MEDICAL MANUSCRIPTS
OF THE FAMOUS FÜRSTLICH STOLBERG-
WERNIGERÖDISCHE BIBLIOTHEK.

These Manuscripts are from one of the most celebrated Libraries in Germany, whose history goes back to the 16th Century. The earliest of these are from the possession of Count Wolf Ernst (died 1606), founder of the Library; the Arzeney-Buch of 1568 being written by him. Thence into the possession of Count Christian Ernst (1710–1771), one of the most important men among the Princes of his time and friend of Frederick the Great, and whose engraved book-plate is to be found in most of these MSS.

- 415 MEIBOMIUS, Henr. Collegium in Aphorismos Hippocratis. MS. in Latin language, of German origin, written down after lectures held by Meibomius (died 1700)
- 416 ARTZENY-BUCH (Recipe Book). MS. in German language, of German origin. about 1700, folio. There is contained a treasury of several thousands of recipes against diseases of any kind, divided into 44 special chapters, concerning: Apoplexy, bladder, ears, eyes (a long chapter of 38 pages), fevers, head, heart, lungs (cough), neck, nose, smallpox, stomach, teeth, etc., etc.
- 417 DE MORBIS. MS. in Latin language, of German origin, about 1700; on all kinds of diseases, the last part giving recipes
- 418 COLLEGIUM CASUALE GOHLIJ. MS. in Latin language, of German origin, beginning of 18th Century. A statement of 71 medical cases of several diseases and the way to cure them. The name Gohlij probably refers to the well-known practitioner, Daniel Gohl, from Berlin, who died 1731. PHILOSOPHIA HERMETICA. Theoria et Praxis. MS. in German language, of German origin, 18th Century; Concerning the Alchemy and its use, 2 MSS. in 1 vol., vellum
- 419 POTT, Joh. Heinr. Cursus lectionum chymico-pharmaceuticarum. MS. in German language, written down after lectures held by Professor Joh. Heinr. Pott in Berlin, about 1730. Pott was one of the most distinguished chemists of his time; on the foundation of

the Collegium Medico Chirurgicum in Berlin he was appointed Professor of Theoretical Chemistry ; later on he became also Director of the Royal Pharmaceutical establishment.

81-1 426 J KORNREUTER, J. D. Magia Ordinis artium et scientiarum abstrusarum, Anno 1515. MS. in Latin language, of German origin, written about 1800, with magic signs and symbols designed in black and gold, and some insertions. Schemes to call up infernal spirits

427 COMMENTARY of Joh. Dan. Metzger Medicina forensis, written down after lectures held by Chrph. Knappe, in Berlin, by Hanold. MS. in German language, dated 1817. Concerning all cases of forensic medicine, F.F. accidents, injuries of any kind, and its investigation

- 428 HUFELAND, Chrph. Wilh. Specielle Therapie. MS. in German language, written down after lectures held by Hufeland, by Hanold, in Berlin, dated 1817-18, 2 vols. Hufeland, one of the most honoured physicians of his time, author of the famous "Makrobiotik," succeeded his father and grandfather as Court Physician at Weimar in the days of Goethe and his brilliant circle; later on he became Professor in Berlin
