY CIRCULAR PERFORATED DISH with sunk tondino centre and a wide border of perforated foliate ornament in green, blue and manganese, divided by six masks in relief within heart-shaped panels, supported on a circular foot, 8in. (*see a similar dish in the Kunstindustrimuseum, Copenhagen, illustrated by Hanover and Rackham, vol. 1, fig. 193*)
- 30 A Dresden shallow Flower Bowl and Cover, perforated and encrusted with flowers, 8½in. ; a Louis Phillipe Teapot, Milk Jug, Sugar Basin and Cup and Saucer ; a Meissen Persimmon Bowl and Cover, on ormolu mount ; and a Worcester Flight Plate of " Hope ", from the Nelson Service, 9¾in. 12

- 31 A pair of Dresden Cups and Saucers, decorated in blue with flowers and diaper borders in the Oriental style ; another Cup and Saucer ; and two others of circular type, with café-au-lait exteriors 10
- 32 A Dresden small Tea Service, painted with an attractive Japan pattern in bright colours, comprising :—Teapot and Cover, Sugar Basin and Cover, Milk Jug and six Tea-cups and Saucers of lobed form 17
- 33 A SÈVRES BISCUIT GROUP, emblematic of a judgment for beauty, showing a female figure standing before a seated figure and being crowned by the three Graces, all in classical robes, 15in. high
- 34 A PARIS DESSERT SERVICE, painted in classical style with wreaths and entwined flowers in colours within gilt borders and florette medallions in the centres, comprising :—two Ice Pails and Stands, two Sauce Tureens, Covers and Stands, two circular Dishes, two square Dishes, and eighteen Plates, *mark in red, Rue Thiroux* 30

CHINESE PORCELAIN

- 35 A BEAKER of bronze form, brilliantly coloured with figure subjects, boys and a mounted combat in a mountainous gorge, 18in. ; and a pair of small Beakers of similar form, with ogre masks within stiff plant and leaves, 9½in. ; *K'ang Hsi*, wood stands 5
- 36 A pair of rare "famille rose" Plates, enamelled in the centres with a peacock and four figures seated, holding fish, known as "The Doctor's Visit", within a border of cranes, aquatic birds and six panels of fish, 9in. ; *Yung Cheng* 2
- 37 A "FAMILLE VERTE" BOWL, brilliantly enamelled on the exterior with figures on a terrace and *shan shui* subjects, the interior plain except for a seated figure, 7¼in., *rare Dedication mark* ; and a small covered Cosmetic Bowl with a figure of a Lady, seated at a table on the cover, 4in. ; *K'ang Hsi* 3
- 38 A "FAMILLE VERTE" DISH of large saucer shape, enamelled in brilliant colours with two Ladies outside a walled garden, a terrace to the left within a border of lattice diaper and reserve panels of butterflies and grasshoppers, 15in., *double ring in blue* ; *K'ang Hsi*

- 38A A PAIR OF CHINESE CLOISSONNÉ ENAMEL VASES AND COVERS of tapering rectangular form, finely decorated in flowers emblematic of the Four Seasons, in natural colours on a conjoined swastika fret and brilliant blue ground, the angled corners decorated in turquoise with archaic designs, overlaid with bronze ogre mask finials joined by "cash" emblems; *Ch'ien Lung*, 1ft. 9in. high; and pierced wood stands 5

** These vases were formerly in the possession of The Tsar Nicolas II of Russia, and are illustrated in the portrait of his daughters appearing in the *Illustrated London News*, August 1st, 1914. This photograph accompanies the lot.

