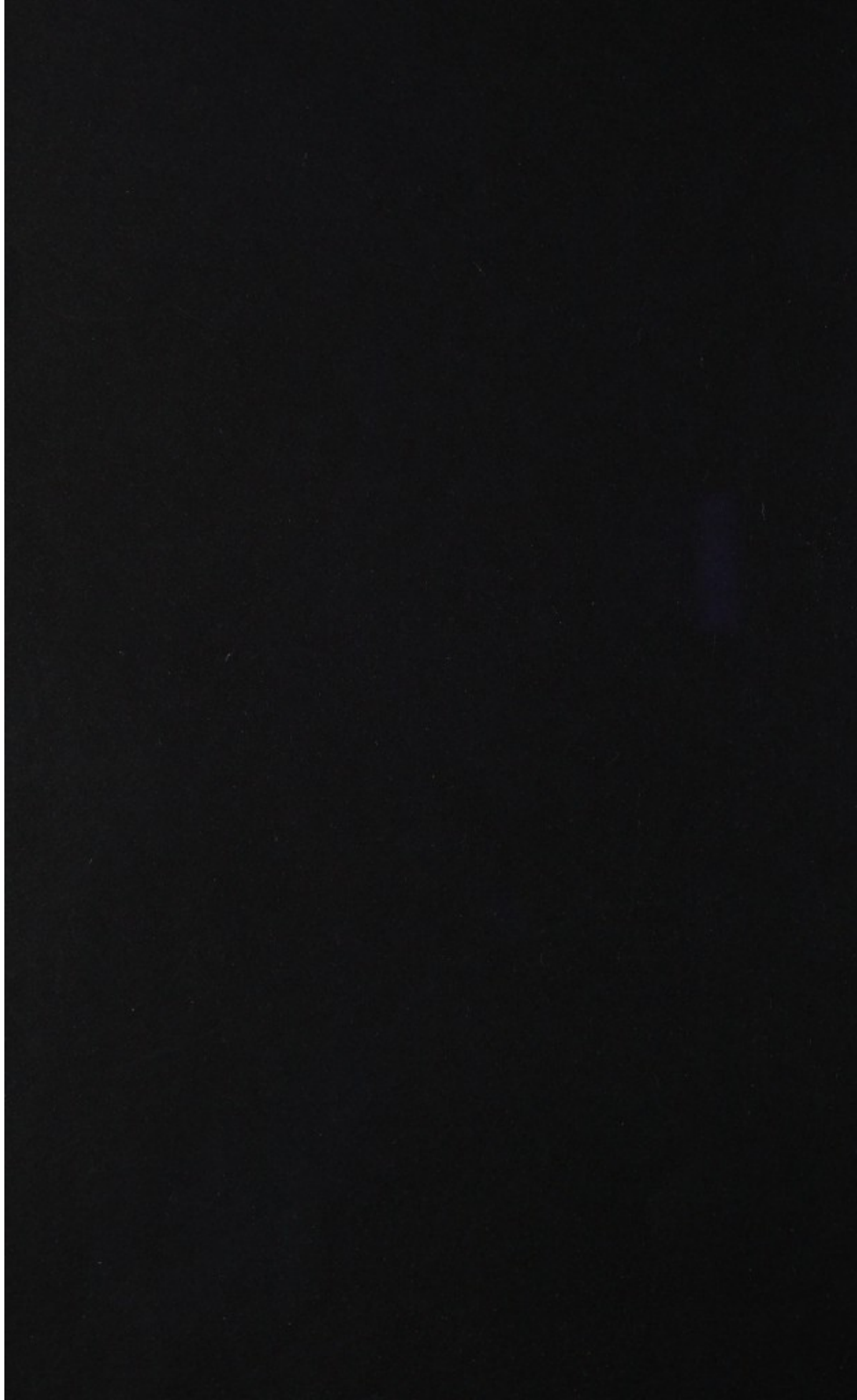

VIII. The Sale of any Book or Books is not to be set aside on account of any Stained or Short leaves of Text or Plates, or on account of the Publication of any subsequent Volume, Supplement, Appendix, or Plates. All MANUSCRIPTS, Magazines, and Reviews, all Bindings, all unmentioned Books in Lots, and all Tracts in Lots or Volumes will be sold with all Faults, Imperfections, and Errors of Description.
