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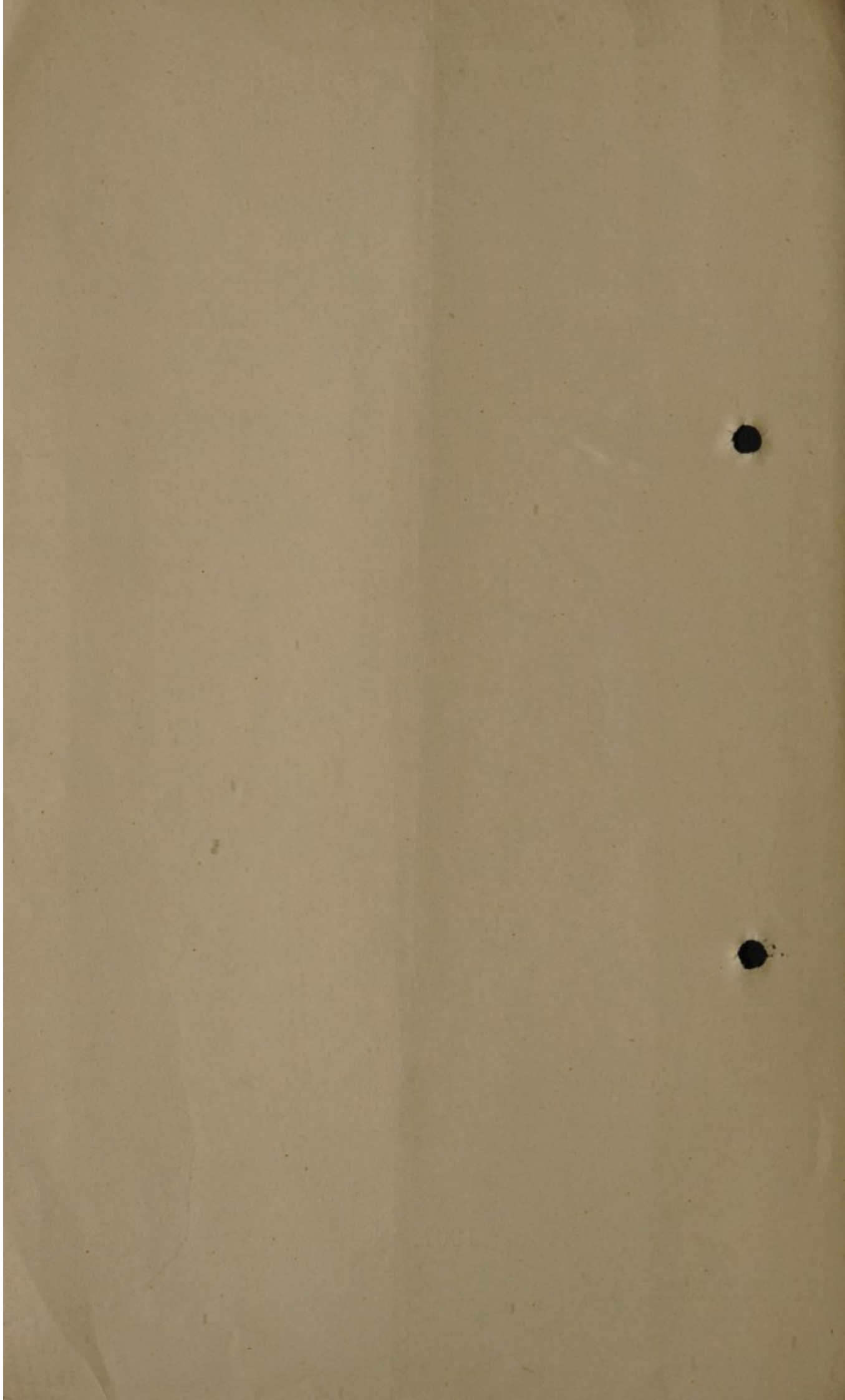

CONDITIONS OF SALE.