- 39 An interesting Miniature of Rubens, by *Bernard Lens*, with his wife and child, whole length, walking on a terrace, signed "*Bernard Lens. Fecit, 1721*", 15½in. by 11½in.; and oak stand
- ** A very old label on the oak panel at the back reads: "Rubens and his wife and child copied from the Original by Rubens in the Cabinet of His Grace the Duke of Marlborough at Blenheim Castle near Woodstock Oxford Shire by Bernard Lens painter in miniature to His Majesty Anno Domini 1721 w'th leave of his Grace."
- 40 A cameo cut-glass Vase, by *George Woodall*, of tall bottle shape, with pale brown ground on which in high relief is a floral design in white, *Webb and Sons, Stourbridge*, 18in. high
- 41 A Wedgwood Vase of fine quality, white ground, on either side are oval panels reserved in turquoise blue, the border of the vase dark blue ground, the neck repeating the turquoise colour, the whole decorated with branches of oak leaves and acorns, and encarpa of flowers and foliage and intricate strapwork, all in gold, 12½in. high, 11in. across the handles

- 42 A stipple Print, printed on cream satin with figures of nymphs, fawns and youths running and jumping, the style of a classic frieze, blue ground and border printed with conventional honeysuckle in brown, $9\frac{1}{4}$ in. by 18in., Empire frame; another ornamented with the flowers of the "garrya elliptica"; and a Fan, with pierced, carved and gilded mother-o'-pearl sticks, and the fan mount exquisitely painted with figures of nymphs en grisaille, on grey background, in deep gilt frame, *outside measurement*, 15in. by 24in.
- 43 A fine Blue John Pedestal with marble and ormolu mounts, $5\frac{1}{2}$ in. diam., surmounted by a finely shaped bronze and ormolu vase of urn shape, with acanthus leaves in relief, *total height* 15in.
- 44 A fine bronze Figure of the "Venus of Milo", 26in. high
- 45 Four fine Empire Bronzes with ormolu mounts: Cupid holding a torch, 14in. high; Mercury holding flame and caduceus, 12in. high; a classic-shaped Vase on plinth, $7\frac{1}{2}$ in. high; and a lamp-shaped Vase, $4\frac{1}{2}$ in. high 4
- 46 A bronze Figure of the Dancing Faun, 11in. high; a Figure of Diana, 8in. high; a Figure of Ceres, 8in. high; including the wooden bases 3
- 47 A fine Boulle Inkstand, red tortoiseshell with metal inlays, two glass Ink Bottles, fitted with one drawer, 16in. long, 12in. deep
- 48 An old Drawing, by *Giulio Romano* (1492-1546): "A Roman Battle Scene" (*see label on back*), in contemporary Florentine walnut frame, *size of drawing* 11in. by $12\frac{1}{2}$ in.

- 49 A RARE LIMOGES CHAMPLEVÉ GEMELLION of circular form, with everted rim and short animal mask spout, the centre decorated with a figure of a king with falcon and dog, a lady at his side, within a deep scalloped border of figures on a blue enamelled ground and smaller alternate green enamel scalloped panels, the under side with an engraved star and fleur-de-lys pattern, 9in. diam., 13th Century

** As the word Gemellion indicates these bowls were used in pairs, probably in refectories and halls at meals for the washing of guests' hands by the process of water being poured from the spout of one bowl while the other was held beneath the guest's hands to receive it.

- 50 A LIMOGES LION PRICKET CANDLESTICK in bronze, with teeth bared, the mane and part of the back decorated in champlevé enamel, traces of gilding, 15in.
- 51 A VERY RARE TABLE CLOCK, by *Johann Sayller of Ulm*, in very fine gilt bronze case, square in form, the corners with cherub heads in relief, and the feet with renaissance grotesque, the sides mounted with pierced and decorated silver-work showing formal heraldic emblems, the movement striking the hours and quarters, early 17th Century, 5½in. square
- 52 A German Crucifix Clock in gilt metal, engraved and flat-chased with formal foliage designs, the figure of Christ and two adoring Saints in silvered metal, early 17th Century, 13in. high
- 53 An ivory Figure of the Crucified Christ, finely carved, on ebony Crucifix
- 54 AN 18TH CENTURY GLASS PUNCH BOWL of fine resonant metal and almost spherical form, supported on a massive cylindrical stem and wide conical foot, 12in.

