two are empty, and on the stand are the Arms of the Dominican Order.

The Crucifix is in excellent condition and perfectly preserved, but three minor pieces of crystal are missing, viz. : the cover of one of the oval Reliquaries in the Cross, one of the small oval medallions at the back of the stand, and one of the rectangular panels also at the back of the stand.

It has been seen and its authenticity verified by various of the foremost experts and documents are forthcoming in support thereof.

The present model was made by French prisoners of war at Porchester Castle, c. 1810, for Sir John Theophilus Lee, G.C.H., R.N., in the possession of whose descendants it has since remained.
