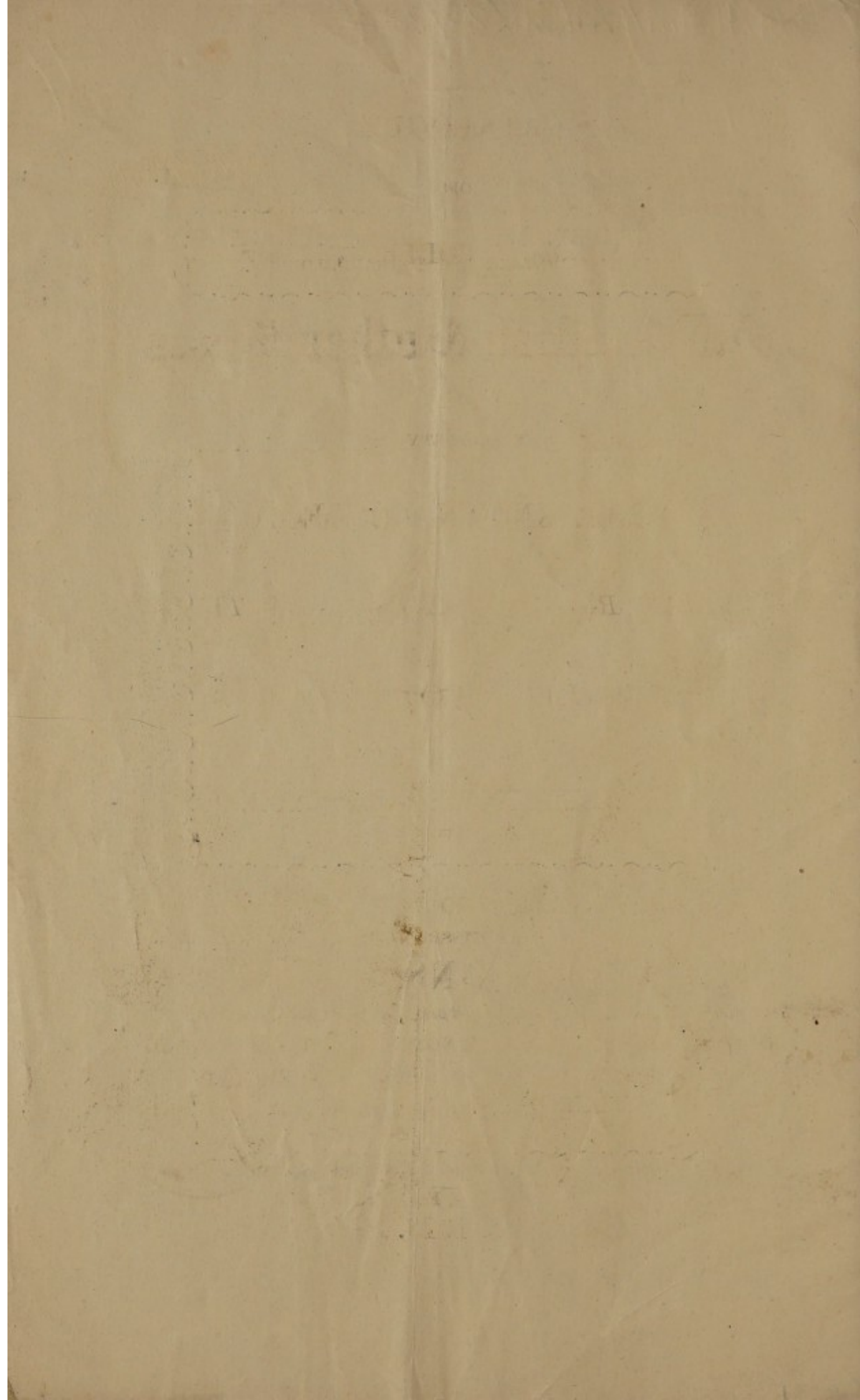

- 3 A large plain Goblet ; and a tall tapering Glass, with a sixpence of William IV. 1834, mint condition, in the stem 2
- 4 Six "Coaching" Glasses, without feet, the knops at the ends of the stems faceted 6