- 55 JACOB EPSTEIN. A BRONZE BUST OF "ORIEL ROSS," strikingly modelled, full face, the hair cut as a fringe to the forehead, falling in short waves at the back, the shoulders bare, 22in. high
- 56 A PAIR OF VERY FINE BRONZE GROUPS, of Hercules and Antaeus, and Pluto and Proserpine, on rock-work bases, well cast, 2ft. 8in. high, German or Italian, 16th Century

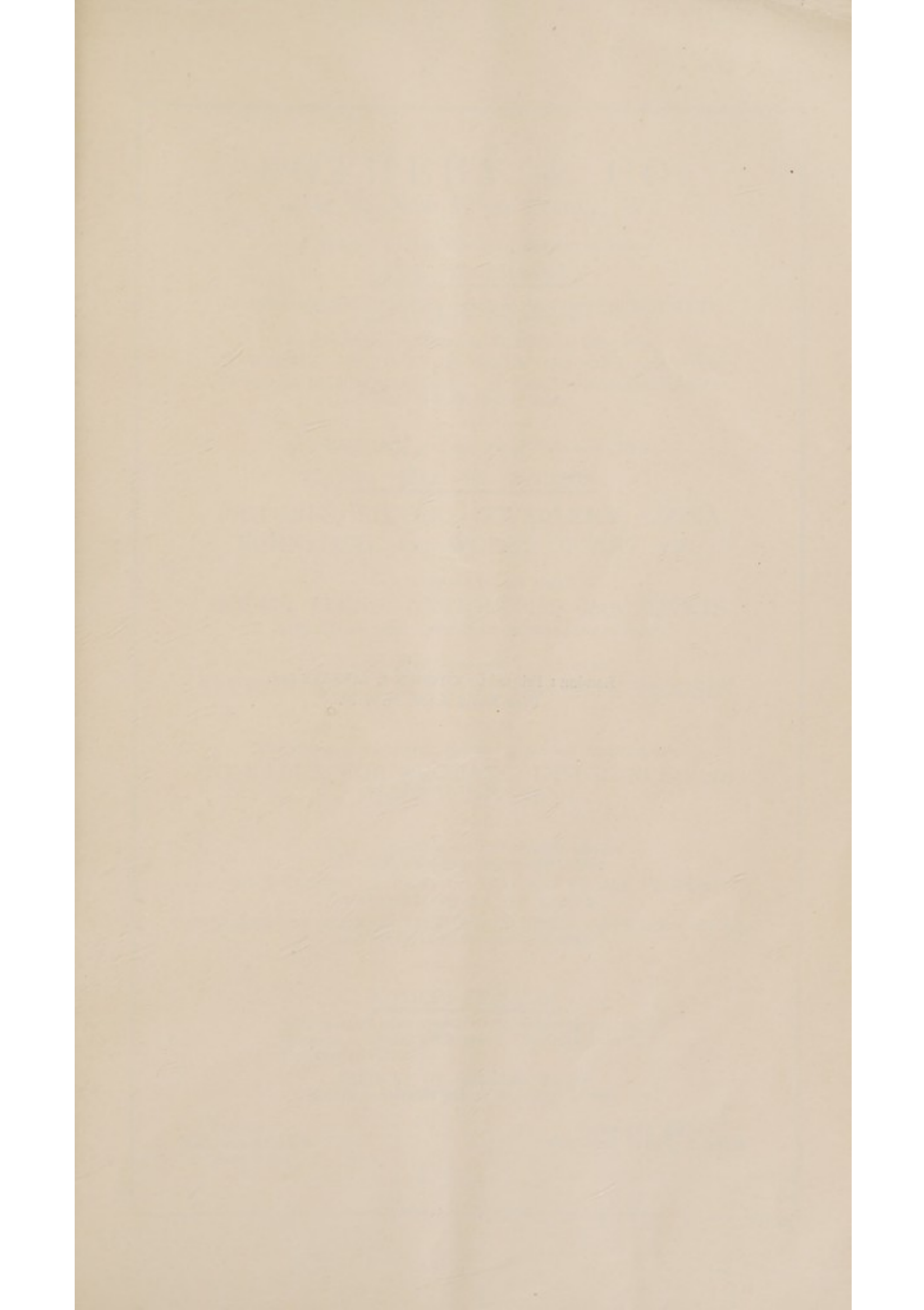
