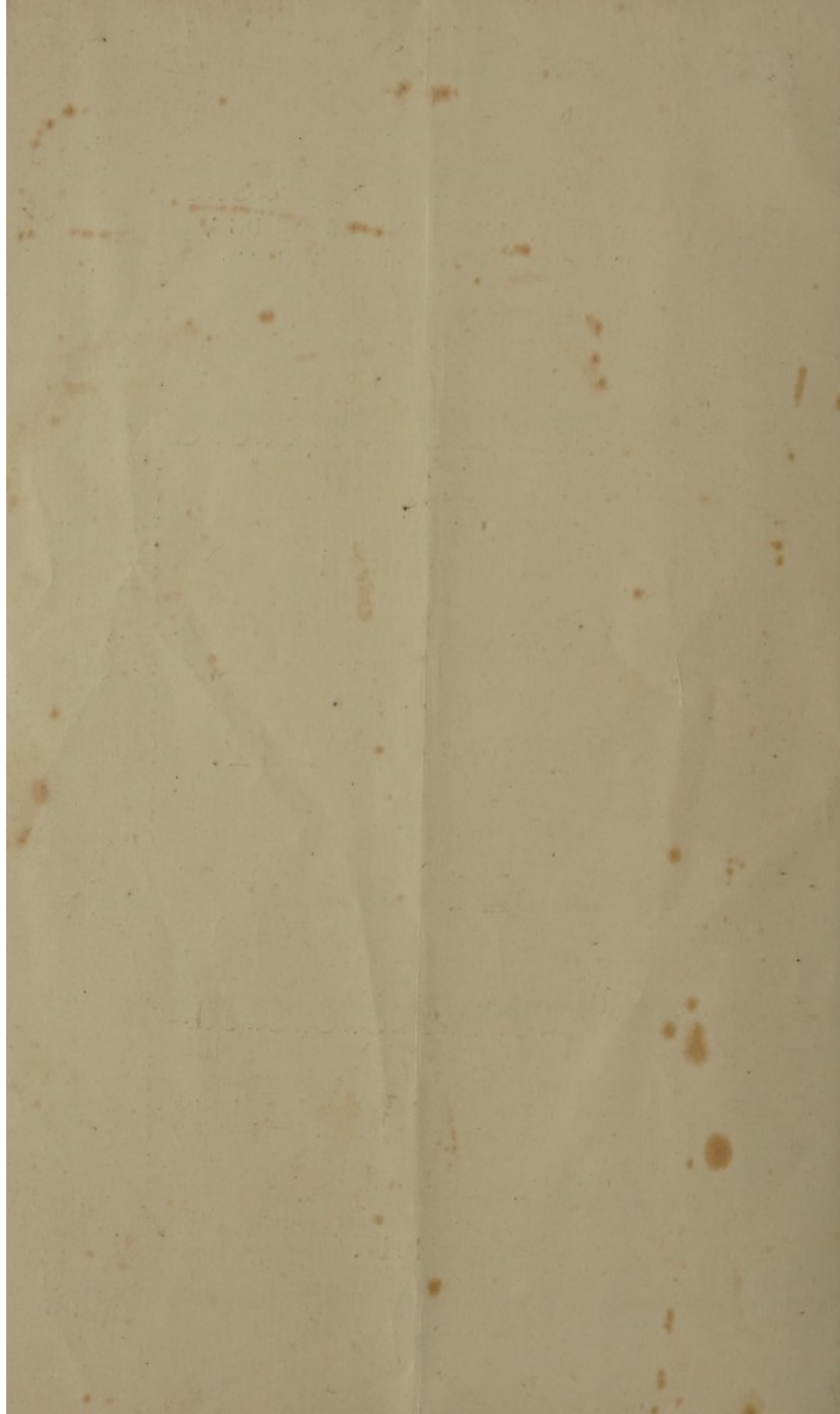

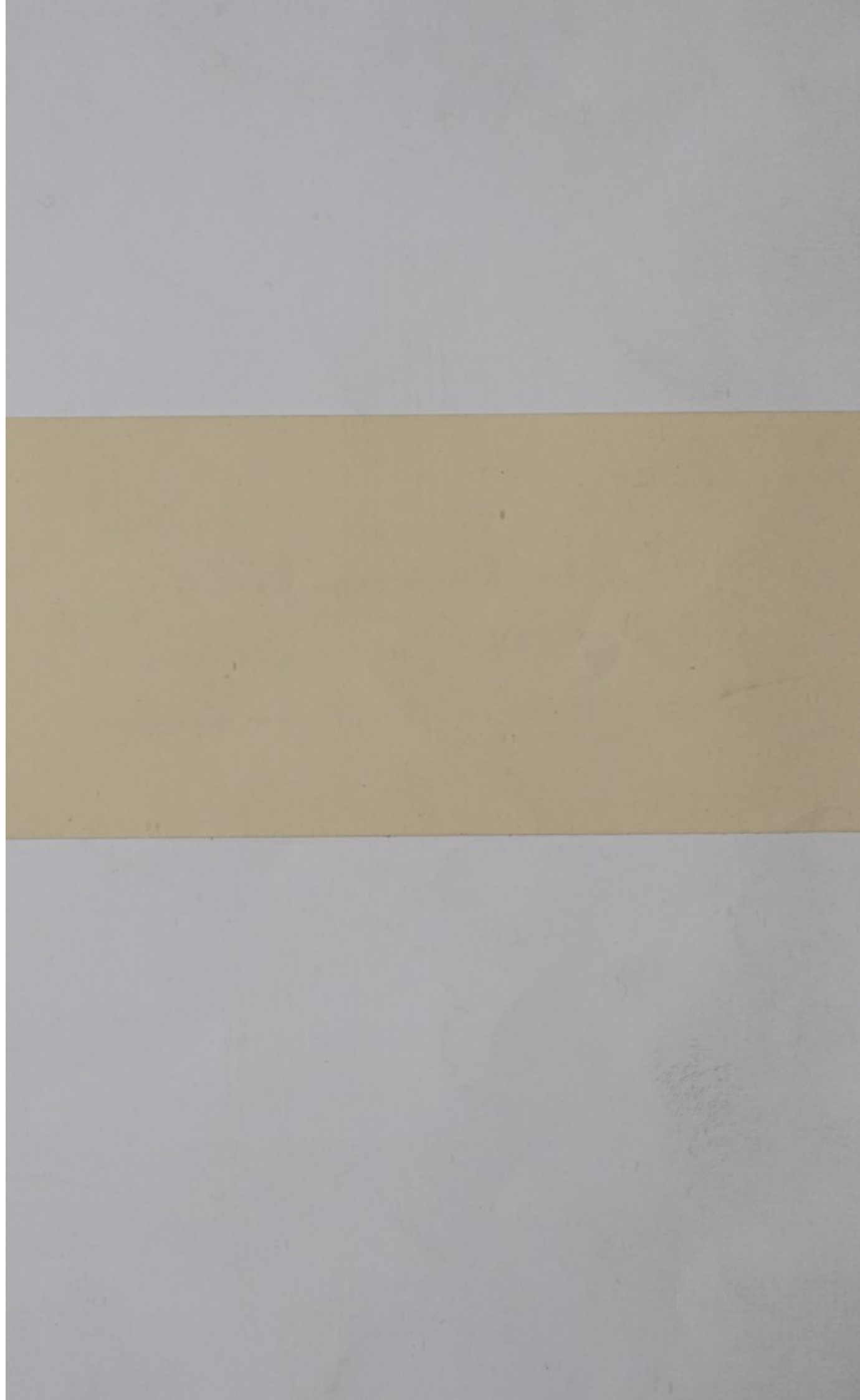

126 CHASUBLE of dark blue velvet, handsomely decorated with embroidery, *English, early 16th century*

* * * This beautiful and valuable chasuble is very similar to one exhibited at the Victoria and Albert Museum, S. Kensington (no. 665-1896). The orphreys on back and front are embroidered in coloured silks and silver-gilt thread on linen, appliqué; on the back is represented the Crucifixion with two angels holding chalices beneath the wounds of Our Lord, below are St. Barnabas and St. James the Greater, both within niches, St. James being repeated, above two other saints, on the front. The repeating design is composed of seraphs, and the chasuble is also decorated with embroidered fleurs-de-lis, etc. It has been edged with modern braid and the sides in front repaired by the insertion of two pieces of velvet, but otherwise is in splendid preservation, both as regards condition and colour, having evidently been carefully kept.

127 A Japanese Fukusa, blue silk, with Jo and Uba, the pine trees of Takasago and Sumiyoshi and Bamboo forming the background of a stage, and clouds, embroidered in gold and coloured silks; *framed*

129 A Japanese Fukusa, black silk, embroidered with gold and coloured silks, showing the Temple of Benten at Miyajima and the landscape on the shore behind it; *framed*

130 A Japanese Fukusa, deep blue silk, embroidered with gold and coloured silks, showing Jo and Uba, the types of a happy old age, she feeding a tortoise of long life from a SAKÉ cup and he watching a crane's nest in a pine tree; *framed*

