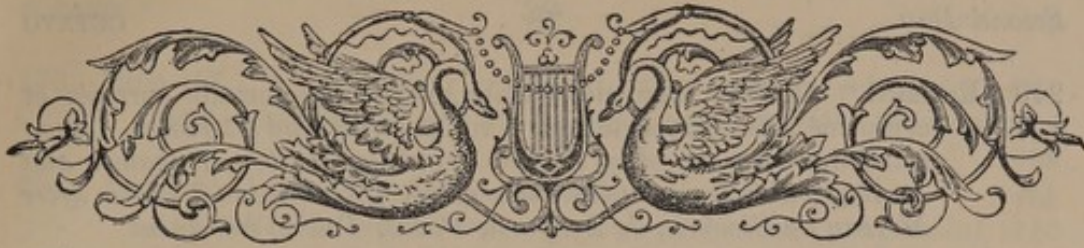

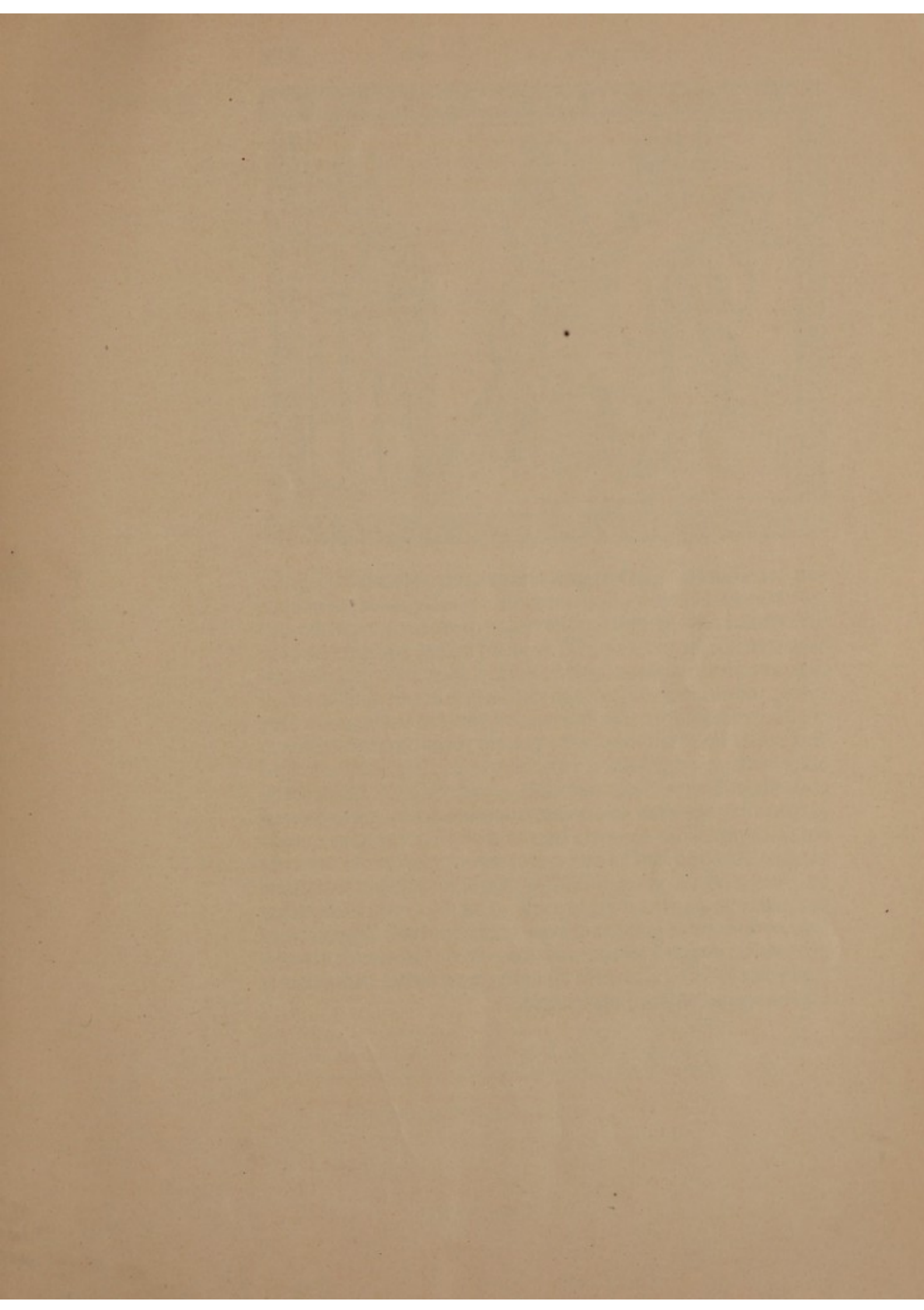

The whole side is minutely worked with small tools, hardly any use having been made of the roll. The elaborate centre ornament is arranged in the form of a circle, usual in Scottish work, in place of a diamond or lozenge more common in England, while each corner of the panel is filled with a quarter-circle. The whole field is semé with gold rosettes and quatrefoils, while the whole ground is heightened with gilt dotting. The diamond-shaped spaces throughout the ornament appear to have been coloured. It seems most probable that this binding was specially prepared for presentation to King James himself, in the printer's office, for the paper used for the lining and end papers is the same as that on which the book itself is printed. This beautiful volume was in the library of David Laing, librarian of the Signet Library, Edinburgh, who died in 1878, and whose splendid library was sold in these rooms in 1879-80. In the frontispiece to Laing's Life (printed in 1878), he is shown holding this very volume in his hand. A copy of the Life of Laing containing the portrait, in which he is seen holding this volume, accompanies it.

