** AN ENTIRELY UNRECORDED BLOCK BOOK WITH WOODCUTS
OF GREAT MERIT. Only two Passion Block books of this
size are illustrated by Schreiber (Gravure sur Bois, 1900,
vol. 8, LXXXX and LXXXXI), the woodcuts in neither
of them approaching the present series in elaborateness,
the spirited way in which the figures are drawn, or the
remarkable expressiveness of the faces.

The book consists of one gathering of 16 leaves with a single leaf before it, 17 leaves in all. The woodcuts start, naturally enough for a Passion series, with the Entry into Jerusalem and follow on in an unbroken sequence to the Last Judgement.

This copy being apparently unique, there is no means of ascertaining with certainty whether it is entirely complete; but from internal evidence we see no reason to suppose that it is not exactly as issued.

** OF THIS BLOCK BOOK THERE IS KNOWN TO EXIST ONLY ONE OTHER COMPLETE COPY, and two odd leaves in the British Museum. Schreiber vol. IV, p. 266, vol. VIII, plate CIX. The book consists of one gathering of 13 leaves, the first blank leaf missing; it is a more primitive production than the Passion Block book first described, both as regards the woodcuts, which show great severity of

treatment, and the very crabbed letter in which the text is cut.

The sequence of woodcuts comprises six scenes, each scene representing one of the temptations to which the dying man is exposed, and followed by a scene in which his good angel fortifies him against them, the last (13th) woodcut showing the final rout of the demons who surround the death-bed. These scenes follow the original quarto edition exactly in composition, but the German Devotions which form the text have little or no relation to the Latin text of the quarto.

The beautiful illuminated pages are of German execution, and according to a partially erased inscription on the first page the book was in the possession of the Jesuit College at Bamberg in 1612.

Of the three known early undated editions, Rome, Ulrich Han and Venice, Wendelin de Spira being the other two, this edition can be shown on typographical grounds to be the earliest. It most probably also precedes the Ferrara edition of 1471. No record of sale since 1919.

 same order, and were assigned by Proctor to the press of
 Georg Herolt. Only two copies of the Vitruvius have
 appeared in the sale room since 1891.
