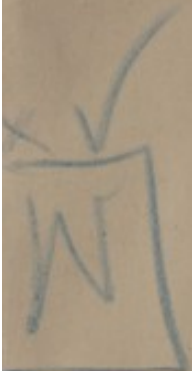

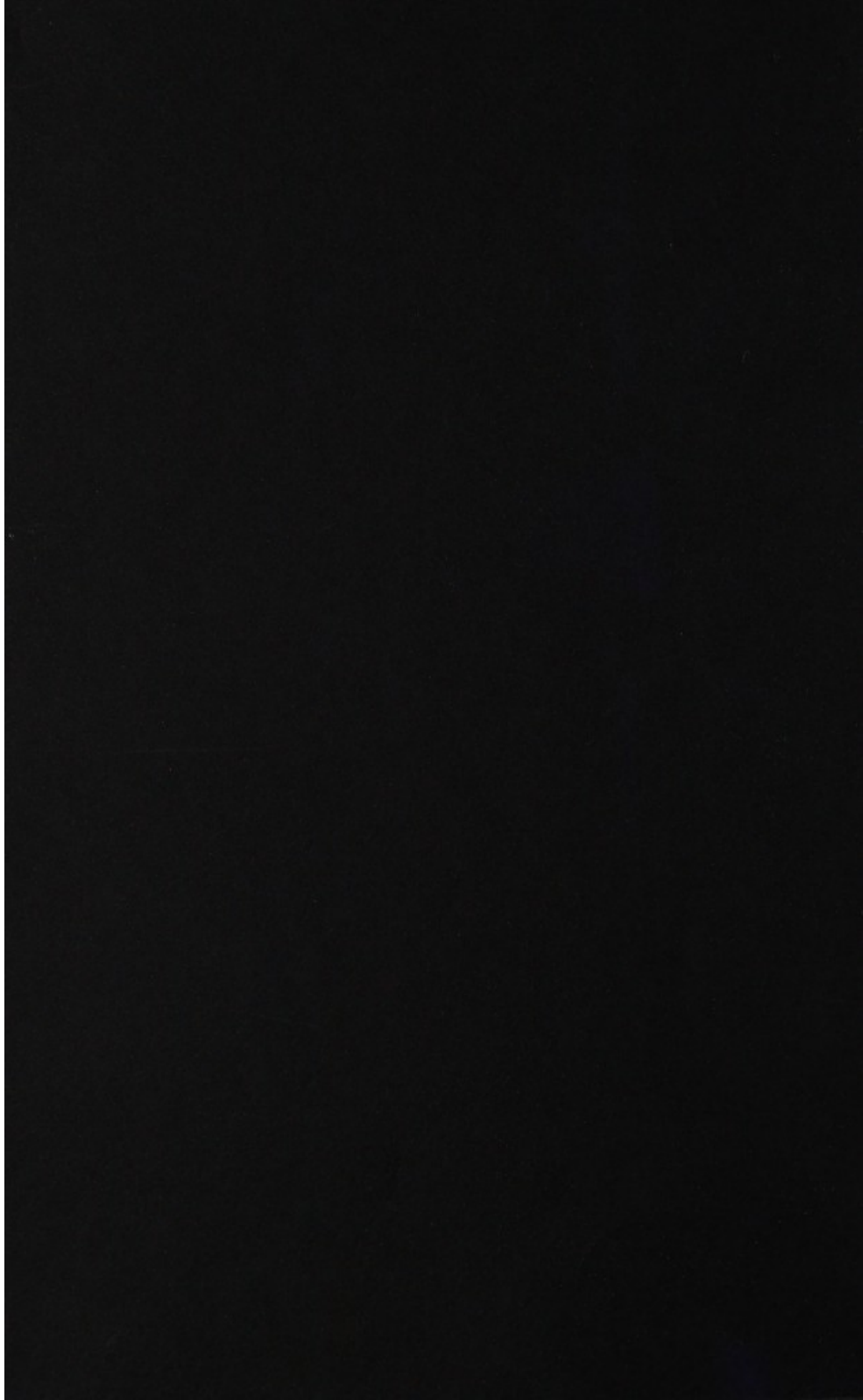

- 20 A Doccia Group of two Cupids seated on a fountain, holding shells, the base moulded with an alligator, $7\frac{1}{4}$ in.; and two small Figures of Children, $4\frac{1}{2}$ in. 3
- 21 A pair of Derby Figures of a Shepherd and Shepherdess playing the bagpipes and mandolin, 7 in.; and a Bow Figure of Plenty, in yellow flowered dress and puce lined blue cloak, holding a cornucopia of fruit and flowers, a lion at her feet 3

- 68 A curious Sampler very coarsely worked with an alphabet, c. 1750; another, worked with a fleur-de-lys, by *Sarah Green*, Bristol, 1847; a Memorial Sampler; and three others 6
- ** The first-named from the Tuer collection; mentioned by that authority in his standard work; and by Huish.

- 71 A Map of England with the counties inscribed, by *Emily Howell*, 1754; an interesting Family Register worked in black on a white canvas ground, of the Mason family, from 1797 to 1849; and three other Samplers 5
- 72 A curious Specimen of stumpwork, of a pear tree, a house and a church; and a Panel, of a lady beneath a canopy in a garden, $4\frac{3}{4}$ in. by 11 in., both framed 2
- 73 A Panel of Charles II, "petit point" appliqué on silk, of a lady playing a lute, flowers and butterflies, 11 in. by $9\frac{1}{2}$ in., framed
- 74 A Sampler, finely worked with an alphabet, and texts, by *Mary Allsop*, 1738; and another with the Lord's Prayer, Creed and Commandments and with flowers, by *Mary Upton*, 1722 2
- 75 An Oval, of fine Charles II beadwork, of a vase of flowers, animals and birds, 13 in., in old frame
- 76 A Charles II Layette Basket in beadwork, with a pattern of figures, animals and flowers, $12\frac{1}{2}$ in. by 11 in.
- 77 A CHARLES I NEEDLEWORK PANEL, in flat and moss-stitch, of Jacob and Ishmael, 15 in. by $10\frac{1}{2}$ in., in old frame

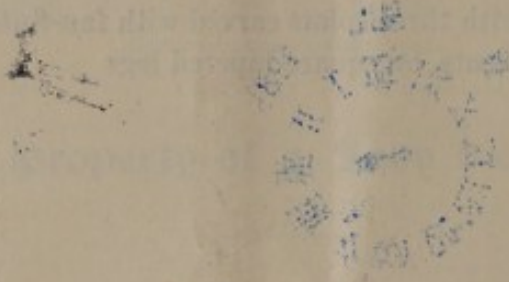
