- I. The highest bidder to be the buyer; and if any dispute arise between bidders, the lot so disputed shall be immediately put up again, provided the Auctioneer cannot decide the said dispute.
- II. No person to advance less than 1s.; above five pounds 2s. 6d.; and so on in proportion.
- III. All lots are sold subject to the right to impose a reserve; and subject to the right to bid by, or on behalf of, the seller.
- IV. The purchasers to give in their names and places of abode, and to pay down 10s. in the pound, if required, in part payment of the purchase-money, in default of which the lot or lots purchased to be immediately put up again and re-sold.
- V. The lots to be taken away, at the buyer's expense, immediately after the conclusion of the sale; in default of which Messrs. SOTHEY, WILKINSON & HODGE will not hold themselves responsible if lost, stolen, damaged, or otherwise destroyed, but they will be left at the sole risk of the purchaser. If, at the expiration of ONE WEEK after the conclusion of the sale, the books or other property are not cleared or paid for, they will then be catalogued for immediate sale, and the expenses, the same as if re-sold, will be added to the amount at which the books were bought. - VI. 

This is apparently the original manuscript by Thomas Jenyns, of which two early transcripts are known, one in the College of Arms, partly printed by Nicolas in 1829, the other, a more extensive manuscript, in the British Museum, probably copied from this manuscript in 1579, and largely used by Papworth and Morant in their Ordinary of British Armorials, 1874. Camden in his answer to Ralph Brooke, p. 13, styles this work "laudatissimus ille vetus Armorum liber, qui a Repertore, Liber Th. Jennins appellatur." See also Vincent against Brooke, 1622, p. 140. L. s. of John Mervyn Nooth, M.D., F.R.S., Physician General to the British Forces in North America, written from *New York* and *Philadelphia*, 1776-82, to his father Henry Nooth of Dorchester, covering about 20 pp. 4to and folio, discusses the Conquest of Long Island, and the evacuation of New York by the Provincial Bands; Lord North's dastardly speech of 17th Feby., 1778, when introducing two bills, one repealing the tax upon tea, and the second appointing commissioners to treat with the revolting provinces; thinks that before the arrival of the speech the rebels had almost persuaded themselves that any further opposition would be in vain, and their adversion to any service under Mr. Washington rendered it impossible to recruit the army; writing in *May*, 1778, he says:

... our Army is in excellent condition, remarkably healthy, and furnished with every requisite for a vigorous campaign ... The order to embark our heavy baggage puzzles us ... it is supposed we shall evacuate Philadelphia. We are, indeed, every day committing absurdities, but I cannot believe that we shall evacuate this city so easily. All our errors seem to originate at home from orders which are sent to our Commanders by the Cabinet Generals at St. James. What could have been more absurd than the thought of augmenting Sir. Wm. Howe's Army by sending troops from Europe to Quebec, to march through the most difficult and inhospitable country in the world to New York ...

By a rebel newspaper just brought in by a deserter, we find that General Lee's conduct in the late affair in the Jerseys is severely censured by Mr. Washington in his letter to Congress, and the General is accordingly ordered under arrest, and is to be tried as soon as possible for deserting his post in the rebel army ... I had always myself a mean opinion of the courage of my old acquaintance, and heartily rejoice that he is humbled so far as to be tried by a set of cobblers and tinkers that his own teaching and rascality have exalted to the rank of general officers.

he continues with an interesting description of the skirmish between the Fleet under Lord Howe and the French, in his last letter, *New York*, Oct. 1782, he speaks contemptuously of the Ministry:

... Never surely were a set of people more determined to ruin their country and never was there a time when our affairs might have been so easily retrieved as at the arrival of our present Commander, Sir Guy Carleton, but alas! every step has been taken by the new Ministry to alienate the mind of the loyalty in America ...

