

PREFACE.

HE jewellery in the following catalogue is mainly of Hellenistic date, but there are also a number of important pieces from the eighth to the fourth century B.C., as well as a collection of Scythian gold-work. Many of the objects belong to the famous Nelidoff Collection, purchased by the Russian Government some twenty years ago and previously published by Ludwig Pollak under the title "Klassisch-antike Goldschmiedarbeiten im Besitze Sr. Exc. des Herrn von Nélidow in Rom" Leipzig, Hiersemann, 1903, (here referred to as P, with an Arabic figure for the number of the item, and, where it is illustrated, with a Roman figure for the plate-number). In his preface to Pollak's book, Nelidoff explains that, except for one or two purchases in Rome and Vienna, all the jewellery is from Greek districts-in which he includes Macedonia, the Black Sea, Asia Minor, Egypt and Syria—and thus the character of the collection is predominantly Greek.

The remainder is derived from two sources, one the collection (Catalogue by M. F., Odessa, 1884) of M. Lemmé, long resident in Odessa and a diligent collector of the ancient jewellery there offered for sale; and the other the collection made by the famous Russian archæologist Pharmakowski, from finds on and near the site of the ancient Olbia, where he conducted excavations for thirty years (see "Mitteilungen der Archäologischen Kommission," B. 13, etc., and a number of notices in the "Archäologischer Anzeiger" of the German Archæological Institute).

For Hellenistic jewellery in general, Schreiber's "Alexandrinische Toreutik" should be consulted: the jewellery of South Russia has been dealt with by Minns in his "Scythians and Greeks" (where references to other publications will be found), and by Reinach in "Antiquités du Bosphore Cimmérien."
