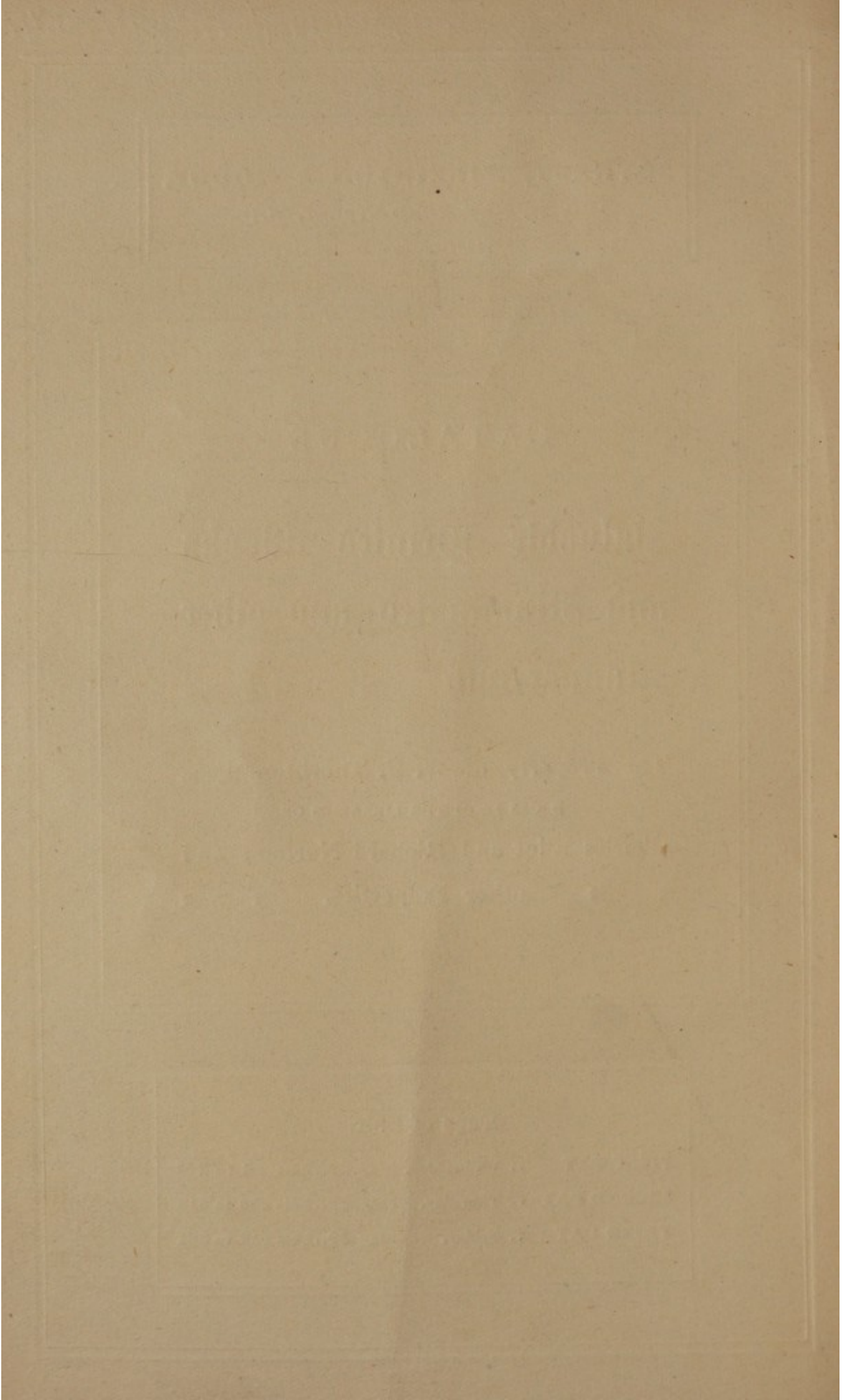

CONDITIONS OF SALE.