- I. The highest bidder to be the buyer; and if any dispute arise between bidders, the lot so disputed shall be immediately put up again, provided the Auctioneer cannot decide the said dispute.
- II. No person to advance less than 1s.; above five pounds 2s. 6d.; and so on in proportion.
- III. In the case of lots upon which there is a reserve, the Auctioneer shall have the right to bid on behalf of the Seller.
- IV. The purchasers to give in their names and places of abode, and to pay down 10s. in the pound, if required, in part payment of the purchase-money, in default of which the lot or lots purchased to be immediately put up again and re-sold.
- V. The lots to be taken away, at the buyer's expense, immediately after the conclusion of the sale; in default of which Messrs. SOTHEY, WILKINSON & HODGE will not hold themselves responsible if lost, stolen, damaged, or otherwise destroyed, but they will be left at the sole risk of the purchaser. Messrs. SOTHEY, WILKINSON & HODGE will have the option of re-selling the lots uncleared, either by public or private sale, without any notice being given to the defaulter.
- VI. All the books are presumed to be perfect, unless otherwise expressed; but if, upon collating, any should prove defective, the purchaser will be at liberty to take or reject them, provided they are returned within ONE WEEK after the conclusion of the sale, when the purchase-money will be returned.
- VII. The sale of any book or books is not to be set aside on account of any worm holes, stained or short leaves of text or plates, want of list of plates or blank leaves, or on account of the publication of any subsequent volume, supplement, appendix, or plates. All the manuscripts, autographs, all magazines and reviews, all books in lots, and all tracts in lots or volumes, will be sold with all faults, imperfections and errors of description. The sale of any illustrated book, lot of prints or drawings, is not to be set aside on account of any error in the enumeration of the numbers stated, or error of description.

 * * * These pistols belonged to Mr. Brontë, and are mentioned by Mrs. Gaskell in her "Life of Charlotte Brontë," p. 53.

- 39 Charlotte Brontë's morocco leather Work Case, containing reels of cotton, work materials and drawings of embroidery
- 40 Fragment from the Coffin of Napoleon I, given to Charlotte Brontë by M. Héger, in Brussels, *who received it from M. Lebel, Secretary to Prince Achille Murat (see letter and accompanying writing on fragment)*; and the Lord's Prayer in Charlotte Brontë's handwriting (*written very small, on space about the size of a threepenny piece*)
- 41 Six Pencil Sketches by Charlotte Brontë, *in small portfolio*
- 42 Various Pencil Sketches, Water-colour Drawings, etc. by Charlotte and Anne Brontë, *in box* (21)
- 43 A pair of silver-rimmed Spectacles, *in shagreen case*
 * * * These spectacles belonged to Mr. Brontë, and are those seen in the portrait given in Mrs. Gaskell's "Life of Charlotte Brontë," p. 486.

- 44 Brontë (Charlotte) Nine tiny Volumes of Juvenile Tales, etc. in a minute handwriting, six being in the autograph of Charlotte Brontë, and three in that of her brother Patrick Branwell
 * * * The date of these early compositions is 1829-30. All those by Charlotte are given in the "Catalogue of my Books" printed in Mrs. Gaskell's "Life." Two, viz. "The Poetasters," and "An Interesting Passage," have been supposed to lost.
- 45 Brontë (C.) Poems, some published, some unpublished; also portions of a Diary and "The African Queen's Lament"
 * * * Manuscript of 50 pp. *date* 1836-7, chiefly in her small upright writing, but last 4 pp. in a sloping hand and 1 p. showing a combination of both styles. About nine of the poems are printed, see "Professor," pp. 345-62, but the printed versions in many cases differ naturally from those in the above MS. (*See MS. list*).
- 46 Brontë (C.) Manuscript Book, No. 1, containing 22 pp. 4to of Verses written in a sloping hand, and includes "We take from Life our little Share" (printed as "Winter Stores"), "Presentiment," "Remembrance" (printed as "Evening Solace," with alternative readings), "Lament" (printed as "Regret"), "Apostacy," "Passion," a "Song" and "Stanzas," see Poems in "Professor," pp. 348-368
- 47 Brontë (C.) Caroline Vernon, a Story in three books, containing 17 chapters, *apparently complete and unpublished*
 * * * Manuscript of 106 pp. 8vo, in a small upright hand, signed at conclusion *Charles Townshend, March 26th, 1839*. On the last page of this interesting MS. appears a poem "Life, believe, is not a dream," printed under the title "Life" in Poems (see "Professor," p. 345).
- 48 Brontë (C.) A Story, without title, signed *C. Townshend, Feby. 22nd, 1839*. Manuscript of 49 pp. 8vo, in minute writing
- 49 Brontë (C.) Various Manuscripts, fragments of Stories, etc., on 64 pp. 8vo, partly in pencil
 * * * One page is dated 1838, and another contains a curious reference to Dickens' "Mr. Squeers."
- 50 Brontë (C.) Draft of a Letter in her autograph, 3 pp. 4to, in pencil, addressed to Wordsworth; printed in Mrs. Gaskell's "Life," pp. 189-190. In 1840 C. Brontë sent a story to Wordsworth which he returned to her in the wrapper upon which this letter is written

