As a medical officer, the writer proposes measures for greater public hygiene, particularly with regard to reforms in connection with the existing laws for the burial of inmates of convents, hospices and other institutions.

The paper consists of particulars of revenue derived from certain vessels in quarantine off Belem, and fees paid by the Vice Consuls of various foreign countries in respect of certificates of health issued to various wares and other craft putting in at the port.

SUB-INSPECTOR OF THE DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC  
HEALTH (SPAIN).

The writer acknowledges the receipt of an order from the Committee of Public Health, whereby "communication with this port has been cut off on account of its supposed communication with Seville which is now infected with yellow fever." He declares that Huelva has not been in communication with Seville, and that such order is likely to be detrimental to the trade "of both nations" (Spanish and Portuguese).

The writer of the letter mentions that he is enclosing the Edict from the Committee of Public Health, and is notifying the delegate at Faro of its import. The Proclamation declares that yellow fever has broken out at San Fernando, and that the Committee has decided that that city should be "out of bounds" for the time being.