- 8 An early Wine Glass, with black etched design of two men fighting, and one of them disarmed fleeing from the other ; an engraved Goblet, with coat-of-arms in gilt, and another, with fire-gilt coat-of-arms, faceted stem 3
- 9 Four tall Glasses, with engraved coat-of-arms and mantling of flags surmounted by a plumed helmet, on tapering stems, with folded circular feet 4

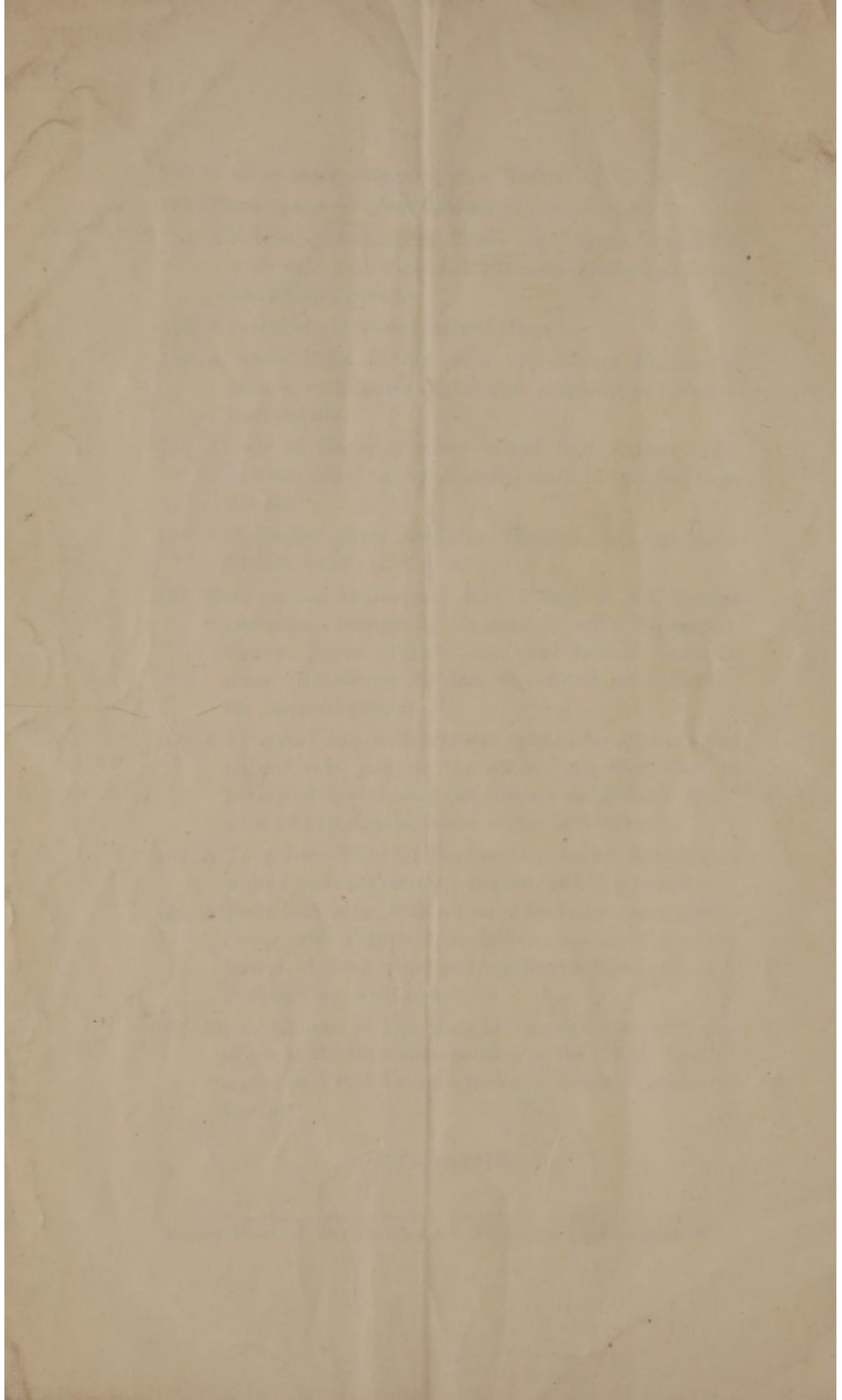


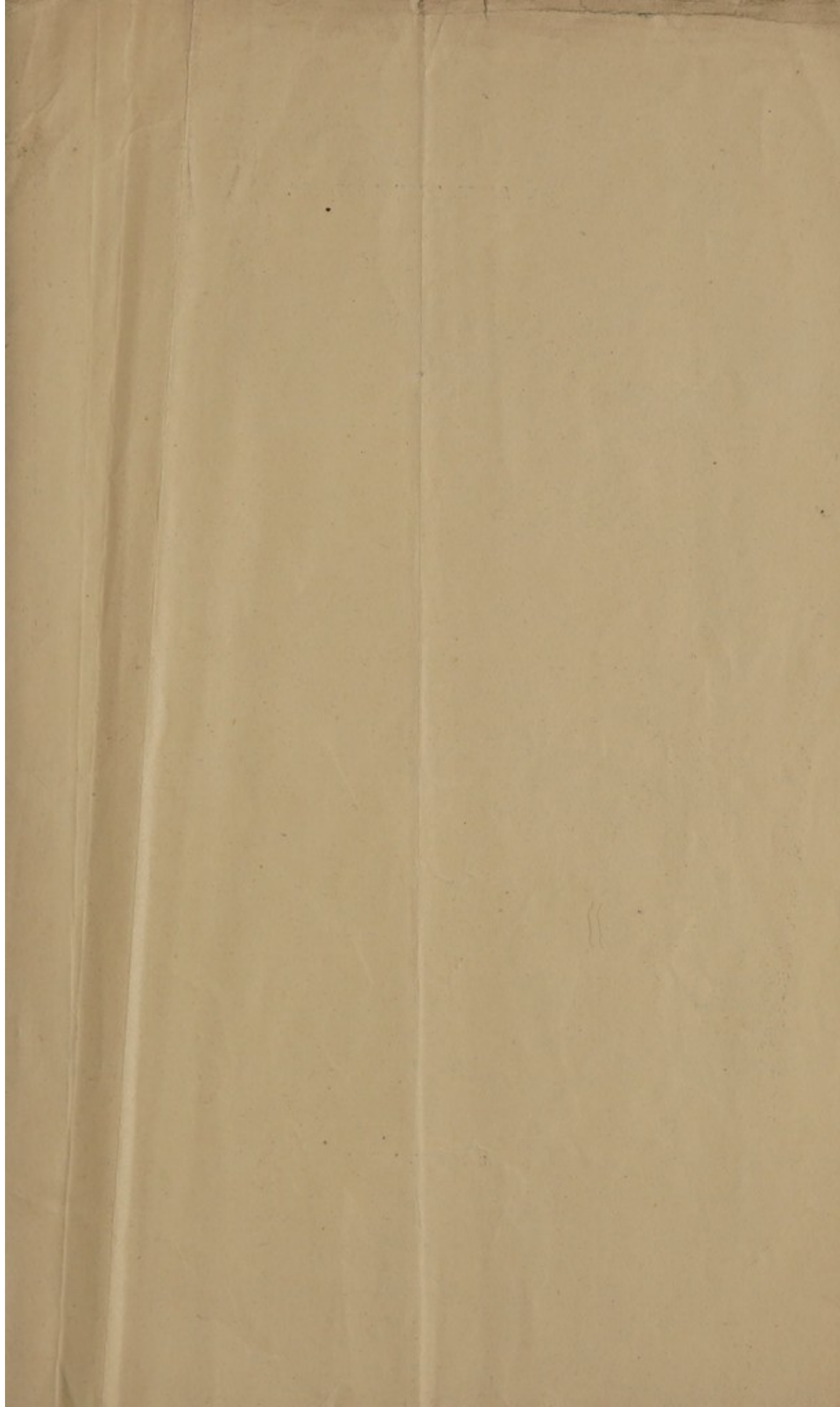