" . . . whose manners still our tardy apish nation
Limps after in base imitation."

De Commynes, who was well acquainted with Italy and with Venice itself, describes the country and the place in his book in flattering colours, and it was just that sort of personal, picturesque way of narrating scenes and experiences which would impress Shakespeare. Capel reprinted a portion of this edition of De Commynes in his "School of Shakespeare" (pages 201-3).

^{**} This exquisite little manuscript, executed in Roman and Italic letter, is worked in three colours, black, red and blue. The main headings and larger initials are done in gold, and each page is surrounded with a gilt border frame. At the end of the Litanies of St. Joseph is the inscription, minutely written: "N. Jarry, Paris, scribebat 1655." But the greatest point of interest attached to the manuscript is that of its original ownership. It is clear from the monogram, which is drawn on the first leaf of the book, that it was prepared for the famous Julie, daughter of the Marquise de Rambouillet, most distinguished of the "Précieuses," and wife of the Duc de Montausier, the original of Molière's "Alceste." It was for her that Nicholas Jarry, in 1641, prepared his most celebrated work: "La Guirlande de Julie," a collection of madrigals by the court poets with illuminations by the artist Robert. The manuscript is now in the possession of the Duc d'Uzes, a descendant of the original "Julie." Jarry also prepared a book of prayers for Julie's mother, the Marquise de Rambouillet. He was born about 1620, and was appointed writer and music noter to Louis XIV. Brunet, in his Manuel and Supplement, quoting, as he says, some of Jarry's principal works, enumerates some forty manuscripts, and there are certainly others not mentioned by him, including the present little book. The original binding, as is so often the case on devotional books of the period, is of black shagreen, with two elaborately worked silver clasps.

the liturgical forms of absolution, both in ordinary and special cases, and "in articulo mortis." Of these letters printed by Richard Faques, there are issues dated 1519 and 1520. The British Museum possesses one dated 1519, and the Bodleian has two of the same year which differ from each other. The Bodleian possesses also a 1520 issue which was presented to the library a few years ago at the tercentenary celebrations, by the authorities of the Royal Library of Copenhagen. Another edition of these letters was printed by Richard Pynson, of which there is a copy in the British Museum. Richard Faques was at work from 1509 to 1530, issuing about twenty-four different books. For some reason almost everything he printed is of the greatest rarity, quite one half of his productions being known only from single copies or fragments.

* * * This is the First Edition of Euclid, and a book of supreme interest. It is also the very earliest book in which mathematical figures occur in any quantity, a few being found in the Ptolemaeus of 1478, and these have been printed with great care and ingenuity. Many of the figures are built up from lines and rules, but a very large number are delicate wood engravings. The fine binding, which is undoubtedly original, is a very interesting piece of XVth Century work, for the style is German, while the execution is Italian. The thinness of the boards and the use of ties at top and bottom, as well as in the front, are both very typical of Italian work, while the dies and their method of arrangement resemble German work of the period. Remembering that Ratdolt was a native of Augsburg, and worked in Venice, the explanation of this combination of styles is clear. An early owner has filled the margins of the first half of the volume with notes, written in a beautiful minute hand. He was clearly a studious mathematician, and has added occasional propositions of his own devices from those of Euclid.

This work, in the form of a dialogue, is a compilation by an anonymous writer from the works of Thomas de Aquino and Pietro de Champagni, who wrote under the name of Petrus de Tarentasia, and was raised to the Papacy as Innocent V. He lived at a slightly later date than Thomas de Aquino, whom he succeeded as Professor of Theology in the University of Paris. Little of his work was printed, though it has been almost conclusively proved by Quétif that he was the real author of the "Postilla super epistolas Pauli" ascribed to Nicolaus Gorranus, and printed at Cologne by J. Koelhof in 1478. The different editions of this book are not easy to trace, as they are entered in bibliographies under various headings. The present edition is twice described by Copinger (nos. 577 and 5200), both times differently and incorrectly. Campbell describes an edition (no. 1491) printed at Louvain by J. de Westphalia about 1485. The two books referred to by Hain (15590-1) as "Tractatus resolvens dubia per modum dialogi circa septem sacramenta occurrentia," printed in 1492 and 1496, may be later editions of the same book. This volume is unmentioned by Hain.

The Archbishop has used red ink for his Greek notes, and black ink for the Latin notes. This volume was probably used by the Archbishop in 1540 when engaged in preparing his famous edition of the English Bible. Moreover, the volume is in its original binding of sheepskin, just as he handled it. It afterwards passed into the possession of John Lord Lumley, the tutor and friend of Prince Henry, eldest son of James I, and has his autograph signature on the title-page. The majority of Cranmer's books fell into the hands of Henry Fitzalan, Earl of Arundel, who gave them to his son-in-law, Lord Lumley. Lord Lumley was tutor to Prince Henry (the unfortunate elder son of James I of England) who, on his tutor's death in 1609, bought a large part of his library which thus became part of the Royal Library, transferred to the British nation in 1757.
