THE AUTHORITY ON PRE-COLUMBIAN RELICS, WHO DISCOVERED THESE  
OBJECTS IN THE COURSE OF HIS EXPLORATIONS.

- 128 A BURIAL JAR, black, 5½ in. long, of an early Inca period, showing on the neck the head of an Inca Noble, on the handle Inca frog-faced birds, and on the shoulder prostrate priests 15/-

\*\* Discovered in 1928 in a burial cave on the lower Table lands of the Andes, about 13,000 feet above sea level.

- 129 ANOTHER BURIAL JAR, 10 in. high, in black pottery, representing a priest of the early Inca dynasty holding the emblem of the sun god in front of him. From the circumstances in which this jar was found with a skeleton in a large urn, it would appear that the priests had committed acts of sacrilege and had been buried alive, together with this jar depicting his crime 11/-  
[Plate IV]

\*\* Discovered in 1928 during an expedition of the Trujillo region, the site of a buried city of great antiquity, part of which was rebuilt and inhabited by the early Incas. The relic has round its neck silver ingots and gold nuggets, with which it was found.

- 6 (130) A PEAR-SHAPED JAR,  $7\frac{3}{4}$  in. high, of the early Chimu period, from the buried city of Tiahuanaco, 13,000 feet above sea level. The jar is ornamented with an archaic face with large mouth, and at the sides (?) seated figures; both the face and the two figures are in relief. The colouring is mainly in terra-cotta picked out with brown; an important and very early specimen [Plate IV]

- 6 (131) THE FIGURE OF A GOD, in squared stone, 10 in. high by  $2\frac{3}{4}$  in. by  $2\frac{1}{4}$  in., a well preserved specimen of great antiquity from the buried city of Tiahuanaco. The figure is coloured a reddish yellow and bears geometric designs. The hands are folded on the chest and hold a panel of picture writing; neither this nor other ideographs on the skirt have as yet been deciphered [Plate IV]

\*\* Removed by Mr. Lawrence, in 1928, from a small burial chamber which was alive with large double-bodied tarantulas.

This and the next lot are believed to be the only specimens of the kind brought to England.

- 132 A COLLECTION OF TWENTY STONE MONOLITHS, household gods of the early Chimu age, similar in type to the last lot and varying in height from  $6\frac{1}{2}$  in. to 1 in. They bear incised ideographic designs

\*\* Discovered in 1928 strewn at the feet of the remains of a mummified woman, close to the spot where the silver objects of Francisco Pizarro were found by Mr. Lawrence.

- 133 A COLLECTION OF SEVENTEEN SMALL GODS, of copper and gold alloy, of the pre-Chimu periods, from  $1\frac{1}{2}$  in. to 1 in. long. Of these, ten represent the parrot-faced god and are the only specimens of the kind known to have reached England. Nothing appears to be known of the cult nor of the race who worshipped this deity [Plate V]

## Other Properties.

16. (149) INDIAN SCULPTURE of the icon form for worship. An oblong quadrangular block of sandstone carved with DURGA "The Inaccessible" slaying the demon bull Mahishasura, upon which the goddess stands attacking it with the *trisula* of Siva, while her *vahan* the tiger is attacking its haunches, in three-quarter relief against the shaped *mandovara* or wall of the shrine, 30 in. high by 17 in. wide by 8 in. deep Gupta, 5th Century A.D.

12. (150) INDIAN SCULPTURE of the icon form, similar to the foregoing, carved with PARVATI "The Mountain Born," two armed, seated sideways in the *lalita* pose upon the bull Nandi, two garland bearers floating above her shoulders, and two adoring figures beside her feet; in three-quarter relief against the *mandovara*, 29 in. high by 18 in. wide by 10 in. deep

6. (151) A Gandhara Relief in horn-blende schist, carved with Sakyamuni seated under the *Bodhi* tree, flanked by six of his disciples in a niche under a semi-circular arch, which supports another representation of the same subject flanked by winged dragons under a lunette arch ornamented with a waved border, all in high relief, 11 in. high by 13 in. wide; on an ebonised wood stand (2)

152 A Gandhara Relief in horn-blende schist, carved with a Sakyamuni of Græco-Baktrian type seated on a raised *padmasana* with hands in the *Dharma-chakra mudra*, turning down the Wheel of the Law as in the first sermon at Benares, with a standing Bodhisat on each side, with a circular nimbi; below these a family of a man, woman and child on their knees worshipping, 11 in. high by 10½ in. wide; on an ebonised wood stand (2)

153 A Gandhara Relief in sandstone, with a green surface. The Great Renunciation Prince Siddhārtha going forth from his palace, the figure in a niche under an arch from which bunches of grapes hang, set between a pillar and a quadrangular panel in which is the figure of a dancing woman, 3½ in. high by 6 in. wide

154 A black-stone Fragment, the head and body to the thighs, of an Indian king, from which the front portions of the arms have been sheared off, and the nimbus broken away, 6 in. high; on ebonised wood pedestal (2)

6 (155) A curious Chinese Brick or Tile of the Wu dynasty, modelled with two standing figures supporting a raised table or platform on which stands the figure (apparently) of Siva, in adoration, with the Ganges flowing from his head in a bifurcated stream; in high relief; in front is the date in Chinese characters, *Tai Yüan* 251 A.D., 13½ in. high by 12 in. wide

4 (156) A Siamese Buddha Head, bronze, of the *Khymer* type, has been lacquered, the flamed spire of the *usnisha* missing, 10 in. high

6 (158) A Chinese Statuette of a General in full armour but with uncovered head, seated, legs pendant, hands on thighs making *mudras*, well chased, 9 in. high

4 (159) A Chinese Buddha Mask with inlaid eyes, 7 in. high; a Siamese Buddha Mask, 2¾ in. high; and a flamed spire and *usnisha* of a Buddha, 5 in. high

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- 163 Four others: A horse's Bit complete; a socketed End Piece for a staff with oryx head; and a pair of engraved Armlets 4 *5/11/11 do*
- 164 Six others: Two Finials; two Armlets; and two Holders 6 *6/11 Lawrence*
- 165 Six others: Two Finials; a Cup; a pendant Figure of a Bird; a Holder; and a Boss with pin-head border 6
