



The writer acknowledges the receipt of an order from the Com-

mittee of Public Health, whereby "communication with this port has been cut off on account of its supposed communication with Seville which is now infected with yellow fever." He declares that Huelva has not been in communication with Seville, and that such order is likely to be detrimental to the trade "of both nations" (Spanish and Portuguese).

The writer of the letter mentions that he is enclosing the Edict from the Committee of Public Health, and is notifying the delegate at Faro of its import. The Proclamation declares that yellow fever has broken out at San Fernando, and that the Committee has decided that that city should be "out of bounds" for the time being.
