## THE GENEALOGICAL COLLECTIONS.

AN IMMENSE AND UNIQUE COLLECTION OF NOTES OR TRANSCRIPTS OF WILLS, LEGAL TRANSACTIONS, PARISH REGISTERS AND OTHER RECORDS INDISPENSABLE FOR TRACING GENEALOGIES.

The late Mr. Lothrop Withington was largely interested in various Historical Societies in the New England States of America, and he formed the project of establishing the genealogy and history of the principal families of Virginia and New England. To do this meant the expenditure of a great deal of time and money and, to assist the work, Mr. Withington accepted commissions to trace the pedigrees of individual families. The period chiefly covered by the English researches is the latter part of the sixteenth and early years of the seventeenth centuries, when New England was being colonized. A great deal of the original research was done by Mr. Withington himself, but he employed assistants to work in various probate registries and record offices.

It is impossible to give, within the limits of an auction catalogue, even a faint idea of the enormous mass of material thus accumulated and classified during many years of strenuous toil. To any worker in the same field it would be invaluable.

The principal sections into which the collection is divided are as follows:—

## 1. NOTES ARRANGED UNDER FAMILY NAMES:

This very large section consists both of typed abstracts of wills and other records and manuscript notes. The amount of material gathered under different names varies greatly, but in some cases is very extensive. The typed transcripts are contained in about 90 boxes, the manuscript notes in upwards of 400 boxes; the two series are not mere duplicates one of the other, and though the same name sometimes occurs in each there appears to be much material in the manuscript notes which has not yet been typed—probably upwards of 1000 names are represented in the two series together ~~497~~

2. NOTES ARRANGED UNDER TOPOGRAPHICAL HEADINGS: <sup>597</sup>

These again consist of two divisions, typed and manuscript. They include extracts from parish registers, from the muniment room at Warwick Castle and elsewhere, the manuscript section being particularly strong in London records, contained in upwards of 60 boxes. Other places include Essex (5 boxes of typed matter), Suffolk (4 similar boxes), Devonshire, Berks, Bristol, etc. 147

## 3. NOTES FROM THE RECORDS OF ECCLESIASTICAL COURTS:

The manuscript notes in this section, which include abstracts of wills and other matter, come from the Court of Arches,

Consistories of Ely, Bristol, York, Lincoln, London, Chichester, etc., Archdeaconries of Canterbury, Winchester, Sarum, Norwich, Lewes, etc., Commissaries of London, and Prerogative Court of York, written on half-sheets of notepaper, contained in 128 cardboard boxes. The typed matter is similar, but contains also a large number of notes from the Act books of the Archdeaconries of Sudbury and Norwich, others from the Parish registers of the same places, with Essex, Middlesex, Herts, etc. No doubt Mr. Withington paid particular attention to these East Anglian records on account of the number of early American settlers who came from there or from London

## 4. NOTES ON THE PREROGATIVE COURT OF CANTERBURY :

These include manuscript notes on the calendar, 1559-1660, wills, printed proofs of the calendar, 1605-19, etc., in 9 boxes, also a number of notes on various books, 1605-19, presumably the records of the Court, these being probably the material on which the printed calendar was based. All the fifteen years, 1605-19, are represented, except 1618, and in nearly all cases there are two collections of notes for each year, one the rough manuscript notes on half-sheets of paper in boxes, the other including both typed and manuscript matter contained in folio notebooks with brown-paper wrappers, both boxes and books numbering 14. There is also the commencement of an index to the wills between 1605 and 1619 in the form of typed slips laid down on foolscap sheets of paper

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## 5. LEGAL SECTION :

This includes a very extensive card index, in about 350 small white cardboard boxes, of Chancery proceedings, each card bearing figures showing the number of the bundle and of the document in the Record Office. There are also a number of manuscript extracts from various Court Rolls, *e. g.* Close Rolls of Elizabeth, James I, and Charles I, Subsidy Rolls, etc. Several boxes of notes are labelled Chancery Proceedings, and others refer to minor Courts. In all there are about 19 boxes in this section, apart from the card index, and a bundle of typed notes

