234A **ELIZABETHAN OR EARLY JACOBEOAN
SURGICAL CHAIR.**

This chair is supposed to be unique and is probably one of the most important early surgical appliances extant. It has descended through a long line (from father to son) of an old Essex medical family, one of whom has had minor improvements and renovations made to meet his requirements. This "heirloom" is reputed to have been made for the earliest medical ancestor and is now being sold on the death of his last descendant, himself a doctor (see notes)

234A **ELIZABETHAN OR EARLY JACOBEAN
SURGICAL CHAIR.**

This chair is supposed to be unique and is probably one of the most important early surgical appliances extant. It has descended through a long line (from father to son) of an old Essex medical family, one of whom has had minor improvements and renovations made to meet his requirements. This "heirloom" is reputed to have been made for the earliest medical ancestor and is now being sold on the death of his last descendant, himself a doctor (see notes)

- 365 *Euricius Cordus. Ex Nosematostichis Elegie*, title within woodcut border, with arms of Albrecht of Brandenburg and 3 grotesque pigs; two elegies, composed on the sick bed, by the well-known physician, whose collected poetical works appeared in 1550, N.D. (ab. 1520)
- 366 *Augustinus Nyphus. De Diebus Criticis seu Decretoriis aureus liber*, a rare edition from the press of Sybold, the Strassburg printer-physician of one of the most generally read and accepted treatises on medical astrology, rare, about 1530
- 367 *Lactantius Firmianus. Opera . . .* A fine well printed edition of 1509, describing internal organs of reproduction; theories on origin of semen, determination of sex, embryo, etc., printer's mark on title, by Benedetto Montagna
- 368 *Regiomontanus. Naturlicher Kunst der Astronomiei Kurtzer Begriff, von naturlichem Einfluss der Gestirn, Planeten vnd Zeychen . . . Regiment durchs jar uber mit Essen, Schlaffen, Baden, Schrepffen, Purnaturlich, Aderlassen, Artznien*, a rare edition of the Manual of Astrology, with medical advice to sleeping, blood-letting, purging, etc., earlier than any other known Egenolph book, 1528
- 369 *Erasmus. Encomium Matrimonii, Encomium Artis Medicæ*, 1518, rare first separate edition; the speech praising medicine is addressed to Henricus Afinius, the then chief physician at Antwerp, bound in at end with *Apologia pro Declamatione de Laude Matrimonii*, 1519
- 370 Engravings of antiquities, etc.
- 371 A parcel of miscellaneous engravings
- 372 A ditto
- 373 A trunk containing a large quantity of well-bound and valuable books