- 51 Brontë (C.) Preface to the "Professor," in pencil, 3 pp. 8vo, as published posthumously in 1857
- 52 Lithograph Letter and two Cards, an invitation from the Mayor and Mayoress of Oxford, 1854, to Miss Charlotte Brontë; Two Letters from the Duke of Wellington and Sir Robert Peel to Rev. P. Brontë, *November 21st*, 1828, contained in envelope addressed to Miss Charlotte Brontë, c/o Smith, Elder & Co.
- 53 Brontë (C.) Book of Poems, copied by her husband, the Rev. A. B. Nicholls
- * * * Manuscript of 61 pp. 4to, contains *inter alia* "Memory," first printed in the "Cornhill Magazine," in 1893; "Saul," dated *Oct. 7*, 1834, apparently unpublished; "When thou sleepest, lulled in Night," containing two lines additional to the printed version. From the other end of this volume is commenced a dialogue between C. and S. 8 pp.
- 54 Brontë (C.) Letter from Robert Southey, dated *Keswick*, 22 *March*, 1837, to Miss (Charlotte) Brontë, in cover, on which she has written "Southey's advice to be kept for ever, My twenty-first birthday, Roe Head, April 21, 1837" (printed in Mrs. Gaskell's Life, p. 159)
- 55 Brontë (Emily) A Volume of Poems, signed (at the top of the first page), *Emily Jane Brontë*, transcribed *February*, 1844
- * * * An important manuscript of 68 pp. 8vo, in very small writing. Each poem is headed with the date of its composition, the last date being *May 15th*, 1847. This is apparently the MS. described by Mr. Shorter ("Charlotte Brontë and her Circle," p. 70), but the present MS. contains a larger number of pages, with more unprinted matter and many variations from the published versions.
- 56 Brontë (E.) Poems in her handwriting, 8 pp. but signed *Charlotte Brontë*, *Jany. 9th*, 1837; Verses in her handwriting, 4 pp. (*undated*) (2)
- 57 Brontë (Branwell) Manuscript Book of Poems, on 77 pp. 4to, with a curious sketch on p. 2 of Contents. From the other end of the book is commenced "Minute Book of the Haworth Operatic Conservatoire Society"
- 58 Brontë (B.) The Life of Warren Howard Warner, Esq., chapters 1-4, Manuscript on 8 pp. under the *nom de guerre* of "John Flower," but signed with initials at commencement and dated *February*, 1838

* * * VERY RARE. The First English translation of this Romance. In the reprint of this little volume, Thornley's own Epistle Dedicatory "To Young Beauties," 4 pages, was entirely omitted, yet it is one of the most curious portions of the book.

* * * RICHARD WOODHOUSE'S COPY, with numerous Manuscript Notes by him, copies of Sonnets by Keats, etc. partly in shorthand. Woodhouse's MSS. are some of the chief authorities for Keats' readings.