## 6. TRANSCRIPTS FROM WILLS, EXTRACTS FROM PARISH REGISTERS, ETC. :

These include a great deal of material which apparently Mr. Withington intended to arrange in alphabetical order. A commencement has been made of this, and in six vertical files there are typed notes arranged under the initial letters of the families to which they refer ; the rest of this section, in 24 boxes, consists of notes, mostly typed, which in some cases are only roughly in alphabetical order, and in others are not in order at all

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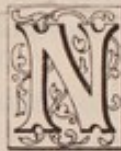




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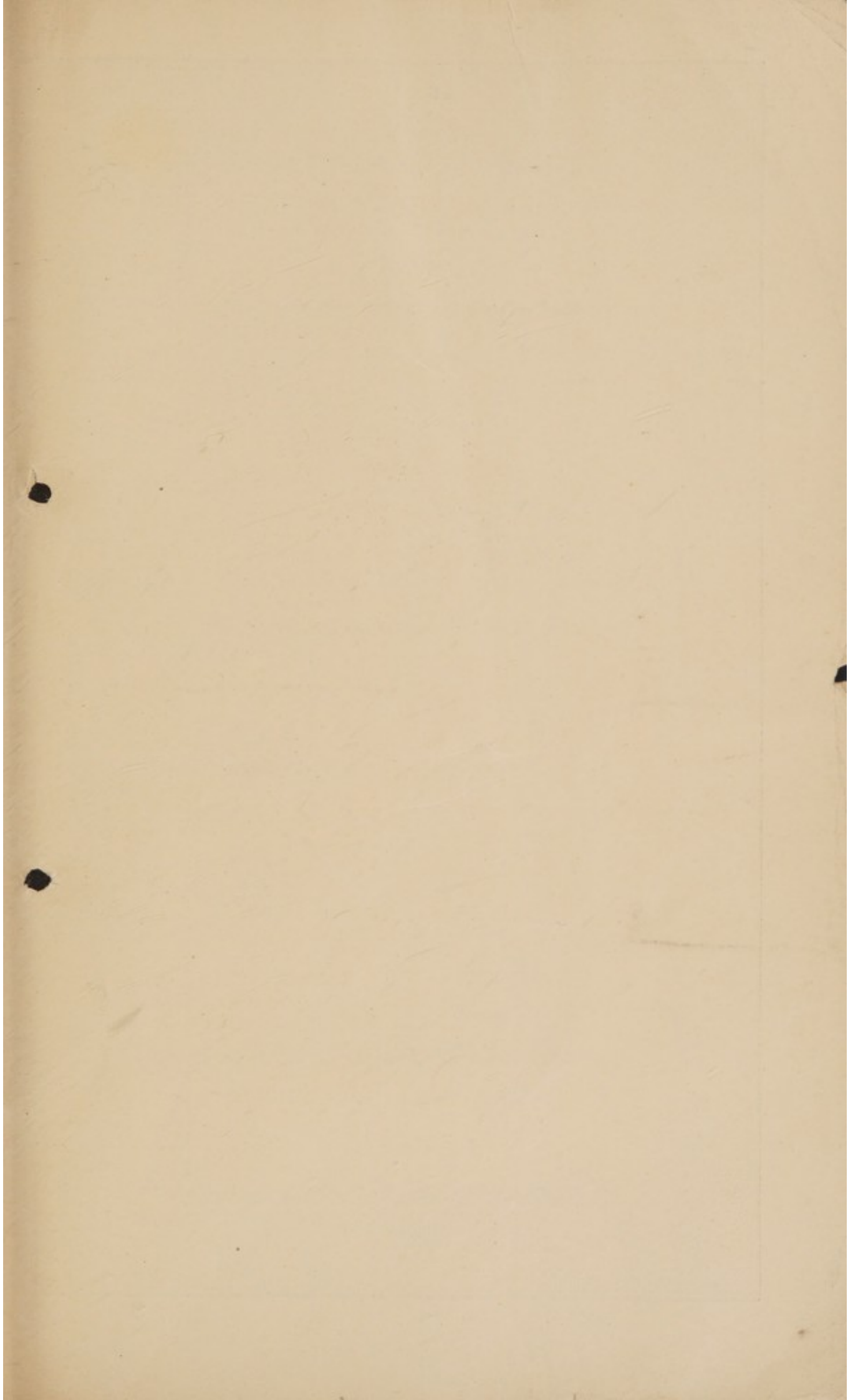
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
