VIII. The Sale of any Book or Books is not to be set aside on account of any Stained or Short leaves of Text or Plates, want of List of Plates, or on account of the Publication of any subsequent Volume, Supplement, Appendix, or Plates. All MANUSCRIPTS, Magazines, and Reviews, and Serial Publications of every description, all Bindings, all Books in Lots, and all Tracts in Lots or Volumes will be sold with all Faults, Imperfections, and Errors of Description. 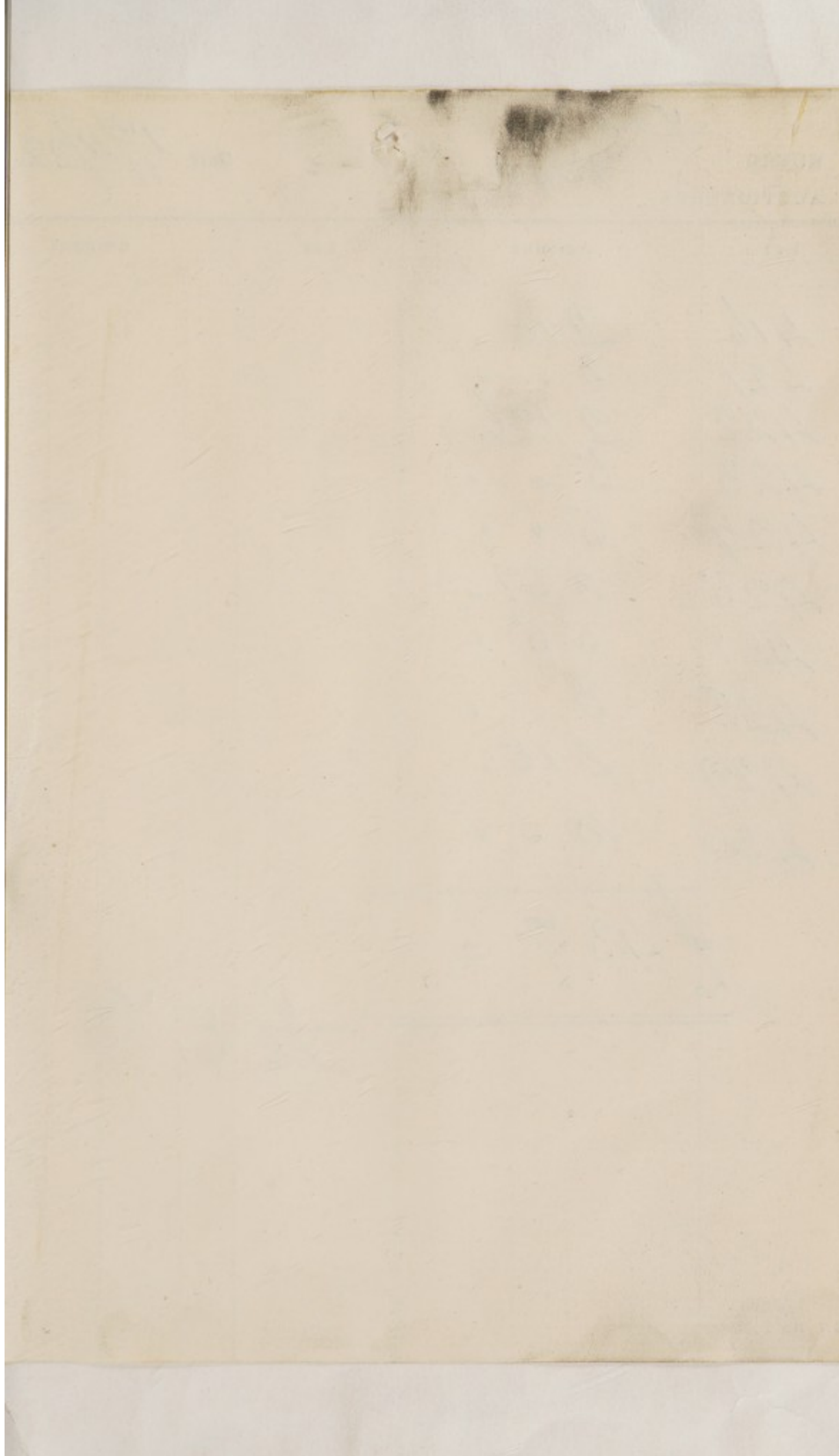

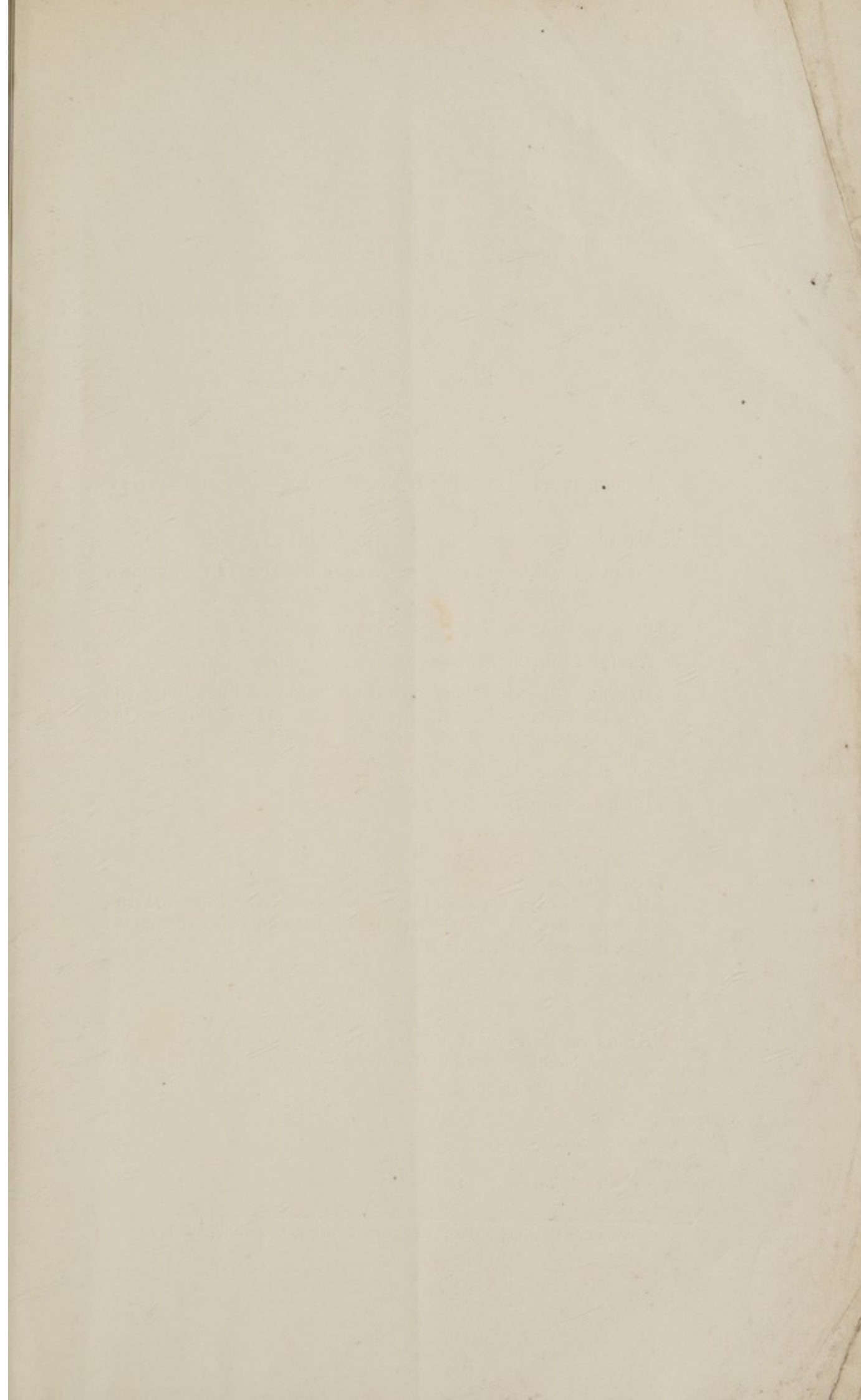
