EGYPTIAN STATUETTES IN STONE.

61 A CARTOUCHE-SHAPED TABLET IN CALCAREOUS STONE, inscribed with the celebrated Hymn to Aten, of the reign of Khu-en-Aten (XVIIIth dynasty), the tablet has been broken from the figure of a kneeling scribe, probably a priest of Aten, 11 in. by 4½ in.; also a similar Head of a Woman, very fine

- 62 A massive Head of a Sarcophagus in carved sandstone, coloured yellow, wig white, eyes white outlined in black; 15 in. high, late period, in nice condition, the colouring showing little sign of wear
- 63 A Model Bust for a School of Sculpture, probably a portrait of Amen-hetep III, XVIIIth dynasty, the position of the features is determined by the block being first squared in canon lines, horizontal and vertical, cut in the back; one side of the face is not quite finished, and over the forehead a piece of the limestone is merely blocked for a uraeus; 8 in. high; found at Gurnah
- 64 A STATUETTE OF A KING in black diorite, bearded, seated on a throne; 10½ in. high

- 65 A-Bust of a Man of Rank wearing the namms, shoulders and chest bare, in polished basalt, inscribed at the back; 7½ in.

 high; XXVIth dynasty; nose missing, but a fine dignified head
- A standing Figure of a Priest or King, said to be Senefru of the IIIrd dynasty, feet missing; he holds in his right hand an object the meaning of which has not been determined, inscribed down the front of figure; 7³/₄ in. high; found at Sakkara
- 67 An Upper part of the Statue of a Man of Rank, wearing the long wig with lappets, in black diorite; 10½ in. high
- 68 Bust of a (?) King, wearing the wig with lappets, black diorite, 4 in. high; also a black diorite Head of an Osiride figure of a King, probably Harmhai I of the XVIIIth dynasty, with portion of inscription: "Saith the Osiris Du...," the rest missing, 3\frac{3}{4} in. high; and a headless seated Figure of Osiris in grey diorite, inscribed, 3\frac{7}{8} in. high
- 69 Composite Figures of two Men, standing; the hair done in a kind of pig-tail, a column of inscription behind each figure; brown limestone, VIth and XIth dynasty
- A limestone Figure of a King, wearing namms and shenti, Early Kingdom style, 9 in. high; a seated sandstone Figure of a Woman (?), IInd dynasty, 95 in. high; and a Model of a seated Osiris, 10½ in. high

- 71 A Statuette of a kneeling Scribe, holding inscribed tablet on his outstretched arms, the back of the figure also inscribed, in polished black steatite; 3³/₄ in. high, fine; found at Kahûn 1

- 72 A standing Figure of a Woman in limestone, $5\frac{1}{4}$ in. high, the figure is nude, but with painted representation of ornaments in black line on the breast, arms, ankles, etc.; also a polished diorite Osiris, $7\frac{1}{2}$ in. high, perhaps of Nubian origin; and a black diorite Half-head of a King, $3\frac{3}{4}$ in. high, found at Thebes
- 73 Three quaintly carved Figures of (?) Lions from Gebelin, in sandstone, about 4½ in. long, two inscribed; also a limestone Head of a wigged Man; and a limestone Torso of a Man, 3½ in. high
- 74 A greenstone Figure of a Cat, 2½ in. long, a fine and unusual model; Rustafjaell collection
- 75 Six limestone, steatite and diorite Figures of Animals, comprising Hedgehog, Crocodile, Hare, Sphinx, Chameleon, and (?) Jerboa 6
- 76 Six others in alabaster, soapstone, limestone, etc., comprising
 Ape with young, two squatting Apes, Falcon of Horus,
 Lion's Head, and Ibis 6
