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

Thirty-eighth Congress of the United States of America, At the Second Session, Begun and held at the city of Washington, the fifty day of December, one thousand eight hundred and sixty-four. A Resolution submitting to the legislature of the several states a proposition to amend the Constitution of the United States.

RESOLVED by the Senate and House of Representatives of the United States of America in Congress assembled, two-thirds of both Houses concurring, That the following article be proposed to the legislatures of the several States as an amendment to the Constitution of the United States, which, when ratified by three-fourths of said legislatures, shall be valid to all intents and purposes, as a part of the said Con-stitution, namely: Article XIII. Section I. Neither Slavery nor involuntary servitude, except as a punishment for crime, whereof the party shall have been duly convicted, shall exist within the United States or any place subject to their jurisdiction. Section 2. Congress shall have power to enforce this article by appropriate legislation.

In addition to many unpublished details, the plot of Col. Ogden, with the written approval of Washington, to abduct LOT 137A—continued.

Prince William Henry, who during the period of the above Journal took residence in Hanover Square, New York, for an entire winter, 1781-2, lends a particular interest to this important manuscript.

The Log "to North America" commenced July 11, 1781, and Prince George reached Sandy Hook Sept. 25th, though the "Intelligence Collected" here is a day earlier, including news of the detruction of New London by Genl. Arnold. The record of events on the American Station then follows. Neither Slavery nor involuntary servitude, except as a punishment for crime, whereof the party shall have been duly convicted, shall exist within the United States or any place subject to their jurisdiction. Section 2. Congress shall have power to enforce this article by appropriate legislation.

Section I. Neither Slavery nor involuntary servitude, except as a punishment for crime, whereof the party shall have been duly convicted, shall exist within the United States or any place subject to their jurisdiction. Section 2. Congress shall have power to enforce this article by appropriate legislation.