- 472 AMERICAN WAR, 1812-15. An interesting Series of Letters and Papers relating thereto, principally of Naval interest, including Admiral Sir Alexander Cochrane, A. L. s. 4 pp. 4to, *Guadaloupe, April, 1812*, and Memorandum, 6 pp.; Admiral John Schank Letters, written by an Amanuensis, 1812, giving his opinion on Canadian Affairs, where he was stationed in 1777; Vice-Admiral Sir H. E. Stanhope, 1813, suggested Naval Plan against the Americans. —FRANKLIN (William), *son of Benjamin Franklin, last Royal Governor of New Jersey*, A. - 474 LIVERPOOL (Robert, second Earl of) Prime Minister, 1812-27, a Series of Thirty-two A. L. s. and L. s. 1812-26, to Viscount Melville, First Lord of the Admiralty, *nearly all marked private and confidential*, mostly on Naval Affairs, in 1818 he insists that England must maintain her commanding situation at sea which is become so necessary in consequence of the operations and proceedings of the United States, and at the same time he insists on the Naval Estimates being reduced to six million; with other important references to Lord Cochrane's Secret War Plan; Affairs in South America and the Pacific; The Peninsular Campaign and Wellington; Complains that the City of London and other places are doing all they can to promote rebellion by encouraging the disaffected and trying to intimidate the magistrates, with various enclosures, etc., *an important and interesting correspondence* (47)
- 475 SOUTH AMERICA. An interesting Auto. MS. and A. L. s. 37 pp. folio, in French, 1805, submitted by Bertrand de Moleville, formerly Minister of the Royal Marine in France, being a Plan for alienating the Continent of South America from Spain and establishing the Province of Mexico as an Independent State; with a Résumé by John McArthur, Author of "Life of Nelson," and other naval works and A. L. s. of the same (4)
- 476 ABERCROMBY (Sir Ralph) Commanded Expedition against the French in West Indies, 1795-6, defeated French at Alexandria, where he died of wounds, 1801, an important Series of Twenty-nine Letters, addressed to Lord Melville, 1794-8, on Military Affairs; with Four Enclosures (33)
- 477 ABERCROMBY (Sir Robert) Served throughout the American War, and distinguished himself in India, Seven A. L. s. 1794-8, to Lord Melville; with Letters of General Sir Herbert Taylor, etc. *a parcel*
- 478 [NAPOLEON I] A. L. s. from Anthony de Poggi, 1804, giving intelligence that Napoleon had sent Admiral Verheul to acquaint the States General that the indemnity agreed upon to the ex-Stadholder could not with prudence and safety be sent, etc.; Five anonymous Letters from Paris and Brussels, 1792, giving details of the Revolution; Notes sur les Isles de France et de Bourbon, 10½ pp. folio, 1794 (8)
- 479 BOSWELL (James) A. L. s. 3 pp. 4to, *Great Portland Street*, 17 March, 1794, to Melville, asking that he may be appointed as British Minister or Commissioner in Corsica, speaks of his intimate knowledge of the Island and his intimacy with Paoli; with A. L. s. of Claud Boswell, Sheriff of Fife, concerning the price of grain; and another (3)



- 480 CASTLEREAGH (Viscount) Foreign Secretary, Six A. L. s. c. 1830, to Melville, on State Affairs; with others of Lord Sidmouth concerning Petitions from the Merchants of Liverpool, Glasgow, Greenock, etc., against American Privateers; Spencer Perceval, *Prime Minister*, Lord Westmoreland, The Duke of Bedford and Lord Powis *a parcel*
- 481 CORNWALLIS (Marquess) Governor-General of India, served in America, Four A. L. s. 1794-1800, to Melville, the first from *Tournay*, speaks of the plight of the Allied Army; with A. L. s. of second Marquess Cornwallis to second Viscount Melville concerning pensions granted to his father by the East India Company, with draft reply, etc. (7)
- 482 PITT (William) Five A. L. s. (*three initials only*), to his intimate friend, Viscount Melville, 1793, etc., refers to the conclusion of Peace between France and Prussia; The Order of the National Assembly to Dumourier to insist on the free navigation of the Scheldt, and his regret in having to decline the call of his friends to form a Government; with Four A. L. s. of his brother, the Earl of Chatham, First Lord of the Admiralty; and A. L. of Lord Advocate Dundas (10)
- 483 HASTINGS (Warren) A. L. s. 1½ pp. 4to, *Daylesford House*, 15th July, 1799 (to Viscount Melville), referring to the first acts of the Court of Directors for his relief

Memorial signed by Archbishop Harcourt, Dean Cockburn, the Duke of Devonshire, Lords Carlisle, Wentworth-Fitzwilliam and Harewood, concerning the disastrous fire of Feb. 2, 1829, with a long correspondence addressed to Viscount Melville, c. 1800, including Marquis of Rockingham, Lords Hertford, Bristol, Hastings, Holland, Tweeddale, Glenbervie and others *a parcel*
- 485 WORDSWORTH (William) Two A. L. s. 1799-1805, to Lord Melville; J. W. Croker, three A. L. s. to the same, *one dated 20 July*, 1815, giving interesting information concerning Napoleon; Wm. Siddons, husband of Sarah Siddons, A. L. s. mentioning her and others 13
- 486 NAVAL AND MILITARY, including Admiral Lord St. Vincent, 1799, Admiral Duncan, Field-Marshal H. S. Conway, concerning the governorship of Jersey; General Lord Howden (1830), concerning Cleopatra's Needle; General Viscount Beresford (4); Lord Raglan, Marquis Wellesley, Duke of Wellington and others (23)
- 487 STATESMEN. A Series of important Letters on State Affairs addressed to Lord Melville, 1796, etc., including George Canning (4), William Windham (14), Lord North, Lord Lyndhurst, Lord Thurlow (7), Marquis of Bath, Lord Loughborough (12), C. F. Greville, etc. *a parcel*



