

- 143 Two Buddha Heads in Græco-Baktrian style with flowing moustachios, in different styles of head-dresses; and a third with the ushnisa development, with a nimbus; from the Swat Valley, c. 150 A.D.

- 144 Sakyā Muni, a Græco-Baktrian figure in horn-blende schist, standing, with moustache, the hair waved and drawn up into a top knot tied and with straggling end, held in position by a fillet of jewels; the garments draped from shoulder to thigh, both hands and feet missing, 14 in. high, Swat Valley, c. 150 A.D.
- 145 Sakyā Muni, a Græco-Baktrian figure in horn-blende schist, seated in the adamantine pose, the right hand in the Abhayā mudrā, left hand across the leg holding a fold of his robe; hair waved and drawn across the ushnisa, the head backed by a circular nimbus, 8½ in. high, Swat Valley, c. 150 A.D.
- Maitreya, a Græco-Baktrian figure in horn-blende schist, standing, right hand in the Abhaya mudrā, left by the side holding the mañgalakalāsa, a flask or bottle, bracelets around each wrist; the hair is waved in Greek style and drawn back over the ushnisa, and behind the head is half of the original circular nimbus, 11½ in. high, Swat Valley, c. 200 A.D.