- I. The highest bidder to be the buyer; and if any dispute arise between bidders, the lot so disputed shall be immediately put up again, provided the Auctioneer cannot decide the said dispute.
- II. No person to advance less than 1s. ; above five pounds, 2s. 6d. ; and so on in proportion.
- III. All lots are sold subject to the right to impose a reserve ; and subject to the right to bid by, or on behalf of, the seller.
- IV. The purchasers to give in their names and places of abode, and to pay down 10s. in the pound, if required, in part payment of the purchase money ; in default of which the lot or lots purchased to be immediately put up again and resold.
- V. The lots to be taken away at the buyer's expense immediately after the conclusion of the sale ; in default of which Messrs. Sotheby, Wilkinson & Hodge will not hold themselves responsible if lost, stolen, damaged, or otherwise destroyed, but they will be left at the sole risk of the purchaser. If, at the expiration of One Week after the conclusion of the sale the books or other property are not cleared or paid for, they will then be catalogued for immediate sale, and the expenses, the same as if resold, will be added to the amount at which the books were bought. Messrs. Sotheby, Wilkinson & Hodge will have the option of reselling the lots uncleared either by public or private sale without any notice being given to the defaulter.
- VI. All the books are presumed to be perfect, unless otherwise expressed ; but if upon collating, any should prove defective, the purchaser will be at liberty to take or reject them, provided they are returned within "Ten Days after the conclusion of the sale, when the purchase-money will be returned.
- VII. The sale of any book or books is not to be set aside on account of any worm holes, stained or short leaves of text or plates, want of list of plates, or blank leaves or on account of the publication of any subsequent volume, supplement, appendix, or plates. All the manuscripts, autographs, all magazines and reviews, all books in lots, and all tracts in lots or volumes, will be sold with all faults, imperfections and errors of description. The sale of any illustrated book, lot of prints or drawings is not to be set aside on account of any error in the enumeration of the numbers stated, or error of description.

The volume bears no imprint or date, but judging from the dialect of the French text, was probably engraved and printed in French Flanders about 1500 to 1520. A cypher at the foot of the map of Gascony on the verso of the fifth leaf, may possibly afford a clue to the engraver or printer. There is also another cypher in the centre of the compass diagram of the North Star on the verso of the eighth leaf. The whole of the colouring is presumably hand work, including the additional names in red on the four maps and the rubrications in the Calendar, the Compasses and the Tables. The Perpetual Calendar contains numerous Emblems and Heads of the Saints, quaintly engraved in similar style to the block book calendars made in England about the same time (e.g. *vide* Huth No. 121). The Portolan-Chart is neatly coloured in the usual style of the period, and ornamented with six flags bearing the Arms of the Countries depicted. There are also three Compass stars, in the centre of one of which are the initials "K. B." presumably those of the designer. This dainty little volume is preserved in a *black morocco binding* of a later period, probably about the beginning of the eighteenth century, when the following inscription at the bottom of the verso of the last leaf was doubtless added: "N.B.—That this appeared to S. P. to have been K. Hen. 8ths. own Book." As this book

has long been preserved in the library of a descendant of Samuel Pepys, there can be no doubt that the initials "S. P." refer to him.

- * * This excessively rare little volume is apparently undescribed by bibliographers. Nordenskjöld in *Periplus* speaks at some length of the extraordinary rarity of engraved and printed portolani, and comments on the curious fact that the invention of printing seems to have offered little or no inducement for the production of maritime charts and portolani by mechanical processes, until well into the second half of the sixteenth century. He mentions in detail such few earlier ones, as had come to his knowledge, mostly separate charts, but describes nothing whatever of the nature of the present work, the four charts in which are ornamented with Flags and Views of Cities in the customary style of the MS. portolano. Each section is apparently complete in itself, viz, the Compass-cards, the Maps and Tables, and the Calendar, but the uneven number of leaves (11) suggests that there should be a twelfth leaf to complete the third sheet. This may have been a blank, and in all probability is the very leaf on which the small separate map of the Baltic was drawn by hand. This leaf actually follows the third leaf of the Calendar, but as it is detached and parted down on the inside of the end cover, it is impossible to say for certain that it belonged to the printed sheet. In the absence of any information to the contrary the volume will be sold according to the description given above.
