- 154 A pair of Chelsea candlesticks, figures of a boy and girl standing under May trees and holding flowers, on scroll bases outlined with lake and gilt, 8³/₄in. high.
- 155 A Chelsea oval dish, modelled with vine branches, in white, 9³/₄in. wide, a fluted sauce boat, modelled with prunus branches, 4in. high, and a cup and saucer, similar.
- 156 A Chelsea tea cup, a coffee cup and two saucers, partly fluted, painted with groups and wreathes of flowers and husk festoons, and outlined with dark blue.