- 131 A Japanese Fukusa, deep blue silk, embroidered with two SHOJO beside a SAKÉ jar, one drinking and the other holding a dipper, in gold and coloured silks; *framed*
- 132 A Japanese Fukusa, light blue silk, embroidered with the Ship of Good Fortune laden with treasure sailing into port, with cranes flying overhead and a tortoise of long life at the side; *framed*
- 133 Japanese Prints, *framed*: Three large head Portraits of Beauties, printed in blue; *each signed* UTAMARO 3
- 134 Japanese Prints, *framed*: Yama Uba nursing the young Kintaro, and two large head Portraits of Beauties; *each signed* UTAMARO 3
- 135 Japanese Prints, *framed*: Awabi Shell Divers, *signed* UTAMARO; The Ghost of Oiwa, *signed* KUNIYOSHI; A Murdered Man in a boat, *signed* HIROSADA; and A Woman seated, *signed* YEISEN 4
- 136 Japanese Prints, *framed*: Women in a procession near Fuji, *signed* TOYOKUNI; Female Divers coming ashore; Women diving for Awabi shells; and A Woman on a boat with a lantern; *the last three by* KUNISADA 4

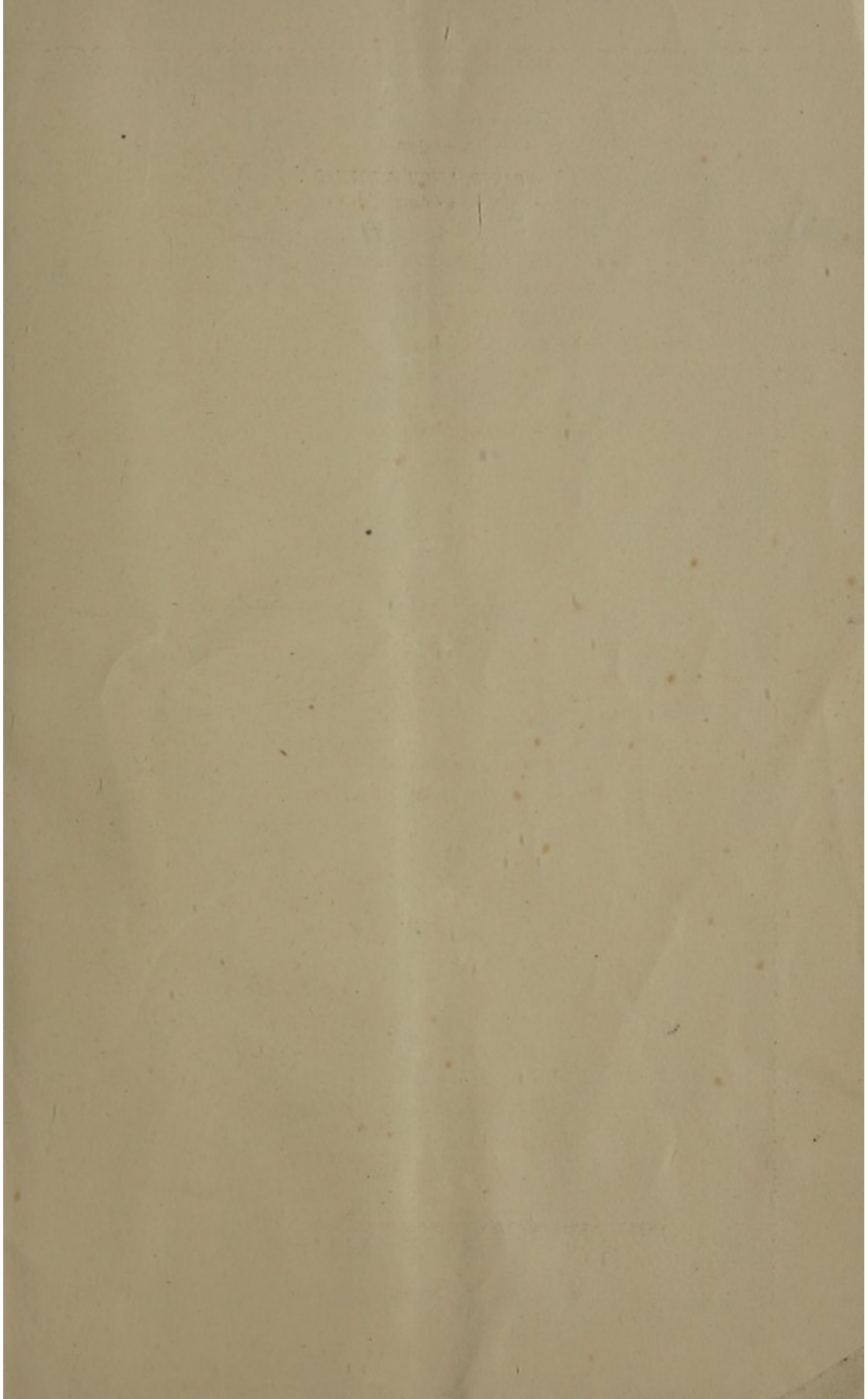


