# THE FREDERICK MARTIN COLLECTION RELATING TO THE CIRCUS.

WD. 128

The unique character of this Collection and, at the same time, the diversity of its contents, render it difficult of description in the orthodox manner. It would, therefore, be as well to commence with a brief reference to the late Mr. Martin's career.

Though his business interests lay in the Motion Picture Industry, the Circus was his lifelong hobby, and his heart never left the ring. So extensive was his knowledge that his advice was sought by the most prominent circus proprietors in England.

For many years the collecting of the vast assortment of prints, drawings and show-bills contained in this lot was his keen delight; indeed, it would not be an exaggeration to say that a lifetime was devoted to the acquisition of these items, which came from we'l-known sources, such as the J. E. Gardner Collection, and from every conceivable place where it was possible to find them. Volumes are devoted to such subjects as the Egyptian Hall, to Astley's Equestrian Theatre, to Freaks, Performers and Menageries, to Bartholomew Fair, Barnum and Bailey's, the Westminster Aquarium; to Belzoni, hydraulic engineer, Egyptologist, founder of the Egyptian Hall, and Strong Man at Sadler's Wells and Bartholomew Fair; to Ducrow of

the "Poses Plastiques Equestriennes"; to the Limbless Man who gave performances of marvellous dexterity, and was reputed to be a wife-beater; to the Bearded Lady, who became the wife of the showman who exploited her; to Grimaldi, Barnum and Col. Cody; to Giants, Mermaids, Monsters and Fire-eaters; in short, to every possible thing relating to the Circus.