- 488 ABINGTON (Mrs. Frances) A. L. s. third person, 29, *St. Albans Street, Oct. 7th* (1794), to Melville, asking for a continuance of his gracious patronage, and for the completion of his efforts on her behalf
- 489 WILLIAM IV (when Duke of Clarence). An important Series of Twenty-nine A. L. s. addressed to Lord Melville, *circa* 1814, on Naval affairs
- 490 AUSTRALIA. An anonymous Letter, 2 pp. folio, addressed to the Duke of Clarence, 1828, referring to future claims of Great Britain on the Colonies of Australia; speaks of the discovery of a river of the first magnitude, debouching into the Indian Ocean from the interior somewhere near Roebuck Bay, fears that France and the Netherlands may send out an expedition, with a covering Letter from the Duke of Clarence; Lord Melville speaks of the writer of the Australian letter as a great blockhead, who seems to know nothing of what he has undertaken to write about; with Six A. L. s. of William IV (8)
- 491 AMHERST (Jeffrey, Baron) Field-Marshal, succeeded Abercromby as Commander-in-Chief in America in the Seven Years' War, took Crown Point and shared in the capture of Montreal, a Series of Sixteen A. L. s., 1793-4, addressed to Lord Melville on military matters; and fifteen others (31)
- 492 MALCOLM (Sir Pulteney) Admiral, Commander-in-Chief on the St. Helena Station, 1816-1817, an interesting Series of Five A. L. s. covering 29 pp. 4to, *written from St. Helena, June, 1816-Jan. 1817*, to Lord Melville, with important information concerning Napoleon:
- I have had two interviews with Bonaparte, he was in great good humour, and conversed freely on various subjects, he feels much disappointed that more was not said respecting him when the St. Helena Bill was before Parliament . . . his eye is sharp, his countenance changes with his mind, to me it was placid, but I can easily conceive that it is often ferocious . . . Bertrand has requested permission to quit the Island . . . it is desirable that he should go from hence . . . Sir Hudson Lowe's conduct towards Bonaparte appears to me to be very correct . . .
- Sir Hudson Lowe requested me to accompany him to Longwood to be present when he stated to Bonaparte the impertinent conduct of Count Bertrand, Bonaparte forgot himself and indulged in strong invectives against Sir Hudson.
- with interesting references to the Dockyard at Simon's Bay, and a recommendation that a blockhouse should be built there. (5)
- 493 MALCOLM (Sir Pulteney) A Series of Ten A. L. s., *Brussels, Paris and Ostend, June-August, 1815*, to Lord Melville, concerning the Battle of Waterloo; he states intelligence has been received that the French had advanced to Charleroi, in number about 130,000, and that the Army under the Duke was instantly put in motion; speaks in a letter *dated*

June 18th of a sanguinary contest between the divisions of our Army, commanded by the Prince of Orange and Sir Thos. Picton, and the French, commanded by Bonaparte in person :

I congratulate your Lordship on the capture of Bonaparte, altho' I must confess I wish we had got hold of him in a more hostile manner.

CAMPBELL (Sir Neil) General, *escorted Napoleon to Elba*, A. L. s. 2 pp. 4to, April 27th, 1814, stating that Napoleon had requested to be embarked on H.M.S. "Undaunted" with certain officers authorised to accompany him to the Island of Elba ; and two others (13)

494 BERRY (Charles Ferdinand, Duc de) and Count de la Chartre. A Series of Letters concerning their return to France after Napoleon's banishment to Elba, with Draft Replies by Lord Melville, Lord Liverpool, Admiral Keith and others (24)

495 HASTINGS (first Marquis of) Soldier and Statesman, a Series of Twelve A. L. s. 1795-1815, to Lord Melville, writing from *Madeira*, in 1813, on his way to India, he speaks of the mutinous propensity of the crew and thinks it possible they might, in the event of meeting with a squadron of American frigates, attempt to seize and surrender the ship, describes the war with the Ghorkas, 1814-15, etc. ; and five others (17)

496 GRENVILLE (William, Lord) Prime Minister, 1806-7, a Series of Nineteen A. L. s. 1793-1805, to Lord Melville, discussing the war with France in 1793, the expedition to West Indies, 1796, and other matters ; with Letters of Lord Grey, Sir Robt. Peel, and others (28)

497 GEORGE III. Five A. L. s. 1792-3, to Lord Melville, one extremely important letter, dated *May 16th*, 1792, concerns the dismissal of Thurlow from the Chancellorship

498 ROYALTY, including George IV as Prince Regent ; Frederick, Duke of York, Twenty-eight A. L. s. to Melville ; Alexander, Emperor of Russia ; Duchess of Gloucester ; Duchess of Kent ; Princess Augusta ; Princess Elizabeth

499 KENT (Edward, Duke of) father of Queen Victoria, Commander-in-Chief in British North America, 1799-1800, a Series of Eleven L. s. eight of which are written from *Halifax, Nova Scotia*, 1797-1799, to Lord Melville, discusses various questions concerning the Army in Canada, which he describes as "this dreary corner of the Globe" (11)
